The meeting lasted 14 minutes. Everything was first read to be voted on at the December 12 meeting. There was a public hearing on the 2023 Budget. No alderperson spoke and there was no one from public wishing to comment on it.

GYM LOCKER CAR KEY THIEF SENTENCED TO 15 YEARS PRISON: Randy Lewis Moore, 21, of Hazelwood is getting a new residence. On Monday November 28, 2022 he pled guilty to

- 15 Auto Thefts
- 2 Burglaries
- 2 Resisting arrests
- 2 Robberies

He had already pled guilty in February to Auto Theft and Felony Resisting Arrest in St. Charles Co and was sentence to 3-years prison.

After waiting sentencing in the St. Louis County Jail, Moore is off to a new home run by the Missouri Department of Corrections.

Moore's specialty was to go into gym club locker rooms and search for unlocked lockers and then grab car keys. He eventually expanded to burglary and armed robberies.

He hit gym clubs both in Town and Country and Chesterfield. For over a year he kept being released from jail (probably due to his age at the time 18) prior to trial only to steal more cars.






