CITY PLANNING DIRECTOR IS IN NO HURRY TO FORCE DEVELOPER TO REMOVE FALLEN TREE AND DEBRIS IN YARD FOR OVER SIX WEEKS. 1834 Manor Hill had a large tree fall across the front yard to the edge of the street on June 23.



A late June storm took down this tree and for six weeks the city has not forced the developer KEMP Homes to clean it up. The City Planning Director, Ryan Spencer, is not forcing his inspectors to enforce Kemp Homes to remove the city code violation from the front yard, claiming Kemp will do it when their plans are approved. It is going on two months now.

Spencer is beginning to remind me of the Planning Director he replaced, Craig Wilde. Craig was a nice guy but refused to enforce the building codes on developers and was forced to resign.

So far in 2023 we have learned the City of Town & Country refuses to enforce these laws in the city's ordinance book;

- Discharging and Possession of Fireworks
- Bars required to have city Liquor Licenses
- Codes banning debris and tree debris on property

Spenser is now appearing to put developers ahead of citizens. Here are email exchanges:

MAN CHARGED FOR SHOOTING AT WOMAN DRIVER ON I-64 IN TOWN & COUNTRY

28-year-old **Terrell Tyreese GALVIN** of Ellisville has been charged with a Felony of Shooting into a Motor Vehicle on I-64 on Wednesday July 19.



This is from the Press Officer of the County Prosecutor's Office:

According to a Town and Country Police Department investigation, on July 19, 2023 at 5:53pm, a woman was driving westbound on Interstate 64 when another driver drove alongside her and pointed a gun at her then fired a shot at her vehicle. She took a photograph of the other vehicle then drove to the Town and Country Police Department. Police contacted the registered owner of the vehicle, who said his daughter was driving the car. Police spoke with the daughter and her fiancé, who confirmed they had been in the vehicle at the time. They initially told police

that the victim had shot at their vehicle first and then the fiancé shot back in self-defense. After they responded to the Town and Country Country Police Department and were separated, the defendant's fiancée admitted that the defendant had fired the only shot. Confronted by this statement, he eventually admitted that he had shot at the victim but that she had not shot at him. The gun that he fired, a Glock 9mm, was recovered from the defendant's mother's residence.



I have probable cause to believe that on July 19, 2023, within St. Louis County, Terrell Galvin, Black, Male, 5'07", 270lbs, committed one or more criminal offense(s).

Count: 01 UNLAWFUL USE OF WEAPON - SHOOT AT/FROM MOTOR
VEHICLE - CLASS B FELONY

The facts supporting this belief are as follows: Victim responded to the Town and Country police station and reported that she had been driving on westbound Interstate 64 when another driver drove alongside her and first pointed a gun at her then fired a shot at her vehicle. Victim took a photograph of the other car then drove to the Town and Country police station. Police contacted the registered owner of the vehicle who said his daughter was driving the car. Police spoke with the daughter and defendant (her fiancée) who confirmed they had been in the vehicle at the time. Defendant and his fiancée initially told police that victim had pulled a gun and fired a shot at their vehicle first and then defendant shot back in self-defense. After both defendant and his fiancée responded to the Town and Country police station, they were separated, and defendant's fiancée subsequently admitted that defendant had fired the only shot. Defendant, confronted by this statement, eventually admitted that he had shot at victim but that she had not shot at him. The gun that he fired, a Glock 9mm, was recovered from defendant's mother's residence.

I believe that the defendant poses a danger to the community or to any other person because of the nature of this offense. A warrant is requested.

THE RETURN OF THE EVIL ROB REHNQUIST: The illegal tree killer and villain of building codes, Rob Rehnquist is back in action off of Mason Road. Dating back to 2019 and beyond Rehnquist saved money by ignoring City codes and cutting down “protected” trees in woodland reserve areas for new houses off Mason Road.

He is now building a garage at 13715 Bellcrest off of Mason Road. He got a “stop Word” order, but now the City Planner states everything has been approved. The stop work order was for not having a permit for a retaining wall. There was no citation issued.

A subcontractor did violate a “permanent open space area.” Again, no citations.

Rehnquist “The Tree Killer” did manage to damage four trees, requiring the Town and Country residents to pay for the Arborist to respond and then recommend treatment for the damaged trees.

