ST. LUKE'S COVID-19 VACCINE CLINIC RELOCATING TO CHESTERFIELD MALL IN APRIL

Chesterfield, Mo., March 5, 2021 – St. Luke's Hospital will relocate its COVID-19 vaccine clinic from its campus to a new location on the upper level of Chesterfield Mall near Macy's. The relocation date is targeted for early April as the space is prepared to accommodate medical services.

While demand continues to outpace supply, the larger space at Chesterfield Mall offers more flexibility for St. Luke's to increase its vaccination capacity and better serve the community as vaccine supply increases over time.

Vaccine doses are administered by appointment only to individuals on St. Luke's waiting list in the populations currently eligible to receive the vaccine in Missouri. St. Luke's COVID-19 Vaccine Clinic is unable to accommodate walk-in requests.

To pre-register, visit lukesvaccine.com. If an individual is not in a population currently eligible to receive the vaccine, they are encouraged to pre-register. When they become eligible to receive the vaccine, St. Luke's will send them an appointment invitation via email if the vaccine clinic has doses and appointments available.

Updates regarding the vaccine clinic relocation will be provided on lukesvaccine.com.

GOVERNOR PARSON HATES PEOPLE FROM ST. LOUIS: I got an email allowing me schedule to COVID vaccine shot for Monday March 8 at Mercy Hospital, the Mercy facility at Clayton Road and Clarkson or the Mercy Clinic in Kirkwood. I think the location furthest away is Kirkwood at about 7.5 miles. On March 8 the shot took 10 minutes of registering, getting my paperwork and getting the shot. There was the 15-minute wait after the shot. Mercy was playing the Sound of Music on a big screen in the waiting area. When the von Trapps sang “Good Night” and waved goodbye we did the same. No six-hour round trip drive involved like Gov. Parson would have us take.


The plan is No COVID vaccines for St. Louis or KC and watch those Dems die off.

Biology & Longevity




- Breed in February, born mid-spring.
- 5-7 pups per litter.
- Mature at 2 years of age.
- Survival of urban coyotes about 60% each year.
- Most live less than 3 years, but can survive more than 10 in wild.
- Cars cause most mortality.

Social behavior limits reproduction.

Pup season is only time coyotes use den.

Will dig or use existing dens.



- Pups born late April- early May
- Both parents tend to young, bring food back to den.
- Young stay in den for first 6 weeks.
- By end of summer/ early fall, coyote pups are full grown and learning to search for food.
- Common to see family groups together this time of year



- Coyotes family groups will stay together through pup rearing.
- Coyotes will share territories with “packs.”
- **Pack coyotes do not hunt cooperatively.**
- Coyotes vocalize to communicate.
- Solitary coyotes maintain larger territories.





Mange is the most common reported coyote disease in the St. Louis area.

- May account for up to 20% mortalities. **NO HUMAN HEALTH RISK.**

Coyotes can host diseases with risks to unvaccinated pets: heartworm, parvo, distemper, tapeworm.

The above coyote with Mange disease was in Chesterfield.



- Stop any feeding, intentional or unintentional.
- Employ scare tactics, a fear of humans is healthy!
- Keep small pets under supervision.
- In the case of the rare truly nuisance individual, trapping and removal is an option at the cost/ effort of the landowner.
- Population reduction via culling does not work for coyotes due to their social behavior.

Ecological Role of Coyotes



- Limit mesopredator populations via predation and competition. This can bump breeding bird survival.
- Control rodent and rabbit populations, and possible reduction in certain disease transmission (i.e., flea-borne zoonotic diseases such as hantavirus).
- As scavengers, they help naturally recycle decaying plant and animal matter.

BOARD OF ALDERMEN MEETING



TIFFANY FRAUTSCHI, BARBARA ANN HUGHES AND FRITZ WIESEHAN VOTE FOR GOOD GOVERNMENT AND LOSE TO DALTON STYLE BAD GOVERNMENT

In the agenda review meeting 15 minutes before the regular meeting it was first brought up. The appointment to be voted on was of former alderwoman Lynn Wright to the Architectural Review Board, something that she has no education, training or experience with.

