FALLEN TREE COVERING ENTIRE FRONT YARD IS REMOVED HOURS BEFORE ARCHETECTURAL REVIEW BOARD HEARING FOR NEW HOUSE.

The sign claims the property belongs to Kemp Signature Homes and is available for a new house of course. The sign has been up for over three months.

Kemp dragged its feet in removing a large fallen tree that covered the front yard starting on June 23. First Kemp told Town and Country Planner Ryan Stewart that they would remove it when they tear down the existing house.

This might have been alright with Spencer, but it was not alright with the neighbors. In fact, it was a code violation that Spencer would not have an inspector issue a citation.

Complaints were then directed to elected officials. The ARB meeting was at 5:30 on Monday August 7. A few hours before the meeting a crew from a tree service removed the tree and debris. Kemp claimed he just actually just bought the house. The County computer property records are often months behind.

THE EVIL ROB REHNQUIST GARAGE PROJECT STILL VIOLATING CODE. WILL THE CITY PROSECUTOR TAKE ACTION? As we wrote with vivid photos of builder, the Evid Rob Rehnquist killing allegedly City protected trees and ignoring City Green Space, he is at it again at 13715 Bellcrest. The address is at a subdivision build by Rehnquist where he got the city to change to Tree Protection area and increase lots from three to seven at the costs of trees.

The home at 13715 is owned by Nick Hamilton, the owner of Car Shield, the national car repair warranty company that currently has a D rating from the Better Business Bureau. Hamilton and Car Shield have sued the BBB over the rating, which at one time had been an F.

A Stop Work Oreder had been issued by the City regarding a retaining wall issue in the Garage construction. More trees in a green space area were damaged.

Apparently when you own a \$3-m house your attached 4-car garage just isn't enough.

The latest is a Rehnquist subcontractor having moved heavy equipment into a green space area causing extensive damage. As far as Rehnquist is concerned Town and County is not a "Tree City."

In response to a Sunshine info request we received the following from the City:

On 6/23/23 there was a notice of violation (see attached) sent to Nick Hamilton, the owner of 13715 Belcrest Court, for disturbance of the permanent open space and the construction of a permanent outdoor game court (an in-ground trampoline). Since the date of the letter we have been in contact with Mr. Hamilton regarding the restoration of the permanent open space, however on Monday (8/7/23) we were notified that construction equipment has since continued to be driven and disturbed the permanent open space.

Both issues have been referred to the Prosecuting Attorney for their review and consideration for further action.

Section 405.335 Natural Resource Protection Standards/Section 405.370.13 Conditional Uses

Mr. Hamilton:

VIOLATION 1

The City has been made aware of a serious violation of permanent open space on your property. There appears to be a construction path used by heavy equipment and the storage of materials within the defined permanent open space area. It also appears that several trees within the permanent open space area have been damaged by this equipment.

Per Section 405.355.B.m.1

Permanent open space shall be maintained in current locations as indicated on the plat and shall remain <u>fully and completely undisturbed</u>, except for activities defined by Section 405.335(B)(3), without prior appropriate permit from the City of Town and Country. In the event that such actions occur, the owner shall be required to replant the disturbed areas and place with the City of Town and Country an escrow which insures their maintenance until maturation.

The only legally permitted activities within defined permanent open space are tree limb pruning, removal of invasive plants, and the planting of native grasses, wildflowers, shrubs, and trees. The planting of lawn or turf grass shall not be permitted.

Within thirty (30) days from the date of this letter the following shall be submitted to the City for approval.

- An arborist report on the condition and survivability of the damaged trees.
- A landscape plan prepared by a landscaping professional for the remediation of the impacted area.

Failure to submit these documents within that time frame will result in this matter being forwarded to the City Prosecutor for consideration of citation issuance.

Once the documents have been received and approved by the City the remediation of the area shall commence within fourteen (14) days of that approval.

Failure to commence remediation within that time frame will result in this matter being forwarded to the City Prosecutor for consideration of citation issuance.

