FORMER CHESTERFIELD POLICE OFFICER DAVID CERNA, COP, SEX PERVERT, VIDEO PRODUCER AND WEBSITE OWNER! NOW READ THE INVESTIGATIVE REPORT KTVI newsman Chris Hayes got a tip and broke the case that someone was video recording people urinating in the men's bathroom on the Mobil on the Run in Chesterfield on Clarkson Road. He turned his evidence over to the Chesterfield Police.

A thorough investigation determined that Chesterfield Officer David Cerna while on duty had been hiding a camera in the bathroom recording men's penises at the urinal. The Mobil station was a favorite place for police officers to take a bathroom break and at least seven officers were also recorded.

A search warrant of Cerna's house in Wentzville resulted in computers being seized. There the bathroom images, along with recordings of Cerna using a glory hole at his house performing anonymous oral sex on people responding to messages on websites were found. All these images were placed on websites run by Cerna.



More troubling were secret recordings of officers changing clothes in the Chesterfield Police locker room, people, including juvenile males wearing sweat pants or shorts being frisked by Cerna and having their pants pulled out at the waist and their genitals secretly recorded by Cerna using a small recording device.

Cerna pled guilty to:

2 counts of **Felony Invasion of Privacy** in St. Charles CO Sentenced to **60 days jail**

Felony Invasion of Privacy Multiple Persons St. Louis CO Sentenced to **4 Years prison but placed on 5-years probation.**

Misdemeanor Invasion of Privacy St. Louis CO. Sentenced to **1-year jail no probation**

Felony Sexual Exploitation of a Minor St. Louis CO Sentenced to 10-years prison but placed on 5 year probation term

Felony Invasion of Privacy Multiple Persons St. Louis Co **Sentenced to 4-years prison but placed on 5-years probation**

Cerna appealed the sentence for Sexual Exploitation of Minor to the Missouri Court of Appeals of the Eastern District. His appeal was denied and the judgment and sentence was affirmed on July 25, 2017. The final notation on the case was entered by the courts in September of 2017.



TOWN AND COUNTRY WOMAN ARRESTED FOR FELONY DRUNK DRIVING.

Carolyn Kruszewski, 25, of 2724 Turnberry Park (a street with only big and bigger houses) in Town and Country was arrested on May 16, 2017 for Felony DWI by the Florissant Police after she was stopped for careless driving. The felony charge was issued on September 26, 2017.

The arresting officer reported that Kruszewski was belligerent and was saying profanities constantly. She was also very drunk with slurred speech when she was swearing and staggering when she tried to walk. A blood test showed her BAC level to be .194%. The blood test also showed narcotics in Kruszewski's blood. The arresting officer also reported smelling burnt marijuana in the car.

Kruszewski has prior DWI arrests and convictions in Kirkwood and Webster Groves.



She has a 2015 Christmas time drug arrest that is no longer on file but the mug shot associated with the arrest still is.

Comes now the State of Missouri by and through the undersigned Assistant Prosecuting Attorney on information and belief that there is probable cause to believe that the above named defendant committed the following crime(s):

COUNT: 01 DWI - PERSISTENT-CLASS E FELONY

That Carolyn Kruszewski , in violation of Section 577.010, committed the class E felony of driving while intoxicated, punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.002, 558.011 and 577.010 RSMo, in that on or about May 16, 2017, 20 West St. Anthony in the county of St. Louis, State of Missouri, the defendant operated a motor vehicle while under the influence of a combination of alcohol and alprazolam, a controlled substance, and

1. On or about January 15, 2013, defendant was found guilty of driving while intoxicated for events occurring on April 16, 2012, in Circuit Court Municipal Division of Kirkwood, MO in court case #T012772461A, and
2. On or about February 11, 2015, defendant was found guilty of driving while intoxicated for events occurring on September 10, 2014, in Circuit Court Municipal Division of Webster Groves, MO in court case # T1401606994.

