**NEW MAYOR MAKES MEETINGS MORE OPEN TO PUBLIC REVIEW; HE CANCELLED FUTURE PRE-ALDERMANIC MEETING WORK SESSIONS:** Mayor Charles Rehm announced at Monday's Board of Aldermen meeting that he would be discontinuing the pre meeting Work Sessions. We say "Good for Mayor Rehm."

Until the pandemic and zoom meetings there was no record of the "work session" meetings. The city clerk took no minutes. The problem with these meetings and the "agenda review" meetings in Chesterfield (which is the same thing) is often issues and pending legislation are hotly debated with no record of what was said.

Issues should be discussed in public. Now that City Clerk Ashley McNamara and administrative assistant Morgan Kuepfert are televising the Aldermanic meetings the public can view legislative sessions from home live or later from recordings on the city's website.

**THIS MIGHT BE A FIRST IN THE LAST 20 YEARS:** There are four men on the Town and Country Board of Aldermen. This last meeting I immediately noticed something I had never seen before.

The two years I served on I made it a point to dress like the residents in the audience. I rarely saw any of them wearing ties and I never did. Recently Dr. Matt Reuter would show up without a tie, but that was about it.

On July 12 none of the men on the Board of Aldermen were wearing ties. Now if we could work on the mayor.

**A GATE TO A DRIVEWAY ON MASON ROAD:** Between Clayton Road and Manchester Road there are eight gates along Mason Road. Four gates are for subdivisions and four are for private drives.

The new homeowner of a brand-new house at 1926 S. Mason wants to make it nine gates. James Redingshafer appeared at the BOA meeting wanting a conditional use permit for a gate.

Mayor Rehm was concerned that the gate needed to be back far enough so UPS and FEDEX trucks can pull into the driveway and not block the two lane Mason Road. Redingshafer said he would be sure to take care of that adding, “My wife’s best friend is the UPS driver.”

Mayor Rehm then asked about a berm built in front of the house. He was concerned about boulders on the street side of the berm which would cause extensive damage to a car that swerved to avoid a child or an animal. Mr. Redingshafer said the position of the large rocks was the work of the landscaper and he would talk to him about it.

Redingshafer knows about code violations. He and his father, James Redingshafer, run Artemis Holdings and they have been cited in the past for code violations while rehabbing apartments in Richmond Heights. It appears as if he is avoiding that in Town and Country. The newly built 7,500 sq 22-room house was listed at \$2,495,000. It is on a 1.1 acre lot.

Once off the street there is a circle drive in front of the house.



**PAVILION AT DELMAR DAYSPRING BAPTIST CHURCH:** Also at the beginning of the Aldermanic meeting there was a public hearing and later a first reading of bill for a 20x40 Pavilion on the church grounds. Mayor Rehm said he received questions of nearby residents concerning noise and lighting.

The church's pastor said the only lighting would be under the roof and not directed outward. He also said there would be no speaker locations in the pavilion and the most

would be a DVD player. He added the pavilion was only for small gatherings and not major events.

**OFFICER JOSH HAMEL RECEIVES ANOTHER AWARD:** Officer Josh Hamel has quite a record with the Town and Country Police. On July 12 he received The Chief's Commendation for his actions getting a Maryville University female student not to commit suicide. Officer Hamel spoke to her for over 20 minutes while she knelt on an athletic field holding a knife against her throat claiming she wanted to die.

Officer Hamel convinced her to put down the knife and then stayed with her until medical help arrived.

In 2018 Officer Hamel received another commendation. On February 3<sup>rd</sup> 2018 Officer Hamel, Officer Dan Duddleston and Sgt. Jeff McNutt on the night shift entered a burning house, woke up the residents and led them to safety.

Hamel received awards from Mothers Against Drunk Drivers and has had several years of perfect attendance with the police department, never missing a shift. Hamel was with the Chesterfield PD for 3-years before coming to Town and Country in 2013.

He now has an off-duty job for the last year of selling real estate in St. Charles County.

