Potential Conflicts of Interest:

Clayton and Ballas intersection- Tobi Moriarty, previously with Transportation Dept, lets me know during a meeting that the city of Town and Country told the County that they would handle the easement acquisition for the intersection, which would have been handled by the County. During the time where Ballas and Clayton intersection was being considered for a bank and coffee spot and subsequently for a federal grant to add turn lanes and sidewalks, Mayor Dalton had recused himself from votes for the Northeast and Southeast corners due to financial conflict of interest. This can be seen in city minutes. However, during all of the closed session contract negotiations, he presided and led the discussions of the \$\$ offered to these same property owners.

The Ballas/Clayton intersection is a completed project and all items related to those closed sessions are public record since it has been voted on and paid out.

Dear Ms. Butler:

The Missouri Ethics Commission has received your complaint filed against Jonathon Dalton. Pursuant to Missouri law, a copy of the complaint has been sent to Jonathon Dalton.


Commission staff will begin an investigation into the allegations in the near future. An investigator may contact you to clarify any details of your complaint. Missouri law requires that the investigation remain confidential until the Commission takes a final action.

If the Commission finds that no violation occurred, the complaint will generally be dismissed within 90 days of its receipt and the dismissal will become public. Both you and the Respondent will be notified of the dismissal at that time.

If the Commission makes an initial determination that a violation may have occurred, the Commission will refer the complaint to its legal counsel for the filing of an administrative legal case. Unlike the 90 day timeframe imposed for the investigation, once the case has been referred there is no definite timeframe for the case to be resolved. Because of the law's confidentiality requirements, the Commission cannot inform you of the status of the complaint during this period. You will be notified of the Commission's final action when it occurs.

PEOPLE...WHERE WERE THEY: There were some people shopping at the Boutique, but there was no one in the park like area of the Town Square. When we checked there were over 50 cars at Queeny Park . There were cars and dog walkers at nearby Longview Park. But no one at the Town Square.





The Mayor Jon Dalton's boondoggle assisted by then Aldermen Fred Meyland-Smith, Skip Mange and Lynn Wright sits at a \$9.98-million price tag for the city. Annual maintenance costs for 2020 are now at **\$74,294.76** as three new bills were paid this week. We have spent \$74,294 and we are letting the trees die by not watering them.

DEALING WITH THE FIRE DISTRICT: A letter to the editor (me) from someone who knows about fire districts...Jane Cunningham with some advice for T&C residents:



Letter to the Editor:

I have followed the Town & Country issue regarding the proposals from the West County EMS and Fire Protection District on fire and ambulance service. This is written to assist those involved in making a decision on what is best for T&C residents. As a former State Rep and Senator for T&C followed by five years on the Monarch Fire Protection Board of Directors, I have good inside knowledge and experience that may be helpful. With that said, I invite those on the Commission or Board of Aldermen to feel free to call me for further explanation or questions they may have. Below are five key recommendations.

1) Unless you just love paying taxes, STOP before you consider adding an additional layer of a taxing district of any kind to your property.

2) Bordering on several established fire protection districts, T&C has an enviable position of having a competitive market from which to contract for fire and EMS services. Having lived in and directed a taxing fire and EMS district, I would grab your current enviable advantage anytime over being forced to pay taxes just for where I live.

3) I was also on the Board of Directors of the Central County 911 Emergency Dispatch Center. When making a decision on 911 response times, it is important to understand that when a 911 call is received, the Dispatch Center knows which fire truck or ambulance is the closest to the incident. That is the vehicle that is dispatched immediately no matter what fire district the incident or the vehicle is in. That ensures the caller gets the fastest response times possible. Therefore when you are being given response times from fire stations or potential stations, it is pretty irrelevant to how the whole response time actually works. You are hardly limited to your own fire district for the fastest response time. This Mutual Assistance from surrounding districts and vehicles is the practice. It is a good and efficient system.