Dalton said in the agenda review meeting and later in the regular meeting that he had an “excellent” talk with Ald. Tiffany Frautschi before the meeting on a topic, without saying what they talked about.

Apparently this was Dalton’s pray was that nothing further would be said. He was wrong.

“I strongly think we should wait a month for the new Board and new mayor,” said Frautschi.

“We were elected to serve a full term,” replied Dalton who many think has moved out of town after selling his Condo on Mason Village Drive. “I was elected to a full four years not three years and 10 months. I plan to do my job,” said Dalton who was forced not to do his job and recuse himself due to many conflicts of interests he had with local business he started to represent as a lobbyist in Jefferson City.

“The Board is changing. We should let the new Board and new Mayor do this,” said Frautschi.

The same debate took place in the regular meeting before the vote.

“There are discussion in the community about the problems in the past (reckless spending on projects that never got done with Lynn Wright behind two of them) and bringing he same people back,” said Frauthschi.

Jon Benigas, who usually is in Dalton’s corner commented. “Each administration has the right to make appointments.”

The vote was then taken and only Frauthschi, Barbara Ann Hughes and Fritz Wiesehan voted against the appointment.

I had to think of Dalton who advertises himself in Jefferson City as a “Republican Lobbyist” and Sue Allen who was a crazed Republican State Rep and how they apparently forgot what the Republican U.S. Senate did to President Obama when he nominated Merrick Garland for the Supreme Court 13 months before he was to leave office. The Senate refused to vote on the nomination claiming they should wait and see who the next president is.

MORE PARTY POLITICS When Ald. Ryan Mortland gave his report on the Fire/EMS Task Force and the Police/Fire/EMS Commission Dalton asked him he they were familiar with House Bill 1016. This bill would require Fire District Members to attend training sessions and if the training was not completed in a year the elected member could no longer be paid a salary and could not be reelected.

The bill directed at the St. Louis County cities and the normally union controlled fire districts (pro labor Democrats) says that any contract between a city and a fire district for over five years would also have to be approved by the voters of the city. Mortland and Sue Allen were not familiar with the pending legislation.

\$25,000 for an Audit Voted Down in 2019. Next up was the legislation Dalton wants to use to head off a State audit of a number of City projects including the Town Square being \$4,500,000 over budget, Mason Road side walk to Queeny Park that after spending \$250,000 never got built nor did the shorter substitute sidewalk project and the Ballas and Clayton turn lane additions that after \$250,000 never got built.

“This is in response to I believe the minority of people that wanted to spend \$100,000 for a State Auditor audit,” said Dalton.

The people pushing for the state audit need about 50 more resident signatures on a petition to get the State audit.

Dalton then said something out of left field. At the last meeting he announced that a high end Delpietro Steak restaurant would be coming to the Town Square along with a wine bar and full bar joint that doesn’t serve food. Originally it was going to be a restaurant and ice cream shop as the Town Square was supposed to be a “family gathering place.”

“I have heard people who want a year- round reservation at Delpietro’s,” said Dalton.

The resolution for a \$25,000 audit passed 5-3 despite that it appears that the State Auditor may well be doing a much more complete audit once the public petition is filed.

The three people for good government this time were Frautschi, Jeff Wittmaier and Fritz Wiesehan.

NO CHARGE FOR THE 2021 LIQUOR BY THE DRINK LICENSES: The alderpersons also passed a resolution to charge for liquor by the drink licenses for restaurants due to lost revenue from being shut down due pandemic related Health Department orders and just people avoiding restaurants since March of 2020 because of COVID-19. This will cost the city about \$15,000 in lost revenue. Package liquor sales will still require licenses.

On Wednesday Town and Country detective were working on identifying a suspect and hopefully making an arrest.