**BREAKING NEWS TOWN AND COUNTRY ARRESTS PRETEND UBER DRIVER OUTSIDE OF STRAUBS IN MASON VILLAGE PARKING LOT FOR SEX ASSAULT ON A PASSENGER AND UNLAWFUL POSSESSION OF A FIREARM:** An 18-year-old female Uber passenger reported being sexual assaulted by a driver who had given her his cell number to call for rides, while she being taken to West County from University City.

She resisted the sexual contact, then asked the driver to briefly stop at Straubs as she needed to pick something up to take with her. Once inside Straubs she called 9-1-1.

The driver, Mark D. Hall 31 of St. Louis was arrested for Sexual Misconduct and Unlawful Possession of a Firearm. A few hours later the County Prosecutor's Office issued felony charges for Attempted Sodomy and Firearm in Possession of Convicted Felon. Bond was set at \$50,000.

The facts supporting this belief are as follows: Victim reported to the police that Defendant picked her up and was driving her to work. While they were in the car, victim stated that the Defendant began rubbing her legs. She told him no. Defendant kept rubbing her legs and her vagina over the clothing. Defendant kissed the victim and started placing his hand under her clothing trying to reach her vagina. Victim was able to stop the Defendant. The Defendant had a gun displayed in the handle of the passenger door which caused the victim to be afraid. The Defendant is a convicted felon in that he plead guilty to the felony of Burglary 2nd Degree under Cause Number 14SL-CR09725-01 in St. Louis County, MO.

The Defendant is currently on probation in St. Louis County under Cause #14SL-CR09725-01. He also has prior arrests for resisting arrest and assault. Given criminal history of the Defendant and the nature of the offense, I believe the Defendant is a danger to the victim and community.



**DO GOVERNMENTS GET THEIR MONEY BACK FOR JULY 4<sup>TH</sup> ADS WHEN THE PAPER ARRIVES NINE DAYS AFTER THE 4<sup>TH</sup> OF JULY?** Last week we reported how the United States Postal Service delivered my copy of the weekly newspaper WEST NEWSMAGAZINE June 9 edition of the WEST NEWSMAGAZINE 27 days late.

This last week was a little better. **I got the June 23 edition on July 13 or 20 days after the date on the masthead.** It was an improvement of 7 days. But what troubled me is there were ads from different city governments for Fourth of July events. The ads were for people to know about the events a week before the holiday weekend. The ads showed up at my house nine days after the events were held.

Who paid for the ads? You and I did as taxpayers especially paying sales taxes in different towns in West County, like Chesterfield.

I sent an email to the City of Chesterfield asking how much the ad cost and if the money is being refunded by WEST NEWSMAGAZINE. The ad cost \$660 and the bill was paid by the city on July 14.

I called West NEWSMAGAZINE and was told to get a refund a client had to contact their salesperson. I was told this has been a recent problem with people at the downtown St. Louis Postal warehouse ignoring bulk non-first class mail.



WEST NEWSMAGAZINE should not be accepting date sensitive advertisements until the Postal Service returns to delivering timely services. Cities should be aware and advertise Public Hearings at least 30 days in advance if they are going to continue to use WEST NEWSMAGAZINE.

**MENTAL HEALTH POLICE RELATED AMBULANCE TRIPS FROM CHESTERFIELD TO MERCY HOSPITAL UP FOR 2021:** It seems in 2021 we have been seeing more and more Monarch ambulance emergency calls that were police related involving trips to the Mercy Hospital Mental Health Department. The information we receive show 2019 and 2020 numbers are about the same. However, so far in 2021 they are up 25%.

Here are the stats from Ast. Chief Nick Harper of the Monarch Fire Protection District who is in charge of the district's ambulance service:

The numbers that Mr. Hoffmann has requested are below. They are specifically for Monarch FPD and Chesterfield PD when the PD called us. The numbers do not include any patients that were successful in

suicide on scene. Those patients were not transported. I would ask Chesterfield PD for the numbers for successful suicides in your time frame.


