MAYOR REHM DECIDES TO RETURN TO ZOOM MEETINGS. With the St. Louis area hospitals reporting an all time high in COVID cases, while the Chesterfield City Council continues to meet at City Hall and hold pre meeting in poorly ventilated conference rooms, the mayor of Town and Country announced he has ordered the City's meeting to return to being held on ZOOM due to the latest COVID numbers.

Here is an email I received on Monday from Mayor Dr. Charles Rehm of Town and Country just hours before the Chesterfield meetings, minus the mayor who has COVID.

Today I went over to the municipal center and told them we are going back to zoom meetings until further notice. The number of inpatient hospitalizations has skyrocketed over the last few days. I know that certain people will be really irritated with me but the numbers are what they are and in my opinion this is the most prudent approach. I have had a large increase in the number of Covid cases in my practice and not all of them have been mild. I hope this surge is temporary and if there were a lot more cases but not many hospitalizations that would be one thing, but that is not the case. Hopefully it will not be too long before we are meeting back in person. Take care, Charles R.

AT LAST! PICKLEBALL COURTS COMING TO CHESTERFIELD PARKS, MAYBE JUST NOT AS MANY AS FIRST WANTED. THE BIG QUESTION IS LOCATION?

Other West County municipalities (Des Peres and Manchester) have outdoor pickleball courts. There has been a steady citizen request for pickleball courts in Chesterfield.

The Parks and Recreation Committee made a pretty large mistake at their meeting on December 8. There was a 4-0 vote to build 10 pickleball courts on 33 acres at the east end of the Chesterfield Valley Athletic Complex. The city would also provide shade, restrooms and water.

Councilmember Hurt moved to put ten pickleball courts, fencing and shade structures in the 33 acres of the CVAC as close to restrooms and water as possible and if additional funding is needed then it should be considered. Councilmember Monachella seconded the motion. Councilmember Budoor commented that whatever the location ends up being, it should be done quickly as the city is behind many others in offering pickleball courts to residents. There being no discussion, the motion was passed by a voice vote of 4 to 0.

However there is no water available or sewer line for this location. A downsized area for six pickleball courts instead of 10 was found at the Central Park that would have access to water, sewer line and parking. This is from a memo from City Administrator Mike Geisel:

Unfortunately, no proposals to construct or develop the 33 acre (32 acre) site were reviewed or investigated prior to that meeting. In spite of years of conversations about the lack of existence and inadequacy of infrastructure on North Outer 40, as well as calendar, regulatory, and cost difficulties associated with developing this site, we believe the recommendation was approved without full and complete information.

The 32 acre site is certainly not the path of least resistance, least cost, or most time effective. **Original location voted for that has no water or sewer service.**

This is not a done deal. It was only a first read on the Council agenda. (Second reads are voted on) When I inquired I got this reply from City Administrator Mike Gdisel: **The 2022 budget provides \$300,000 for pickleball courts. Neither project location has been independently budgeted. Once a location is finalized, we will initiate our detailed project development. We have, identified project obstacles at both locations and will adjust per council's direction....**

THERE IS A THIRD POSSIBILITY AND EVEN A FOURTH ACCORDING TO PUBLIC WORKS DIRECTOR JIM ECKRICH. Here is part of his memo:

I have consulted with the Director of Parks, Recreation, and Arts, and there may be another option worth considering. The west end of the CVAC contains the A concession stand and restroom. Just north of that concession stand is a parking lot. The southern portion of that lot could relatively easily be converted to pickleball courts. This area is advantageous because it is located immediately next to shade and restrooms. The loss of parking is not ideal, but could potentially be offset by a parking lot addition west of the entrance road. Although the property west of the access road is not owned by the City, it may be worth pursuing an easement or parking agreement with that property owner. If the City Council is determined to pursue pickleball courts at the CVAC, it is my recommendation that they authorize the Parks, Recreation, and Arts Director to further study this potential location, including additional work required and cost estimates.

Here are photos of the area for Eckrich's suggestion to use part of the parking lot for courts.



At January 3rd city Council meeting the chambers were full of pickleball players. They wanted to tell the Council two things. One was how much they really liked playing pickleball and the other was how they want the new courts to be in the Central Park and not in the Chesterville Valley Athletic Complex. We were told by several people that the large crowd was thanks to Mayor Bob Nation's wife Louise Nation, a long time nurse/administrator at St. Luke's Hospital and a pickleball player.

“If you put the courts on the west end of the CVAC in Chesterfield Valley it would be further from downtown Chesterfield and closest to St. Charles County, she said. “Putting it back to the Parks Commission would just be stalling,” she said. It was exactly what the City Council did on an 8-0 vote.



