





**BOTH CHESTERFIELD SCHOOL DISTRICTS FIGHTING TIF PLAN FOR THE CHESTERFIELD MALL** The newly installed TIF (Tax Increment Financing) Commission of 3-city officials, 6 County officials, two from the Parkway and Rockwood School Districts and one from the Monarch FPD.

The TIF is to raise funds for city infrastructure connected to the projects at the soon to be torn down Chesterfield Mall and Wildhorse Village project.



The City and the School Districts differ on the estimate number of school age residents in the apartments and condos by a wide margin. The City estimated 236 students while the school districts think 840 is more like it.

The project shows 3,350 new residential units meaning 835 new students equaling \$16,000,000 in costs every year. The TIF Commission and school Districts disagree.

CHESTERFIELD, Mo. – Chesterfield Mall will close at the end of 2023 to pave the way for new development. The Staenberg Group and CRG plan to build thousands of apartments and townhomes, as well as space for offices, retail, and restaurants on the mall site and nearby. The developments stand to add new students to the Parkway and Rockwood school districts. The City of Chesterfield projects up to 236 new students. The districts say it could be more than 840 students.

The major disparity in those estimates was on display Tuesday night at a public hearing regarding a \$353 million tax increment financing package tied to the development. Chesterfield officials say the TIF money would pay for the project’s public infrastructure components and not developers’ improvements.

Officials from the Parkway and Rockwood districts shared a letter with us they sent it to Chesterfield City Councilmembers last month. It details concerns about the TIF proposal. Among them, a potential lack of revenue to pay for the expected new students. FOX 2 received a statement from the Parkway School District. It reads, in part: “The current TIF proposal does not provide adequate financial resources to educate 800 new students and we don’t currently have the space in our schools.”

The City of Chesterfield responded with a statement that reads, in part: “The TIF projects that Parkway and Rockwood will receive more than \$221.9 million in additional new tax revenue from the TIF, as compared to nearly \$19 million without the TIF. Parkway suggests they lack capacity to add students while they have already experienced a loss of 767 students in the last four years and are projecting to lose 300 more by 2026. The City of Chesterfield values our

partnership with our school districts. We disagree as to the TIF, but that does not suggest any animosity or lack of appreciation for what each other is responsible for, and how well they do it!”

The commission did not make a recommendation on the TIF proposal on Tuesday. They will meet again on Nov. 15. The Chesterfield City Council will ultimately decide the TIF’s fate, regardless of what the commission decides.

Here is the letter to the City Council from both school districts:



October 13, 2022

Greetings,

This letter is to inform you of impacts on Chesterfield families and taxpayers of the proposed Chesterfield TIF. Additionally, it is an invitation to meet with all of you to discuss our concerns and proposed solutions.

The project as proposed shows over 3,350 new residential units in Parkway and Rockwood. That is approximately 835 new students. By 2030, we project the cost of educating those 835 students will be over \$16 million annually. Unlike a normal residential build, there will be no new revenues to the schools to pay for their education. The total loss for our community, schools and taxpayers is estimated at over \$220 million dollars over the next 20 years. Based on projections given, it will be a quarter of a century until revenues match expenses on an *annual* basis for Parkway. Rockwood will never break even on an annual basis. Neither District will ever break even in total over the life of the projections given.

For Parkway there will be approximately 800 new students. This development is within the Shenandoah Elementary footprint. The students will also go to Central Middle and Central High. Shenandoah is not big enough to handle this influx of students. In fact none of Parkway's elementary schools were built to handle this large of a population influx. Without a funding source, Parkway would be unable to build a new school.

For Rockwood, there will be approximately 40 new students. This will put an additional burden to house these new students at Wildhorse Elementary, Crestview Middle School and Maquette High School. Potentially requiring a building addition at Wildhorse Elementary if enrollment growth exceeds projections.

This has significant implications for taxpayers and families:

- 1) Major district wide boundary changes will be needed without a new school. For Parkway, many Central students will be moved to the North and West footprint. That will then result in many West students moving to the South area.
- 2) In addition to redistricting class sizes will increase without proper funding. Low student to teacher ratios are vital for a proper education
- 3) Parkway may be forced to remove the voluntary rollback in place on our residential tax rate and consider increasing the tax rate to support the additional student enrollment.

