

**EX ALDERMAN NEWSLETTER 369 AND CHESTERFIELD UNAPPROVED 314**



February 17, 2019

**AN UNJUSTIFIED CAMPAIGN INFERENCE:** In the Ward-2 Board of Alderman race Laura Baer had a posting that was grossly unfair to several alderpersons and made inference that the current Ward-2 Alderwomen were bullies. She claimed “Countless Sunshine Law inquiries that appear to be aimed at discrediting staff are counterproductive.” See below:

1. Our City staff is a team of top-flight professionals who are well trained, hardworking and dedicated to serving all residents. Lately, they have been unjustly harassed, bullied and burdened with unnecessary tasks that keep them from their primary responsibilities. Countless Sunshine Law inquiries that appear to be aimed at discrediting staff are counterproductive. I believe fully in transparent, clear and honest government without compromise. However, certain actions by some elected officials seem to have other motivations. We need to return to respectful, collaborative governance.

**Not a clue!** The piece of campaign trash talk shows that Baer does not have a clue why the Sunshine Requests were made.

1) Simply asking for information as an elected official does not guarantee you will get the information you asked for. Nor does your simple verbal request create a record that residents can see.

2) By making a Sunshine Request, your request is in writing and part of a public record. You are not being a bully or discrediting anyone, unless of course the information obtained shows someone had been lying about an issue.

Here are the Sunshine Requests by Ald. Frautschi and Butler for November, December of 2018 and January of 2019 (none in 2019):

Two of these requests dealt with the Mason Road sidewalk boondoggle that the alderwomen were trying to get facts that had been withheld.

Both Butler and Frautschi made public records attempting to get information citizens have been asking for over the botched Mason Road sidewalk project. At one point former Services Director Craig Wilde refused to provide information until he had obtained all the facts in the case including future costs. He would not answer their questions.

Here are the email requests by Laura Baer during the same time. She has made three more Sunshine Request than the person she is running against.

Baer's newest Sunshine request was for copies of all emails sent or received by the city or staff from/to Butler and Frautschi on their personal non-city email accounts over a 2-year period. This would have required a considerable amount of staff time and a \$600 deposit was requested before research was started. At that point the request was withdrawn.

New houses or empty lots where original houses once stood out number original houses on Oak Springs 14-to-7. That will soon be 15-6. Here are the plans for the new house:






HERE IS ONE OF THE 12-NEW HOUSES ON OAK SPRINGS

Meyland-Smith opened the meeting by questioning the minutes from the prior meeting. This is what Meyland-Smith was upset about:

*“Finally, she (Ald. Frautschi) stated that the Ward 2 Aldermen would be hosting an informational meeting from 5:00-6:00 PM on Monday, February 25, at the Municipal Center. She noted that the guest for this month’s speaker series would be an Ameren representative to speak about power line easements and their vegetation management practices.”*

“This is an extension of the Ward-2 Forum. (a citizen meeting with the 2 alderwomen held once a month in the morning before an aldermanic meeting. Meyland-Smith and Ald. Lynn Wright tried and failed to get these meetings banned.) This needs to be changed. It infers it is endorsed by the Board of Aldermen,” said the great windbag.

“I’d be happy to change it to ‘Ward-2 Speaker’s Series,’” said Frautschi. That amendment to the minutes would later pass, but not before comments that had nothing to do with the wording of the minutes or the amendment.

**HERE COMES LYNN:**

“I’m sadden! We need to come together. It is coming together like Ward-2 is its own city,” said the clueless Wright who never holds special meetings for specific problems faced by Ward-1 residents. Wright appears to be tight with Frautschi’s opponent Laura Baer so these comments are not a surprise.

Tiffany responds:

“We have invited all the wards to participate in these meetings. We have a massive active high tension power lines across the length of Ward-2. The residents in Laruel Lakes planted under the lines and Ameren tore up their plantings. They want to know what they can do. I don’t think this should be debate,” said Frautschi.

In fact both Butler and Frautschi have gone and found speakers of local interests, something the other alderpersons have not done. They seem to be practicing “good government” and are being criticized by jealous alderpersons.

