**WARD-4 CANDIDATE WITHDRAWS FROM APRIL BALLOT:** After a City Clerk takes candidate filings to the Board of Elections the candidate can no longer come to city hall and withdraw from a Council race on the April ballot. All candidate filings have to be turned in by January 24.

Frances R. Siddons filed with the Chesterfield City Clerk to run against Gary Budoor, AKA Gary Girdhar according to the Times of India. Filing closed late December. Candidates had until January 24 to withdraw, After that date they had to get an order from the Circuit Court for their name to be pulled.

Siddons, a new resident from New Jersey where she was involved in local politics had been coming to meetings since filing. Her decision to withdraw after January 24 required her to file with the court. This is from the Court:

ORDER: Pursuant to the petition of Frances R. Siddons for an order authorizing withdrawal of candidacy and pursuant to MO. REV. STAT. 115.127 it is hereby ordered that Frances R. Siddons' candidacy for Council Woman of the City of Chesterfield is to be removed from the 04/04/2023 ballot so ordered Judge Mary Elizabeth Ott.

It is clear that Siddons requested her name to be removed and the Judge did not order her name removed for any reason prior to and other than the request,

Now here is the email sent out by the city administrator that inferred "the circuit court ordered her off the ballot for cause, when in fact she asked to be removed because she no longer wanted to campaign.


