**TOWN AND COUNTRY 18-YEAR-OLD CHARGED WITH ARMED ROBBERY:** Alex Matukin, 18, of 1515 Topping Road was charged with Armed Robbery and Armed Criminal Action by the County Police for an incident that occurred on August 2 at a Club Fitness at 4438 Lemay Ferry Road.

Matukin is alleged to have held a gun against the victim's head while taking his car keys, cell phone and wallet. The victim is 17-years old and attends Mehlville High School.



Charging documents used Matukin's former address in Oakville. The family has lived in Town and Country since 2016. A Vietnamese family is listed as the owner of their former house in Oakville. Matukin gave the Topping Road address when booked.

Here is the Probable Cause Statement from the official court charging documents:

I, Stephen Snyder, DSN 4680, St. Louis County Police Department, knowing that false statements on this form are punishable by law, state that the facts contained herein are true. I have probable cause to believe that on August 2, 2018, at 4438 Lemay Ferry Rd, St. Louis County, Mo, Alex Matukin, White, Male, DOB 09/14/2000, 5'09", 160lbs, committed one or more criminal offense(s).

Count: 01        ROBBERY - 1ST DEGREE - CLASS A FELONY

Count: 02        ARMED CRIMINAL ACTION - CLASS U FELONY

The facts supporting this belief are as follows:

Victim and defendant got into a short verbal argument. Defendant pointed a gun at victim's head and took victim's key's, wallet, and cell phone. Victim can identify defendant as the subject who pointed a gun at his head. Witnesses observed defendant point a gun at victim's head. Witnesses can identify defendant as the subject who pointed a gun a victim's head.

Besides armed robbery Alex has three traffic charges pending. On 03/03/18 he was cited by the County Police for Speeding 26mph over limit, Following Too Closely and Improper Lane Usage. Those cases are pending. Alex's facebook page is full of him with fast cars.

On court bond documents Alex Matukin is now listed as an employee of one of the trucking companies.

**CHESTERFIELD CRIME CONTINUES TO BE LESS THAN IN 2017:** Most major crime in Chesterfield continues to be down compared to 2017. Rape and sex offenses are down. Robberies are way down with two so far this year versus nine last year. Larcenies are down. Assaults are off despite Harpo's Bar still being open. There have been only 25 residential burglaries this year compared to 30 in 2017. Business burglaries are another story. They are the first crime on the plus side this year with 28 while there were only 16 through the first 10 months in 2017. However Parking Violations are up, 119-to111.



**WHY DOES TOWN AND COUNTRY FORCE RESIDENTS TO GO TO CITY HALL INSTEAD OF VIEWING PROPESED CONSTRUCTION IN THEIR NEIGHBORHOODS ONLINE?** When there is new construction or a planned house with hearings before the Planning Commission, Architecture Review Board or Board of Adjustment neighboring residents will receive a letter like the one below from Services Director/Public Works Director Craig Wilde telling them they can come to City Hall and look at the plans.

The only problem is that lots of people are working all day and/or having duties dealing with kids and can't make it to city hall.



I asked Wilde why they don't just put the plans online on the City's website so residents can view them at their convenience after the City Hall is closed.

Craig said the problem is that some plans are not easy to turn into PDFs to place on the city's website. My response to that is the City needs to require developer to submit plans that are compatible with posting on the city's website.

This is another case that is somewhat unique to Town and Country where the developers are held in a higher standing than the residents.

**TOWN SQUARE:** Originally the Town Square project was supposed to be done with a ribbon cutting toward the end of 2018. With 11-Change Orders and \$3,000,000 more to be spent that date has been pushed further and further back.


Last week Clayton Road was reduced to one lane of traffic for more work on the tunnel from the north side of Clayton Road to the Town Square. This is the third time Clayton Road has had prolonged lane closures. Here are two photos from November 8.



**HONEYSUCKLE AN IMPROVEMENT AT THE PARK:** In the fall of 2017 we went of Longview Farm Park and took photos of how Honeysuckle had taken over the park. We even suggested renaming the park “Honeysuckle Park.” Below are two photos of October of 2017.