Rockwood could be forced to ask voters to support a tax rate increase to cover the additional cost to educate the new students.

- 4) Trailers may need to be purchased for the influx of students. This is not an ideal learning environment.

In general TIFs are not often used for Residential.

- 1) TIFs should only rarely be used for residential development due to the costs mentioned above.
- 2) At the first TIF meeting the City was asked if they knew of other successful TIFs that included thousands of residential units. They were unable to name any and have not provided any examples since the meeting.
- 3) A small residential project in an area with excess school capacity is the only time a TIF should be used for residential with a guaranteed revenue stream to support the increased operating costs of education. Neither of those are factors here.
- 4) A residential TIF without proper financial support for the residents it will serve - the schools, students, teachers and families is not good for the community - and may undermine the perceived value of development to potential residents. As we know, strong schools are a strong predictor of where residents will choose to build and live.

We were asked by the TIF commission chair to begin working with the City to work on a compromise due to the significant impact to Chesterfield families and taxpayers. We would appreciate your time to work together on this. Here are some of our proposals:

- No TIF for residential projects- this is a very normal request by all school districts.
- Limit the use of the TIF for the blighted area. Based on the map provided by PGAV only the mall is considered blighted.
- Chesterfield provides space for a new elementary school. Similar to how the current TIF plan has money to expand the library to meet increased demand.
- Chesterfield guarantees the PILOTs. The forecasted increase in City utility and sales taxes would more than cover that guarantee. If the estimates are accurate, the City will never pay a dime for that guarantee. Parkway could use this revenue guarantee for bond payments related to the cost of a new elementary school. We would be unable to secure a bond against a forecasted PILOT alone. Rockwood could use this guarantee to help fund the education of the new students.

**MAYOR GETS UGLY AT END OF MEETING OVER PICKLEBALL DELAY** The last item on the agenda was Pickleball Courts. It was a resolution to: Direct staff to prepare plans, estimates, and specifications for construction of Pickleball Courts in Central Park at the location originally recommended by the Master Plan and Parks Committee and return the developed information to the City Council for review and further direction for the project.

The courts were originally to be built at an entrance to a new section of Central Park. Councilman Dan Hurt said he spoke with a real estate agent who thought the location was a bad idea.

The Pickle Ball Courts' placement on the property purchased for the Central Park near the amphitheater was continued for a year at a July meeting of the Parks Committee. A number of councilpersons are concerned about green space as much or more than the Pickle Ball Courts.

“We began this to have move green space, so we should,” said one councilperson.

The Council took no action on ordering the staff to develop plans for the Pickle Ball Courts at the original planned area on the purchased property. Last November the Council had not chosen a location for the pickle ball courts. Tax money had not been budgeted for the courts but \$300,000 from Federal ARPA COVID relief funds had been budgeted.

At the end of the meeting and before Mayor Nation adjourned the short Council meeting, he made a speech directed at and criticizing the City Council.

“Councilmembers acting as obstructionists and are denying our residents a good source of exercise. It isn’t right. I don’t appreciate the action of the Council tonight,” said Mayor Nation.

It should be noted that the mayor’s wife is a very active pickle ball player who has been a leading proponent to have City outdoor pickle ball courts in the center section of the city.

**LIQUOR LICENSE ISSUED TO PROBLEM BUSINESS IN GREEN TRAILS.** The Council against the advice of the City Attorney and City Administrator, who feared being sued, had been refusing to issue a liquor license to the gas station and repair shop at retail area in the middle of the subdivision, due to code violations on the property. The license was applied for and not approved since July. At the November 7 meeting it was granted on a 7-0 vote.

The property and adjoining property had unlicensed car from the repair shop illegally parked, plus commercial vehicles stored and trash dumpsters without lids.



The owner Tom Bradley addressed just some of the violations, but not all. The city paid to tow off the illegally and unlicensed cars. The dumpster was still without a lid in November.

Due to a number of complaints from residents in Ward 1 about the issues at the gas station, Councilwoman Mary Monachella refused to vote for approval of the liquor license and abstained.
