


EX ALDERMAN NEWSLETTER 478 AND CHESTERFIELD UNAPPROVED 423



May 8, 2021

FINANCE COMMISSION AKA WAYS & MEANS COMMISSION AND SPENDING \$15,000,000 FOR NEW FIRE HOUSES AND MORE UNION FIREFIGHTERS/PARAMEDICS...THERE WERE NO COMMENTS



The commission was supposed to discuss the Fire/EMS Task Force's options for service, including abandoning the existing fire house and spending \$11,000,000 building two new firehouses that would increase response times for huge numbers of homes in Wards 2 and 3 plus add 18 Union firefighters-paramedics to the bill for another \$4,500,000 annually.

There wasn't much of a discussion as the large agenda caused Chair Ald. Sue Allen to proclaim there was not enough time for discussions and the members should send her or City Administrator Bob Shelton their comments. Oz Conrad then asked, "What about

residents? Shouldn't they be able to comment? It was decided residents could also send in their comments. Here is Bob Shelton's email:

Conrad later stated that it was stupid not to have a meeting dedicated to just the fire district issue.

EARLY COMMENTS: I filed a Sunshine request for copies of comments sent from Ways and Means members and the public. By Tuesday there were only three, including one that I had sent in the form of an article recently appearing in the newsletter.

This first one is from Ways & Means member Randi Weber and had me scratching my head amazed at how little knowledge she had on the subject that Sue Allen called "good questions."

Sue, re EMS/Fire options,

I'd be interested in seeing breakout of estimated operating expenses over time, especially staffing levels, employee costs/pension obligations.

I understand that firemen are union & very expensive. Don't think T&C police union but situation might encourage it.

Wondered if expected employees are permanent T&C employees or West County EMS/Fire employees.

What about training costs for employees? WC EMS/Fire has expensive training site on Manchester next door to DSW retailer. If T&C had own employees, what's needed for training?

Am concerned about interest level of T&C residents re property taxes. Issue seemed sternly opposed when last discussed by BOA. Given economy, not sure residents are ready for it.

Might make sure people understand what's involved with being annexed by Fire District. Jon Dalton was not an advocate. Don't think can get out of it, once it's a done deal. Not sure how can/cannot control associated costs.

Wondered if anyone serving on task force has experience in negotiating last contract. Skip Mange would be a good resource....thought he had served that role. Wondered if there's a consultant w/that background. Think Webster Groves is building a new firehouse...might have resource(s).

Randi Weber

Let's look at Randi's comments.

1 Looking at long term costs and staffing levels are excellent ideas. Employee costs and pension obligations belong to the Fire District and will be paid in the contract to T&C.

2 The "expected new employees" would be all union firefighters/paramedics and the city would have no control over salaries.

3 Training costs would belong to the Fire District but would be passed along in the annual costs under the contract.

4 Mrs. Weber is correct about residents being concerned. Most residents don't have a clue about this proposal to build two new fire houses for \$10-\$12-m (that we don't need) . The proposal would involve a city property tax for the first time in over 20-years. Homeowner's county property already will be going up in 2021 as it is a reassessment year. This would put new property taxes on top of increased property taxes.

5 Mrs. Weber talks about former Mayor Jon Dalton not being an advocate of the city being annexed by the fire district. This isn't completely true. Dalton is a lobbyist in Jefferson City. In 2006 when the Fire District last attempted an annexation of Town and Country they had been a lobbying client of Dalton in 2005. Dalton kept this mouth shut as the Fire District had firefighters go door to door with petitions to put the annexation on the November ballot. He got involved months later due to strong opposition to the annexation and had the Fire District pull the issue from the ballot.

6 She thinks former mayor and alderman Skip Mange should be involved. When he turned 80 he resigned from the Board of Aldermen mid-term. He was showing signs of fatigue and lack of concentration at meetings. He is now 83. Plus Skip has a record of spending money recklessly.

She also asked since Webster Groves is building a new fire house, should Town and Country look to Webster for a consultant. There was not a consultant issue in W.G. It was how to fit two new and bigger trucks into the station.

Old Orchard Station



New station built in the around 1970s behind City Hall housing fire crews from the fire station in the 100 block of W. Lockwood and the Old Orchard Station.

The first fire station in Webster Groves was in the 100 block of W. Lockwood Avenue in the heart of the business district. The City of Old Orchard had a brick fire station built at the same time around 1900. Old Orchard merged with Webster Groves and W.G. kept and manned both fire stations.