The below foot bridge you should be able to see a creek and a large pond. In 2017 all you saw was Honeysuckle.



In 2018 the City spent close to \$9,000 to have a contractor come in and remove SOME Honeysuckle. You could see an improvement, but more needs to be done.





The below photo shows an area in 2018 that still needs some work.



The City only used a contractor in 2018. The City's Parks employee did not remove any Honeysuckle. Early December would be an excellent time for staffers to remove some more as other plants have lost their leaves but Honeysuckles are still green for a while longer, making them easy to spot and remove.

**SPEAKING OF HONEYSUCKLE!** The City is paying the Bob Brinkman Construction Company to remove Honeysuckle around the Town Square Project under construction. The City removed Honeysuckle in Drace Park last year and removed some in Longview Park this year.

Perhaps they could make one of the city's busier intersections a little safer by removing Honeysuckle from the southwest corner of Mason Road and Clayton Road intersection and improve the sight lines for motorists.



**IT WILL BE A LONG WINTER ALONG MASON ROAD:** The Mason Road “Trail” (wide sidewalk) project is still without a permit from the St. Louis County Highway Department and there is no date when the project might restart. It started in late September and then abruptly was brought to a stop by the St. Louis County Highway Department.

Who is to blame? Certainly the contractor, T. Hill Construction, is at the top of the list, but not far behind is the Town and Country staff under services/Public Works Director Craig Wilde. Getting a required permit and verifying that one was obtained would be top priorities in most cities for similar projects before work starts, but not in Town and Country. You might think that creating such an eyesore and dangerous condition that T. Hill Construction would be suspended from city projects and contracts for a while. If you thought that you would be wrong. The city just awarded T. Hill a contract for snow removal this winter and they are about to get a City contract for “On-Call” road repairs.

Since this project is part of a Municipal Parks Grant it is supposed to be completed by the end of 2018. That does not look like it will happen. The County wants the section of sidewalks returned to ADA Compliance before a permit is issued. With winter setting in and Christmas approaching I wonder if the city will spend money to decorate the bobcat front loader, left where a sidewalk used to be along with the building materials.






Maybe they could put a Santa in the Bobcat.



Will the City of Town and Country agree to pay hospital bills for joggers and walkers hit by cars having to go in the street where a sidewalk was or will the alderpersons who voted for this (the two Ward-2 alderwomen voted against it) have to pay? The work was stopped on October 8 and is now in its second month.

**MASON ROAD CRASH UPDATE:** If you recall last week we ran this photo concerning a car crash into the Lochinvar subdivision fence. The crash happened at 7:58 AM Tuesday November 6. It involved a single car, a 2008 Honda Fit operated by Georgia Park of Ballwin (car is registered to Park at a Kirkwood address).





This is from the police report:

Driver #1 said she was travelling northbound on Mason Road when she heard a "click" noise and her vehicle started to pull to the left. Driver #1 further said after her vehicle pulled to the left she turned her steering wheel to the right and started to skid/slide and ultimately drove off the roadway over grass and struck a small section of fencing.

**TWO REQUESTS TO FIND OUT ABOUT MASON ROAD PROJECT: MAYOR DALTON REFUSES TO LET STAFF TALK AT MEETING:** My wife for a number of years as a home office claims examiner for a very large insurance company handled million dollar claims against cities and contractors with performance bond insurance for government projects. She knows about liability claims against cities in connection with construction projects.

She spoke first during the citizen comment section of the Board of Aldermen meeting on 11/13/18. She first said for over a month she has seen large “Men Working Signs” on Mason road and has not seen any men working.



Next she talk about leaving the equipment out on the edge of the road by subdivisions and asked how long before children started to play on it and the other materials by the contractor.



Finally she asked for a report on the status of the Mason Road project.

Next the regular meeting started and during the aldermanic comment section Ald. Lindsey Butler also asked for the staff (Public Works Director Craig Wilde) to give a verbal report on liability issues and an update on the status of the sidewalk “trail” project that has stopped on Mason Road.

