GARDEN CLUB PRESIDENT THREATENS TO SUE OVER NEWSLETTER

ARTICLES: I'm sure nothing has appeared on this website that has cause Claire Chosid to lose any money. Some of the information we have posted about the Mason Ridge Garden Club and where it was at the Mason Ridge School was not made up, but came from former members of the club who have quit over the years. Mrs. Chosid apparently thinks it is a good idea to threaten Town and Country residents.

John,

I previously wrote to you regarding the false and defamatory statements you made regarding the Mason Ridge Garden Club and me, as published in your "Ex-Alderman Newsletter 484 & Unapproved Chesterfield Newsletter 429." Since my last email, I have consulted with, though not yet retained, legal counsel to assist me in taking action regarding your false and defamatory statements. I have been advised that should we choose to file suit, success on a defamation claim is likely.

Missouri's laws regarding defamation are clear and simple: a published false statement made by an individual who knew or should have known their statement was false, coupled with damage to the target of the defamation. Your statements regarding Mason Ridge Garden Club being "kicked out" of working at Mason Ridge are demonstrably false. Statements about the work ethic of the Mason Ridge Garden Club damage its public reputation and may act as a deterrent to future funding given to the Club from the entities to which the Club provides its volunteer services. You know that your statements are untrue, or at least you should, given your long vendetta against both the Club and me.

Should I be forced to file suit on behalf of myself and the Garden Club, we would seek not only compensatory damages for your defamation, but also attorney's fees and punitive damages sufficient to deter others from making statements like yours in the future. It is my preference to avoid suit, however.

Consider this letter to be a formal demand that within fourteen (14) days of receipt of this correspondence, that you issue a formal, published retraction of the allegations made against the club, along with a formal, public apology for your defamatory statements.

Ms. Chosid's group has the name of a Town and Country Park. She is the leader of the group. She uses city funds for materials for their special projects and T-shirts. The city park has a sign with their name on it. For these reasons she and the group are fair game to public comment. I have not commented on anything other than her position as president of the Mason Ridge Garden Club that accepts money from Town and Country.

Sometime ago the group problems keeping members, as volunteers kept quitting. We reported this. Then there was tax money going to the group. This is an article from our September 27, 2012 newsletter (#62)



BOARD OF ALDERMAN MEETING JUNE 28, 2021: After seeing how short the agenda was I bet a city staffer the meeting would last 12-15 minutes. I lost it lasted 17 minutes.



MAYOR UNAWARE (momentarily) OF ALL THE BUILDINGS THE CITY OWNS.

During the meeting resolutions to approve the purchase and delivery of 1,000 tons of road salt for winter snow and ice operations was quickly approved.

At the end of the meeting the new mayor, Dr. Charles Rehm, asked, “Where do we store all this road salt?” The answer is posted on the city’s web site along with photos of the city hall and fire house. It’s the salt shortage building where the Fire District wants the city to build a second firehouse.

The mayor has only been on board two months but you would expect him to know about these three buildings and the Longview Farmhouse. “Of course” was his response when City Administrator Bob Shelton began explaining about the building.



Liquor Licenses: A number of Liquor Licenses were renewed including one for John Mineo's. The license is now in the name of the widow of John Mineo, Sr. and not his son John Mineo, Jr., who is the general manager of John Mineo's restaurant on Clayton Road at Mason in Town and Country. John Mineo is also a CONVICTED FEDERAL FELON. Felons can't hold liquor licenses in Missouri. This is a portion from a press release from then U.S. Attorney for the Eastern District of Missouri Catherine Hanaway about guilty pleas by former St. Louis high school basketball coach Floyd Irons and Mineo. Mineo had to pay restitution to victims of \$653,147. (The "John Doe" in the press release is Mike Noll, who got 20-months and \$1,032,000 to pay in restitution.)

St. Louis, Missouri: Irons, and John Mineo, Jr., a local restaurant operator, pled guilty to wire and mail fraud charges in connection with a million dollar mortgage fraud scheme, United States Attorney Catherine L. Hanaway announced today.

During the course of this scheme, Irons was employed by the St. Louis Public Schools. Mineo operated his restaurant, and was employed as a mortgage broker at Midwest Mortgage Consultants, LLC.

According to statements made in court during the plea, during late 2005, Irons and associate John Doe met with John Mineo, Jr. and told him of their scheme to purchase residential real estate for investment purposes. They told him that they would obtain mortgage loans for these residential purchases through him at the mortgage brokerage company where he was employed, Midwest Mortgage Consultants, LLC., for 10% or more of the home sales price to be "kicked back" to them. Additionally, Irons and John Doe told Mineo that Irons would be identified as the sole purchaser of these residential properties, but that Irons and John Doe were in business together, and that the mortgage loans would actually be paid by John Doe.



