

An officer conducting business patrols located a water main break at a vacant business and notified the fire department who was able to shut off the water and prevent significant damage to the building.



A NOTE FROM PAST EXPERIENCE: My days of answering calls as a police officer and many years volunteering to work Christmas since I didn't have any kids, I found the worst days for "Family Disturbances" were Thanksgiving and Christmas. All the relatives, including some who didn't get along, crammed into one house with the open bar serving drinks by noon, was a recipe for family fights and calls to the cops and sometimes paramedics.

The earliest such call was in Rock Hill. I answered it at 10am and the problem person was almost falling down drunk, plus the suspect was a "she." There was the 10pm call in Liberty, Missouri that was like being at a bar. The entire basement was a bar, where the fight broke out and was still going on when we arrived.

The exception to the rule dealt with the super-rich. There could be quite a family fight going on and there would be no calls to the police. The reason was the superrich folks did not want their neighbors to see the police at their house. Over seven years I don't remember one call when I worked in Chevy Chase Maryland.

In Chevy Chase one husband locked his wife in the trunk of their car for a day. She did not file a report, but told me about it several days later. After a divorce she either jumped or was pushed to her death from an upper floor of her apartment in nearby Friendship Heights, Maryland.

This year it appeared to be the weather that kept the relatives from showing up.

Town and Country did have one husband and wife Christmas Day Disturbance.

MONARCH FIRE CHIEF RETIRES AFTER 48 YEARS WITH ST. LOUIS FD AND

MONARCH: Cary Spiegel retired as Fire Chief at the Monarch Fire Protection District in November. Spiegel had an interesting ride to the top. The Firefighters Union majority board forced previously non-union command staff to retire when they had a 2-1 majority with Robin Harris, a commercial airline pilot who was not tied to the Firefighters Union voting against the forced departures.

When former State Senator Jane Cunningham was elected to the Fire Board the Fire Union lost its majority on the board. Chief Sean Porter was forced out and Chuck Marsonette was made Fire Chief and Cary Spiegel came back to the Fire District as a Deputy Chief in 2013.

Marsonette was forced to resign over a conflict with his off-duty work as an airplane flight instructor. Cary Spiegel was then promoted to Fire Chief.

Over Spiegel's time as Fire Chief and battles between the Fire Union and District began to wane to the point that board meetings consisted of an empty meeting room.

The Fire Board voted 3-0 for Deputy Fire Chief Russ Adams to become the new chief on November 18, 2022. Adam has over 35 years experience in the fire service including 22-years with Monarch. Chief Spiegel's last day was November 23.


