FORMER ALDERWOMAN GUSSIE CRAWFORD DIES: Gussie Crawford died while of heart failure at St. Luke's Hospital on Monday February 7, the day before her 87th birthday. There will be a service at Schrader Funeral Home on Sunday at 11:30.

Gussie served 2-terms as the Town and Country Ward-3 councilwoman after defeating Steve Fons in 2014. However she was perhaps best known nationally being a board member of the AAU since 1968 and president from 1988-1992. She also served as an Ambassador to the Youth Games in Europe appointed by President Reagan. In 1988 President Reagan gave her an award for her service to youth athletics.

In 2016 Gussie was awarded an AAU Lifetime Achievement Award.





In 2016 the AAU established the Gussie Crawford Lifetime Achievement Award given to the athlete, dead or alive that had a lifetime achievement and made a positive impact on sports.

The Gussie Crawford Award has gone to the family of Jessie Owens, Jim Thorpe, Babe Didrikson Zaharias and Muhammad Ali.

Gussie, a former nurse, lived in the first house in Town and Country on the east side of Weidman Road long before the City Limits sign (her property was in the city, but the street was not for another 1000 feet). Her frame house sits on 5.85 acres of land.

RESOLUTIONS ARE THE TOP ITEMS BEFORE CITY COUNCIL ON MONDAY.

Resolution from Ward One Councilwomen tells the City of Maryland Heights that the City of Chesterfield opposes Railroad Shipping Center for pickup truck and vans manufactured at the Wentzville GM Plant is the first of two.

As we have been reporting for several months on this proposal that was recently voted down by the Maryland Heights Planning and Zoning Commission. The plan is to truck vans and pickup trucks from the Wentzville General Motors assembly plant to the Howard Bend area of Maryland Heights for shipping across the country by rail.

The railroad shipping part of this plan would affect other parts of Chesterfield with rail service including the new Staenberg developments which have hotels and planned condos.



This plan will likely go before the Maryland Heights City Council and despite being voted down by the Planning Commission. It could be approved with a super majority vote of the Council. This would not only affect living conditions (noise and lights) in nearby Chesterfield subdivisions it would clearly affect property values in a number of Ward-1 subdivisions that abut the Maryland Heights flood plain known as Howard's Bend. The high volume of rail traffic would have an adverse effect on Maryland Heights subdivisions.

Here is the resolution:

RESOLUTION # 475

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF CHESTERFIELD,
MISSOURI OPPOSING THE PROPOSED INDUSTRIAL
DEVELOPMENT BY PRECISION VEHICLE HOLDING FOR THE
MARSHALLING, STORAGE, AND DISTRIBUTION OF NEW
PRODUCTION VEHICLES VIA RAIL AND CAR CARRIERS AT 149
RIVER VALLEY DRIVE AND 860 HOG HOLLOW ROAD LOCATED
WITHIN THE CITY OF MARYLAND HEIGHTS.

WHEREAS, Precision Vehicle Holding submitted for a Planned District on 90.95 acres of land located within the City of Maryland Heights; and,

WHEREAS, the proposed development includes heavy rail and vehicular operations that will produce negative impacts including, but not limited to noise pollution, significant vibration, added traffic to Hog Hollow Road; and light pollution; and,

WHEREAS, the proposed development site is located directly adjacent to several established residential neighborhoods located within the City of Chesterfield; and,

WHEREAS, the proposed development does not provide reasonable transition or buffering between residentially zoned properties and the proposed industrial development which will lead to negative impacts on the health, safety, and general welfare of the residents in the area; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Maryland Heights Planning Commission held a Public Hearing regarding the zoning changes and numerous Chesterfield residents provided testimony pertaining to the negative impacts of locating an industrial development of this nature adjacent to residential properties; and,

WHEREAS, after receiving testimony from all interested parties, the City of Maryland Heights Planning Commission found that the operation has the potential to negatively impact the general welfare of adjoining residents and such impacts cannot be adequately mitigated.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Chesterfield opposes the proposed industrial development of the 90.95 acres located at 149 River Valley Drive and 860 Hog Hollow Road due to the adverse impacts the proposed development will have on the established residential neighborhoods within the City of Chesterfield and the City of Chesterfield strongly urges the City Council of Maryland Heights to affirm the decision of the Maryland Heights Planning Commission to deny approval of the development and reject any appeal by the petitioner.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of Chesterfield supports the City of Maryland Heights Planning Commission in their denial of the application of Precision Vehicle Holding and encourages any and all regulatory bodies to support the denial due to the inability to mitigate negative impacts between incompatible zoning and land uses.

Passed this day, February 7, 2022, by the City Council of the City of Chesterfield.

This passed on a 8-0 vote.

The second resolution is directed to the Missouri State Legislature in opposition to a bill requiring City Council candidates to declare a political party. Most city and town councils and aldermanic boards are technically independent. The resolution urges State Reps to vote this bill down. Bill 1611 is currently not on a House calendar and hopefully will die. One Chesterfield councilperson asked if stop signs show that they are Republican or Democrat? Likewise are ordinances about high grass and falling down houses aren't normally partisan.

This passed on a 6-2 vote with borderline Trumpers Tom DeCampi and Aaron Wahl voting against it.