THE GREAT DEBATE THAT WASN'T



It was hyped as a debate between Councilman Ben Keathley and Mayor Bob Nation and former councilman Mike Casey, put on by the Chesterfield Chamber of Commerce beginning at 6:30pm on Tuesday March 9. Much of the hype was untrue.

First of all the event did not happen at 6:30pm as advertised. After logging onto the website at 6:30 and having to listen to some awful music for 10 minutes, a banner appeared on the scene saying the event would start at 6:45. That too was a lie.

At about 6:50 we started seeing ads from the sponsors of the event. It actually started near 7pm which means the viewership had to have dropped since many of the people tuning in at 6:30 surely gave up.

The moderator, Kate Uptergrove of West Magazine stated this was not a debate, but a “forum” and each candidate would talk about themselves and what they would do and not talk about their opponent. That did not last too long. She announced that Mike Casey would not be present.

The not talking about your opponent rule was first broken by Keathley when he again said Mayor Nation had proposed a property tax several times. In fact Mayor Nation has brought up property taxes several times in writing or saying if sale tax revenue continues to fall and people want the same level of services they have to look how to pay for them and adding property taxes would be one way. I’d give this one to Mayor Nation or at least make it a tie.

Mayor Nation later seemed to stretch the truth when he claimed there no government incentives under his administration. That is basically true. As a councilman Bob was against the CID and TDD sales taxes for the outlet malls. An existing TDD that the 100 or so resident in the TDD voted on to be extended six years, meaning a longer period of time of high sales taxes. The mayor and city administrator have a seat on the TDD board. A small number of residents live in the TDD have to vote to extend the TDD. The big push was from parents of kids who play hockey to help pay for an Ice Rink complex.

There is a TDD board that voted to have the residents vote in a mail-in election to extend the TDD tax from 2025 to 2031. On the Board was Mayor Nation and City Administrator Mike Geisel, along with current Federal Inmate and former County Executive Steve Stenger.

I attended the meeting when the vote happened. It was at the City Hall and not anywhere within the boundary of the TDD district. Both Mayor Nation and Mike Geisel voted for the TDD extension to go to the voters. So they kind of voted for it while the residents were the ultimate vote. However the TDD Board could have killed the extension with a "No."

One) The TDD Board meeting was held at the City Hall, giving it an appearance of a city related meeting.

Two) Both Mayor Nation and his appointed city administrator voted to send the matter of extending the sales tax six years to the voters in the TDD, which gives the impression he favored it.

I'd score this one for Keathley.

Another subject presented by the moderator was the issue of technology. Ben Keathley spoke rings around Bob Nation and clearly had more knowledge on the subject, a fact admitted by the mayor. This one clearly went to Keathley.

Five times Keathley brought up the issue of changing the municipal court, meaning replacing the prosecutor and making sure there is a judge more interested in justice than defense attorneys getting high fees for getting their clients reduced non-criminal or non-moving charges.

"I want there to be a change in our court system. We need to be better with dealing with repeat criminals," said Keathley.

"Our court system needs to react more to DWIs and criminals," Keathley said earlier. "Now is the time to improve our court system," he added.

“It doesn’t do us any good if our police department catches criminals and the courts make it a catch and release,” said Keathley near the end of the hour.

Mayor Nation never addressed his ethically challenged judge and prosecutor. This is clearly a win for Keathley.

Both Mayor Nation and Councilman Keathley gave the City’s neighborhoods as the City’s biggest asset.


In summation Nation didn’t say anything noticeable.

Keathley mentioned he was quoted by former mayor Jon Nations. Keathley was favorably quoting the guy who led the council to approve the \$800,000 Doorack 10-year lease for an empty lot that the city never utilized and worse allowed the lease agreement to be hidden from the public at the city attorney’s private law office.

Keathley had a big win until he uttered Jon Nations’ name in his summation. He still got more points from us than the mayor but he should remember a scandal like Doorack should not be forgotten.