I, Daniel Cushing, DSN 0636, Florissant Police Department, knowing that false statements on this form are punishable by law, state that the facts contained herein are true. I have probable cause to believe that on May 16, 2017, at 20 West St. Anthony, Carolyn Kruszewski, White, Female, DOB 06/11/1992, 5'04", 140lbs, committed one or more criminal offense(s).

Count: 01 DWI - PERSISTENT-CLASS E FELONY

The facts supporting this belief are as follows: Defendant was operating a motor vehicle in St. Louis County. Defendant was stopped for a traffic violation. Defendant's person smelled strongly of an odor of an intoxicating beverage. Defendant's eyes were watery, bloodshot and her pupils were dilated. Her balance and walking was stumbling, swaying and staggering. Defendant's speech was slurred and confused and she used profanity and was belligerent, arrogant and acting inconvenienced. Defendant refused SFSTs. Defendant was read his Missouri Implied Consent and she refused to provide a sample. A search warrant was obtained and defendant's blood was drawn. Defendant's BAC result was a .194 and she also tested positive for alprazolam. Defendant admitted roadside that she had drank "six drinks earlier" and that she had just finished smoking weed in response to officer's question as to the odor of marijuana in her vehicle. Defendant has at least two prior intoxication related traffic offenses.

POLICE PURSUIT THROUGH CHESTERFIELD AND TOWN AND COUNTRY ON THE TIRE RIMS ENDING IN A CAR ABLAZE. On

October 11 Brittany Bobo, Shomyia Renay Hemphill and Lamonica Monique McGee, where the three felony shoplifters who grabbed over \$8,000 of merchandise out of the Victoria's Secret in Lake St. Louis (St. Charles County), jumped in a Nissan, blew a tire after hitting a curb making their escape and then tried to outrun police officers who were driving cars with four inflated tires east on I-64.

The chase went from St. Charles County across the Missouri River into Chesterfield then Town and Country and ended in Frontenac, when sparks from the metal .

30-YEAR-OLD DRUNK WOMAN DOING 75 MPH ON HIGHWAY 141 ON A FLAT


TIRE: On Saturday night into Sunday morning May 15, 2016 Town and Country Officer McPherson was running radar on NB Highway 141 near Clayton Road. At 1:31 AM he clocked a 2013 white Mercedes Benz doing 74 MPH in a 50 MPH zone.

After getting the car stopped Officer McPherson noticed that the right front tire was flat and the wheel was broken causing the tire to deflate.

He identified the driver as Rebecca Kim, 30, of Lake St. Louis. Officer McPherson asked Kim if she know her tire was flat and if she had hit anything.

She replied that it was “just low on air.” She showed the usual signs of being a drunk driver, booze on the breath, slurred speech, bloodshot and glassy eyes and unsure balance. Kim stated that she had 2 beers at the Circle 7 Ranch Sports Bar on Clayton Road.

Kim failed several field sobriety tests and a field breath test. She was arrested for speeding and DWI and transported to the police station.

At the police station she took an official breath test that showed her BAC level to be .192%.

She was cited for DWI and Speeding.

Kim has a history of receiving moving violation traffic citations and getting a lawyer and then having the charges amended to no-moving and no-point violations.

PROTESTERS AT CITY COUNCIL MEETING WON'T SAY WHAT THEY ARE PROTESTING AND WILL ONLY SAY I AM AN ASSHOLE.

At the Monday October 16 Chesterfield City Council meeting gadlfy Octogenarian Harvey Roseberg was getting an award an award of his garden from Chesterfield Citizens Committee for the Environment.

In the passed Harvey has run against one of the most popular members of city government and has sued resident who refused to pay annual billing fees of \$200 when the indentures only allow \$50 annual bills. The lawsuit came while Harvey was on the Board of Park Trustees of Green Trails subdivision.

In 2015 the 80-year-old Rosenberg ran against the wildly popular incumbent 70-year-old Nancy Greenwood, who was a former mayor. Greenwood won with 73% of the vote.

But I was not the only one to notice them. Several members of the city council noticed them as did the man sitting next to the couple who gave them the stink eye after the rest of the room sat down after the pledge and the silent prayer.

After Harvey got his garden award from the Greenies, Harvey and the odd couple all left.