VIOLATION 2

Inspection of the violation of permanent open space resulted in discovery of a permanent outdoor game court in the form of an in-ground trampoline. Permanent Outdoor Game Courts require conditional use permit approval. You have thirty (30) days from the date of this letter to either remove the in-ground trampoline or submit a conditional use permit application

Failure to commence remediation within that time frame will result in this matter being forwarded to the City Prosecutor for consideration of citation issuance.



CITY COUNCIL MEETING AUGUST 7, 2023



CITY COUNCIL VOTES TO BLIGHT CHESTERFIELD MALL AND ADJOINING PROPERTY 8-0. The City Council without debate voted unanimously to blight the property of Chesterfield Mall and some adjoining property on Monday August 7, 2023.











Over a dozen people spoke in favor of the development (which is not on the agenda yet) and the move to blight the property.

A lawyer speaking for Dillard's Department Store spoke against the blighting measure. Dillard's was one of the large department stores at the Mall but really wasn't. Dillard's owns their building that was connected to the mall but not property of the Mall.



Dillard's store suffered major damage in 2016 from a broken water pipe and they did not reopen. However they want to be around when the Staenberg Group develops and rebuilds the property.

The lawyer said he provided all council members with a document on why the property should not be blighted. However, he provided it three hours before the meeting.

All:

This correspondence is submitted with respect to the second reading of Proposed Ordinances 3457 and 3458 which is scheduled for August 7, 2023. We request that these comments be provided to the City Council prior to their meeting for consideration by the City Council.

As you and the City Council are aware, we represent Dillard's, an "interested person" in that it owns approximately 17 acres in the proposed Redevelopment Area ("the Dillard's Parcel"). You and the City Council are also aware that Dillard's has previously asserted, and continues to maintain, that the proposed Redevelopment Area does not satisfy the statutory requirement that it is a "blighted area," and further maintains that the adoption of this proposed Development Plan will be legally invalid. I refer you to my letter dated July 17, 2023 previously submitted to you and the City Council wherein we identified several deficiencies and problems with the proposed Development Plan that show a lack of substantial evidence to support the proposed Development Plan under Chapter 353.

In addition to the matters set forth in my July 17, 2023 letter, we are submitting herewith for the City Council's consideration in connection with the Development Plan (via an electronic Sharefile link) photographs of the proposed Redevelopment Area taken in December 2022 and additional photographs of some areas of the Dillard's Parcel taken just a week ago which depict the present condition of the proposed Redevelopment Area and the Dillard's Parcel. We point out that the photographs included in the June 2, 2023 Development Plan prepared by PGAV Planners ("PGAV") appear to be outdated and do not accurately represent or depict the present, or even a recent, condition of the property. It is imperative that the City Council consider the present condition of the property when making any blight determination with respect to the proposed Redevelopment Area.

Also submitted herewith for the City Council's consideration is the Declaration of C.J. Duque. As set forth in that declaration, PGAV never contacted Dillard's to coordinate an inspection of the Dillard's Parcel or to discuss Dillard's plans for the Dillard's Parcel. Had PGAV done so, PGAV would have learned that Dillard's wants to and at all times has intended to update, reopen and operate the Dillard's Parcel in its present location in connection with any redevelopment of the proposed Redevelopment Area and that Dillard's had been in ongoing discussions with The Staenberg Group ("TSG") with respect to redevelopment of the Dillard's Parcel in the proposed Redevelopment Area prior to submission of the recent Chapter 353 Redevelopment proposal. Examples of some of those communications between Dillard's and TSG are included with the declaration.

As the City is aware, it is still Dillard's desire and intention to reopen its store in the proposed Redevelopment Area, and Dillard's is engaged in discussions with TSG to explore how Dillard's can participate in the redevelopment of the proposed Redevelopment Area. This is an important fact in determining whether an economic liability exists with respect to the proposed Redevelopment Area. Between Dillard's and TSG, which already owns the remaining parcels located in the proposed Redevelopment Area and which intends to redevelop its parcels without the use of any tax abatement under Chapter 353, the proposed Redevelopment Area is not an economic liability, as these two entities on their own can and will redevelop the proposed Redevelopment Area without any Chapter 353 redevelopment. In light of the foregoing, the Chapter 353 Redevelopment Plan is not necessary or warranted. Any attempt to condemn the Dillard's Parcel will be a legally risky and very costly endeavor.

