NEW HOUSES COMING TO TOWN & COUNTRY: Here some of the new homes before the Architectural Review Board.

12824 Topping Acres: The new house replaces a mid-century modern that currently has vegetation growing on the gutters and roof. The house is only 6,700 sq feet but looks like it could replace the Lords' house in a remake of the Philadelphia Story as it has an existing large pool and 1,756 sq ft pool deck for the Katherine Hepburn and Jimmy Stewart to swim in.

13221 Stonecourt (Barrett Station Road) This one is actually the first house in the Greystone subdivision n Lot 1. I called the T&C building inspector after I saw the plans, because it has a one bay front facing garage and 2-bays on the side of the house.



It's a 5,100 sq ft house on a 1.3 acre lot.




Front facing garage entrances are illegal on new houses in T&C except in a subdivision next to the Town & Country Crossing Shopping Center where the city rezoned an empty lot for commercial expansion to residential with houses on tiny lots with front facing garages. This was done with government sticking its hand where it didn't belong. It was done to allow the shopping center developers to sell of the property to keep from going bankrupt during the 2008-09 recession when only 40% of their shopping center was rented.

I was told that sometimes people will try and claim that a single front facing garage is not for cars, but for riding lawnmowers plus carts and wheelbarrows for work in the garden. I was also told that the city normally claims it is still a garage.

I DON'T THINK THIS GUY IS GOING TO SHOW UP FOR COURT IN TOWN AND COUNTRY OR CHESTERFIELD. We last wrote about Sultan Alhamed in October of 2020, when he was arrested on September 7, 2020 for DWI, Speeding and No Auto Insurance by the Town and Country Police. At the time he was living in the 400 block of Iron Lantern Lane in Ballwin. 11 months earlier Town and Country got him for Driving While Revoked and No Auto Insurance.

Alhamed also has cases pending in Ballwin (Possession of Marijuana) and Chesterfield. In Chesterfield he was charged with Domestic Assault and twice with Property Destruction. At the time in 2018 he was living at 14578 Bexhill Court in Chesterfield.

He has court dates in August in both Town and Country and Chesterfield. **I PREDICT HE WON'T SHOW UP.** This might have something to do with it: On May 27, 2021 he was arrested in North County by the County Police for Murder and Armed Criminal Action and his being held in the County Jail with NO BOND. Here are the facts in the case:


Count: 01 MURDER 2ND DEGREE-CLASS A FELONY

Count: 02 ARMED CRIMINAL ACTION-CLASS U FELONY

The facts supporting this belief are as follows:

Defendant was angry with victim for waking him up in the middle of the night. Defendant grabbed victim by the neck and strangled victim. Defendant then grabbed a knife and stabbed victim multiple times. Victim suffered multiple stab wounds. Victim did not survive the attack. Victim was pronounced deceased on scene by responding officers. Defendant admitted on both officer body cam and post Miranda that he strangled, stabbed, and hit victim.

I believe that the defendant poses a danger to the community or to any other person because defendant killed victim without provocation

TOWN AND COUNTRY ORDINANCE WOULD BAN DEVELOPERS FROM PLANTING INVASIVE TREES: The bill was first read at the July 12 Board of Aldermen meeting and would ban the planting of Invasive Trees and other plants on the Missouri Conservation Commission Invasive Tree and Plant list.

Included on that list are Bradford Pear Trees and Honeysuckle. Most recently developer Rob Rehnquist would clear cut existing trees that the City had banned in his permits and replace them with the Bradford Pear trees.

Here are two of many cheap Bradford Pear trees that Rehnquist planted in a new development on South Mason Road.



Here are some highlights from the two-page bill:

PLANT UNIT - A set quantity of canopy trees, understory trees, evergreen trees, and shrubs. **Plants listed as an invasive species by the Missouri Department of Conservation shall not be permitted to be included as part of a plant unit.**

Section 2. Title IV. Land Use, Chapter 405, the Zoning Regulations, of the City of Town and Country Municipal Code, specifically Section 405.336.H is hereby amended as follows: (additions shown as underline)

405.336 Residential Tree Protection and Removal Standards.

405.336.H Recommended Tree List. The following list of trees, while not **all** inclusive, shall be considered desirable by the City of Town and Country for the purpose of planting, preservation and/or replacement. **No trees shall be planted that are listed as an invasive species by the Missouri Department of Conservation.**

410.200.A.16. Landscaping.

- a. No planting shall be installed at the subdivision entrance which obscures the vision of exiting or oncoming traffic.
- b. The City may require ground cover appropriate to insure proper runoff if the Public Works Director recommends such.
- c. The City may require the clearing of underbrush, may require sodding, seeding, and other landscaping improvements in common ground where land has been altered.
- d. No plants shall be installed that are listed as an invasive species by the Missouri Department of Conservation.

GATHERING PLACES: Thursday evening July 15

Jon Dalton proclaimed the Town Square would be a community gathering place. Developer Bob Brinkman before the commercial area was built promised a high-end restaurant and claimed to have signed a deal with Clementine's Ice Cream Shop.

That was in 2018. In February of 2021 Brinkman announced the restaurant was still coming possibly open by August. The space is empty and the Pace Property Rental sign is still on the door.

Also promised for an August opening was a wine bar. They have the sign up and nothing has been done inside. There were people gathering to have their nails done, but no one was walking, sitting or gathering in the park like area.



THE START OF THE COUNCIL MEETING: It was a good night for awards to start the meeting. The agenda was short.





CHESTERFIELD STILL TRYING TO KEEP HANDICAPPED PEOPLE OUT ON COUNCIL NIGHTS: If you remember for three years in a row every summer the City of Chesterfield staff turned a blind eye to the fact that vines were growing over the handicapped handrails to the handicap entrance of city hall from the handicap parking area.

The City now keeps the vines trimmed. But they are now doing something almost as bad. They have a handicap parking area, On Council nights there is an electric cart available to use to get up the ramp from the parking spaces, plus the handrail.

Here is the new change. Once you get to the handicapped door entrance, it is LOCKED. This is not just “we forgot to unlock it” because for the last three meetings it has been locked. The City offices close at 5pm but the City Hall remains open on nights there are meetings and court, unless you are trying to get in the handicap door.



JUST WHEN YOU THOUGHT THE END WAS NEAR: The announcement that mask would no longer be required for people smart enough to get vaccinated followed by the full opening of restaurants, theaters, stadiums and parks has lasted about two weeks when things started to change.

Thanks in part to the brilliant people both in the metro area and out-state who have refused to get free vaccine shots, COVID-19 is on the rise again. In the last week the Metro COVID-19 TASK Force made up of medical professionals is recommending masks be worn inside and a return to social distancing.

On Wednesday County Executive Sam Page announced that the County's COVID-19 positivity rate is back above 10% with an average of 190 cases a day. This seemed like a prelude to a County Health Order.

As we done consistently, we are, and will continue to operate in conformance with the County Health orders.