**OTHER SIDE OF THE COIN:** I’m sure if Lynn Wright or Fred Meyland-Smith would have speakers at City Hall on different topics of citizen interest they would be giving themselves big pats on the back. If Lindsey Butler and Tiffany Frauthschi do it, they try to ban it and when that did not work they bad mouth it from the dais. The end of April when Meyland-Smith and Wright are off the BOA cannot come fast enough. (Both are not running for reelection.)

**NAME IT:** Chesterfield had suggested that they should and perhaps have some adjoining cities join them and start their own County. Now Alderwoman Lynn Wright

has accused Ward-2 alderpersons Butler and Frautschi of wanting to start their own city, for providing speakers for public forums. Here are a few possible names:

Masonville, Mason Heights, City of Queeny Land, Frautschville, Butlertown, City of Country & Town.

**CITIZEN FORUMS ARE NOTHING NEW:** What Lindsey Butler and Tiffany Frautschi are doing with a speakers forum that Meyland-Smith and Wright are so upset about are nothing new. Mayor Peggy Symes used to hold them all the time when she was mayor from 1993-to-95. This was a good idea in 1995 but make Wright and Meyland-Smith irate 24 years later.




**THE BETTER TOGETHER NON-DEBATE:** A number of communities have taken a hard stand against the Better Together movement by passing resolution against the entire plan. Chesterfield passed the resolution and is looking into trying to be annexed by St. Charles County or forming their own new County. Meanwhile Town and Country has remained silent.

**Fred Meyland-Smith:** I am going to recommend that the next meeting (work session) start at 6 o'clock instead of 6:30 so we can debate this.

**Skip Mange:** Chesterfield kind of blew their gun earlier.

**Jon Benigas** (who almost sounded like he supported the Better Together plan): Help me understand what the emergency is. We should get feedback from our residents first.

**Lindsey Butler:** We have put out nothing as a city.

**Skip Mange:** The mayor is holding a coffee on March 14 and will discuss it. (Not yet on the city calendar.)

**RESIDENT UPSET WITH RESIGNATION OF CRAIG WILDE:** The only citizen speaker at the BOA meeting was Keith Godding who lives on Topping Road and served on the Topping Road Task Force, a citizen group reviewing the repaving of Topping Road and the addition of a sidewalk. Town and Country Director of Services (Public Works and Planning) was on the Task Force. Wilde resigned in December.

Godding's family has owned houses on Topping Road since the 1930s and he has lived in 1900 block of Topping since 1974. Godding wanted to be told why Wilde had resigned.

"Craig was on the top of my list...with his experience and expertise. It came to my attention that Craig resigned. My question is why? It has come to my attention that he resigned for not the best of reasons. Please shed light on the circumstances on the resignation," asked Godding, who went on to say that a resignation letter ought to be a public document. (It certainly is not.)

Godding lives next door to Aldermanic candidate Laura Baer who has been telling people that Wilde resigned because of actions by a Ward-2 Alderwoman.

As we mentioned earlier Wilde had refused to answer elected officials questions about the Mason Road sidewalk boondoggle, causing both Ward-2 Alderperson tot file Sunshine Requests seeking answers.

However neither alderwoman is liked by Mayor Dalton and certainly he would have taken no action against Wilde.

After the meeting I briefly spoke with Mr. Godding and said that resignation letters are "personnel matters" and not public records. The only person who can release that letter would be Mr. Wilde.

### **MEYLAND-SMITH DESCRIMINATES AGAINST MOST TOWN AND COUNTRY**

**RESIDENTS:** Godding was out of time for public comments and wanted to speak again.

"You are a long time resident of this community and that carries weight," said Fred Meyland-Smith, who apparently thinks that mere 10-year residents should not be provided the same treatment.

**BUTLER ADDRESSES RUMORS:** "I'll tread lightly here," said Ald. Lindsey Butler after Godding's comments. "I heard the rumors as well. He (Wilde) left on his own volition. I'm sadden as well. I'm aware of the rumors and where they came from."

