TOWN AND COUNTRY RESIDENTS ON VACATION, BURGLARS CUT PHONE LINE, ALARM COMPANY DOESN'T CALL THE POLICE AND BURGLARS GET AWAY WITH \$392,000 WORTH OF PROPERTY. HOMEOWNER SUING ALARM COMPNAY. The entire lawsuit is too long to include in this edition of our newsletter, but it has been posted on our website. *Chen v Hackett Security*

Here is our lawyer's synopsis of the suit and some additional info.

The Chens had \$392,000.00 worth of stuff stolen in a burglary in November, 2018 while they were out of the country. They contracted with Hackett Security to monitor their home while the system was up and running. The burglars cut the phone line, thus, no signal, so no alarm. The Chens think that Hackett should have called the T&C Police when they discovered the phone line was not working. It looks like Hackett's insurance company hired Brown & James to handle the case. Hackett Security maintains that their contract with the Chens does not require them to notify anyone if the phone line is not working, and they have other contractual affirmative defenses. It would be a regular old contract dispute case except I guess for the amount of money involved. And, Hackett maintains that if the Chens received any money from their insurance company, it should offset any amount that Hackett would be responsible for. A side note, a now deceased Lt. Col. James Hackett with the St. Louis City Police Department (he was an Assistant Chief) served as an Executive Vice President of the security company, founded by his son, Michael until his death.

Back in the early 1970s in between being a radio disc jockey and going to the police academy, I spent 18 months as a police dispatcher for the Creve Coeur Police Department. We had over 100 alarm boxes on the wall from houses in Creve Coeur, Town and Country and some homes in unincorporated Creve Coeur (St. Louis County). The alarm boxes would sound and had two lights...one for an alarm and one for "trouble" such as a phonenumber being cut or out of service. We dispatched officers to both types of alarms. In bad thunderstorms was the only time we didn't dispatch officers on

“trouble” alarms as the dispatch area was a sea of flashing red lights and deafening buzzes from the alarm boxes. However, one time we caught burglars breaking into a drug store on Olive Bld during a thunderstorm. The alarm sounded as a regular “alarm” and we did not ignore it despite all the others sounding due to lightning effecting the phonelines.

NEW MAYOR IS LIKE THE OLD MAYOR WHEN IT COMES TO POURING MONEY DOWN THE MONEY PIT KNOWN AS THE TOWN SQUARE: The Draft for the 2022 Town and Country budget is out. Guess what? For the fourth straight year the overall budget, thanks in a big part due to the costs of the Town Square Project, is in deficit RED. Despite this our new mayor, Dr. Charles Rehm wants to have a new project for the Town Square, luckily the project, a statue to honor veterans and First Responders is being paid for by an individual.

How about new projects once the budget is all in the black? Or is responsible spending too much to expect?



If you look closely the administration (city hall operations) and the police department are getting fewer funds budgeted in 2022 than in 2021.

Town and Country's budget reserve has been sinking for a number of years. It is supposed to not fall below 50% of a total annual budget. In 2021 it was down to 59%.

This is from the city.



The City does have a “piggy bank” of savings set aside to help balance the budget or pay for large capital projects. The largest and most flexible source of reserves is the General Fund Balance.

The policy of the City has been to maintain a minimum General Fund balance of 50% of the General Fund budget. The current 2021 GF balance is at 59%.

What does this have to do with the Town Square?

The mayor wants to put a statue honoring veterans and first responders. **That’s a hard to imagine statue, maybe it will be an infantry man, wearing a firefighters’ helmet while holding a radar gun.**

Even if it is being paid for by a donation, there are costs including installation and maintenance. My only point is to do residents a favor and wait until the deficits have left the budget before spending more money on new projects.

NO GASOLINE FOR A WHILE AT WATERWAY...JUST CAR WASHES: The gas pumps have been removed and the tanks dug up at the Waterway Car Wash and gas station at Clayton Road and Woods Mill. We have been told it will be 4-to-6 weeks before you can fill up and get a car wash. Right now it is just exterior car washes.

When they reopen they will no longer sell BP gasoline. It will be an independent Waterway brand. That’s good. I have boycotted BP gas since they killed a number of

their employees and millions of fish and animals from their unsafe operation of an off-shore oil well that exploded and poured oil into the Gulf off Louisiana.

