REALLY IS THIS A GOOD IDEA? GETTING YOU VITAMINS FROM A DRIP BAG?

Perhaps you got this advertising card in a packet of cards for a new business coming to Town and Country. The new business coming to Town and Country Crossing is where you go, lay down and have a drip bag of “vitamins” go into your body.

At my house as a kid it was a morning command from my mother at the breakfast table, “Take you vitamins.” It seems to me that was a lot easier than getting an IV. This is the response from City Staff to our question about if this was for real.

Yes it has been approved and they will be going into 1074 Town & Country Crossing, it’s by Qdoba.





We asked a Town and Country doctor what his impression of this new business was. Here is his reply:

The traditional medical answer is that most people with healthy diets don't need vitamin supplements. Deficiencies do happen, and when they do supplementation is needed either by mouth or parenteral. When there are absorption challenges or severe deficiencies IV is needed.

Overall, it doesn't seem like something that I'd be interested in based on what I know. I'm not clear of the benefit or potential risks of treatment. Having too much of anything including vitamins can cause harm.


The property is at the corner of Clayton Road and Mason Ridge Road.

The proposal was voted down due to the fact that there was not to be any siding on the garaging similar to the brick house.

The homeowner and their architect came back in February with plans to have the more expensive brick on the side of the garage that faces Clayton Road but keep the other two sides with non-brick siding.





Former Mayor Jon Dalton's last act against the citizens of Town and Country was Fred Meyland-Smith's appointment to the Planning & Zoning Commission. If you remember Fred avoided paying city and state sales tax, registered a new car to some property he owned in Illinois, while keeping the vehicle at his Town and Country house and using it daily in Missouri. A tax cheat is making decisions for your community.

Fred wanted the entire garage to have brick walls. He wanted to be sure that if someone walking on Mason Ridge and pushed the branches of the plant life far enough apart, they could see a brick wall on the garage. Fred who loves to hear himself talk repeated this point three times during the meeting.

The vote was 5-2 for the new plans, with Meyland-Smith and Granville White voting “No.”



MARYLAND HEIGHTS CITY COUNCIL APPROVES PRECISION VEHICLE HOLDING FOR 3,000 OR MORE VEHICLES AND RAILYARD. Precision Vehicle Holding out of Wayne, Michigan got THE Maryland Heights City Council approval, despite being turned down a month earlier by the city Planning Commission for a 93-acre facility.

They plan is to ship by rail up to 3,000 Vans and pickup trucks manufactured at the Wentzville GM plant across the country by rail from the location. They will also have a 9,500 square foot truck repair building and a 3,500 square foot office building.



Precision's application called for it to be open from 6am to 2am but the Council was told verbally on Thursday February 17 they would be open from 6am to 10pm.

Despite remnants of a dangerous ice and snowstorm over 200 people were at the meeting. No one from either Chesterfield or Maryland Heights were speaking in favor of the proposal.

Besides the application being rejected by the Maryland Heights Planning Commission, the City of Chesterfield passed a resolution against the project and a large nearby subdivision hired former Chesterfield Mayor John Nations who wrote a 9-page document to the Maryland Heights Council, mayor and city administrator why the proposal and rezoning of the flood plain should be rejected.

All this did a lot of good. The vote for the proposal was 8-0 by the Maryland Heights City Council.

THE SOON TO BE MARYLAND HEIGHTS HOWARD BEND FLOOD PLAIN RAILYARD AND NEW VEHICLE STORAGE YARD: Things for Chesterfield to Consider.

In 2018 after several years of one resident holding up construction, the City of Chesterfield closed River Valley Road at the Maryland Heights city limits stopping people from using the street as a cut through from Olive Blvd to flood plain that Maryland Heights had plans to develop as a condo, retail and warehouse complex, that never happened

Now with the Maryland Heights City Council approving a planned development to create a railyard for 3,000 pickup trucks and vans trucked in from the Wentzville GM plant to be loaded on trains and shipped across the country. The City of Chesterfield needs to close Hog Hollow Road at the Maryland Heights city limits.




Fire/EMS and Police can open this fence blocking River Valley Road at the Chesterfield/Maryland Heights City Limits. Notice how close the railroad is.

YOU HAVE TO WONDER: With an 8-0 vote after the planning commission voted the project down you have to wonder what the Maryland Heights City Council was thinking.

WHERE'S THE MONEY? There is no real revenue unless someone opens a dinner for the truck drivers from Wentzville, the rail crews and the 30 employees at the Precision Vehicle storage yard that would generate a little bit of sales taxes.

However, Maryland Heights' costs of greater police protection and patrols, road improvements and road treatment during snow and ice storms is going to cost some money.

I checked for campaign contributions from Michigan to elected officials in Maryland Heights through December 31 and have not found any. The next campaign contribution

reporting deadline of 40 days before the April 5 election is February 28. That is followed by deadline to report contributions of 5-days before the election and 30-days after the election.



MAYBE NOT COMING Chesterfield approved rezoning for a new subdivision, The Residences at Hog Hollow that would be north of Olive Blvd to the railroad tracks and Maryland Heights City Limits and east of Hog Hollow Road. However, no site development plan has been submitted to the city yet. You have to wonder who would want to buy a home next to the Precision Vehicle Loading and Rail facility.


CHESTERFIELD'S WWII HEROES: A HOLOCAUST SURVIVOR, NAZI CAMP LIBERATOR, AND P.O.W. IN GERMANY

Thursday, April 7, 2022, at 6:00 PM, the Heritage Foundation of Chesterfield will host an event celebrating the lives of three local citizens, each with a unique first-hand experience of WWII.

- Ben Fainer, Holocaust Survivor: Ben was a Chesterfield business owner who spent six years in Nazi camps, from age 9 to 15. He was liberated by U.S. forces on a final death-march in the waning hours of the war. After 60 years of silence, he met and became best friends with one of his liberators!
- David Lupo, U.S. Army Liberator of Dachau: David was a Chesterfield resident who fought his way across France and Germany. In the spring of 1945, he began to hear something called "concentration camps" being mentioned in Signal Corps communications. It wasn't until he found himself opening the gates of Dachau that he understood what those messages were talking about.
- Frank Huelskoetter, U.S. Army P.O.W. in Germany: Frank was a Chesterfield resident who fought his way across France and Germany, before his unit was surrounded and taken prisoners. They were lined up in a field, and the Germans set up machine guns pointed at them. Frank assumed he was going to be killed.

A ceremony will be held at the **Chesterfield Community Center at Chesterfield Mall**, followed by a book signing and open house and at the Chesterfield History Museum. Both are **located on the upper level adjacent to Macy's**. Speakers will include Bob Nation, Mayor of Chesterfield, Michael Staenberg (friend of Ben Fainer), Sharon Berry (Ben Fainer's daughter), Helen Turner, St. Louis Kaplan Feldman Holocaust Museum, and Mark Leach (co-author with Ben Fainer of *Silent for Sixty Years: Ben Fainer Holocaust Survivor* and editor of *Why We Fought: Nazi Camp Liberators of St. Louis*).