**MASON ROAD SIDEWALK PLAN RECEIVED PRELIMINARY APPROVAL FROM COUNTY HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT.** Ald. Lynn Wright announced that the County Highway Department hs give tentative approval for the sidewalk/trail construction along Mason Road after they ordered it halted in October. She also announced the Parks Grant Commission approved to extend the completion date on the grant for the project.

Meyland-Smith clearly was not listening. "Great news on Topping and Mason Roads," he proclaimed only to have Wright and others say "It was all about Mason Road."

**ALDERMAN ORDERS STAFF TO DETAIN JUVENILES WITHOUT CAUSE:** Toward the end of what should have been a short meeting and was turning out to be a long meeting, Ald. Skip Mange stopped the meeting and ordered City Administrator Bob Shelton to go to the lobby and bring a group of Cub Scouts into the chambers.

The Scouts had a tour of the police station and jail and were headed out the door when they were taken into custody. They clearly wanted to leave and had no interest in the Aldermanic meeting.



The Cub Scouts were told to give their first names as Mange grinned from the dais apparently well amused.

**UNAPPROVED CHESTERFIELD NEWSLETTER 314**



**CHESTERFIELD MAN SENTENCED TO 15 YEARS IN PRISON FOR MULTIPLE COUNTS OF CHILD MOLESTATION.** On February 1, 2019 David Matthew Breese AKA as Matt Breese, 54, pled guilty in Circuit Court to the following child sex crimes:

- 4-counts of felony Child Molestation Sentenced to 15-years in prison
- 1-count of felony statutory sodomy
- 1-count of felony attempted sodomy
- 1-count misdemeanor attempted child molestation

The crimes took place between 2013 and 2016. Breese was charged in September of 2016 and indicted by a grand jury on February 2, 2017.



At the time of sentencing Breese used an address of 16521 Lacrosse in Chesterfield. He has also recently had addresses at 1216 Foxview Terrace in Ballwin and 16340 Westboro Circle in Chesterfield.

**COUNT: 02 ATTEMPTED STATUTORY SODOMY 2ND DEGREE**

That David Breese , in violation of Section 566.064, RSMo, committed the class D felony of attempted statutory sodomy in the second degree, punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.011 and 560.011, RSMo, in that on or about August 28, 2016, in the County of St. Louis, State of Missouri, the defendant attempted deviate sexual intercourse with S.H., by reaching into the underwear of S.H., and at that time S.H. was less than seventeen years old and the defendant was twenty-one years of age or older, and such conduct was a substantial step toward the commission of the offense of statutory sodomy in the second degree.

**COUNT: 03 ATTEMPTED CHILD MOLESTATION 2ND DEGREE**

That David Breese , in violation of Section 566.068, RSMo, committed the class B misdemeanor of attempted child molestation in the second degree punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.011 and 560.016, RSMo, in that on or between August 27, 2016 and August 28, 2016, in the County of St. Louis, State of Missouri, the defendant attempted sexual contact with H.C., by asking to touch the breasts of H.C., who was then less than seventeen years old, and such conduct was a substantial step toward the commission of the offense of child molestation in the second degree.

**COUNT: 04 STATUTORY SODOMY 1ST DEGREE - DEVIATE SEXUAL INTERCOURSE WITH PERSON LESS THAN 14 YEARS OLD - SERIOUS PHYSICAL INJURY/DISPLAYS DEADLY WEAPON OR DANGEROUS INSTRUMENT/SUBJECTS VICTIM TO INTERCOURSE WITH MORE THAN ONE PERSON/VICTIM IS LESS THAN 12 YEARS OF AGE**

That David Breese , in violation of Section 566.062, RSMo, committed the felony of statutory sodomy in the first degree, punishable upon conviction under Section 566.062, RSMo, and subject to lifetime supervision under Sections 217.735 and 559.106, RSMo, in that on or between September 1, 2013 and December 31, 2013, at 16340 Westboro Circle Drive, in the County of St. Louis, State of Missouri, the defendant, for the purpose of arousing or gratifying his own sexual desire, had deviate sexual intercourse with H.C., who was then less than twelve years old, by touching the victim's genitals with his hand.

The additional charges of felony child molestation were added later.

Breese will have some money for the prison concessions as he had \$34,000 in bond money refunded.



