Three Planning and Zoning meetings over 10-months with overflow crowds of residents all against this project had no effect on P&Z members. Only Dennis Bolazina voted against it.

Will McKnight the vice chairman from Ward 2 made a statement that did not sit well with the overflow crowd. "It will be good for the looks for Town and Country."

The dorm, then hotel plan was changed again to green space. The sports center capacity was reduced again. Originally it was 3,000, then 2,800 and now 2,200 seats. There will still be 2 roundabouts on South Outer 40.

Keep in mind the Board of Aldermen voted down a private Catholic grade school where the empty convent is just south of the Maryville project. The reason,,,90 students would create too much traffic.

After the vote where Ward-4 Alderman Jeff Parrotte voted for the project several residents from Ward-4 were talking about finding someone to run against Parrottee as a "write-in" in the April 4<sup>th</sup> Municipal election. He is currently unopposed.

Finally people in the crowd were actually timing pompous ass, former Alderman Fred Meyland Smith who Mayor Charles Rehm apparently appointed to make residents suffer, as he talked excessively every time he opened his mouth. Thanks to Meyland-Smith the meeting was over 3-hours with just one agenda item.



The plans for the project now goes before the Board of Aldermen for final approval.




**CITY COUNCIL MEETING Tuesday Jan 17, 2023**



**COUNCIL VOTES NOT TO PUT ONE SALES TAX ON THE APRIL BALLOT: WEED SALES TAX:** The Council voted to table indefinitely the proposed local Marijuana Sales tax (3%) and not put it on the April election ballot. There was some talk after the meeting that two sales tax issues on the ballot might confuse voters and hurt getting the Out of State/Internet passed.

**COUNCIL VOTES 7-1 TO PUT "OUT OF STATE" AKA INTERNET SALES TAX ON THE BALLOT.** Aaron Wahl claimed voters were misinformed in 2022 when the Out of State sales tax was defeated. He said that the City needed to educate the voters.




Filing for the open spot are Grace Harvey, a local Farmers Insurance agent and Greg Haug, a West County realtor.