Mayor Dalton demanded that Butler direct all questions to him. Wilde stated they would begin removing material and equipment from the site the next day. The next day

(Wednesday) T. Hill Construction was filling in the trenches they created to avoid liability issues but had not resumed actual construction.

Dalton refused to allow Wilde to give a brief verbal report on why the project stopped and how long it would be before it would start again.

**REQUEST TO AUDIT PUBLIC WORKS PROJECTS RESULTS IN DEBATE AND A CONTINUANCE AS MAYOR SAYS HE IS AGAINST IT.** Ald. Dr. Matt Reuter had a resolution at the last Board of Aldermen meeting to place RFP (request for proposals) to audit the Public Works Department and public works projects.

It isn't The Mayor's Meeting, but the Board of Aldermen meeting. That did not stop Mayor Jon Dalton in coming out loudly against it. An audit of some of the pet projects and the grossly over budget Town Square project could be embarrassing for Dalton.

"I want to know more about it. I recommend the Board continue this."

Reuter pointed out that the RFP would not cost the city anything and the city could learn what was needed or what experts think should be audited, since the Public Works Department and projects have never been audited.

"The idea is to gain information. I'm not asking for funding at this time," said Reuter. "Let the companies tell us what they can do for us."

Dalton shot back.

“Putting out a RFP doesn’t make it an ill conceived project.” Said Dalton, who appeared to be worried what an audit might find.

This initial back and forth was in the pre-meeting Work Session meeting. Similar comments were made in the regular meeting. Reuter, Tiffany Frautschi and Lindsey Butler wanted the resolution to go through and voted against the continuance. The other four members present voted to continue it.

**DEER MANAGEMENT FUNDING IN THE ROAD FUND BUDGET VIOLATES CITY POLICY. THE MAYOR DOES NOT CARE!** Violate away! Here is the city’s policy concerning what projects the Road Fund’s budget is to be spent on.

### **ROAD FUND**

The Road Fund is a restricted fund used to account for financial resources to be used for the improvement, repair, maintenance and control of public roads, streets, and bridges within the City. Road Fund revenues consist of road & bridge tax receipts, grant moneys received, interest earned on its fund balance and any transfers received from other city funds.

Road Fund moneys may be spent on the improvement, repair, maintenance, and control of public roads, streets and bridges within the city limits, and the salaries and related benefits of city employees that pertain to road or street construction, improvements, repair, renovation, maintenance or operation.

Nowhere in the policy statement is there anything about culling deer herds. Sure you could argue that deer being hit by vehicle make the road dangerous. But in reality Deer Management comes under the General Fund as it is a public safety matter, like the police writing speeding tickets and arresting drunk drivers.

Mayor Dalton continues to try and hide expenditures so he can brag about having a balanced General Fund Budget. He is in fact lying to the public.

Ald. Lindsey Butler brought this up on at the Aldermanic meetings on Tuesday 11/13/18. She reported in 2018 both the Deer management budget and the City Beautification Grants were shifted from the General Fund to the Roads Fund, where per city policy they don't belong.

For 10 years Mayor Jon Dalton had deer management in the General Fund where it belongs. The killing of mosquitoes is still in the General Fund with \$6,000 budgeted but killing of deer has been moved to the Road Fund where by policy it doesn't belong.

In the 2019 Budget under Road Fund, Deer Management is listed at \$82,822, It shows that in 2018 it was \$234,000. Then it shows ZEROS for 2016 and 2017. That is a lie. \$104,110 was budgeted in 2017 and \$79,380 in 2016, but it was in the General Fund where it belonged, but the current budget document ignores it existed as it is not for those years listed on the Road Fund page.

**The Problem:** Other than Ald. Lindsey Butler no elected official is pointing out this scam. Elected officials need to vote NO on this budget until "deer management" and Beautification Grants are put back in the General Fund where they belong. Staff employees are in a bad position with a mayor tries to hide numbers, but at least they should be reporting the numbers are in violation of policy.

The car was totaled after leaving the road and crashing. The 14-year-old passenger was injred and transported to a hospital in Clarinda, Iowa.

