Dir. Jadali said if they city lost any of these sales tax providers it would very adversely affect the entire budget.

Last month the Ways and Means Commission voted to send to the Board of Aldermen a recommendation for a city 23-cent property tax. The staff is recommending that the 23-cent property tax be ignored, but the Alderpersons pass a 10-cent per \$100 valuation property tax (this was recommended in 2020 and ignore by the board).



ALDERMEN IGNORE WAYS AND MEANS AGAIN & STAFF AND VOTES FOR NO PROPERTY TAX. At the regular Aldermanic Meeting on Monday August 8, the aldermen vote 7-1 for have a ZERO property tax for the next two years. Apparently Federal money (\$2,000,000) in rescue bailout due to the drop in retail tax revenue during the pandemic was the reason to continue to ignore their money experts and staff.

Sue Allen was the only alderperson to vote against a 0 property tax.

Annexation: T&C has shown an interest in annexing Barrett Station Road from the City Limits to Manchester and then west on Manchester to the Manchester Meadows Shopping Center already in the city.

Two things I noticed: I annexation stopped at the curb of Manchester and did not take in of the street leaving all the crashes, drunk drivers, stalled cars to the County Police.

The second thin is that the City of Manchester is trying to get a huge annexation passed that would include much of this area.



Available information indicates the entire Annexation Area north of Manchester Road contains:

- Approximately 10 retail and commercial buildings including fast food, service, gasoline, a storage facility and one big box (Slumberland Furniture)
- 4 small office buildings
- Two condo complexes on Mason Green and Mason Oaks with total 66 units
- Mason Meadows Court with 8 single-family homes

The estimated increase in revenue from the area would be \$74,600. The city unrealistically estimated costs being \$10,000 for police services. With my background in police administration I would have to say the \$10,000 in unrealistically low.

I would have to think this area would create enough work for 1½ officers (\$105,000). This counts required patrol, shoplifters, theft and bad check investigations followed up by the detectives, auto accidents (crashes) on the north side of the Barrett Station/Manchester intersection, dealing with drunks at Taco Bell at midnight and gasoline drive offs from the Phillips 66 station. There are also some calls requiring two officer responses. \$10,000 is too low and unrealistic. It would not be cost effective and using that mark would mean no additional officers and a reduced level of service for the pre-annexation residents.

Plus you would have the residential area of condos requiring police responses to various calls, plus vacation/out-of-town checks.

POOL PARTY RESULTS IN LARGE POLICE RESPONSE: Nicole Graham, the homeowner at 14 Long Meadows is once again receiving the attention of the Town and Country Police.

Graham lives at 14 Long Meadows Lane off of busy Clayton Road. Her back yard abuts Cedar Valley Drive, the service road to I-270. She had over the years owned a number of dogs and refused to keep them from leaving the yard. Several have been hit by cars on I-270.

This spring Town and Country spent over \$2,100 getting a court order requiring Graham to keep her dog Archie in the yard.

On Sunday August 7 Graham apparently rented out the pool for a pool party. She was not at home for the pool party. Town and Country Police eventually responded to a disturbance involving between 100-200 teenagers. The large number of people required assistance from other police departments including Des Peres and as far away as Chesterfield that sent four officers.

These awards were for the response and arrest of the suspect involved in the robbery and shooting on June 14 of the 20-year-old employee of Delmar Gardens Retirement and Nursing Home on the South Outer Forty Road.

Christian Fredrick, 19, was arrested and charged within a week on the crime. He was charged and later indicted with Assault 1st Degree, 2-counts of Armed Criminal Action and robbery.

The people called up to receive their awards last should have been first. They were Kelly Vargas and Christopher Hayes, both were driving by and stopped to provide aid to the victim who was shot multiple times before paramedics arrived. They were credited with saving the victim's life.

I hate to say this, but I'm old school, having been a supervisor in the 70s and an assistant chief in the 1990's.

The City of St. Louis has three or four similar shooting every weekend just on Washington Avenue. If they handed out awards for arrests, they would run out of frames and paper. I'm so old...I would (used to) put this on their evaluations and help for the next raise. The awards would go to the citizens.

When I worked for Chevy Chase Village PD I answered a robbery in progress call at 10:30 in the morning. It was the very high end Gianni Versace clothing store that was being robbed, where the \$1,000 to \$10,000 clothes being stuffed into duffle bags. I was the just on the scene. It was in Montgomery County Police area just across the street from the Chevy Chase city limits. We answered a lot of calls when the County didn't have any officers available. The getaway car was not on busy Wisconsin Avenue in front of the store. I figured it had to be in the parking garage on the end of the building that had medical offices above the retail stores. I was in the open with a gun pointed at

the front door. I requested that responding officers go to the garage with sirens sounding to keep the suspects from driving off into Washington, DC two blocks away.