4) Unions for fire, teachers or any other group have a primary purpose of enhancing the salary, benefits and work conditions for their dues-paying members and protecting them from discipline or discharge. No matter how pretty the presentation, always remember that is their job and goal. Other than the Monarch Fire Protection District and the Mehlville Fire Protection District, almost all fire districts in St. Louis County are controlled by the firefighter's union. How, you ask, since the three member boards of directors are voted on by the people? Easy. The unions collect forced dues from their members. In the case of Monarch, each firefighter pays over \$2,000 annually resulting in roughly half a million dollars coming into the kitty each two year election cycle. The union selects individuals to run for the board positions who demonstrate allegiance to the union by providing salaries, benefits and work rules the union approves. Anyone who is independent of the union, or heaven forbid committed to the taxpayers, face

an election against an opponent with unlimited funding and manpower to go door-to-door and man the polling places. In my personal case, I chose to run because of the blatant abuse of the taxpayers by the union-friendly Board. I knew I was probably the only person who had a chance of winning because I had been elected to the MO House and Senate numerous times by the same voters and I had \$150,000 left in my Senate campaign account when I retired. I spent about \$85,000 of that account against what was estimated to be \$135,000 in money and manpower time against me. Union firefighters went door-to-door sometimes three times and had the polls covered three deep. But we had the funds to educate the public by a candidate they already knew and trusted. I won by 60%.

In the case of T&C, if there is a vote of the people, voters would easily be swayed and confused by this same heavily funded and manned campaign machine. There would be no way to match the "information" they would provide to your voters.

5) Now what am I talking about by taxpayer abuse. If you just take a quick peek at the Monarch website, you will see the salaries and benefits that the union had established which we were helpless to change because of a collective bargaining agreement in place for years that could not be rescinded without the union's agreement. Go to <http://monarchfpd.org/index.php?82> and click on Browse Salaries. First, you will note that the "Minimum hiring requirements for a FIREFIGHTER/PARAMEDIC are a high school diploma or GED and one year of related experience and/or training or Associates degree from an accredited technical school or college, a valid driver's license and paramedic license."

Then look at the salary and total compensation which indicate that most firefighters who have been employed five years or more are making between \$100,000 and \$200,000 for their total compensation package which includes salaries, overtime and other pay (Click on Download Detailed Information for an explanation of what goes into the compensation for each public employee). Firefighters work 48 hour shifts which mean they are paid while they sleep during the two nights on their shift. Granted they must get up and go if there is an alarm during their shift. Now add to that that they actually work on average 2.3 days per week (120 24 hour days annually) which easily allows a second job. By accumulating vacation and sick leave, a 15 year firefighter can be gone

from duty for over two months during the year. No wonder it was not uncommon to have 100 people applying for vacancies.

I would be totally surprised if these numbers are not much sweeter at West County EMS and Fire Protection District but you won't locate a Transparency Portal on their website. My guess is also that the collective bargaining between the Board and Union are behind closed doors. That makes it easy for a Board Member to hide that he/she is actually working on behalf of the union and not the taxpayers. Once Board Members who were committed to taxpayers controlled the Monarch Board, we required all financial information be transparent on our website AND the collective bargaining negotiations open to the public and press to watch. The collective bargaining agreement itself is also on the Monarch website.

Bottom line, **KEEP THE CONTROL YOU HAVE** by contracting for the services you need. Get bids from surrounding districts; competition is a wonderful thing. If for some reason you decide to be a glutton for punishment by becoming a taxing district or partnering with a taxing political subdivision, require all the information I listed above to be publicly posted and that the City of Town & Country control the majority of the Board, meaning you (probably the aldermen) have the authority to place two people on that three member Board.






In the main room I was surrounded by all French Bulldogs and just took four photos and got out of there before there was head shaking and drool flying or snoring.

WHEREAS, we have learned that the fatality rate from this disease is far lower than originally thought; and

WHEREAS, ~91% of fatalities from this disease in Missouri have been people aged sixty or older and ~76% of fatalities from this disease in Missouri have been people aged seventy or older; and

WHEREAS, ~90% of all fatalities nationwide show a co-morbidity factor due to a pre-existing condition; and

WHEREAS, the behavioral health of our population is as important as their physical well-being; and

WHEREAS, the spiritual and/or religious health of our population is as important as their physical well-being; and

WHEREAS, the economic health of our population is as important as their physical well-being; and

WHEREAS, the ability of our citizens to govern themselves is as important as their physical well-being; and

WHEREAS, many of the County Executive Orders and Guidelines generally treat all populations in the same manner regardless of age, race, pre-existing condition, or living situation, focusing primarily on their physical well-being; and

WHEREAS, the behavioral health of our population is declining, resulting in depression, negative behavioral change, and suicide; and

WHEREAS, our citizens are cannot attend and freely participate in religious services with family and friends;

WHEREAS, the businesses that buttress our community are suffering from the impact of the County Executive's Orders and Guidelines; and

WHEREAS, the employees of these businesses are suffering financially from the impact of the County Executive's Orders and Guidelines; and

WHEREAS, we are challenged to govern our city under the current Orders and Guidelines.

