### **LYNN WRIGHT, THE MASTER WASTER OF TAX MONEY, TRIES FOR A**

**COMEBACK:** On December 28, the last day of filing for the April 5 Municipal election, Lynn Wright the former alderwoman tied to some of the greatest wastes of money in the history of Town and Country government filed to run against incumbent Barbara Ann Hughes. Wright was on the Board of Aldermen during the period of the Missouri Auditor's Office review of Town and Country spending.

Here are some of the highlights of Wright's time as an elected official:

\* She was a big supporter of the "Mayor Jon Dalton Town Square" that went \$4.5-million over budget. Many believed that Dalton wanted the Town Square built and then buy the property across the street next to the fire house and build a new city hall. Dalton had a clear conflict of interest as the builder of the Town Square was a client of Dalton's Lobbying firm. The two were connected with other major projects including the Town and Country Crossing Shopping Center and a nursing home on Woods Mill Road.

\* She cost taxpayers \$200,000 when Dalton would not use eminent domain for property to build an oversized sidewalk called a "trail" from Clayton Road down Mason Road to Queeny Park. Originally that was going to cost the city \$20,000 with the majority of the

money (\$220,000) coming from a Muni League Parks Grant. When that died she wanted to build the Large Sidewalk to Nowhere” that would basically involve resurfacing over the existing sidewalk that stops long before reaching Queeny Park.

\* When the city began construction of the “Sidewalk to Nowhere” (\$340,000 of City money) by tearing up the existing road shoulder and sidewalk St. Louis County Highway Department immediately ordered the work stopped. Mason Road is a County Road and the city never got permission from the County for the project.

\* She voted to take over the I-64 and Mason Road interchange from MoDot, relandscape it and maintain it. The cost \$152,000 for landscaping State of Mo property plus \$24,000 a year maintaining it.

\* She and Jon “Ethics Violator” Dalton had a great dislike for the two reform alderwomen in Ward-2 Lindsey Butler and Tiffany Frautschi. They found Laura Baer to run against Frautschi. The campaign included false statements by former police chiefs, including one who in writing gave a rebuttal to the false statements. Frautschi won with over 70% of the vote.

### **TWO RACES OUT OF FOUR WARDS IN CHESTERFIELD:**

As we reported in our last edition William Wu of White Birch Valley Court filed to run against incumbent Mary Ann Mastorakos.

On the last day of filing (December 28) for the April Municipal Elections Tamarah Wagner of Eatherton Road filed in Ward-4 to run against Merrell Hansen, the current chair of the city's Planning Commission.

Wagner ran for one of two seats on the Rockwoods School Board in April of 2021 and lost, finishing third out of seven candidates. She financed her campaign to the tune of \$17, 943. She did receive a small technical fine from the Ethics Commission for \$120.

There was a complaint posted on reddit website that she was illegally posting campaign signs.

A witness observed the suspects inside and told them to leave, after which they did. The witness observed the two subjects to be wearing bags. Within minutes, the Chesterfield Police made contact with Defendant Stidmon and a juvenile suspect, and found them to be in possession of the stolen credit card as well as the stolen property from inside the nursing home. The bag that the suspect was wearing contained a firearm.

I believe the defendant poses a danger to the community as he entered a nursing home while armed with a weapon and stole property.