**FEBRUARY 10<sup>TH</sup> ICE STORM DOES NOT STOP DRUNK DRIVERS:** On Sunday 02/10 Missouri was hit with an ICE STORM. Roads over much of the state were a glaze of ice. 

**MORE APARTMENTS PLANNED FOR “DOWNTOWN CHESTERFILED” ALONG I-64 TO THE EAST OF THE TRAILER PARK:** The Planning and Public Works Committee approved plans for 173 unit high-end 5-story apartment complex with a 12,000 sq foot of retail and a 2-story 14,000 sq ft restaurant, plus parking garages on 7.3 acres. The development will be between a small section Wild Horse Creek Road but mostly Old Chesterfield Road and I-64. Committee members were told the apartment units would be high-end condo like units with top grade fixtures and appliances.



**RIGHT THIS WAY MR. FIRST NIGHTER TO THE MEZZANINE:** When some talks about a mezzanine, I think of a theater or sports arena where the seats about the box seats, normally in a thin section, are called mezzanine seats.

However when a fire district wants to build mezzanine level at a fire station I wonder what kind of shows they would be putting on. However that was not the case.



Mezzanine actually means any “low story” between two floors.

Last week the Monarch Protect District voted to award a \$5,000 contract for an architect to prepare plans for a mezzanine at Fire Station 5 on Long Road in Chesterfield Valley.



This building is in a flood plain where in 1993 there was a massive Missouri River flood. Since then a systems of dams and flood walls have been built, but just three years along a December flood saw water overflowing flood walls and cover some City of Chesterfield Parks land. This mezzanine is to keep IT and electrical equipment off the ground level at the fire station.

The case was not worked by the FEDS, but by Chesterfield Police detectives who found text messages between Hancock and dead woman. Hancock had two felony drug possession arrests in 2016 and 2017, but those are no longer active cases indicating

dismissals or probation periods being completed. He does have an active Assault case in North St. Louis County and a warrant for his arrest from Des Peres.

**The City of St. Louis Deficit:** Do you really want to be part of this: This is part of an email sent by Chesterfield City Administrator Mike Geisel to city council members after a review of the current financial condition of the City of St. Louis.

## [Page 212 Ratio of Outstanding debt](#)

The outstanding debt for the city, as of June 2018, \$2,813,0622,000. Yes, \$2.8 BILLION

That debt level means that the outstanding debt of the City of St. Louis represents 20.92% of the personal income of the residents of St. Louis. Stated another way, each resident owes \$9,115

(by comparison, the City of Chesterfield has total outstanding debt of \$43 million

Each Chesterfield Resident carries a debt load of \$657 or less than 1.25% of the annual personal income.)

Of this amount, they show \$432,848,000 in outstanding pension benefits, but you also have to add \$489,731,000 in OPED (Other post employment benefits). So for conversational purpose, they owe former employees & retirees \$922,579,000, Almost \$1 billion.

What is more frightening, look at the trend of total primary government debt since 2009. It is going the wrong way. Its gone from 17.8% of personal income, to 21%.

This is like the folks at Better Together either want or expect the residents in St. Louis County to invest in a sinking ship.


**CHEXIT:** No it is not a new cereal or my favorite Christmas time snack. Some locals taking a nod from Briexit referring to Britain leaving the European Union and have name Chesterfield “Chexit” as it looks for ways to avoid the St. Louis City-County merger being pushed by Better Together. Chesterfield has talked about trying to join St. Charles County or breaking off and creating a new county separate from St. Louis County.



Fire Departments: Here is what Better-Together says about fire districts and fire departments. For the time being they would make the St. Louis Fire Department a self taxing Fire District. They would allow city fire department to continue to operate for the time being. They make no mention about the Des Peres Department of Public Safety where all the employees are cross trained as police officers, firefighters and paramedics. Here is the Better-Together statement from its executive summary of the merger plan:

***FIRE SAFETY*** We recommend that the City of St .Louis' fire department become a fire protection district and all other fire services continue to be delivered in their current manner. Admittedly, this is a difficult recommendation for us to make, but we believe that reform of this scale must, in part, include dealing with art of the possible. We recognize that not all desired reforms can be accomplished in a single effort. Fire safety presents a complicated landscape, paired with greater disparity in employee pay and benefits, than across the other service areas, which ultimately makes the creation of a single department too costly to be attainable in the short-term. However, it is entirely consistent with the experiences of other regions that fire protection would be a candidate for future consolidation efforts in subsequent years depending on community input to the Metro City government.

