LARGEST RESPONSE ON AN ISSUE IN OVER A YEAR: We still have a list of people that dates back to when I was an alderman that gets the newsletter emailed to them. We don't add to this list as we try to get people used to going to our website.

When I send out the newsletter I jokingly refer to it as the West County Whirl. It is my giving a "tip of the hat" to the Evening Whirl, a weekly newspaper in North St. Louis since 1938 that specializes in reporting crimes. In the past the publisher had at time made up quotes to go with the stories. One such story in 1977 involved the Town and Country Municipal Judge being arrested having sex in a men's restroom in Forest Park.

They didn't know one person was a lawyer and a muni judge. The article quoted the other suspect as saying, "Pump Daddy, I'm your Laddie." SOME MEMBERS OF THE TOWN AND COUNTRY PUBLIC WORKS COMMISSION DID NOT HAVE A CLUE THAT THE MASON ROAD TRAIL PROJECT WAS KILLED BY ALDERPERSONS: Regular readers know that back in 2017 a MUNI County Parks grant was fronted for Town and Country to build a trail (extra wide sidewalk) over existing sidewalk and also on lawns abutting Mason Road. The trail was to go from Clayton Road to the Mason Road entrance to Queeny Park close the three miles away.

Town & Country and St. Louis County did not have easement property along the 170-year-old road. A number of residents would not sell any land for the installation of a

wide sidewalk. Town and Country Mayor Jon Dalton refused to use eminent domain to buy the land, so the project died.

But the Town and Country Parks Commission led by Ald. Lynn Wright who never saw a project that was too expensive, wanted to put the extra wide sidewalk on top of the existing sidewalks along the County road. It would be “The Trail to No Where” as it would not reach Queeny Park . The City then got the Parks Grant amended and began the new project. The contractor, T. Hill Construction began tearing out of the existing side and removing trees in early October of 2018 and within a day or two the St. Louis County Highway Department shut down the project.

TOWN AND COUNTRY AND T. HILL NEVER OBTAINED APPROVAL OR A PERMIT FROM THE COUNTY HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT.

16 months later no final approval was yet obtained but the Board of Alderman had a bill in front of them to complete the project with the Parks Grant still in play. The County was now requiring that the City would have to handle all liability issues on both the sidewalk (trail) and the County Highway road itself.

At the January 27, 2020 the project was killed all together. At the time there were only seven alderpersons as Mayor Dalton never filled Ald. Skip Mange’s seat after Mange resigned in September of 2019. This meant 4-yes and 3-no votes could not pass any bill. Five votes, a majority of seats was required. The vote was 4-3 in favor, which meant it failed.

The Parks grant was withdrawn and the city was now responsible to replace or restore the existing sidewalk that was damaged or destroyed by T. Hill Construction working without a county permit.

Now moving ahead to the Public Works Commission meeting on Monday May 18...

The Commission needed to approve a contract with an engineering firm for the restoration work that included ADA compliance that did not exist when the destroyed sidewalk was originally built.

The amazing thing about this was some members had no idea that the project with the extra wide sidewalks had been killed and was not going to happen. Nothing like being an informed government office holder!

Tony Chao (Ward 3) had no idea about the changes and began asking several questions. Chao wasn't alone in this with none of the commissioners in the dark not bothering to call city staff to inquire before the meeting.



A fuzzy looking Tim Randick then had to go over the entire story. The Commission voted to approve the \$8,722 engineering contract. Tim provided us with the projected costs to restore the sidewalk.

HRGreen believes they should be able to get County approval with the current work order proposed of \$8722.50. To be conservative we believe engineering will not exceed \$15,000 and construction to be between \$25,000 and \$35,000.

KANSAS CITY STAR AND MARIJUANA TRADE PUBLICATIONS REPORTS THAT MAYOR DALTON'S MARIJUANA LOBBYING CLIENT IS BEING INVESTIGATED BY THE FBI. Jon Dalton after being jettisoned from two major law firms is now at Armstrong-Teasdale. There besides doing some legal work, he is the president for the Armstrong-Teasdale in house Lobbying firm, AT Government Strategies.

