TOWN AND COUNTRY DEER CULL AND CHESTERFIELD DEER CENSUS: White Buffalo is back and is again culling (killing deer) using bait stations in all four wards in Town and Country. Their contract is to kill up to 150 deer for 2019. After about two weeks here are the stats through Tuesday February 4, 2019:

Ward 1: 7

Ward 2: 63

Ward 3: 42

Ward 4: 16

Total: 128

Wards 2 and 3 abut Queeny Park where St. Louis County has refused to cull its deer herd with deer spreading into Wards 2 and 3. The Town and Country deer problems might be more manageable if the County would do something about the Queeny Park deer over-population.

CENSUS WITH DEER IS NOT EVERY 10 YEARS BUT EVERY YEAR: White Buffalo will be doing another deer census in Town and Country. They did one in Chesterfield last year. However to save money Chesterfield had police officers complete a deer census this year. They are done, however the city will not be releasing information concerning the census until the end of February or the first week in March.

BETTER TOGETHER; SINGULAR VOICE OR VOICE OF EACH ELECTED OFFICIAL: At the end of the Monday February 4 City Council Agenda Review Meeting, Mayor Bob Nation made an interesting statement.

ANOTHER NIGHT OF BETTER-TOGETHER AT CHESTERFIELD CITY COUNCIL MEETING. There was a line of people wanting to speak on the pros and mostly the cons of the Better-Together Merger Plan that would wipe out local government in St. Louis County. Here is how things went:

AT THE WRONG GOVERNMENT MEETING? Dr. Hashim Raza spoke early on in the meeting. He gave his address as 1728 Stiffel Lane. After the meeting I asked him where he practices and he said Missouri Baptist Hospital. Both his house and his place of work are in Town and Country! However, he just recently moved to Town and Country from Chesterfield.

“We are all one region. When I look at St. Louis we have a negative outlook. If we take care of the whole body we will give better service,” he said.

Dr. Raza went on to say how he lived in Washington, DC for two years and it was much better than St. Louis, even after he called it a swamp.



I lived in the immediate Washington, DC for 16 years and fled back to St. Louis to escape the traffic, crime and bad government. I was the assistant police chief in Chevy Chase Village, the wealthiest per capita city in Maryland and dealt with law enforcement in DC on a daily basis since Chevy Chase bordered DC.

In Dr. Raza's praise for "one government DC" he forgot to mention all the uniformed police departments. Here are some of them:

- 1) The Washington Metropolitan Police
- 2) Uniform Division of the Secret Service (with jurisdiction city wide)
- 3) U.S. Park Police (jurisdiction include all of the DC Mall and all parks)
- 4) Metro Transit Police (jurisdiction includes all subway stations, buses and bus stops)
- 5) District of Columbia Housing Authority Police
- 7) Library of Congress Police
- 8) Supreme Court Police
- 9) Capital Police (jurisdiction includes large areas blocks from the Capital where members of Congress may live or eat)
- 10) National Zoo Police
- 11) Smithsonian Police
- 12) Amtrak Police
- 13) Bureau of Engraving Police
- 14) Federal Protective Service Police (jurisdiction around all Federal buildings)
- 15) Government Printing Office Police
- 16) Naval Police (civilian police force on U.S. Navy property)
- 17) George Washington University Police
- 18) Georgetown University Police

- 19) Howard University Police
- 20) FBI Protective Uniform Police
- 21) American University Police Department

These are just uniform police departments. There are still plain clothes FBI, Secret Service, ATF, IRS, Health & Human Services agents and U.S. Marshals. DC is anything but one mega government. There are even more uniform Federal Police agencies in the suburban counties around DC.

To the east is Prince George's County where there are 27 municipalities. Driving along the area that borders D.C. is like a trip down Natural Bridge Road, as most cities have almost 100% minority populations, their own police forces, high crime rates and low incomes. For every Pine Lawn, Wellston and Hillside in St. Louis County there is a District Heights, Capital Heights, Seat Pleasant and Cottage City in Prince George's County. There are more cities (many higher-end) in Virginia and in Montgomery County, Maryland next to D.C.

Dr. Raza doesn't know what he is talking about saying how Washington, DC is a model for St. Louis to follow.

Dr. Raza also used a rather bizarre example of St. Louis being a woman with a foot infection and if it is not treated the whole body becomes infected and dies. I didn't get it. Treat the foot infection (St. Louis) and leave the arms, chest and head alone. But Dr, Raza expects the rest of the body to be used to fix the foot infection.

