BOARD OF ALDERMEN SLASH \$5,300 FROM WHITE BUFFALO DEER MANAGEMENT CONTRACT FOR JANUARY.

The Board of Aldermen have cut \$5,337 from the 2023 Budget eliminating the deer census (deer population estimate) from the White Buffalo Deer Management (shooting deer) contract, dropping it to a low of \$35,303. The City's plan is to do deer census every two years.

The census estimate gives the City an idea what they will have to deal with concerning deer in 2023.

MORE DEER NEWS

Deer was quite the topic at the December 12 Board of Aldermen meeting.



Deer lover Ald. Barbara Ann Hughes, who with Skip Manage was behind the sadistic deer relocation of 2000. In this event the City arranged with an area in Southeast Missouri where the white tail deer had not migrated to YET (they certainly did eventually). Over 70% of the deer captured died of a slow and painful death in transit known as Capture Myopathy. This was so bad that the Missouri Conservation Department banned the sad and cruel deer capturing, while allowing hunting, and herd management through rifles and bows & arrows.

Capturing and relocating deer is a lot more expensive than shooting deer. Since 2000 deer have become more and more a public safety issue. When I was a police captain in Maryland the deer began migrating from Pennsylvania around 1990. By 1995 there were so many deer and deer related auto crashes that police officers began shooting them, especially in large County Parks that the deer were taking over.

In December of 2022 Barbara Ann Hughes made a motion to include non-lethal in the deer management bill. This caused City Administrator Bob Shelton to jump up and inform everyone the Department of Conservation only allows lethal deer management as it is actually more humane.

THE HELL WITH THE CITIZEN'S WELFARE: Barbara Ann was the only person to vote for her motion to have non-lethal deer management. She apparently was pissed so when the overall budget came up for a vote, she voted NO. She voted against the \$35,000 deer management, but also voted against police protection for 2023, she voted against EMS service, Fire service, snow plowing, road repairs, paying employees, etc.

Barbara Ann was just reelected on an unopposed ballot in 2022, meaning she can put deer before people again when dealing with the 2024 budget next December.

This is from the meeting minutes:

Amendment was: *Motion to amend the budget, specifically the Road Fund, by the removal of the deer management program in the amount of \$42,640. The amendment motion failed by voice vote but it was 1 aye (Hughes) to 5 nays.*

THE HELL WITH THE CITIZEN’S WELFARE PART TWO: Next up was a motion by Ald. Pam Holman. Instead of donating all the dead deer for processing to the St. Louis Food Bank to feed area residents in poverty, to give 20 deer carcasses to the Zoo to feed animals instead of people. The change would be cheaper, but you have to question if people shouldn’t come first before zoo animals. Here is the motion:

Explanation of the substitute: *the substitute includes amendments to allow for up to 20 deer to be donated to the zoo in addition to those processed for the Share the Harvest program. It also removes distance sampling services for 2023 and extends the requirement to every other year. Motion passed by voice vote with 5 ayes and 1 nay (Hughes).*

COURT DENIES TOWN AND COUNTRY’S REQUEST TO DISMISS LAWSUIT OVER FAILURE TO ENFORCE BULDING CODE: On 11/29/22 St. Louis County Circuit Judge Ellen Ribauda denied the City of Town and Country’s motion to remove them from the lawsuit involving Dave and Erin Lamb, residents at 603 Greenwich Green who are claiming that the city did not enforce building codes for a new mini mansion on a lot originally facing Clayton Road but now on a hill on Greenwich Green.

The Lambs claim the construction and lack of enforcement of building codes badly damaged their mid-century modern house designed by the late well known architect Ralph Fournier, by sending storm water onto their property.

The 2023 Budget did not get approved as presented. Ald. Pam Holman made a motion to add \$500,000 to finish the Woodmark Stormwater project, something that is needed. The engineering and design have already been completed and paid for.

Amendment was: *Motion to amend the budget, specifically the Parks & Stormwater Fund, by reinstating construction of the Woodmark Stormwater Project in the amount of \$500,000. The change in fund balance for the Parks & Stormwater Fund will show as a deficit once the budget document is updated. It will go from \$287,089 to (\$212,911) to accommodate the \$500,000 project being added back for 2023. Motion passed unanimously by voice vote.*

NO TACOS FOR YOU: On the agenda was the approval of the Tacos 4 Life restaurant in the strip shopping center in front of Schnuck's supermarket on Clayton at Woods Mill. Three items included approving the business license, approving outside dining and approving action by the Architectural Review Board.

All agenda items were withdrawn by Tacos 4 Life after Schnucks (DESCO) and Tacos 4 Life had issues with the lease and other items. We were told no Tacos 4 our Life for a while or ever.



COUNTY PROSECUTOR OPENING A SATELLITE OFFICE AT CHESTERFIELD