A-T lists as one of their major clients, Beleaf, a medical marijuana sales operation with licenses to operated five stores in Missouri including three in St. Louis and St. Louis County (including West County). Beleaf is pushing for Missouri to approve simple retail marijuana sales, like in Illinois. The below is from the May 8th Edition of Marijuana Daily News that covers commercial marijuana issues by state and on the National scene.

The committee's request includes records for communications between the DHSS and the Missouri Medical Cannabis Trade Association as well as records related to BeLeaf Medical, a vertically integrated marijuana company in the state.

A longtime political operative close to Gov. Mike Parsons, Robert Tilley, is a lobbyist for both the trade association and BeLeaf Medical.

The Star reported that Tilley and a spokesperson for the trade association could not immediately be reached for comment.

The FBI has also sought information about the state's medical cannabis licensing process and Tilley's relationship to MMJ companies and Parson's administration, the Star reported.

The [FBI has been investigating](#) corruption allegations in the [cannabis licensing processes](#) in various states.

The legislative committee also requested communications between the DHSS and the governor's deputy chief of staff that are centered on the hiring of the state's MMJ czar, Lyndall Fraker.

It you look at the list of “major” clients of AT you will see a number of clear conflicts of interest for Dalton that the Board of Alderpersons and voters have been ignoring for years.

BJC operates Missouri Baptist Hospital in Town and Country. The city has to issue building permits. The Lutheran Senior Services owns a large nursing home and senior condos in Town and Country that also has to have city construction and operational permits.

Dalton lists the City of Crestwood, the City of Hazelwood and Missouri Municipal League as “major clients.” Whose issues are more important? His clients or Town and Country especially when there are conflicts.

Northpoint Development has had projects in T&C and Dalton has represented them as both a lawyer and a lobbyist.

CITY COUNCIL MEETING STARTS OUT NICE BUT THEN TURNS INTO 45 MINUTES OF SHOUTING AND NAME CALLING. IT WAS EITHER VERY ENTERTAINING OR JUST PLAIN CREEPY DEPENDING ON YOUR MIND SET:

Things started off nicely in the teleconference meeting on zoom. First it was the Agenda Review meeting that started at 5:45. The public portion was over by 6pm when the Council went into a Secret one-hour meeting. We were told later that there was no arguing, shouting, yelling or threatening during this meeting.

Despite having cancelled the \$75,000 fireworks show for the 4th of July the City Council put on a fireworks show at the May 18 City Council meeting.

They started out quietly. In comments from citizens, Rob Kilo of Benton Taylor Drive asked for the City to sign a petition or make a resolution requesting the County Highway Department to place a simple painted crosswalk on the pavement at Baxter Road and August Hill Dr.

The City just recently approved installing solar streetlights in the area, including that intersection.

Next the Council approved on a 8-0 vote the ordinance requiring a permit to place a dumpster on residential property. The permits would be renewable if necessary expiring every 30 days.

The ordinance would get rid of the dumpster in the below photo that has been sitting in the front of a house on Ladue Road for a year.



The Council then handled four other matters with no issues.

They passed a resolution to St. Louis County government wanting to share the \$173.5 million from Congress in CARES Funds (Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act... \$2-trillion total) with municipalities for public safety. This could be used to pay police if County Executive Sam Page would share. This was explained and discussed and then passed without any loud dissent.

Next up was Pandemic Financial Strategy from City Administrator Mike Geisel. This proposal was to return all furloughed employees to work gradually by July 1 at full pay. It was mentioned that the \$75,000 from the cancelled fireworks show could be used to pay police salaries cut by 10% to avoid layoffs. This passed on an 8-0 vote. An earlier amendment to change the proposal failed on a 6-no 2-aye vote with Tom DeCampi and Ben Keathley voting for the amendment it. Now it was fireworks time.

Ben Keathley brought up a motion to reduce everyone's pay for 3-months by 10%. I'm not sure of the logic since everyone just voted to bring back laid off employees and eliminate the 10% pay cut in the police department.