If you consider yourself a “Law & Order” type person you might want to think twice about paying for overpriced meals from a place run by a convicted felon.

TOWN & COUNTRY POLICE, FIRE, EMS COMMISSION MEETING



MORE BS BY THE SHOVEL FULL FOR CLOSING THE CITY FIRE STATION AND BUILDING TWO NEW ONES: Ald. Ryan Mortland was at it again. Selling a group of people (Police, Fire, EMS Commission) who mostly have not been following an important issue that will if he gets his way hand the fire union 18 unneeded jobs and

costing the citizens of Town and Country ten of millions of dollars to build two new fire stations that are not needed.

At the meeting on Tuesday after, I have to admit, that it really sounds as if City Administer Bob Shelton is trying to sell the expansion judging for his presentation missing many facts.

Here is some of the missing information:

They are selling the point that Town and Country receives more mutual aid responses from neighboring fire departments, but they don't mention that car crashes and car fires on West I-64 to Mason Road and NB I-270 to I-64 require dispatchers to send neighboring fire/ambulances vehicles reference providing the fastest response times.

The current number of ambulance and fire truck calls do not justify two new stations and 18 more firefighters/Paramedics. (4.4 ambulance calls a day and 1.2 fire truck calls a day)

No one on this commission was told the vote of the Ways and Means Commission (7-1 against abandoning the current fire station and building two more) and the reasons for it. Nor were they told how the opinions of 6 aldermen at a recent retreat meeting who favored no new fire houses. The finance report from retiring Finance Director Pam Reitz showing the city could not afford what the Fire District and Ald. Mortland want and how the city's reserve would vanish in two years,



Bob Shelton said one plan was for two new fire houses with one having an ambulance and a fire truck and the other having either one ambulance or one fire truck. Fire District Fire Chief Jeff Sadtler spoke up and said a fire truck would be best because ambulances can't fight fires. However, the city experiences four times more ambulance calls than calls needing a fire truck. The big difference would be more union firefighters.

4 for the fire truck and only two for the ambulance. Also, the city has an over population of nursing homes.

Mortland, Shelton, the fire chief and eventually commission members began calling a fire house that opened in 1991 as old. The newest fire station in the City of St. Louis was opened in 1974. There is nothing old about the Town and Country Fire Station.

City Administrator Bob Shelton said the last time there was a property tax in Town and Country was in the 1970s. He could not be more wrong! In 1974 Town and Country changed from being a Village to being a "City." The reason was that Villages could only have real estate taxes up to 50-cents per \$100 assessed. The Village of T&C was going broke and had to raise the real estate taxes, not get rid of them. Some staffer watching the meeting on zoom apparently emailed Shelton and he corrected himself later in the meeting saying the last real estate tax was in 1996.

Misinformation flowed at the meeting, just like all the meetings that Ald. Mortland has chaired. While the commission did not vote on this it was clear the members, Ald. Mortland and to some extent Bob Shelton were under the influence of the Fire Union controlled Fire District.

Mortland closed out the fire task force report part of the meeting by saying "Health and public safety is the primary driver." Mortland's subdivision got him elected to counteract adverse actions by the Board of Aldermen that effected their subdivision. Now Mortland wants to close the fire house that is a block away from his subdivision, increase response times and raise all his neighbors' taxes.

IN OTHER REPORTS: Police Chief Jim Cavins announced that Lt. John Flanagan was retiring after 28-years and had been the officer with the longest time with the department. (The 35-year veteran officers like Bob Arthur, Gary Hoelzer and Pat Kranz all retired in the last four years.) He did not mention how Flanagan was named with others in a lawsuit over harassment and sexual harassment filed by the then only female officer on the department. The City settled the lawsuit to avoid going to trial. The sergeant who was sexually harassing the officer soon resigned. (The lawsuit is on our homepage)



He mentioned that they have 11 applicants for a police officer opening. Several years ago well paid suburban departments could have as many as 50 applicants for an opening. However, in recent years fewer people want to be cops.

HOWEVER, THIS IS WHAT HE FORGET TO MENTION. Chief Cavins did not mention that Officers Cook and O'Bryan have been on light duty due to on-duty injuries for over a month after having their cruiser involved in a three-vehicle crash on I-270 caused by an inattentive driver.