WE HEREBY RESOLVE that the City of Town and Country asks the County Executive, Sam Page, to restore the personal liberties of our citizens by removing the restrictions and behavioral requirements imposed on our citizens, our government, and our businesses through the County Executive's Orders and Guidelines; and that the County Executive establish Orders and Guidelines that protect our most vulnerable without impacting our least vulnerable.

Adopted this XX day of XX, 2020, Town and Country Board of Aldermen.

Let's look at some of the LIES:




Jon Benigas: I'm in favor in doing what is necessary to more this forward.

Barbara Ann Hughes: I would be against this. We need to avoid making this position.




Pam Holman: I'm not ready to move this forward.

A TRUMPER ON COVID-19 TURNS INTO A LIBERAL DEMOCRAT ON SIGNS:



It was there he shot his ex-girlfriend's current boyfriend on the parking lot on Saturday night September 19. Sky Zone faces Edison Road in Chesterfield Valley. The victim managed to walk back into the Sky Zone. Ivy fled the scene in his VW sedan.

Ivy was involved in a police chase in North County on Lindbergh Blvd and ended when a County Police car hit a median wall and another motorist requiring ambulances for both the other driver and the officer. Ivy managed to escape. After an intense search for him in North County, Ivy turned himself in on Friday September 25.

2242 returned in service and returned along with 2234 to scene later on special assignment to extricate deceased victim for M.E.



The Grand Jury charges:

BACKGROUND

Defendants

1. At all times relevant to this indictment, defendant Franco Sicuro, M.D. (“Dr. Sicuro”), was a psychiatrist, licensed to practice in the state of Missouri. Since in or about June 2001, Dr. Sicuro has owned, operated, been the medical director, or otherwise been associated with one or more health care related businesses, including Millennium Psychiatric Associates (“MPA”), Advanced Geriatric Management (“AGM”), Centrec Care, Sleep Consultants of St. Louis, Midwest Toxicology Group (“MTG” or “Midwest”), Genotec Dx (“Genotec”), and Benemed Diagnostics.
2. At times relevant to this indictment, defendant Carlos Himpler (“Himpler”) lived in St. Louis County, Missouri and described himself as a business development strategist. Since in or about June 2008, Himpler has owned and operated one or more health care related businesses, including Rest Easy of St. Louis, Sleep Consultants of St. Louis, Midwest, Genotec, Core Toxicology, and Core Dx.
3. At all relevant times, Dr. Sicuro and Himpler, as individuals or through their businesses, submitted and caused to be submitted reimbursement claims to health care benefit programs. As defined in Title 18, United States Code, Section 24, a health care benefit program is any public or private plan or contract, affecting commerce, that provides any medical benefit, item, or service and any individual or entity providing a benefit, item, or service under such plan or contract.

MOVING AHEAD

**FRANCO SICURO, M.D.,
and
CARLOS HIMPLER,**

the defendants herein, and persons known and unknown to the Grand Jury, did unlawfully, willfully, and knowingly combine, conspire, and agree with persons known and unknown to the Grand Jury to commit the following offenses against the United States:

- a. to defraud the United States, namely, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services, an agency of the United States Department of Health and Human Services, through deceit, craft or trickery, and by means that are dishonest, that is, by impeding, interfering, and obstructing the lawful government functions of the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services' enforcement of the CLIA requirements for clinical laboratories and its administration of health care and health care plans, including Medicare and Medicaid, in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 371;
- b. to defraud a health care benefit program and to obtain, by false and fraudulent representations, money owned by and under the control of a health care benefit program, in connection with the delivery and payment of health care benefits, items, and services, in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 1347(a); and

- c. to knowingly and willfully falsify, conceal, and cover up by trick, scheme, and device a material fact, and to make materially false, fictitious, or fraudulent statements and representations, and make and use materially false writings and documents knowing the same to contain materially false, fictitious, and fraudulent statements and entries, in connection with the delivery of and payment for health care benefits, items, or services, in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 1035(a).

Purpose of the Conspiracy

- 21. The purpose of the conspiracy was for the defendants:
 - a. to own and operate clinical laboratories that they knew did not comply with CLIA and other regulations governing clinical laboratories and to conceal the lack of compliance from regulatory agencies and insurers;
 - b. to submit reimbursement claims to health care benefit programs that falsely and fraudulently represented that the laboratories owned by the defendants had performed the tests and to conceal from the insurers and

regulatory agencies that the tests had been performed by reference laboratories; and

- c. to use the payments derived from the fraudulent claims to enrich themselves and to purchase and acquire real and personal property with the proceeds of the conspiracy and fraud scheme.