Barb McGuinness brought up that the proposal was illegal as city administrator Mike Geisel is not a regular employee but under a long term contract with a set salary.

This started a litany of comments and even motions. Ben Keathley, who usually is not in the middle of these scums, made point of order and Tom DeCampi made several loud point of orders when Mayor Nation declared that DeCampi was "Out of Order."


DeCampi shouted, "This is an outrage and lawless!"

City attorney Chris Graville took exception to DeCampi saying the proceeding was "lawless." "That's unfair," said Graville.

DeCampi wanted to debate Mayor Nation declaring motions "out of order" and quoted where in Robert's Rules of Order it allowed debate on certain "out of order" proclamations from person running a meeting.

City Attorney Chris Graville then asked several times for more time to look in his copy of Robert's Rules to see if debate on the mayor's Out of Order claim should be allowed. During his research that lasted for at least 10 minutes DeCampi was trying to talk and Mayor Nation declared how he was "Out of Order." DeCampi again said how the meeting was lawless and then declared City Attorney Graville as being "lawless."

This got Graville's attention as he said he took exception to DeCampi's statement.

After being called lawless by DaCampi, Graville had an announcement to make.

"It (an out of order/point of order proclamation) is debatable," said Graville.

"I beg to differ with you," said Mayor Nation. "We are taking about appeals on a point of order."

Ben Keathley then spoke up. "If you don't like my motion, vote it down."

At one point during this ultimate fighting contest, Mayor Nation instructed City Planning Director, Justin Wyse who was controlling the video and audio to be prepared to shut off DeCampi's audio,

"Seriously, things are out of control," said Mayor Nation.

Dan Hurt got the floor and quietly talked about what it was like to own a business and have employees and how employees become part of your family. This was in opposition to Keathley's 120 day pay reduction for all employees and elected officials.

Hurt instead of saying something stupid or making a lame joke, successfully clamed things down. Unfortunately Mayor Nation missed this point and cautioned Hurt that he was taking too much time.

They then took a vote to have a debate on the Mayor's Out of Order proclamation. The Order stood on a 4-3 vote (Councilman Michael Moore lost his signal on this computer and vanished from the meeting).

After the vote DeCampi asked for the floor and was allowed to speak. He began to loudly rile again. Mayor Nation allowed Councilman Dan Hurt to speak again.

Hurt did address DeCampi and Keathley by calmly and softly saying, "I'm confused on what you are trying to do. At the last meeting you were for keeping fireworks

DeCampi began again and Mayor Nation declared him out of order again.

"I have the floor," shouted DeCampi.

"You are out of order" replied Nation.

"I have the floor for ten minutes. The lawlessness here it is sickening," said DeCampi.

Councilwoman McGuinness had made a motion to postpone Keathley's reduction indefinitely. After some yelling and screaming that passed.

Frankly it was difficult to keep up with all the comments and voted. City Clerk Vickie McGownd was nice and provided the following information.

John,

The amendment to the Pandemic Financial Strategy passed by a vote of 6-2 with Councilmembers Keathley and DeCampi voting "No". The Pandemic Financial Strategy, as amended, ultimately passed by a vote of 8-0.

Councilmember Keathley's original motion on Elected Official and Employee Compensation was to have staff prepare an ordinance with a 120 day expiration period, with a 10% reduction in salary for staff and elected officials, that would expire at the end of the 120 days. This motion was seconded by Councilmember DeCampi.

After the "back and forth", Councilmember McGuinness made a motion, seconded by Councilmember Monachella, to postpone the discussion pertaining to Elected Official and Employee Compensation, indefinitely. This motion passed by a vote of 4-3 with Council members Keathley, DeCampi and Ohley voting "No".

I think the city clerk was not having a good time trying to keep up with the shouting and insults while taking the minutes. Here are some photos of her during the second half of the meeting.



THE END: The Council did agree with no shouting on subdividing the property were Top Golf is located to allow a new hotel and a tower for people to parachute off of, with an open bar nearby of course.