The problem happened in the 1950s when a post-war housing boom came to south Webster. Fire calls were answered from the two original fire stations. The problem was the Frisco Railroad that had a passenger and freight line that ran parallel to Big Bend Blvd going the length of the city. There was just one bridge over the railroad tracks. It was on Salem Ave. A huge area of south Webster including along Rock Hill Road, Clark School and along S. Elm experienced long response times from fire trucks if there were slow freight trains on the Frisco tracks.

The City in the late 1950s built a fire station on S. Elm at Rose Avenue. The problem today with that station was it could not accommodate larger fire trucks. The new station

Mrs. Weber referred to in her email to Sue Allen simply replaces an existing station at the same location and does not change response times.

Three days after Mrs. Weber sent the email to Sue Allen I called her to talk about her concerns and facts. She told me she never wrote an email to anyone. I read it to her and she told me that she did not write it even though it came from her email address.

I sent her a copy of her email that she claimed she never wrote. This caused a concern in general if she should even be voting on this, despite some of the good points the email brought up.

The next email came from a resident who did not have a clue about the issues, but was concerned. I'm not going to identify her, but will use parts of her email.

Sue and Bob

I listened to the meeting you recently held on the Service Options.

My questions are:

1. What are the requirements for calls that come in - is a fire truck required to accompany an ambulance? If not, what is the percentage breakdown of calls that required both a truck and an ambulance or just an ambulance. It sounded in the meeting that ambulance response times were a concern but option 3 light builds an additional station but no ambulance?

In the past the Fire District ran the fire truck on most ambulance calls. There were complaints especially with trucks going to nursing homes with medical staff to assist the paramedics. Many of us felt this was done to show calls for the fire truck, which rarely answered any fire related calls. The Fire District eventually agreed to send the fire truck only on heart attack calls where the 2-person ambulance crew often will have to work on the patient. The truck staff will give them someone who can drive the ambulance to the hospital while both paramedics work on the patient.

Sending a fire truck out on unnecessary runs creates a huge liability issues because fire truck vs car collisions can be fatal. I know. I have worked them as a police officer and off-duty as an investigator for insurance companies.

When I was an alderman there were supposed to be 4-persons assigned to the firetruck and two to the ambulance. I suggested that when they received ambulance calls that involved manpower issues they should have a firefighter/paramedic assigned to the firetruck go with the ambulance. This would keep the firetruck at the firehouse with a required minimum 3-person crew to answer other fire or ambulance calls and reduced liability. My suggestion was ignored by the Fire District.

2. Are any of our existing services contracted or are all the Fire and EMS employees of Town and Country?

Since 1984 after the annexation of house west of Topping Road the city quit providing fire service and signed contracts with the Manchester Fire District (which later became the West County EMS & Fire Protection District). There have not been any city employees for 37 years on a fire truck or ambulance. They are all Union employees of the Fire District. Recently the City took over inspection duties and has a fire marshal who does new construction fire code inspections and annual inspections of businesses and schools.

3. If we chose option 5, what would be the board composition? In the past, fire districts have routinely had two firefighters and one citizen on their board, and I know from auditing these entities their "costs" were ridiculous. If the City chose to be annexed, would the City have any veto power in decisions?

This resident thinks being annexed by the fire district would create a new fire district. She is wrong. It would be part of the Union Controlled West County EMS & FPD. The District has an elected three-person board of directors. They are residents and no firefighters are on the Board of Directors. The City would have ZERO control or input if an annexation passed unless a resident got elected to the Fire District Board.

4. Is there concern/thoughts that a property tax will be needed in the future say now through 5-10 years to compensate for Covid, its after-effects, and just the overall cost of doing business to cover the other operations of the City?

The lost of tax revenue in 2020 and 2021 due to the pandemic has not been discussed concerning the tax/money grab desired by the Fire District.

6. I feel residents move to Town and Country for many reasons, but always expect a high level of service in all areas. I do think it is a hard sell to say the current station (from an outward appearance and what residents have experienced) is obsolete and needs replaced. Is building two new stations the most desirable because of the location of the current facility?

Many of us who successfully fought the annexation attempt in 2006, believe the residents have received good service and the desire of the Fire District for two new fire stations and 18 more Union employees is a waste of money and actually an attempt to steal money from the residents.

We will continue to look at comments received at City Hall on this issue.