I went out to the lobby and did not see the man in shorts at first and jokingly asked one of the members of Committee for the Environment who the un-American couple were. This question located the guy quickly as he heard me and ran from the city hall doors

and started shouting that he had a First Amendment right to do what he did and I have no right to call him UnAmerican for using his constitutional rights. I agreed and said I was sorry and I wanted to know what he was protesting in Chesterfield.

He then asked if I was the press and I said I was and he started yelling, "You're an asshole!" He yelled this and kept jabbing his finger at me. I told him I had a number of photos of him and the woman and wanted to know what they were protesting. He kept yelling "asshole" and made his way toward the door. The woman meanwhile held some papers up so you could not see her face.

When the council meeting was over I went to the dias to ask some questions and asked if anyone knew the pair. Barb McGuinness said she saw them sitting and asked what happened. As I told the story and got to the part of him yelling "Asshole" when Councilman Barry Flachsbart said, "He has a point."

NO INFLATABLE PUMPKIN FACING I-64 FOR THE TAUBMAN OUTLET MALL BUT TWO PUMPKIN SIGNS ARE OKAYED:

If you remember from our newsletter two weeks ago the Chesterfield Planning Commission gave permission for the Taubman Outlet Mall to have two inflatable pumpkins and two temporary signs promoting a pumpkin patch and starting November 1 promoting Christmas Trees.

It was all approved, but Ward-4 Councilwoman Michelle Ohley requested a Power of Review and at the Planning and Public Works Committee meeting the Planning Commission approved signage was voted down 3-0.

Taubman was back on October 16 with just 15 days and two weekends before Halloween. They thought they had a deal for an inflatable pumpkin at the east end of the property for westbound I-64 traffic to see and two temporary signs.

The council voted for no inflatable pumpkins facing I-64 but they could have one at the event site of the pumpkin patch. They also get to put holiday or Christmas decorations up from November 1 to January 1 when they must be removed.

Finally they got the two temporary signs they wanted on a very close vote.



The pumpkin can be at the pumpkin patch only and not facing the road and the sign is allowed.

Here is some of the discussion:



Barry Flachsbart: In the history of the council we have stringently opposed any attention getting devices.



Dan Hurt: We, the council, need to do this (allow temp signs) overall and not just one at a time.



Michelle Ohley: What is the superior design? (Claimed by Taubman in a filing for the temporary signs and not answered at the Planning and P-W Committee meeting and again not answered at the Council meeting.)

Mayor Bob Nation: The new signage ordinance allows temporary signs. It is like you did not read it. It is like Nancy Pelosi saying pass it now and then go back and look at what it (bill) says.



Mike Doster (lawyer for Taubman Outlet Mall): I have a hard time seeing how this does not benefit all of us. It brings people to the mall. More shoppers means more tax revenue. Give us a chance to see if this works, Call it an experiment.



Ben Keathley: I see a company trying to take back the pumpkin business. I think they deserve a chance to be successful.

THE VOTE: It was for the two temporary signs. It passed 4-3 Tom DeCampi was absent from the the meeting.

They raided his condo at 14522 Bantry Lane, Chesterfield just off of Clayton and just west of Town and Country on November 9, 2016. 11-months later after lab tests were returned charges were finally filed against Ronald Zuroweste, 45, who was an all purpose drug dealer.

- Count: 05 POSSESSION OF CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE - CLASS C FELONY

The facts supporting this belief are as follows: Officer executed a search warrant at defendant's residence. Search of the residence revealed a substance believed to be marijuana, a substance believed to be methamphetamine, a substance believed to be LSD and a substance believed to be hallucinogenic mushrooms. Defendant admitted ownership of all the items and stated he sells marijuana. Lab confirmed substance to be marijuana, THC, psilocyn, salvinorin A, and methamphetamine.

20-YEAR-OLD CHESTERFIELD WOMAN ARRESTED BY HIGHWAY PATROL FOR MARIJUANA POSSESSION: On Saturday October 14, 2017 at 5:48 PM the Missouri Highway Patrol reported that they arrested Jessica Burleski, 20 of 339 Chesterfield

Oaks Dr Chesterfield in Montgomery County, Missouri (I-70) for Possession of Marijuana and Drug Paraphernalia. She was released on summons from the Montgomery County jail.

