**TOWN AND COUNTRY’S POSITION ON FIREWORKS:** The City’s staff posted on the city’s website that fireworks are illegal. The mayor wrote in his newsletter that fireworks are illegal. Ward-2 alderpersons emailed a newsletter telling residents that fireworks are illegal. Unfortunately, the police department is apparently unaware that fireworks are illegal.



From Mayor Dalton newsletter posted on the city’s website on July 3:

Happy 4 th of July to one and all. As a reminder, City Hall will be closed on Friday, July 3 in observance of the holiday. Additionally, fireworks are not permitted within Town and Country City Limits. If you hear or see any fireworks, please call our Dispatch Center’s non-emergency number at 314-737-4600.

### Fireworks are NOT allowed in Town and Country

"It shall be unlawful for any person within this City to sell, possess, offer for sale, expose for sale, give, use, discharge or explode any fireworks, except as provided in Subsection (C) of this Section. "

40 years ago fireworks at home consisted of cones that shot colored flames five feet in the air or a string tied on a clothes line or between two trees that when ignited was a colorful waterfall.

Now 40-year-old dads with more money than sense drive out of St. Louis County and buy fireworks that they can shoot 50 feet in the air and will explode at a noise level similar to military artillery. The ashes and debris fall to the ground on yards and houses often causing damage and sometimes fires. The noise of these exploding missiles send many dogs into frenzies and some dogs if outside will run away.

The problem with these repeated bombs in Ward-2 of Town and Country it also involves horses, who often are just as seriously bothered by fireworks as are the dogs. Along Mason Road there are two homeowners with horses, plus a large stable on the Mason Road side of Queeny Park. Off of Topping Road on the John McDonald property is a stable with number of horses. In Ward-3 there are four horses at the Longview Farm Park. In Ward-4 there are a lot of horses.

During the 4<sup>th</sup> of July weekend the West County EMS and Fire Protection District was busy. Firefighters responded to three fireworks related fire calls (one on an assist out of district) but fortunately no EMS calls related to fireworks injuries.

Monarch Fire Protection District did not run any fireworks related calls in Chesterfield. With two to three hours of constant fireworks violations of large aerial bombs that create safety issues, they are easy to find and stop...here is the total number of fireworks calls/complaints and the number of citations issued by the police:

Town and Country:

July 4 12 calls/complaints 0 citations

July 5 4 calls/complaints 0 citations

Apparently animal cruelty is just fine with the T&C Police. To hell with the safety of horses, dogs, houses and property as long as people can blow things up on July 4<sup>th</sup>.

If the local police department is not going to enforce the fireworks law, maybe the board of aldermen should take it off the books. However, many residents would expect there to be enforcement before houses are burned down. This is another example in Law Enforcement where a violation is ignored until disaster strikes when city and police officials decide to enforce the law.

**IRISH EYES ARE SMILING AS T&C WELCOMES A COMPANY MAKING THE TAX DODGE JIG.** The same company is coming to Town and Country after getting a \$20,200,000 state tax break.

A big-time press conference was held on Tuesday June 23 at Maryville University to announce that **Accenture Federal Services** would open offices in Town and Country in an office building owned by Maryville. At the press conference they claimed it meant 1,400 new jobs for the St. Louis area.

**Rest of Story:** It is 200 jobs to start and 1,200 to follow (maybe).

In January it was announced that Accenture Federal Services (with offices located in Arlington, Virginia outside of Washington, DC) received a \$341,000,000 contract to upgrade the Department of Commerce data platform.

Actually, Accenture Federal Services, is also a Missouri LLC since 2005 with an office address of 12747 Olive Blvd. in unincorporated Creve Coeur.

Gov. Mike Parson was at the press conference that seemed like a Republican campaign event. After Parson spoke Congresswoman Ann Wagner gave a few words. Republican lobbyist and Town and Country Mayor Jon Dalton was also present.

**REST OF THE STORY:** Accenture was given a \$20.2million tax break by Missouri. Not paying taxes is part of the foundation of Accenture, which was created after a split from Arthur Anderson Consulting, Inc. The company was first incorporated in Bermuda making a serious dodge of paying US Taxes. In 2009 the company moved to Ireland where it was reported in 2012 it was only pay 3.5% federal Irish taxes instead of the normal rate of 24%.

**City tells alderperson it wants to hide email information. Butler raises concern over stormwater project with city attorney but gets no response. Former Ald. Lynn Wright apparently not a big fan of this newsletter:**

Steve,

I was asked today about this newsletter article by a Ward 2 resident who is concerned about their storm water project which was completed within the last year. They are concerned with the lack of licensing and with a negative event occurring since there wasn't a qualified professional signing off. I assured them that the consultants we hire are qualified. It would also appear from the article that an interview was given, so does this become open to public discussion?