WINE DRINKERS FILLING THE TOWN SQUARE PARKING LOT, BUT SAW ONLY TWO PEOPLE TOWN SQUARE PARK AREA: I received this email from a regular reader of the newsletter last week:

John, I have to tell you my experience at the "Town Square" in T&C!!!

Last Saturday I dropped my son and his wife off at 2:00PM at the Wine Bar - and there had to be 75 or more cars on the lot!!!

Amazing that booze has put some life and business in the Town Square folly!!!

I warned her that the nail salon draws a surprising number of people, but I'd check it out in the 2 o'clock hour on the next Saturday. I was then on October 30 and was amazed at the number of cars on the west side of the parking lot.

Clearly the Wild Crush Wine BARn was drawing customers. The Wine Barn does not have regular food service but does have a full bar to go with the wine service which should increase the police department's DWI arrest numbers.



But despite all the cars, we saw just two people in the Town Square park area.



PARKWAY SCHOOL DISTRICT ELEMENTARY TEACHING ASSISTANT AT HENRY SCHOOL INDICTED ON MULTIPLY CHILD PORN CHARGES:

Connor Brueggemann, was indicted in October with the Federal Grand Jury indictment filed on October 27, 2021 for possession and obtaining some really gross child pornography. He was 24 at the time of his arrest on State charges of Promoting Child Pornography 1st Degree in July of 2020. At the time of the July 2020 arrest he had a Ballwin address. He was fired immediately by Parkway after the 2020 arrest.



Connor Brueggemann

Brueggemann had worked during the 2019-20 school year as a teaching assistant at the Parkway School District Henry Elementary School on Henry Road. The school serves children living in parts of Town and Country, Chesterfield, Manchester and Ballwin.

CONNOR BRUEGGEMANN,

the defendant herein, did knowingly possess material that contained an image of child pornography that was produced using materials that traveled in interstate and foreign commerce, to wit, Samsung SM-G960U, said electronic device having being produced outside of Missouri and therefore having traveled in interstate and foreign commerce, and said electronic device contained child pornography, including by not limited to, the following:

- 1) "gMthjRAb_1.jpg"- a graphic image file that depicts a minor female in lascivious display of her genitals and engaged in sadistic or masochistic abuse;
- 2) "7c1ExY4D.jpg"- a graphic image file that depicts a minor female engaged in anal-genital sexual intercourse with an adult male;
- 3) "cREFCYbD_1.jpg" – a graphic image file that depicts a minor female in oral-genital sexual intercourse with a dog.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 2252A(a)(5)(B).

HERE ARE THE HIGHLIGHTS PARKS COMMITTEE MEETING: With a push by Councilman Gary Sriperumbudoor, AKA Gary Budoor, for the city to build a cricket field, someone is still going to have to pay to use it. The city had agreed to look at building a cricket field over a year ago, but the cricket players losing their field in St. Charles County were upset at the fees the city wanted to maintain the field and withdrew their request.

The group wanting the cricket field was made up heavily of India nationals who were also Budoor's strongest base in his 5-vote victory for the Council over an incumbent.

Budoor also would like the city becoming involved with Diwali Festival, another event from India. Here is a capsule of what happened at the Parks Committee meeting on Wednesday October 28.

No City involvement in Diwali festivals. Tom McCarthy, Parks Director, will meet with Cricket Club reps to see if they will agree to Chesterfield's terms for the use of new cricket fields. (The report will come back to our committee.) In prior years rental fees and the fact that rentals would be open to different groups were the issues.

CITY COUNCIL



CITY WILL NOT HAVE A MASK REQUIREMENT. City Attorney Chris Graville told the Council during the Agenda Review meeting that the County Council 30-day Mask Mandate has expired so the city no longer will have to require masks be worn in City Hall and can stop having video Zoom meetings (which of course completely stops the transfer of the COVID virus and makes the meeting available to all of the public at any time).

Graville said the last mandate requiring masks was issued by the Health Director (and approved by the Council) . The County Council could vote in a new Mask Mandate at any time including at their regular Tuesday night meeting.

Besides no mask requirements there will be meetings at City Hall again. This was from City Administrator Mike Geisel the day after the meeting.

I have been advised that the County Mask mandate has expired. Effective immediately, masks are no longer universally mandated within Chesterfield City facilities.

their big business is breakfast and they are apparently going after the early morning alcoholic trade.