Jessica studied Criminal Justice at Lindenwood University and is now studying Criminal Psychology at Columbia college in Columbia, Missouri. I hope she took advantage of the situation and quizzed the Trooper.

One of Burleski's more recent quotes on her facebook page is "This truly captures how I feel about responsibility in my twenties. **I DIDN'T ASK TO BE BORN.**"

This was the second time Burleski has been stopped by the Highway Patrol. On June 4, 2016 she was cited for speeding by a trooper out of Rolla (I-44).

PERSON WHO WORKS IN CHESTERFIELD MALL STEALS A CELL PHONE LEFT IN A BATHROOM STALL BY A HOUSEKEEPING EMPLOYEE, THEN FIGHTS OFFICER AND RESISTS ARREST: The phone belongs to a housekeeping employee of Chesterfield Mall who set it down on a toilet paper roll while she cleaned a stall on Friday November 25, 2016. She forgot about the phone when she left. When she noticed it missing she returned to the bathroom and found it gone.

She left the bathroom and was contacted by another employee at a Mall store asking if she was missing a cell phone. That person entered the stall, saw the phone and then chose another stall thinking the owner would be back for the cell phone while she was using the toilet.

When leaving the restroom she saw a Black/Female with red dreadlocks and wearing a Great Wraps shirt walk out of the bathroom with the cell phone.

The victim went home without the phone and the next day reported the theft to her boss. They in turn went to Great Wraps in the Food Court and learned that the person matching the description was Arthenna Yvonne Brooks. Brooks, 22, was due in at 11 o'clock. The victim and her boss went to Great Wraps at 1 PM at which time Brooks gave her the phone back, but it was missing the pick case and the SIM card making the phone non functional. Brooks said she had the SIM card at her home.

The boss and the victim went to the Mall Security Office and the police were called. Officer Pousson responded.

Brooks was now called to the security office and when she showed up she seemed surprised that a police officer was there. Brooks told the officer that she didn't know where the SIM card was. Officer Pousson asked why she took it out of the phone. This is from his police report:

Brook became visibly angry in her facial expression and in a loud voice said "I already told you". I told Brooks she didn't tell me and asked her again why she took the sim card out of the phone. Brooks turned her back to me and started to walk out of the office. I told Brooks to stop but she did not. I put my left hand on Brooks left forearm and told her to stop again but Brooks forcefully pulled her left arm forward pulling her arm from my grasp. Brooks continued walking away from me. I told Brooks she was under arrest for Stealing and to stop. I put both of the hands on her left arm and Brooks tried to pull away from me again but was unable to. Brooks began yelling and cursing at me to let her go. She continued to try and pull away from me. Brooks refused to comply with all my commands to stop resisting. I made two attempts to put Brooks left hand on the small of her back while giving her commands to so. Each time I tried to put a handcuff on she pulled her left hand to the front of her body. I asked K█████g to assist me in putting Brooks hands behind her back. K█████ walked to the front of the security desk and took hold of both of Brooks hands. He placed both of her hands on the small of her back and I was able to put handcuffs on Brooks. The handcuffs were double locked and checked for proper fit. Brooks continued to yell and curse. Brooks was trying to pull her hands out of the handcuffs and twisting her hands back and forth in the handcuffs. I told her to stop pulling against the handcuffs several times but she did not comply. I

While claiming the SIM card to the stolen phone must have been at her house. However it was located at the Chesterfield Police Station while Brooks was being processed when an officer searched her fanny pack.

Mall security video recordings were checked and Brooks was seen leaving the at close with the phone and with a White/Male

While the phone was valued at \$800 the County prosecutor's office refused to issue a felony charge. Instead a city ordinance violation was issued.



OUTCOME: On 07/18/17 Brooks apparently without a lawyer pled guilty to stealing at the Chesterfield Municipal Court. She was fined \$173.50 and with court costs of \$26.50 she owed \$200.

