TOWN AND COUNTRY ARRESTS TWO FOR STEALING FROM POST OFFICE MAILBOXES. A delivery truck driver working the late shift on Wednesday morning August 31 after 2AM saw two males stealing mail from the mailboxes in front of the Town and Country Post Office.



The driver immediately dialed 9-1-1, but the suspects were gone before the police could arrive. The description of the subjects and their car were broadcast to neighboring departments and the Manchester PD and T&C located them across the street on Manchester Rd from the Manchester PD. INDICTMENT

COUNT I

The Grand Jury charges that:

On or about October 13, 2021, in St. Louis County and within the Eastern District of Missouri,

**ABDUL-AZIZ ABUHAMDEH,
a/k/a "ABDULAZIZ ABUHAMDEH"
a/k/a "ABDUL-AZIZ MUHYI ABUHAMDEH"**

the defendant herein, did knowingly and intentionally possess, with intent to distribute, 50 grams or more of actual methamphetamine, a Schedule II controlled substance, in violation of Title 21, United States Code, Section 841(a)(1), and punishable upon conviction under Title 21, United States Code, Section 841(b)(1)(A)(viii).

COUNT II

The Grand Jury further charges that:

On or about October 13, 2021, in St. Louis County and within the Eastern District of Missouri,

**ABDUL-AZIZ ABUHAMDEH,
a/k/a "ABDULAZIZ ABUHAMDEH"
a/k/a "ABDUL-AZIZ MUHYI ABUHAMDEH"**

the defendant herein, did knowingly possess a firearm in furtherance of a drug trafficking crime which may be prosecuted in a court of the United States, that is, possession with intent to distribute methamphetamine, as charged in Count I, in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 924(c)(1).

COUNT III

The Grand Jury further charges that:

On or about October 13, 2021, in St. Louis County and within the Eastern District of Missouri,

**ABDUL-AZIZ ABUHAMDEH,
a/k/a "ABDULAZIZ ABUHAMDEH"
a/k/a "ABDUL-AZIZ MUHYI ABUHAMDEH"**

the defendant herein, knowing that he had previously been convicted of one or more crimes punishable by more than one year of imprisonment, did knowingly possess one or more firearms which traveled in interstate commerce prior to or during his possession, in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 922(g).

FORFEITURE ALLEGATION

The Grand Jury further finds by probable cause that:

1. Pursuant to Title 21, United States Code, Section 853(a), upon conviction of an offense in violation of Title 21, United States Code, Section 841(a)(1), as set forth in Count I, the defendant shall forfeit to the United States of America any property, constituting, or derived from, any proceeds obtained, directly or indirectly, as the result of such violation, and any property used, or intended to be used, in any manner or part, to commit, or to facilitate the commission of such violation.

2. Subject to forfeiture is a sum of money equal to the total value of any property, constituting, or derived from, any proceeds obtained, directly or indirectly, as a result of the violation set forth in Count I.

3. Pursuant to Title 18, United States Code, Section 924(d)(1) and Title 28, United States Code, Section 2461(c), upon conviction of an offense in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 922(g) or 924(c) as set forth in Counts II and III, the defendant shall forfeit to the United States of America any firearm or ammunition involved in or used or intended to be used in said violations.



FORMER MAYOR RESIGNS FROM CHESTERFIELD TIF COMMISSION BEFORE THE FIRST MEETING.

Not that long ago several councilpersons vowed that there would be no new TIFs in Chesterfield. (Tax Increment Funding). Those councilpersons lost reelection and the next thing you know there is a new TIF Commission for the area of the Chesterfield Mall, planned for redevelopment, the areas to the west of the site.

After approval of the Commission there has been some local opposition. Once again here is Planning Director Jason Wyse explanation of the TIF:

The TIF under consideration would be used for public improvements (streets, sewers, public parking...) and would not fund any construction of buildings.

There are existing sales taxes and those will remain. There are no new sales taxes associated with a TIF. The total cumulative assessed value of real property in the proposed redevelopment area is determined prior to development. All of the taxing districts will continue to receive taxes based on that base pre-developed assessment throughout the life of the TIF. As the property is improved, the assessed value of property in the redevelopment area increases above the 23 original base level. When property taxes are calculated based on the increased valuation on properties within the TIF, a "tax increment" is produced and is deposited in the special allocation fund. This is how public improvements are funded in a TIF.

One of the first persons appointed and approved by the city council was former Mayor Bruce Geiger, 80, a retired executive at Monsanto.



Geiger just resigned and said his resignation was for personal reasons.

Former-Mayor Geiger is being replaced by Robert H. Rodermund, Jr, who lives in Chesterfield and works at his Financial Consulting firm in St. Charles.

CITY COUNCIL MEETING:

NO VIDEO LINK AGAIN: The meeting in August was supposed to be the first regular meeting with video so residents could view the meeting live or for the next two weeks. That did not happen.

The promise was then made the first meeting in September would have video. That did not happen. The ability to watch meetings at home seems to be a promise with intention of the city delivering.

The Popsicle Art that was going to be placed in a park apparently melted. On May 15 the City Council approved renting the popsicle sculpture from a Florida artist to be placed in the city's Central Park.

That never happened. All city officials are saying is that the Popsicle is no longer available, except for the Parks Director Tom McCarthy who had the answer:

The artist could not get the product to build Popsicle and the old one was worn out and really bad shape with several broken pieces on it.



The Popsicle is being replaced by a piece from New Jersey called The Sun to the Moon with an artist's value of \$15,000.

LIQUOR LICENSE FOR PIZZA PLACE, BUT NOT FOR GAS STATION/REPAIR SHOP:

The City Council approved a full liquor by the drink license for the Mellow Mushroom at 15525 Olive Blvd. It is the long overdue replacement for Charlie Gitto's. The Mellow Mushroom is moving in after Gitto's tried to repair heavy July rain damage several years ago.



The building owner made repairs and but had problems leasing the property with the pandemic. The Mellow Mushroom has been set to make this it's third location in St. Louis. The FOR LEASE SIGN is still up while opening day is in the next month. Perhaps they are splitting the building?



MEANWHILE The package Liquor License application for Bradley Fuel and Repair was continued for the next two meeting, ongoing problems with the applicant was cited. Councilman Aaron Wahl stated he was unfamiliar with the problems.

Ward-1 Councilwomen Barb McGuinness and Mary Monachella immediately mentioned residents' complaints as the gas station/repair shop is in the middle of a subdivision.



They and City Administrator spoke of cars parked long term on the small shopping center lot, a SNO-Come/Ice Crème truck stored on the lot and operated as a business without a license, dumpster not meeting code, trash stored elsewhere and the failure to mow grass.

City Administer Mike Geisel said that the people running the repair shop have been sent letters about the violations and have refused to take action addressing them. We could find no citations having been issued by the city yet.