**CHESTERFIELD DILEMMA IN THE POOL SALES TAX CASE:** Chesterfield has a serious dilemma in the event they win the case against the St. Louis County Sales Tax Pool before the Missouri Supreme Court. Since no other county in Missouri has a sales tax pool to be shared among cities Chesterfield is hoping that the Sales Tax Pool will be declared unconstitutional by the courts. Chesterfield has gotten about 43% of the 1-cent sales tax generated at Chesterfield stores. That went up to 52% in 2018. However they want to keep it all like cities could did prior to 1983 in St. Louis County and all the cities outside of St. Louis County currently do.

**The Problem if they win:**

- 1) If the Court rules in Chesterfield's favor and eliminates the pool tax, the city would have to put the 1-cent sales tax back on the ballot in April or August for approval. The City would have to use budget reserves to bridge the period with no taxes collected.
- 2) If the voters turned down the 1-cent municipal sales tax, suddenly instead of 52% of the tax generated Chesterfield would get ZERO.

**The problem if they lose:** The City will have spent a large amount of money on lawyers to take the case through the courts to the Supreme Court.



**FELONY CHESTERFIELD SHOPLIFTER WHO DID ONE-YEAR IN JAIL FOR SHOPLIFTING AND ASSAULTING A POLICE OFFICER, RETURNED TO CHESTERFIELD TO STEAL AGAIN AND NOW IS A NO-SHOW IN COURT:** We have written about Kathryn Love twice before. On June 18, 2016 she and her sister had shoplifted a large amount of items from the Gap store at the Taubman Outlet Mall

When Officer David Krumm of the Chesterfield Police Retail Security Unit responded and stopped Love she resisted arrest. She then ordered her sister to spray Officer Krumm with mace.

They were both arrested. Love was charged with Assaulting a Police Officer (Felony), Felony Stealing and Resisting Arrest (felony). At the time of her arrest Love had several different drugs in her purse and said she resisted arrest because she didn't want to get "dope sick" in jail.

Her bond was set at \$25,000 and she never made bail. On October 27, 2016 she pled guilty and was sentenced by Judge Michael Jamison to 1-year in jail on all charges and a stealing charge filed by the County Police in May of 2016.

Upon release from jail she returned to Chesterfield and on January 25, 2018 she was on video stealing \$1,199 worth of sunglasses from the Sak's Off Fifth Avenue store in the Premium Outlet Mall. When she was arrested she admitted the theft and said she was high on heroin at the time of the theft.

She appeared before former Chesterfield City Attorney Rob Heggie, who ignored her past record and sentences, set her bond at \$7,500 but allowed only \$750 to be posted. Love was bailed out of jail.

On October 10 Love failed to appear in court. (There is a shock.) Heggie then issued a warrant with "No Bond." In as much as Love has used 38 different aliases she is likely to evade arrest until she is taken into custody and fingerprinted for a new crime.

**MORE ATTORNEY CONFLICTS:** Chesterfield Chris Graville is still working for both sides. He is working for the people in Chesterfield. In Clarkson Valley and Ballwin he is

the municipal prosecutor where he reduces thousands of serious moving violations to “parking violations” if the dangerous driver hires a local attorney. He is also representing criminals. The most recent one we ran across is Peter Razny.

Razny lives at 65 Forest Crest Drive, just to the north of Parkway Central High School.

On 11/16/16 the Maryland Heights Police arrested Razny on 2-counts Felony Drug Possession (not marijuana).

On 5/13/17 he was charged with six counts of Possession of Controlled Substances (not marijuana). This was in connection to drug sales as the County Police seized \$2,800 from Razny in connection to drug sales. A year later on 05/31/18 Razny pled guilty to all charges and was placed on a 5-year SIS, No Jail, No Fine and No Record is probation is completed.

However, on 11/07/18 an arrest warrant was issued for Razny for Probation Violation. He was arrested on November 9, 2018.

