**STORMWATER BILLS FIRST READ.** The budget for 2023-24 had no funding for stormwater projects on Woodmark (Ward 2) and Oak Springs (Ward 1). Alderwoman Pam Holman got these projects back on the budget after they had been cut by City Hall staff.

The low bid for the Woodmark (in Thornhill subdivision) was \$449,238.65 by T. Hill Construction. T. Hill won the contract with the other two coming in at \$476,868 and \$504,935.


The low bid for the Oak Springs Lane project was \$103,851 versus the high bid of \$268,950. The Two Alpha Contracting Company won with the low bid.

**RESIDENT TO DONATE \$10,700 FOR TWO FLOCK CAMERAS:** The City has purchased of two flock cameras. A resident has agreed to donate \$10,700 for the two cameras. The one thing is both will be placed on Topping Road at the north and south ends.

The Flock cameras check license plates for stolen cars and people with warrants and felony arrest orders. There are a number of Flock Cameras in Town and Country and Chesterfield subdivisions. There is also one at Clayton and Ballas.

In Town and Country most are at entrances to subdivisions as car thieves and car clouters are normally arriving in stolen cars. The Flock Cameras send out the “hit” to on duty police officers and supervisors.

**CITY APPLIES FOR GRANT TO MAKE BOPP ROAD IMPROVEMENTS.** The Aldermen voted to apply for a grant that would pay for 80% of the \$2,324,685, leaving the city with a cost of \$464,937. The grant would be through the East-West Gateway Council of Governments.

**COUNCILMAN AARON WAHL SENDS OUT AN E-MAIL THAT HE IS CONSIDERING WITHDRAWING FOR APRIL ELECTION:** Councilman Aaron Wahl sent out an e-mail on January 9 saying he is going to withdraw from the April election. Wahl, a local chiropractor, has an opponent this year, Pat Tocco, who was one of the six at the last Council meeting complaining Drag productions including the recent Drag Queen Christmas. If Wahl steps down it will only leave a race in Ward-4.

At the January 3<sup>rd</sup> City Council meeting Wahl stated that he would place an ordinance on the ballot to charge sales taxes on Internet purchase and would continue to place the ordinance on the agenda if it got voted down. It appears he will not have an opportunity to do that.

Tocco recently complained about what we wrote about her remarks at the last City Council meeting being lies. (Word is that she has some backing from Jane Cunningham and Ben Keathley.) See Below.

**ONE OF THE ANTI DRAG QUEEN CHRISTMAS SPEAKERS CLAIMS SHE DID NOT LIE.** At 4:30pm on Thursday I receive a call from Pat Tocco a Chesterfield resident and City Council candidate, 34who denied lying when speaking against the Drag Queen Christmas Show at the Factory theater. I had her name with six others that I referred as a "Pack of Liars" in our newsletter last week after their statements before the City Council which were shown to be false.

She challenged me to go review her comments before the Council and see where she lied. The other five speakers were making outrageous statements claiming the Drag Queen show involved nudity (the whole point of a drag queen is it is men dressed up in women's clothes not being nude), was pornographic, anti-Christian, encouraged child abuse and was obscene.

I highlighted the part of her comments where I felt she lied and also where she encouraged Chesterfield to violate the first Amendment of United States Constitution. She lied claiming the drag show me the city's "definition of pornography, nudity and obscenity." Police Chief Ray Johnson assigned two officers inside the Factory Theater and they reported there was no nudity, no pornography and no obscenity in the show.

Of course Tocco would not know this since she did not attend the show, but felt she should comment on what she did not know.

Hello, I'm Pat Tocco. I live here in Chesterfield. My address is 14702 Whitebrook Drive.

I participated in a large St. Louis group that express their upset with the drag show at Factory on Wednesday December 21. I too feel that this type of live performance is not suitable for minors under 18. Similar to how movies self regulate with R rating.

**This drag show definitely met the definition of pornography , nudity, and obscenity under Chesterfield Ordinance Section 210.1670-200.** I emailed my councilwoman on Saturday, spoke with Mayor Bob Nation on Monday morning about my concerns. I also talked to Officer Gary Gunn on Tuesday to understand how the police would control the event inside outside the event. I also attended the rally on Wednesday evening.

I would like to express my appreciation that Chesterfield followed the above ordinance and stopped minors from attending the this adult only performance. I would also like to compliment the police for their profession handling of the event issue. However, I'm asking the mayor and city council to perform a post-event evaluation to determine to determine if the matter was handled in full compliance with the above ordinance and weather any addition steps were warranted.

Matters that can be included:

One Did the Factory violate the ordinance by any of its actions and what are the penalties?

Two Is the penalty high enough to discourage a venue from taking such actions? And I believe it is not.

Three Do the definitions or guidance of the ordinance need any clarifications or revisions?

Four Have a discussion with Factory management to make sure they understand such the that type of events that would not be acceptable for minors and Chesterfield fully plans to enforce this ordinance.

As a Chesterfield resident I was embarrassed as this put Chesterfield under a negative spotlight. **I really want Chesterfield to be viewed as a family friendly city. Please take the necessary steps that this never happens again.**

Here are the Obscenity and Porn ordinances.

### OBSCENE

Any material or performance is obscene, if:

a.

The average person, applying contemporary adult community standards, would find that, taken as a whole, the material or performance appeals to the prurient interest in sex;

b.

The average person, applying contemporary adult community standards, would find that, taken as a whole, the material or performance depicts, describes or portrays in a patently offensive way human sexual intercourse, sodomy, bestiality, oral copulation, masturbation, urinary and defecatory functions, sadism, masochism, sadomasochistic abuse, lewd exhibition of the genitals or any touching of the genitals, pubic areas or buttocks of the human male or female or the breasts of the female, whether alone or between members of the same or opposite sex or between humans and animals in an act of apparent sexual stimulation or gratification; and

c.

The reasonable person, when taking the material or performance as a whole, would find that it lacks serious social, literary, artistic, political or scientific value.

## Article X Offenses Concerning Pornography

### OBSCENE

Any material or performance if, taken as a whole:

1.

Applying contemporary community standards, its predominant appeal is to prurient interest in sex; and

2.

The average person, applying contemporary community standards, would find the material depicts or describes sexual conduct in a patently offensive way; and



A reasonable person would find the material lacks serious literary, artistic, political or scientific value.

PERFORMANCE

Any play, motion-picture film, videotape, dance or exhibition performed before an audience of one (1) or more.

**PROTESTERS CLEARLY DESCRIMINATING AGAINST GAYS.** If you want to see obscenity in a music show go to a Rock Concert where often you can see musicians with no shirts, grinding and humping as they sing or play the guitar. I haven't seen any West County protesters at these concerts.