Brooks only other record was that she was cited by St. Louis Police for riding the Metro Link train without a fare card.

10 YEARS AFTER THE COOKIE THORTON MASSACRE AT A KIRKWOOD CITY COUNCIL MEETING CHESTERFIELD TO GET METAL DETECTORS FOR CITY COUNCIL CHAMBERS. Below is a report from Chesterfield City Administrator Mike Geisel on buying two metal detectors for not more than \$8,000 for the Council Chambers. This move comes 10 and a half years after disgruntled Kirkwood resident

Cookie Thorton disarmed a police officer shooting and killing him and another officer then shot up the dais killing a city department head, a councilperson and the mayor who died 18 months later of his wounds.

CITY ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

As directed by the City Council and in accordance with the City's security plans, the Police Department researched and sought bids for the purchase of metal detectors to be placed at the entry to the Council Chambers. I concur with the recommendation of the Police Department in recommending purchase of two metal detectors from Ed Roehr Safety Products at a cost not to exceed \$8,000, which is to be funded by a transfer from General Fund – Fund Reserves. This purchase will be the final expense related to the initially recommended security enhancements.

Please note that policies related to the use and function of the metal detectors are to be discussed separately during closed session. For security reasons, said policies will not be discussed herein.

I was told that once operational the metal detectors will first be used for Municipal Court.

Town and Country installed metal detectors within months of the Kirkwood City Hall massacre. It was probably a very good idea at the time because "Deer Lovers" were loudly in opposition to the city's plan to hire sharpshooters and kill hundreds of deer inside the city limits. It was not a far stretch to imagine a "deer lover" shooting city officials to save the lives of some deer.

Town and Country has an off-duty police officer manning the metal detectors for Board of Aldermen meetings, Board of Adjustment Meetings, Planning and Zoning meetings and municipal court. The metal detector is there and people are checked anytime there is a meeting or court when a decision could anger someone.

TDD BOARD NOT PAYING FOR SPECIAL ELECTION, THE CHESTERFIELD

HOCKEY ASSOCIATION IS: This is a technical issue only. The Chesterfield Hockey Association wants to continue the 3/8-cent TDD sales tax in Chesterfield Valley to help them with building a two rink facility on the west end of Chesterfield Airport Road.


There is currently a mail-in election to approve extending the sales tax that had originally been promised to end no later than 2031 and probably according to sales projections end as early as 2025. The shoppers in the area and residents of the TDD District had been promised the tax would end.

The Hockey Association wants to continue the tax 15 years past its promised end date.

On Monday October 16 after the Chesterfield City Council I asked Chesterfield City Administrator and TDD Board chairman Mike Geisel if the Hockey Association was paying for the special mail-in ballot TDD election that was just underway through the first week of November or if the TDD paid for it.

Mike said the TDD had to pay for it and the Hockey Association sent a check to the TDD. He added that he did not think the Board of Elections had billed them yet.

We obtained a copy of the check and Mike was wrong. Clearly the Hockey Association paid for the election directly.

Well, under the guises of you learn something everyday...

CHA did in fact, pay the TDD the sum of \$25,000 to cover any\all costs related to the CHA project proposal. That would, normally include the election board costs.

However, I've now learned that the legal expenses related to CHA project, had virtually consumed the full \$25,000 deposit payment and rather than have the TDD ask the CHA to send in additional funds, they were asked to simply pay this bill directly.

So, the long answer is that CHA did deposit \$25,000 to cover expenses. However, the expenses ultimately exceeded the initial deposit and they just paid that bill directly.

I was unaware of that until today...

Again this is a technical issue only. You would expect the Hockey Association to front the money since they want \$7,000,000 in TDD generated sales tax money. But the TDD board probably should have paid the Election Board making it a government to government transaction instead of a special interest organization who would benefit from the new tax.




They subtly pushed their agenda. They then broke out into five groups to discuss advantages and disadvantages of merging the city and the county. The problem was


the noise level from the overflow crowd made it impossible to hear anything 10 feet away from you.


