CHESTERFIELD POLICE BLOTTER See the calls, the crime and the arrests

TUESDAY 03/07/23

23-976 – CIT/ Overdose/ Attempt suicide – Timberlake Manor Parkway: Officers received a call for a subject who was having suicidal ideologies. Prior to arriving, further comments stated the subject was now on the ground and unconscious. Upon officers' arrival it was discovered the subject was overdosing. Officers administered Narcan and the subject regained consciousness. The subject was transported to the hospital for treatment. If it wasn't for officers' quick reactions upon arrival and administering Narcan the subject could have succumbed to his drug use.

23-975 – Leaving the scene of a motor vehicle crash – Woods Mill/ Olive: A vehicle struck another vehicle from behind. After the crash, the unidentified driver of the striking vehicle got out of that car and walked away from the scene without contacting the other driver and leaving that car in the roadway. Upon officers' arrival a search of the area for the driver met with negative results. An attempt to contact the registered owner met with negative results so the vehicle was towed. See next report.

23-977 – Stolen vehicle – Thunderbird Ct: Approximately an hour after the above AALS was taken that same officer received a call for a stolen auto from a residence. Upon arrival it was determined that the victim's vehicle that was stolen was the vehicle that was involved in the above crash. The vehicle will be processed by a day shift crime scene officer on 3/6/23.

Officers responded to calls for service to include motor vehicle crashes, disturbances, sick cases, solicitors, suspicious vehicles, auto fire, suspicious person, alarms, found property and a traffic hazard.

The traffic officer on duty investigated four crashes during the shift, three of which involved minor injuries.

Officers responded to other less significant calls to include burglar alarms, sick cases, gas leaks, and accidental injuries.

Officers also provided routine patrols of businesses, neighborhoods, and parks.

23-1006 Drug Arrest: An officer conducted a traffic stop for a license plate violation on Walden Pond. The officer then discovered the driver had felony warrants out of St. Louis County and St. Louis City for drugs. A search incident to arrest revealed a large

amount of fentanyl, methamphetamine, heroin, and drug paraphernalia with intent to distribute. The subject was arrested and conveyed to the station. At the station, the officer discovered the subject had a large, festering wound on his arm from drug use. The subject was conveyed to the hospital for a fit for confinement where a doctor immediately admitted him and indicated his arm may have to be amputated. The subject was released to the hospital's custody pending application of warrants and St. Louis County and City were notified of his medical condition and location. This was a good example of police work and traffic enforcement that removed a large amount of dangerous drugs from the street.



23-1008 Warrant Arrest: During a call for a traffic hazard on 141 at Olive, the driver of a disabled vehicle was found to have an assault on law enforcement warrant out of Clayton PD and another assault warrant out of St. Louis County. He was placed under arrest and into the back of a caged police vehicle for transport. Due to his vehicle being disabled, blocking traffic, not registered, and no insurance, the vehicle was towed. However, when the subject observed his vehicle being towed, he became combative and hostile while in the back of the police vehicle. Officers on the scene used de-escalation techniques and were able to calm him down without using any force. Due to his aggressive nature and dangerous criminal history, he was conveyed directly to St. Louis County Intake where he became combative with corrections officials after being released to their custody. Good job to officers who kept their composure and used their training to control a dangerous individual to police officers.

Missouri State Highway Patrol Report: A traffic officer responded to a call for a vehicle collision in the area of Highway 40 and the Boone Bridge. Upon arrival, it was discovered the crash occurred in St. Charles County and the Missouri State Highway Patrol was notified and responded to investigate. Due to only one trooper responding and the crash involving a drunk driver and a vehicle blocking a lane of traffic, the Chesterfield Officer assisted by placing her vehicle in the involved lane to block traffic. While waiting for the scene to clear, a motorist traveling on W/B Highway 40 in the fast lane, failed to pay attention to the emergency equipment ahead and failed to

pull to the side for emergency vehicles and struck the rear of the Chesterfield Police vehicle with the officer still in it. The officer was shaken up but immediately exited her car and checked on the other vehicle's occupants who were also not injured. The Missouri Highway Patrol responded and investigated the crash. All city notifications were made.

It should be noted if the Chesterfield Officer did not block the traffic lane, the vehicle would have crashed into the trooper, fire department personnel, and the previous crash victims as they were all outside their vehicles.

Officers also provided patrol to neighborhoods and businesses as well as conducted traffic enforcement.

No Report - Fire - North Outer 40: Emergency Personnel responded to a report of a fire. The call notes indicated it was a possible vehicle fire. First Responders located and quickly extinguished a moderate-sized mulch fire that had spread to the surrounding flora.

Officers responded to calls for service to include; trespassing, traffic hazards, motor vehicle crashes, and others. They also conducted proactive traffic enforcement as well as routine patrols of neighborhoods and businesses.