OH I FORGOT TO MENTION: Mike Hejna, is president of the Gundaker (realty) Commercial Group. He is also a supporter of Better Together. Here are some of the reasons Hejna gave for the City-County merger and the elimination of all cities.



“We have had no growth over the last 40-years. 23 of the cities have less than 1000 population. That is smaller than some subdivisions. There are 52,000 pages of local ordinances.”

It was interesting that Hejna was the former Chairman of the Chesterfield Chamber of Commerce and now he wants to wipe Chesterfield off the map.

Hejna was just one off when he spoke of cities and villages in St. Louis County under 1,000 population. Here they are:

Bella Villa 737, Bellerive 187, Beverly Hills 559, Champ 13, Cool Valley 970, Country Life Acres (rich people) 74, Crystal Lake Park 495, Edmundson 832, Flordell Hills 805, Glen Echo Park 160, Grantwood Village 861 (the Busch family’s Grant’s Farm), Greendale 660, Huntleigh 340 (Very rich people), Kinloch 287, Norwood Court 958, Pasadena Park 456, Pasadena Hills 914, Sycamore Hills 667, Twin Oaks 393, Uplands Park 443, Westwood 278 (rich people), and Wilbur Park 471.

Here is the important thing that Hejna failed to mention: HE IS ON THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF BETTER TOGETHER!

Dr. Raza and Mr. Hejna were shoveling BULLSHIT on this evening.

HERE ARE SOME OF THE ANTI BETTER TOGETHER COMMENTS:

“I SUPPORT THE COUNCIL (Chesterfield City Council) in doing research. I found the Chesterfield municipality to be a success. I’d like to see it stay that way. I support Chesterfield becoming Chesterfield County or being part of St. Charles County,” said **Marvia Kanhe**.

“I lived in the area BEFORE IT WAS A CITY. What an improvement our city has made. No merger action! Do what you have to and use tax money to stop it. Do not hand it over to a corrupt government. We will just become their cash pail. We must stand together against Better Together or we will become a blip. Please Council how do we stop this train wreck,” asked **Marjie Saiter**.

“The beauty of St. Louis is everyone can choose a city that fits their needs. St. Louis is a failed city due to corruption. Let’s have a West County County. The guy paying for this lives outside of Folk, Missouri (Rex Sinquefield is they guy and his mailing address is actually in unincorporated Westphalia, MO). It is time for Chesterfield to get this over with (stop Better Together),” said **Dennis Ganahl**.

“Oh what a tangled web we weave when first we practice to deceive. (Sir Walter Scott. Spoken by Norm Baxter and referring to Better Together). Pay no attention to the man behind the curtain (from the Wizard of Oz, Baxter referring to Rex Sinquefeld). What is the budget for the first year of the proposed mega-city? Why do West Countians need the input from people in Springfield and St. Joseph (referring on a state wide vote to create the mega-city since it would never pass in St. Louis County), asked **Norm Baxter**.

McGuinness later sent me parts of the Better Together Plan press releases and her comments:

Page 14-15, #6 3a.....the new metro gov.." may assume any outstanding obligations related to fire protection services heretofore in City of St Louis, including payment on principal & interest on indebtedness and obligations related to employee benefits, pension, retirement and medical, life insurance...". **(Despite public assurances that the new metro gov't will leave existing fire protection districts alone, in fact they may assume all obligations of City of St. Louis fire protection, costs to be covered by County residents)**

Page 9....# 4 Paragraph B....."The Metropolitan City may assume outstanding obligations of the St Louis Municipal Corporation".....that is the new name for the City of STL. **(Despite public assurances that they will not assume city debt....again costs to be covered by County taxpayers)**

Page 7....item 9.....**muni's are required to turn all their property, contracts, records and personnel over to the metropolitan city. How is this even possible and OK to help yourself to something that is not yours. Confiscatory....no due process...shocking**

Page 6....item F..... all officials of the muni's must 'co-operate' with the transition to metropolitan city....and not frustrate its implementation.....**(everybody must fall in line....you will obey !)**

Page 9 Section 3 (3)...."following the transition, a municipal district may merge or consolidate with one or more municipal districts or may be dissolved as authorized by ordinance of the metropolitan city...".....**so if you tick them off, they will legislate you out of existence....not that cities will have much of an existence anyway**

This is not a merger...it is a hostile takeover.... Citizens will lose local governance and control of their planning and zoning, their police, their roads, their public works and their courts. All those decisions will be made in downtown STL.

The was all cooked up behind closed doors. Because this scheme was developed by a private group pushing their agenda, citizens have not been afforded the protection of the Missouri Sunshine Law.....so we could all know what was going on. Instead of seeking citizen input and feedback on their plan after presentation.....they sprung it on the public and then ran over and filed it with the Secretary of State.....everyone has had to try to catch up and absorb its implications.