Harry Pardo who lives off Baxter Road said the Pickleball courts should be in the Central Park. “The courts need to be convenient four our residents,” he said.



Jane Brown wanted the Pickleball Courts to be in the Central Park. “We have to drive to other communities to play pickleball outside,” she said.



Ernesto Vera spoke about all ages of Pickleball players. “Pickleball is a family sport. All ages and families play. It should be centrally located,” he said.



Brian Cheng, a Chesterfield resident and recent retiree from Monsanto spoke. “Pickleball is now part of my life. Why I don’t like to have to go to Chesterfield Valley is because when the wind is present you can’t play a decent game.” Cheng held up a lightweight plastic pickleball that look like a small wiffle ball. The wind is stronger in Chesterfield Valley, a flood plain off the banks of the Missouri River.



Connie Stader is a newcomer to pickleball. "I didn't know what pickleball was until COVID hit and the racquet ball courts were closed. Dan Hurt (Councilman) told me the pickleball courts should be in both Central Park and Chesterfield Valley," she said.

Many Ann Mastorakos, the president pro-tem filling in for COVID-positive Mayor Bob Nation, asked how many of the people in the chambers were there about pickleball. Here was the response:



It was announced that two pickleball courts are planned to be built in the new Logan Park off Schoettler Road next to Logan University.

There is \$300,000 in the 2022 budget to build the pickleball courts. The remaining question is where to build them. After the Council voted to send the matter back to the Parks Committee, Councilman Aaron Wahl stated he thought the Parks Committee should make two recommendations where to build the courts. He did not like the current CVAC location saying it would not allow additional baseball or softball fields to be built there. The next Parks & Rec & Arts Committee Meeting is tentatively scheduled for Wednesday January 12 at 5:30pm.

MAYOR NATION REPORTS HE HAS TESTED POSITIVE FOR COVID: Mayor Bob Nation was not at the Monday January 3, 2022. Mayor Pro-tem Mary Ann Mastorakos ran the meeting.

Mayor Nation sent out an email informing elected officials and staff that a pre surgery (hip surgery) COVID test came back positive. He is apparently or was asymptomatic not showing any symptoms. The day after the meeting he was seen at the YMCA.

Although Mayor Nation was not showing any evidence of being overly concerned with the current pandemic. He could have held the December City Council on Zoom. Only two members of the public showed up. The sign on the door to city hall saying masks were REQUIRED had been change to “encouraged.”

At the last three council meetings only Councilwoman Mary Monachella wore a mask and that was only at the December meeting.

The majority of the City Council apparently has not taken this pandemic too seriously. Mayor Nation certainly has not tried to set a “safety first” example to council members and staff during this serious health event.

I mentioned to Councilman Dan Hurt after the meeting that holding pre meeting “work sessions” in the conference room was stupid. People were not six feet apart and the room is poorly ventilated compared to the Council Chambers, unless the Council

members wanted to encourage the spread of COVID. I mentioned that if the mayor had not taken a COVID test prior to surgery no one, including the mayor would be aware he had it and could spread it. If they were going to continue to hold in-person meetings the work sessions should be in the Council Chambers. Hurt admitted that I made good points.

CHESTERFIELD PLANS TO DISOBEY COUNTY INDOOR MASK MANDATE: This is an email sent out on Thursday January 6 2022 from the City Administrator to city staff and elected folks.

There is a lot of uncertainty as to the legality of the order. We will make no changes to our process or procedure until we have a final opinion from our legal counsel. It is our initial opinion that the County order is invalid, but that is preliminary.

CITY SENIOR CENTER TO BE AT MALL: The Council voted 8-0 to enter into a lease agreement with Chesterfield Mall (half vacant and planned for future major remodeling/demolition) for the space that was used in 2021 by St. Luke's Hospital to give COVID vaccines.

The space will be rent-free but the city will have to pay for utilities. The program will include events, recreational programs and education events for seniors. It will be staffed by part time city rec-employees. The lease could take effect in weeks and would be good for just two years.

ST. LUKE'S LOSING MOST OF NEUROSURGEON STAFF. A newsletter reader called us on Monday saying he just received a letter from his neurosurgeon at St. Luke's stating all but one neurosurgeons are leaving the hospital. We later confirmed this and was told the current neurosurgeons are expected to be gone within two weeks.

Most of the doctors are opening offices in O'Fallon and St. Peters in St. Charles County, due to a non-compete clause for a specific period of time.