The County SWAT team was training that morning and they responded in mass and found the four armed suspects hiding the garage and medical building. The four suspects were all Gay and were doing the robberies up and down the east coast to pay for sex change operations. I got a letter of thanks from the County Police on this one.

The other one of note was a robbery in progress at a gas station/car wash located two blocks from the Gianni Versace store (it is long gone replaced by a 5-story expensive condo complex). When I arrived a drug addict was holding a gun to the throat of the woman cashier. My first assist car wasn't a car at all. It was a traffic officer on a motorcycle. He straddled his motorcycle and pointed his gun at the suspect. I walked up to the suspects and cashier who was shaking and took his gun away and handcuffed him. For this I got no letter or award...just all in a day's work.

In this June 14 robbery/shooting case 37% of the Town and Country Police Department got an award. Times change.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PROPERTY TAX: When this was brought up Ald. Fritz Wiesehan wasted no time in making a motion to keep the property tax at ZERO. It seems Fritz might have had a slight conflict of interest. Fritz is the vice-president of Mari de Villa the 22-acres of retirement condos and a nursing home on 22-acres.

Despite the Ways and Means Commission twice in the last two years voting for a return of a modest property tax and the staff recommending the same it appears as if there will be a public hearing in September for the continuation of a ZERO property tax.

An increase in taxes is not good for any elected official. It could mean them getting voted out of office. That's part of being an elected official, willing to do the right thing that could cost you at the polls. Despite the Federal COVID Response grant, something as low as a 10-cent property tax will stop problems with providing fire/EMS service, police service and safe roads for a few years in the future.



COUNT: 02 POSSESSION OF BURGLARY TOOLS - CLASS E FELONY

That Antonyo Ridley, in violation of Section 569.180, RSMo, committed the class E felony of possession of burglar's tools, punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.002 and 558.011, in that on or about August 5, 2022 at 11:29 PM, at 9 Arnage Road, in the County of St. Louis, State of Missouri, the defendant possessed a metal punch, which was a tool adapted, designed and commonly used for committing or facilitating offenses involving forcible entry into premises, and the defendant so possessed such tool with a purpose to use the same in making an unlawful forcible entry into a building.

I, <u>Kyle Hahn, DSN 5301, Chesterfield Police Department</u>, knowing that false statements on this form are punishable by law, state that the facts contained herein are true and documented in report number 22-3429. I have probable cause to believe that on August 5, 2022, at 9 Arnage Boulevard, Antonyo Ridley, Black, Male, DOB 12/13/1990, 5'07", 250lbs, committed one or more criminal offense(s).

Count: 01 BURGLARY - 2ND DEGREE - CLASS D FELONY

Count: 02 POSSESSION OF BURGLARY TOOLS - CLASS E FELONY

The facts supporting this belief are as follows: Chesterfield police responded to a burglar alarm at the Rolls-Royce dealership at 9 Arnage Boulevard. On arrival they found several windows and a glass door completely shattered. Surveillance footage from the dealership showed a black male wearing a blue cap breaking the windows and the door and ultimately entering through the broken door. Once inside he pulled on a couple of car doors and left the business. Meanwhile a black male wearing a white T-shirt with a hood was outside the building, evidently acting as a lookout. Police arrested defendants, who matched the description of the men seen in the video, a short distance away from the dealership. Defendant Ridley, the man with the blue cap, was in possession of a tool that he later admitted he had used to break the windows. He admitted he had gone inside the dealership, saying he was looking for something, possibly money for gas. Defendant Miller-Brown, who was the one waiting outside, made no statements to police.

I believe that the defendant will not appear in court in response to a criminal summons because he is a resident of the Kansas City area with no known ties to the St. Louis region. A warrant is requested.

CHECK THEFTS FROM POST OFFICE If you have mailed any checks paying bills from the Swingley Ridge Post Office recently, be advised YOU MIGHT BE A VICTIM. According to the Chesterfield Police Reports 19 residents have reported having checks stolen from where they dropped off the checks in envelopes at the outside mailboxes at the Swingley Ridge Post Office.

The suspects then erased the "Pay to" on the checks and the amount. One check was changed to \$20,000 another to \$11,000.

These types of thefts have been a problem across the country, with thieves making keys to work the mailbox locks. This has been a big problem in the Washington DC suburbs.