I do have a question as to the reasoning for the inactive status listed in the article(lack of time) when the reasoning given twice in closed session was the perception that the city would not pay for travel to earn CE. Perhaps this needs to be cleared up. One sounds like the city would not pay and the other that their is a lack of time to commit to the position.

Either way, since no discussion was allowed for the Board to hear all evidence and to ask questions, this issue doesn't have a true conclusion, in my opinion. We have had more meetings and discussion on art submittals and sidewalks than on this, which has the potential for causing confusion for residents and possible litigation.

I believe that I will be receiving more calls and emails. Please advise what to do in these situations.

Lynn, I would agree that money shouldn't be spent on a newsletter article's inaccurate information. Would you agree that money should be spent to protect the city from negligence and mismanagement? When someone asks us about this article do we say it is not correct, when it is?

We as a Board were witness to a portion of the situation during a closed session and it does turn out that this article is true from the stand point of having an employee in a high ranking office that was unable and unqualified to perform the duties of the office as stated in our code. I do realize that the Board may not be aware of all the facets since we were allowed about 3 minutes to hear the situation and no time to ask questions. I would like for the city to do what is needed to correct potential issues and avoid any confusion or litigation that may arise from a negligent decision.

This has less to do with the newsletter and more to do with the questions it will create and the fact that the city bypassed the Board and our ability to decide what needs to happen. We had more discussion on another similar situation where there was a violation of an implicit policy whereas this is explicitly stated as a violation in our code, state statute, and the state licensing board. I am requesting we discuss protecting the city and its residents and determining the scope of the situation. This would be good governance.



It should further be noted that the Ellisville K-9 also was used to locate one of our suspects along with the firearm.

**20-2251** Supplement – The two men taken into custody last night were both convicted felons. The suspect with the gun and fentanyl was recently released from the penitentiary. His case was submitted to the FBI and adopted for federal prosecution. The case against other main suspect will be presented to the County PA for multiple felonies. The investigation continues and officers assigned to the X-Patrol identified one of the passengers in the stolen car as a 16-year-old girl from Wildwood.

It should also be noted that just prior to this report a ring door bell picture was sent out from the area of West Dr. and Olive Blvd. showing a suspect attempting to enter a vehicle in the drive way caring a hand gun with what appears to be a high capacity magazine. Attempts to contact the owner of the ring door bell were met with negative results however the detective bureau has the ability to contact them through ring and will follow up.





Resulting from the financial effects related to the COVID-19 pandemic, the men & women of the Chesterfield Police Department chose to take a 10% pay reduction in lieu of 20 staff members being furloughed. Upon learning of this reduction in pay and wishing to support his community's law enforcement officers, Mr. Ryan van Wyk chose to act. Mr. van Wyk took it upon himself to coordinate an effort to relieve these police employees of this financial burden. With the support of many from throughout the St. Louis area; and after several weeks' time, thousands of dollars were raised through a "Go Fund Me Page." hosted by Mr. van Wyk.

Last week, each member of the agency received their share of that financial support in an effort to supplement their lost wages. This week, the men & women of the Chesterfield Police had their opportunity to thank Mr. van Wyk and his family for their gracious efforts. As a result of his selfless act of kindness by coordinating this effort, Chief Ray Johnson presented Mr. van Wyk with the Chesterfield Police Department's "Citizen Service Citation." Many thanks to Mr. Ryan van Wyk from a most grateful group of law enforcement professionals.



**Police Chief Ray Johnson explained the rest of the donations in an email:**

John....no it didn't come close to covering the loss. But, we actually had additional donations from a variety of sources. The total we received from ALL sources was \$22,035, with the \$6,775 from Mr. van Wyk's GoFundMe campaign being the largest single source. Several checks for \$1000 from individuals, quite a number of gift cards which we sold to officers at face value to

convert the cards to cash so the dollars could be added to the total cash, and a variety of donations ranging from \$25 to \$500, and the two or three \$1,000 checks. The total amount lost by all employees was \$84,146.

Then, regardless of the actual dollar amount the individual lost (that varied, of course, depending on their salary) each officer received \$195.00 cash. (113 employees @ \$195.00 = \$22,035.)

Although, the City Finance Dept. assisted us in keeping track of the funds (a running tally) as they were received/distributed, at no time did we co-mingle the funds with City funds, nor, at any time did the City ever have possession or control of the funds received.
