TOWN AND COUNTRY COLLEGE STUDENT HAS CHARGES OF FORCIBLE RAPE IN 2019 DROPPED TO MISDEMEANOR ASSUALT IN 2022. In 2019 Michael Kratz, 19, had a dorm room at Maryville University even though he lived two miles from the campus at 6 Wembury Court off Mason Road.

On November 9, 2019 Kratz, who was born in Belarus, was having consensual sex with a co-ed in his dorm room when the sex turned into non-consensual and very forcible.

Here is the story from Det. Katie Exline's Probable Cause Statement (she had a typo on the date...it was 2019 and not 2018):

That Michael Kratz , in violation of Section 566.030, RSMo, committed the Felony of Rape in the First Degree, punishable upon conviction under Section 566.030, RSMo, and subject to lifetime supervision under Section 217.735, RSMo, in that on or about November 9, 2018, in the County of St. Louis, State of Missouri, the defendant knowingly had sexual intercourse with L.L.P, by the use of forcible compulsion.

The facts supporting this belief are as follows:

Victim met Defendant for a consensual encounter. After its conclusion the Victim attempted to leave the Defendant's dorm room but was prevented. Defendant bit Victim as she tried to leave and dragged her back on the bed. Defendant grabbed Victim's hair to force her to perform oral sex. Victim was pushed by her shoulders back on to the bed where defendant began penetrating the Victim again. Victim told Defendant to stop multiple times. Defendant bit her in several places including her inner thigh, neck, breast, and vagina. Defendant held her hands behind her head while penetrating, in addition defendant grabbed her neck. Victim is able to convince the Defendant that she will come back later so that he will stop and is able to get out of the dorm room.

A warrant is requested because I believe that the defendant poses a danger to the victim and community due to the nature of the crime. Defendant is also a danger to the community due to his family making threats to the police about finding the victim.

Kratz and his widow mother hired very high dollar defense attorney Scott Rosenblum.

Kratz was charged in less than 24 hours of the rape. The case was not over for 2 ½ years.

On May 19, 2022 Kratz pled guilty to a very reduced charge of Misdemeanor 4th Degree Assault and received a 1-year SIS probation. This means on May 19, 2023 all public reports of this will be sealed including the police report. It will disappear just like his DWI conviction did when the probation period was up.

I can understand why the victim might not want to testify in open court with Defense Attorney Scott Rosenblum getting her to repeat sex acts in detail. So I understand a deal being made to reduced to Forcible Rape and 4-Counts of Sodomy to be reduced to a misdemeanor Assault plea.

What I cannot understand is how County Circuit Judge Richard Stewart could give Kratz only a 1-year Suspended Imposition of Sentence (SIS) probation term with all records of this disappearing. I think Kratz should have been forced to do 60 days in jail and then be placed on a SES Suspended Execution of Sentence probation in lieu of another 180 days in jail. The SES would also keep the charges an open public record.

Perhaps County Prosecutor Wesley Bell's staff should have insisted on a little tougher misdemeanor sentence as part of the deal.

IN FEDERAL COURT ON IMPORTING UNAPPROVED FOREIGN DRUGS

In 2010 Dr. Abdul Naushad was hit with an \$820,000 civil judgment in 2010 he had to pay for dispensing and charging Medicard/Medicare for unapproved foreign drugs from the Missouri pain clinics. You would think \$820,000 would have gotten Naushad's attention. It apparently did not. His wife Dr. Wajiha Naushad was involved with providing unapproved drugs.

In 2019 the couple were indicted by the Feds on 21-counts of buying, using and billing Medicare and Medicaid for a drug that is not approved for use in the United States.

On Wednesday April 20 the couple was convicted by a Federal Court jury of Conspiracy and Health Care Fraud. The couple was dealing with the same drug that resulted in the \$820,000 settlement in 2010.

On Thursday August 25 the couple were sentenced. Abdul was sentenced to one-year in Federal prison and Wajiha to a 3-year probation term. They were also ordered to make restitution of \$235,977. Added to the \$820,000 fine in 2010, the Naushad have had to pay the U.S. District Court \$1,550,977 in the last 12 years.

The Naushads live at 325 Conway Hill Court in Town and Country.

A REMINDER PUBLIC HEARING ON PROPERTY TAX COMING UP: Currently there is a ZERO property tax rate before the Alderpersons despite warnings of trouble ahead from the Ways & Means Commission and City Staff. The commission wanted a 23-cent property tax to keep services where they are for a number of years.

The staff recommended a 10-cent tax that would generate just under \$1,000,000 a year in new revenue. Without an actual property tax above zero, the city will quickly face deficit spending.

The public hearing will be at the start of the Monday September 12 Aldermanic meeting at City Hall at 7PM.