**MISSING OBIT:** Back when the Post Dispatch was still owned by Pulitzer Publishing they had a news obit person on staff. They would run articles about local people who recently died who had certain occupations. When my mother died in 2005 they ran a regular obit and a news obit. Why? It wasn't because she was a real estate agent with Ira Berry then Caldwell banker for 40 years. It was because she was a public school teacher. She taught high school English at Normandy High School just before the start of World War II. School teachers, cops, firefighters got news obits.

I mention this because I was really surprised when the Post Dispatch ran a regular "Paid For obit" but never did a "News Obit" on the passing of former St. Louis County Police Captain Jack Patty, who at one time was Chief of Detectives before Police Superintendent Gil Kleinknecht suddenly moved him to a non-enforcement job overseeing the record room. There were rumors that Kleinknecht was unhappy with Patty working with St. Louis Police Chief of Detectives John Doherty dealing with some of the local organized crime figures after a rash of car bombings. I have no idea if that rumor was true but it fits the reputation that Col. Klink had. One thing for sure is that Patty and his staff solved a lot of serious crimes. After the transfer, Patty retired and went to work at the St. Louis County prosecutor's office as a case investigator when Buzz Westfall was elected County PA.

Patty had been suspended years earlier along with his supervisor Pete Vassel by new Police Chief Robert diGrazia, who was gone in three years. deGrazia, a San Francisco native went to Montgomery County Maryland where he was fired as police chief in less than two years and then to Boston where he lasted five years. (The Post-Dispatch gave diGrazia a "News obit" when he died at age 90 in 2018.)

But regardless, Patty was often in the news and oversaw lots of police officers. So it was odd that the Post-Dispatch did not think his death was “newsworthy” especially since he was “local” growing up in Webster Groves and being a star football player and serving in the Marines during the Korean War..

### **RESTAURANT REVIEW: Lemmons 5800 Gravois St. Louis 02/09/19**

If you are old like me you remember Lemmons being a crowded neighborhood restaurant and bar featuring fried chicken that you would pass on your way to the Bevo Mill. Then the restaurant was overshadowed as it became more of a bar and neighborhood tavern.

Since 2014 Lemmons has had a new life thanks to the Grbic family. The place was gutted. It is no longer a “bar” but a neighborhood place with a modest menu with modest prices.



We were there on a Saturday between lunch and dinner. Tuesday thru Friday they are open at 4. On Saturday it is NOON-to11.

The place has received favorable reviews from the Riverfront Time and the Post-Dispatch.

We met a couple there on Saturday. There was just a table of eight (counting kids) and us. At that table the conversation was going back and forth between English and Bosnian. The place is no longer a beer and sports bar, but there were a number of large screen TVs. Instead of a basketball game or the PGA at Pebble Beach the TV's were featuring roaring fires.



The place was a bit of a contradiction. The menu was a single one-sided piece of paper. But there were cloth napkins on the table. The food is mostly American with a little German, Italian and some with a Balkan twist.

The Grbic parents are from Bosnia, but their kids who run the place were born in St. Louis and went to school here. The kids and other staff members were very pleasant and gracious.



We should have been a little more diverse in our ordering.

My wife went with the Smoked Chicken Wings (\$10) and the Tomato Bisque soup (\$5).



The chicken wings were very good. The soup was excellent. The same bowl of soup at a restaurant on the Hill would have cost \$8 instead of \$5.

This was a bad thing to do, but two of use ordered the Chuck Roast Sandwich (\$13). Our waiter said it was very popular.



It was big enough I cut it in half before trying it, planning to take half home.

I bit into the sandwich expecting the flavor of the meat and the onions. I got almost nothing, not even the cheese had much taste to it.