OTHER \$\$\$ NEWS Here are some interesting items from our soon to retire finance director, Jean Reitz presentation:

2. Initial 2021 Sales Tax Data Analysis - A review of sales tax data in "real time" is not feasible due to the lag in distribution from the state and the fact some businesses file monthly and others file quarterly. That being said we have enough data (64% of businesses) at this point to generate a comparison between pre-Covid Jan-Feb of 2020 and Jan-Feb of 2021. When comparing business categories we find the following:

Grocery:	+11%
Hardware:	+29%
Home Goods:	+52%
Restaurants:	-21%
General Retail:	-6%

3. New Businesses and Retail Centers - Five new retail businesses are projected to open by end of 3Q of this year.



MAYOR NATION MAKE ONE MOVE TO IMPROVE PUBLIC SAFETY, IMPROVE THE CITY JUSTICE SYSTEM, SUPPORT THE POLICE. IN ANOTHER APPOINTMENT HE DOES EXACTLY THE OPPOSITE.

NEW JUDGE: Here is where Mayor Nation appeared to do everything right. He appointed Mark Gaertner, who was a former staff attorney at Anheuser-Busch and now practices law specializing in personal injury work as a partner in a law firm occupying the last building in Rock Hill, MO on Litzsinger Road. His father was a St. Louis Circuit Court judge and later a judge on the Missouri Court of Appeals. His brother is a former St. Louis County Circuit Court judge and is on the Missouri Court of Appeals.



What makes Gaertner unique compared with the ethically challenged retiring judge Rick “The Judge Whisperer” Brunk and Chesterfield prosecutor Tom “Hire a Lawyer and I’ll reduce your charge to a non-Criminal Offense” Engelmeyer, is that he does not do criminal defense work and he does not have a part time job on any other municipal court. Hopefully that will reduce the “Old take care of your buddy lawyer” system.

Mayor Nation mentioned this at the meeting saying:

Mark Gaertner

- 1 Does not practice criminal defense work,
- 2 Does not work for another municipality as a judge or prosecutor

Mayor Nation added that the appointment of Gaertner should:

Eliminate any conflicts of interest

Gain respect of law enforcement (he could have said restore)

The middle of Litzsinger Road and the middle of Bremerton Road are the city limits of Rock Hill and Brentwood. His office is on the Rock Hill side that make Gaertner more of a “regular guy” Of course he lives in Ladue that is the St. Louis Kingdom of Rich Snobs, but it is an advantage that he will not be presiding over cases involving friends and neighbors if he lived in Chesterfield, like Brunk and Engelmeyer.

NOW FOR THE BAD NEWS: For all the reasons to appoint Mark Gaertner judge, Mayor Bob Nation forgot them, disregarded them and let the safety of the public be damned. He reappointed Tim “Hire a lawyer, get a great deal” Engelmeyer to another 4-year term.

If you are unaware how Engelmeyer cares more about local lawyers making money as defense attorneys than the public’s safety, please read the article I wrote before his last reappointment

Here are two well known St. Louisans who were very drunk and involved in crashes. In the case of defense attorney Scott Rosenblum a cross over, wrong side of the road head on crash that sent the other driver to the hospital and Cardinal broadcaster Dan McLaughlin, who was falling down drunk in his first DWI arrest and then was involved in

a crash and falling down drunk unable to open his car door for his second while he was on probation for the first. AT the time he was on probation for his earlier DWI on I-64. Engelmeyer did not ask the probation be revoked and Brunk didn't do it on his own. What's the point of having probation if the person can keep breaking the law?

Despite strong police evidence in the Rosenblum case, not only didn't Engelmeyer take the case to trial. He reduced to the DWI to a non-alcohol offense.

The new Chesterfield City Judge now no longer works at other cities. Brunk was also judge in Wildwood. Engelmeyer is the judge in Creve Coeur, prosecutor in Chesterfield, Valley Park, Des Peres and Fenton. Plus he does defense work in cities where he is not part of the court system. Nation thought no defense work or other court jobs in other cities was a good idea for the judge, but apparently it was fine for the prosecutor.

It was a surprise that the vote was 8-0. If the vote was a month earlier there would have been at least 3-NO votes for Engelmeyer. Ben Keathley, Michelle Ohley and Tom DeCampi had been vocal in the past about the city needing a change in the muni court. However, Keathley ran for mayor and lost. Ohley lost reelection in April. Had Keathley won Engelmeyer would not be looking at a reappointment.

Councilmen Michael Moore and Dan Hurt apparently are big supporters of unethical prosecutors and almost no standard of justice in the city court as they quickly moved and seconded Engelmeyer for reappointment.

The vote was 8-0 with the surprise being Tom DeCampi voting for a guy he voted against four years ago.


There are still plenty of citizens, resident, voters who are trying to avoid crowds. Chesterfield will have very reduced sitting at meetings.