So Graville joins the likes of Chesterfield prosecutor and Creve Coeur judge Tim Englemeyer and Rick Brunk the Chesterfield and Wildwood judge in allegedly working for the safety of the people of West St. Louis County but representing criminals from the same area and reducing almost all charges of defendants who hire local lawyers.

**NEIL BRUNTRAGER** has just been named the City Attorney of Webster Groves. Here is the problem with that: As city attorney Bruntrager will have to deal with labor issues for the city and liability issues. The largest number of employees in Webster Groves is the police department with 46 officers.

Bruntrager is the attorney for the St. Louis Police Officer's association. His firm also represents individual police officers facing disciplinary action. His firm also represents fire districts and union firefighters. His firm also advertises handling criminal and DWI defense work. How is a city well represented by a lawyer with this many conflicts of interest?

Bruntrager's partner is Charles Billings. Billings is the municipal judge in Des Peres, Fenton and Overland. How can someone who does and advertises from criminal and DWI defense work be a fair and impartial judge looking out for the safety of the public? They can't! They are looking out after the welfare of fellow local lawyers!

It used to be municipalities had civil attorneys as city attorneys and judges. They did not have conflicts of interests. Those days are long gone. Local elected officials refuse to return to the fair and impartial days.

**FOLLOW THE MONEY:** Instead of listing all the contributors over \$500 or \$1000 to local incumbent candidates for state office we have broke it down a little differently.

**Dean Plocher** (the former Municipal Judge of Pine Lawn, one of the most corrupt courts in Missouri) District 89 State Rep serving parts of or all of Des Peres, Town and Country, Frontenac, Chesterfield, Huntleigh, Kirkwood and Ladue.



2018 so far Plocher has raised more than \$60,000. He had the fewest in-district contributions of any West County State Rep candidate.

Most money came from Political Action Committees, corporations, special interests or lobbyists.

Here are a few that caught our eyes:

**Missouri Pork Association** 2-Contributions (Smithfield Farms, a Chinese owned company that has two huge pig farms in Missouri that have been polluting neighboring small farmers with hog waste run off, got legislators to pass a bill that allows neighboring property owners to sue them just one time for damages.)

**Cigarette Companies;** 2-contributions from 2-different companies: Missouri has the lowest cigarette tax in the nation.

**1 Gambling Company.**

**Derek Grier** State Rep District 100 serving parts of Chesterfield, Town and Country and Ballwin. Grier raised \$56,322 so far in 2018. He won reelection with 56% of the vote. Grier accepted 129 contributions from outside of his district with 19 contributions being from outside of the State of Missouri. He accepted 41 contributions from within his district.

Grier is a member of the Christian Science Church and a graduate of Principia College. Members of the dwindling Christian Science Church do not believe in medicine or doctors. However Grier accepted numerous contributions from medical PACs and pharmaceutical PACs. Members of the Christian Science Church also do not believe in use of tobacco products. **Grier accepted two contributions from cigarette manufacturers.** Missouri has the lowest cigarette taxes in the nation. He also accepted a contribution from the owners of a gambling casino.

**Bruce DeGroot** State Rep District 101 DeGroot won with 65% of the vote. His district covers parts of Chesterfield, Wildwood, Clarkson Valley and Ellisville.

DeGroot accepted \$2,000 in contributions from one tobacco company. He accepted seven contributions from out of state insurance companies and two more from insurance PACs.

**Tim Fitch: County Council District 3.** The former St. Louis County Police Chief, who many believed was forced to retired by then County Exec Charlie Dooley, won the raced


for County Council over Paul Ward with 54% of the vote. Fitch's area was huge going from Fenton and including Manchester, parts of Ballwin, Town and Country, Des Peres, Chesterfield, Creve Coeur, Kirkwood, Valley Park and South County. He replaced former Town and Country alderwoman Colleen Wassinger, who decided not to run for another term on the County Council. Wassinger currently lives in the Village of Huntleigh.