Today, the Better Together Task Force is presenting a plan to bring the 'old city' and the 'old county' together into one new Metropolitan St. Louis City.

The proposal calls for combining the 88 muni's and the City and County into one new Metro St. Louis City. The new Metro St. Louis will have about the same population as Dallas – 1.3 million people. It is envisioned to have 1 police department, 1 municipal court system, and to combine most City and County departments.

You make City government work. Your hard work and dedication is the best thing about City government – our residents, businesses and I value and appreciate what you do every day!! You know firsthand how hard it can be to deliver good service – and get things done.

If this plan passes, none of you will lose your job - every City employee will become an employee of the new Metro St. Louis government. Also, importantly, you will stay in your pension system and none of your benefits will be lost.

The seat of this new government will continue to be in downtown St Louis – with some services and offices throughout the new region.

The fragmented government that we have in this region today – with 55 police departments, 80 muni courts, 88 municipalities, and dozens of economic development efforts - results in fussing and fighting as we try to compete with each other for the next new Walgreens, or who should pay for the Convention Center, or how to serve our people best.

In our hearts we know that our fragmented government does not work well for all of us. We know our communities have starkly different outcomes in life expectancy, educational attainment, and job opportunities.

I know this is not easy... Change is never easy. I know you and your families are worried... but I want to reiterate that you will keep your jobs and pensions.

I also know we can create a new Metro St. Louis, a more equitable St. Louis, with more and better opportunities for all of our kids... and grandkids.

BETTER TOGETHER FORGOT TO GET POLICE INPUT BEFORE WANTING ONE GIANT POLICE DEPARTMENT: The opening and closing paragraphs to a letter sent out by the St. Louis Area Police Chief's Association shows more problems with the Better Together proposal of getting rid of all suburban police departments and forming one giant police department.



This message is to provide the position of the more than 70 policing agencies that comprise the St. Louis Area Police Chiefs Association (SLAPCA) regarding the suggestions of Better Together to disband municipal policing as part of an initiative to merge St. Louis City and County.

The Better Together suggestion is based upon information gathered in 2014 and published in April of 2015 by the Police Executive Research Forum (PERF). It is important to note that not one police chief or command staff member from any SLAPCA member municipality was interviewed or asked for any input by Better Together. In addition, no Board Member or employee of Better Together is or has been a law enforcement officer, let alone been a commander or manager of law enforcement officers.

■ ■ ■ Better Together has ignored years of learning and improvements that Ferguson brought to St. Louis law enforcement and suggests returning to a structure that unfortunately would almost certainly result in another such crisis in this community. As such, SLAPCA stands firmly and unanimously against such unsupported suggestions and drastic unprofessional initiatives.

TOWN & COUNTRY POLICE CHIEF RESPONDS TO BETTER TOGETHER AND A KEVIN HARRIGAN COLUMN IN THE POST-DISPATCH: Chief Gary Hoelzer was none too happy with a Sunday column in the Post-Dispatch by Kevin Horrigan who in support of Better Together wanting to create a huge area police department, wiping out city police departments that have been around for as long as a 100 years. Here is part of what Horrigan wrote:

“Mayors in county municipalities wax eloquently about local pride in residents’ knowing that if a cat gets stuck in a tree, one of their lightly trained and underpaid cops will come get it down and then go back to his speed trap.”

Here is part of Hoelzer’s response to Horrigan’s column:

I am not sure who Mr. Horrigan is writing about, but it bears no resemblance to the professionalism of officers I know in Town and Country and the surrounding law enforcement community. Many of our agencies have met the highest professional standards of 21st century law enforcement, certified or accredited by the Missouri Police Chiefs Association or the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies, Inc. (CALEA). Officers throughout the metro area hold the same Class A license in the State of Missouri, which is regulated by the Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) Commission under the Missouri Department of Public Safety. All officers in the State must receive at least 24 hours of annual continuing education in the areas of legal and technical studies, firearms training, interpersonal skill development and racial profiling or bias-based policing. Officers throughout St. Louis County cross-train on responding to active killer incidents, and work side by side on the Major Case Squad and large scale incidents such as the 100th PGA Championship.

