TOWN AND COUNTRY ELECTIONS:

INTERNET SALES TAXES DEFEATED: Despite the City of Town and Country's effort to "educate" voters without "campaigning" for Proposition U with mailers and advertisements, the Proposition to charge local municipal sales taxes on Internet purchases was soundly defeated.

City staff was looking for the revenue increase, especially after having to use reserve funds due to the COVID pandemic, plus cost over runs for the Town Square. Fortunately the Schuncks supermarket saw an uptick in sales with families staying at home or the loss during the pandemic could have been worse.

SUE ALLEN REELECTED:

It wasn't as close as some of us thought it would be in Ward 4. David Murphy a 23-year resident of Town and Country out "campaign signed" Sue Allen, but she got a lot more votes.

Allen, who to people attending Aldermanic and P&Z meetings, often seems confused and asked questions that seem that they would never end. She did not have a campaign website. Murphy did have a campaign website and laid out his positions on several issues. Allen a former State Representative now living in an apartment at the Lutheran Retirement complex on the South Outer Road at Mason Road.

FRANCISCO WINS IN WARD-3 TOWN AND COUNTRY: Michelle Francisco, 52 of Greenwich Green easily won the Ward-3 race against Mohammad Agha. Francisco did not have a campaign website and her WEST COUNTY NEWS candidate info did not bring up specific issues.

Dr. Agha lives on Devonworth Drive and is a professor in medical and rehab sciences.

There were no nasty tactics, mailers full of lies or other unpleasant actions in either Town and Country campaign, unlike the Ward-4 race in Chesterfield.

QUEENY PARK HOUSE RENTAL TO RAINTREE SCHOOL VOTED DOWN. The rental of the 166-year-old Jarville house and addition, that for 30-years housed the AKC National Museum of the Dog until 2018, to the nearby Raintree School on Mason Road for pre school to second grade classes was required to be voted on. The house and grounds are part of the St. Louis County Parks. They are located on Mason Road abutting Town & Country.

The rental agreement was ballot was defeated on Tuesday.


MARYVILLE UNIVERSITY WANT TO TAKE OVER WOODS MILL CENTER SHOPPING CENTER. Plans exist for Maryville University to take over the Woods Mill Center at Woods Mill Road and South Outer 40 Road, then tear down the existing 86,000 square retail and office site.






The plans would be to replace the commercial property with a six-story dorm, an event center including a sports auditorium, a parking garage and surface parking.





BACK IN 2014 RESIDENTS STOPPED A MUCH SMALL PROJECT. In 2014 St. Andrews an independent Catholic School wanted to purchase the 6.66 acre property belonging to the Sisters of St. Peters that has been the convent for nuns, but was currently home to just two retired nuns.





The proposal was for an elementary school, grades k-8 with about 140 students. There was extensive opposition to the school from residents of the gated Cedar Springs subdivision (home to current mayor Charles Rehm) and to the south from residents of the larger Manderleigh Subdivision.


The residents complained that parents dropping off students during morning rush hour would make current heavy traffic on S. Woods Mill even worse. The measure passed in Planning and Zoning on a 4-3 vote but was defeated by the Board of Aldermen.

A six-story college dormitory and a sports center clearly would create more traffic than a grade school with 140 students.

Ald. Fred Meyland-Smith voted against the school as a member of the P&Z Commission and the Board of Aldermen. It will be interesting to see how he votes on P&Z as an expansion of a college campus with lots of traffic.

MASON AND CONWAY. NEW CAR CRASH CENTRAL? Former Alderman Larry Satz mentioned to me that there had been two recent car crashes at the T-intersection of Mason Road and Conway. Larry drove up on each crash scene. So we took a look at the reports. Both involved stop sign runners.

The first one happened on St. Patrick's Day March 17 at 1:23pm. According to a witness one driver disobeyed a stop sign and hit a car making a left turn from WB Conway onto Mason Road. There were no injuries.




The driver of the Chevrolet (which had to be towed) that ran the stop sign was **Sean Backus, 35**. Here is his record:

The second crash happened 12 days later on Tuesday March 29 at 2:10pm.

The driver of a Ford Transit Van (30-year-old St. Louis resident) admitted he ran the stop sign on EB Conway hitting a Chevrolet being driven from a woman from Creve Coeur who was making a left turn from Mason onto WB Conway. Both vehicles had suffered enough damage that they had to be towed. The woman from Creve Coeur reported minor injuries.



LIE 1 Merrell Hansen in chair of the Planning Commission, which does not deal with needed street repairs. Wagner claimed Hansen was costing taxpayers \$320,000. This is completely false, that number is the city's expense with the majority of the funding coming from a East-West Gateway grant.

LIE 2 Wagner is claiming making Wilson “safe” was a pet project of Hansen. In fact it has been a long term project of Public Works Director Jim Eckrich for several years. Eckrich was very aware portions of Wilson Avenue were very unsafe. Wagner claimed Hansen “sabotage” Councilmen Tom DeCampi and Gary Budoor on pushing the Wilson project while many residents did not want any road improvement fearing it would cause more traffic. Hansen had nothing to do with this. The City Staff was pushing to make Wilson Avenue safe. The vote to obtain a road grant was 6-2 with DeCampi and Budoor (the Ward-4 reps) voting against a safe road and the rest of the Council seeing an immediate need for road improvements.

LIE 3 Wagner claimed Hansen wanted to hold secret private meetings with her subdivision. This is completely false. Public Works Director Jim Eckrich wanted the private meetings with subdivisions off of Wilson Avenue. He was overruled and he held one open public meeting inviting everyone from three subdivisions.

Hansen, the current chair of the Planning Commission won easily.





Shane Cerone has informed the St. Luke's Board of Directors of his resignation from the position of president and CEO of St. Luke's Hospital. The Board respects his decision to return to his home in Michigan and has accepted his resignation.

We are grateful that during Shane's time with us, St. Luke's has continued to provide outstanding care to the community, while increasing physician involvement and partnership in our system. As you know, this was no easy feat as his tenure included leading our organization through the COVID-19 pandemic. We deeply appreciate all Shane did and wish him well in his future endeavors.

Gary Olson, former CEO at St. Luke's, has agreed to return in an interim role starting on April 4. Gary's deep history and understanding of the organization will be an asset to us in this transition. Shane will be supporting Gary in the transfer of duties.

HERE IS THE REST OF THE STORY FROM AN INSIDE SOURCE:

We received the email today regarding the resignation of St. Luke's CEO and return of Gary Olson (Again). Shane has only been there since 10/1/2020. He has created a lot of fires and has not been able to extinguish any of them. I can guarantee you that Shane was forced out and did not simply resign. This is actually a very good thing for the hospital as things there have completely spiraled out of control. Employees have been experiencing it first hand as part of the Medical ICU, which they completely gutted over the last 6 months. That is a whole other long and complicated story. Granted the MICU group is the group that just survived 2+ years of COVID onslaught. The MICU now can't hire new physicians to replace the ones they fired (without cause) or resigned. The MICU is now completely operated by Locums (Temp Docs), which is a worst-case scenario. The Network Director was actually just forced to work a 72 Hour (!!!) shift in the MICU last week because the locums backed out on her. Shane Cerone's passive leadership is what caused that disaster along with many similar situations all across the hospital (ex. Neurology). Nurses and Doctors who emailed and wrote letters directly to Shane and to

the Board of Directors have been leaving in droves. Hopefully St. Luke's can bounce back and return to being a great hospital.





AND MORE ON ST. LUKE'S: Here is a follow up email from our inside source at St. Luke's.