Fitch did not accept any outside funds and only used \$6,000 of his own money for mailings and handouts. The only negative I found is that Fitch's campaign treasurer was former County Police Chief Gil Kleinknecht. During Kleinknecht's rein as chief under Gene McNary, he talked down about municipal governments and police departments. He put logos claiming "The Proud Ones" on the sides of patrol cars which was a clear shot at municipal departments. As soon as Kleinknecht left town those decals vanished and cold relations began to thaw.

**FATAL TRUCK CRASH AND BLAZE CLOSES I-64** A brand new 2019 Freightliner tractor trailer being driven by Darrell Stewart, 29, of Greensboro, NC was eastbound on I-64 in Chesterfield Valley when Stewart drifted onto the should at struck a parked 2015 Volvo tractor trailer and then burst into flames killing Stewart. The crash happened at 4:38AM on Tuesday November 13. It closed eastbound I-64 for 12 hours.

The Volvo truck was operated by Jermaine Johnson, 34, of St. Louis. Johnson pulled his truck off the road due to a mechanical problem and had flashers working and had put out reflective warning signs on the shoulder behind the truck.


**RESTAURANT REVIEW: THE BIG SKY** The Webster Groves restaurant on Old Orchard across the street from the Highway 61 Roadhouse is an awful place for a meat and potato fan, but apparently a nice place for those who like something different, like my wife.

We ate there one evening about six years ago and it was a pleasant dinner with prices on the medium-high range. We returned for lunch on Friday November 2. Keep in mind that I'm a meat and potatoes guy, while my wife likes something different.



I noticed going in that the concrete steps were cracked and sections chipping off. This gave me the thought that maybe profits haven't been that great.

The Big Sky Café is open for lunch from 11 to 2 and then for dinner. We were there for lunch on a Friday so I thought it would be busy. I was very wrong.

The first thing this meat and potato guy noticed was there were 5 different burgers on the menu. None were a regular burger or cheeseburger. We asked our waiter if we could get a cheeseburger with a slice of American or Cedar Cheese. We were told that was not possible.

He is what was on the menu for a burger, two did not feature beef:

Blue Cheese Burger \$12.50  
Quinoa and Lentil Burger \$12.90  
Smoked mushrooms, fentina cheese, harissa aioli \$12.90  
Salmon Burger \$13.50  
Gruyere Burger \$12.90

It made me want to quick drive down I-44 to O'Connell's Pub.

We decided to make two orders and share them.

**Pan Roasted Rainbow Trout**

*fresh spinach, grape tomatoes, crumbled  
LaClare Creamery goat cheese and smoked  
Anjou pear sherry vinaigrette 12.50 ©*

**Rosemary & Red Wine Braised Pot Roast**

*naturally raised beef chuck roast slowly braised  
in red wine, rosemary, carrots, onions and celery,  
served with smoked gouda polenta 11.90 ©*



I'm used to trout coming out of the pan with some potatoes on the side, not on a bed of unknown green leafs. Even my wife, who likes something "different" had to admit that what was missing was the "trout taste." If you were lucky enough to find a piece that was all fish it was still missing "fish flavor."



I also hated the Pot Roast. I found part of the meat was tender, but part of it was tough to chew.

However, my wife liked the sauce so much she went to the store and the next day in our kitchen she tried make something similar using a recipe from Parade Magazine. On Saturday night we had a similar pot roast. I ate the meat and our security agent seemed to enjoy the sauce.

My wife might return to the Big Sky but it will be with her monthly lunch bunch buddies and not with me.

**STILL A FUN PLACE TO GO:** We did a favorable review of the Picadilly at Manhattan Restaurant in Maplewood sometime ago. We continue to go back every five or six months.



The building has been around 100 years. It used to be a corner tavern in an all residential area. It is now a restaurant with a bar.

Here is a late lunch from last week:

At a table of four, two had the short rib beef pot pie, one had the chicken pot pie and I had the half order of ribs.



“This pot pie is like having Thanksgiving dinner in a dish,” was the comment from a pot pie customer and the other two agreed.

While I’m a Baby Back ribs that fall off the bone fan, the standard ribs were in a smoker on the parking lot. As you can see you did not get cheated on meat.




Vera Lynn circa 1942