MISSOURI OPPOSING THE MISSOURI HOUSE BILL 1611, WHICH WOULD REQUIRE CITY COUNCIL CANDIDATES TO DECLARE A PARTY AFFILIATION.

WHEREAS, Representative Sassmann has filed House Bill 1611 for consideration during the 101st General Assembly the Missouri legislature; and, WHEREAS, Local municipal elections in the State of Missouri are non-partisan; and,

WHEREAS, The primary function of local municipal government within the State of Missouri is provide Police, Public works, Parks, and Planning services for the benefit of the local community and businesses; and,

WHEREAS, Any requirement to require declaration of party affiliation as a condition of candidate filing will unnecessarily and detrimentally affect the effectiveness in the delivery of local public services; and,

WHEREAS, Party affiliation should play no role in voting, decision making and delivery of essential local services at the municipal level; and,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Chesterfield opposes the unnecessary and detrimental impacts associated with interjecting partisan affiliation with the non-partisan duties and responsibilities of locally elected municipal officials.

Passed this day, February 7, 2022, by the City Council of the City of Chesterfield

This also passed on an 6-2 vote.

WILSON AVENUE ROAD IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM GRANT APPLICATION PASSED ON A 6-2 VOTE WITH BOTH COUNCILMEN FROM THE WILSON AVENUE WARD VOTING "NO"

Wilson Avenue is very unsafe. Some residents are concerned if the city did its job like it is suppose to do and make it a safe roadway there would be more traffic. But now there is no shoulder, blind curves and blind small hills making crashes due to snow, deer jumping out on the road, texting drivers more serious.





In August of 2021 Councilmen Tom DeCampi and Gary Budoor voted against the city applying for a grant for the road improvements.

Three weeks ago Public Works Director Jim Eckrich gave an hour long presentation at city hall attended by numerous residents from the subdivisions off Wilson Ave. Eckrich's plan was well received.



Action Recommended

This matter should be forwarded to the City Council for consideration. Should Council concur with Staff's recommendation, it should authorize the Mayor and City Administrator to execute a grant submittal to East West Gateway for the Wilson Avenue Improvement Project. The grant application fee for this project is currently estimated at \$5,250 (0.5 percent of the requested federal funds). Those funds are budgeted in account 120-079-5261. The application fee will be returned if the grant application is not accepted.

Despite evidence of an unsafe road that is also failing in sections the two councilmen from Ward-4 voted NO. The legislation to apply for the grant passed on a 6-2 vote.

"I guess the council people of Wards 1,2 & 3 are suppose to take care of the people in Ward-4," said Ward-1 Councilwoman Barb McGuinness.

Michael Avenatti was convicted yet again in Federal Court, this time in New York for stealing from his client Stephanie Clifford, AKA porn actress Stormy Daniels, former paid sex partner (who normally would be referred to as a prostitute) of Donald Trump. He was found guilty by a jury on February 4 of stealing \$300,000 in funds paid to Clifford by Trump to keep her mouth shut.


The guilty verdict on charges of wire fraud and aggravated identity theft at Avenatti's trial in Manhattan federal court is his second criminal conviction in that court.

Avenatti, 50, was convicted at a <u>separate trial there two years ago this month</u> <u>of an extortion scheme</u> against athletic apparel giant <u>Nike</u>.

Avenatti graduated in 1989 from Parkway Central High School. He went to St. Louis University while living with his parents in Chesterfield his freshman year. He then graduated from the University of Pennsylvania and got his law degree at George Washington University in Washington, DC.



Posing as Woman To Give 60 Men Oral Sex ...

The Post-Dispatch article printed on Wednesday 02/09/22 did a great job laying out David Cerna's deeds in a few amount of words.

CLAYTON —A former Chesterfield police officer who has served jail time for <u>using a spy</u> <u>camera in a gas station restroom</u> and posting videos online of anonymous sexual encounters at his home is now charged a second time with failing to register as a sex offender.

David Cerna, 41, of the 2400 block of Breezy Point Lane in unincorporated St. Charles County, was charged recently with a felony count of failing to register as a sex offender.

Last year, Cerna was sentenced to probation after pleading guilty to a charge of failing to register as a sex offender while living in Maryland Heights.

David Cerna, a former Chesterfield police officer, was charged in February 2022 with failing to register as a sex offender.

The latest charge says Cerna, as of Jan. 7, had not registered by the end of 2021. The registration is required for his 2016 convictions of sexual exploitation and invasion of privacy. He did not yet have a lawyer in the new case.

Cerna was <u>sentenced to jail time and probation in 2016</u> for using a hidden camera in 2013 and 2014 to videotape a teenage boy's genitals while he detained and searched the boy. He also videotaped two other males under their clothing and used images to create child pornography.

Earlier in 2016, Cerna admitting collecting videos from a camera he installed in a men's restroom at a gas station in Chesterfield and posting them on a pornographic website.

Cerna also was <u>sentenced in St. Charles County</u> in 2016 for uploading to the web videos of him having sex with men at his home there.

Authorities said he lured men to his home in 2014 using Craigslist ads posing as a woman seeking sex, performed oral sex through a hole in the door and then posted videos of those sex acts online. Cerna told police as many as 60 men visited his home over 18 months.

Cerna was fired from Chesterfield police after serving six years there.