This was how the property looked when it was eligible for a 3-home subdivision and before Rehnquist got the status changed and began clear cutting. The Planning and Zoning Commission had turned down the 7-house proposal; then the Board of Aldermen approved it.





The first stop work order came on April 16, 2019 at the project at 1919 S. Mason. This was after Rehnquist cut down two stately 100-plus year-old Elm trees that had dodged Dutch elm disease. These trees were supposed to be protected. However, Rehnquist was not issued a citation. He and his subcontractors continue to place plowed dirt around existing trees that will likely kill them.



The entire land parcel in 2012 had been designated Protected Woodland. There was only room for three houses to be built on the property. In 2016 Rehnquist attacked the requirements and the Board of Aldermen buckled and moved the protected trees area to the rear of the property.

Here are some of the citizens and residents comments at the Board of Aldermen meeting in May of 2018 opposing the 7-house, tree killing proposal that the Aldermen eventually approved.

“There are numerous reasons to fail Mr. Rehnquist’s request. Your constituents overwhelming oppose it. The commissions (Planning and Zoning) got this right. We expect you to do the same thing.”

“There is zero support for this guy. We are waiting for all of you to do the right thing.”

“I was shocked there is a long line of elderly people and widows who come up and show the damage Rehnquist has done to their property. To hear him deny any public responsibility is shocking.”

“I was thrilled Planning and Zoning rejected Mr. Rehnquist. I think it is a shame he doesn’t to abide by the rules.”

“He has done damage to neighbors’ property. Mr. 7-year-old granddaughter asked, ‘Who speaks for the trees.’”

“It is appalling that past Rehnquist developments have done damage to others’

property. Three strikes and you are out. Mr. Rehnquist should be out in Town and Country.”

“Where are the city priorities with development concerning existing adjoining properties? We are not being provided the best oversight by the city.”

Two engineers spoke and said that tree removal for a seven home subdivision instead of the three homes allowed, would cause storm water damage to adjoining neighbors.

What's New? Rehnquist and subcontractors are still violating “open space” areas. Rehnquist is doing work without permits and Rehnquist is damaging trees. The Planning Commission unanimously approved Rehnquist’s application that did not followed code on April 19.

Another Rehnquist subdivision on Mason Road did not follow code, Here is the result to property south on the east side of Mason at 1536 South Mason, that had been in one family for 150 years. He lost a lawsuit filed by the property owner, who maintain the damage was much greater than the judgment.



Rehnquist reluctantly met city requirement for a sidewalk and trees at another subdivision but mixed in cheaper pear trees that have since been disallowed due to failure to withstand wind when full grown. Many cities are removing pear trees from right-aways between sidewalks and the street.

ANOTHER VICTIM OF THE POLICE REFUSING TO ENFORCE FIREWORKS LAWS:

There was the Drace Park Pavilion valued at \$120,000 that was destroyed by illegal shooting of fireworks that the police ignored, until the fire was reported.



There are the residents fearful of their neighbors shooting off fireworks and hot ashes falling on their houses. Of course, there also are the dogs who become very afraid during fireworks being shot off illegally. Here is the latest victim:

Former Alderwoman Tiffany Frautcshi, whose family includes her husband, a retired Navy aircraft carrier air combat commander, now a test pilot at Boeing, kids, the family dog and two horses. One of the horses suffered a head injury in its stall due to frightened bucking while fireworks were being illegally shot off and ignored by the police.



It seems to me that the cost of the destroyed park pavilion and the horse's vet bill should come out of the police budget since they made no effort to enforce the city's fireworks laws.

QUEENY PARK TREE REASON FOR WEEKEND POWER OUTAGE: The power outage was to houses on the west side of Mason Road after a large tree on the edge of Queeny Park was uprooted and fell on power lines along Mason Rd.

Priority Street Enforcement Activity

The majority of these locations are within subdivisions where complaints of speeding and/or stop sign violations have been received. Officers assigned to the Traffic Enforcement Unit and the Bureau of Uniformed Patrol are expected to routinely monitor these locations and take enforcement action when necessary.

STEALING/ RECEIVING STOLEN PROPERTY/