Without regard to their own safety, our officers respond to major crimes (albeit less frequently than in other parts of the metro area), remove impaired drivers from our roadways, frequently go head-to-head with wrong way drivers on the interstate, respond to hundreds of crashes on our roadways, and are trained in intervention strategies for those suffering episodes of emotional or mental crisis and who are sometimes combative or threatening suicide. Our officers have also been known to assist our more senior

community members with carrying in groceries, unlocking vehicle doors when the keys have been locked inside, enter burning houses or vehicles to rescue occupants, deliver lifesaving antidotes for those who have overdosed on heroin or opioids, or apply an AED to those suffering a heart attack. I guess we would even respond to a cat in a tree, although that sounds like a fire department call.

I was happy to see that Chief Hoelzer did refer to the PGA 100th Anniversary Championship Golf Tournament as an INCIDENT and not an event. I say this since the PGA did not repay local police departments tens of thousands of dollars in road closures, traffic direction and off site security. This was an INCIDENT since the PGA stole thousands of dollars of government service for a private event.

SECOND PRIEST AT PRIORY REMOVED FROM SCHOOL DUE TO SEX

OFFENSES: The Priory School, the most expensive Catholic School in St. Louis, has just fired a second priest in less than a year. In May of 2018 Father Maximilian Toczykowski, was removed from the Priory School and suspended from the Priesthood after obscene images were found on this lab top. The Creve Coeur Police investigated the incident, but no charges were filed.

Now on Friday February 1, Michael McCusker AKA Father John McCusker, a teacher at Priory who lives on campus was arrested for Stalking after being found hiding in bushes at a female teacher's home in Richmond Heights. Police responded after the teacher called police about a man looking into her window.

According to published reports, the teacher had filed complaints on McCusker during the school year for harassing behavior.

Besides "Stalking", McCusker was charged with resisting arrest after running from the Richmond Heights Police.

McCusker, 38, taught Theology at the school.

Greenridge Drives is located in the west end of Richmond Heights between McCutcheon and McKnight. Most of the houses on the street are ranch style houses.



On January 16, 2019 the owner, Thomas Gilliam, 38, and a clerk, Zach Perino, 28, were cited by Chesterfield Police for operating a business without a license and for selling to a minor. The store is across the street and just west of the Parkway West High School.

2) Why would the city of Chesterfield allow a business that sells a dangerous product to continue to operate without a business license and occupancy permit without having the police cite him every day he is operating and without having the city attorney take legal action to shut the business down?

3) Why aren't the Ward-3 Councilmen Dan Hurt and Mike Moore demanding the the city and police do more?



BAD GOVERNMENT WINS ON A 5-3 VOTE: We wrote last week how Chesterfield was about to keep the same auditing firm after nine years for another 3-years. We mentioned how you need to change auditors every few years for 1) a fresh set of eyes on the books and 2) to be sure the same mistake is not repeating itself or the same info is not being over looked year after year.

Voting against hiring long time city auditor Daniel Jones & Associates to audit the city's books again for the next three years were Dan Hurt, Tom DeCampi and Michele Ohley.

The "NO" votes for another 3-years of the same auditor and for good government practices:



CRICKET IS BACK BEFORE THE CITY COUNCIL: On June 20th 2016 a group of people including a number of children came to the Chesterfield City Council meeting requesting a city cricket pitch be added to other city athletic fields. The city investigated the request and estimated it would cost \$11,800 to turn a field on the wrong side of the flood wall at the Parks and Rec complex into a cricket pitch. The city would then want a \$34 user fee.



This killed the proposal and sent a group of disgruntled young cricket players away.

Now 2 ½ years later the same folks are back with a number of young cricket players who live in Chesterfield again asking for a cricket field. There is one change. It was mentioned that the residents wanting a cricket pitch may have the money to build one.

“I hope Chesterfield builds a cricket pitch. I have to practice in my driveway,” said Pooja Ganesh, a young girl who plays several sports.

“I’m really hoping we can make a cricket pitch,” said Patsh Patel.

“Our first president, George Washington played cricket. I was told we (Chesterfield Parks & Rec) don’t the money for a pitch. I can come up with the amount for a cricket pitch,” said Canesh Krishamurthy.

Now with someone willing to find the money maybe there could be a cricket pitch in Chesterfield, even if it is on the wrong side of the flood wall.

In October of 2016 a large group of young cricket players were back. The issue then was how the group did not want to be charged field rental fees of \$34. City administrator Mike Geisel said he did not see how they could not charge a fee, since the city charged a field use fee for baseball, softball, football, soccer and lacrosse fields.

Perkins was director of the St. Louis Zoo from 1962-to-1970 and was given the title Director Emeritus. He died in 1986. He lived in a large house in Clayton on Wydown Blvd. across the street from Washington University and near the St. Louis Zoo.

As a kid we all knew which house was the Perkins home and we would always look for him when we drove by as our parents took us to Forest Park.