Also attached to the Declaration of C.J. Duque are certain documents obtained in discovery in the pending TIF lawsuit between Dillard's and the City, which detail the police and emergency service calls made in the past five (5) years with respect to the larger TIF redevelopment area. Mr. Duque's declaration details the true present conditions of the Property, which, due to his position as Division Engineer overseeing Dillard's Missouri stores, he is very familiar with. Mr. Duque explains that, far from being abandoned, the property is still actively managed, monitored, and maintained by Dillard's. Although Dillard's did not reopen this store following the water main burst in 2016 due to pending redevelopment discussions, it remediated the damage caused by the City's burst water main and repaired the Property to a stable condition. The Property is monitored and protected by active security and life-safety systems, which immediately notify Mr. Duque and his team of any issues.

The police and emergency records disclosed by the City include not only those to the proposed Chapter 353 Redevelopment Area, but also the surrounding properties included within the much larger TIF Redevelopment Area. You will see from these documents that the calls with respect to the TIF redevelopment area (of which only a fraction are attributable to the proposed Chapter 353 Redevelopment Area) are no greater than neighboring and adjoining areas and that the type of calls identified within the TIF Redevelopment Area as a whole do not indicate a predominance of "unsafe conditions" or "the existence of conditions which endanger life or property by fire or other causes" as required by state statute. PGAV's conclusory comments in the Redevelopment Plan that the Redevelopment Area is an economic liability due to "a need for greater public resources, such as increased attention required by police, fire, and code enforcement officials from the city" therefore lack evidentiary support. Specifically, there is no evidence of any calls relating to activities that would "endanger life or property" or result in Nor are there any reports or other evidence of homeless or other "unsafe conditions." individuals taking shelter upon the proposed Redevelopment Area. PGAV's comment that the proposed Redevelopment Area is ripe for trespassing, vandalization and other crimes is not supported by evidence, let alone substantial evidence as required by Missouri law. Development Plan itself specifically acknowledges that there were no signs of break-ins, nor any other crimes, other than some harmless graffiti on the Dillard's Parcel and one stray paint can in the enclosed mall, which are very small portions of the proposed Redevelopment Area, not the Area as a whole. There is simply no evidence to support a finding that the proposed Redevelopment Area is a social liability.

We believe the above evidence, in addition to the matters set forth in my letter of July 17, 2023, establishes that the proposed Redevelopment Area is not blighted as contemplated by Chapter 353 and that the Development Plan does not satisfy the requirements of Missouri law.

Finally, I will note that we have great concerns regarding the proposed use of Chapter 353 redevelopment in this context, as it has been specifically represented that TSG has no intention of seeking tax abatement, the principal purpose behind Chapter 353 redevelopment, with respect to the Development Plan, and particularly in light of the pending TIF for the same property and additional property, which has already been approved by the City and subject to a redevelopment agreement and plan and which is proceeding in parallel with this proposed Chapter 353 Development Plan. We believe the use of Chapter 353 in this context is contrary to the letter, spirit, and intent of Chapter 353 and the TIF statutes. Pursuit of a Chapter 353 redevelopment plan while simultaneously also pursuing a TIF redevelopment plan for the same property are in conflict with one another, and it seems to us that the City will have a difficult time convincing the court that the proposed TIF development satisfies the "but for" test under Missouri law in light of the same. The Chapter 353 Development Plan, to the extent that it is approved by the City Council, constitutes further evidence that the City's actions with respect to the TIF were arbitrary, capricious, and without evidentiary basis or support.

Again, I must point out that Dillard's is engaged concerning this matter. We welcome any assistance that the City can provide to help Dillard's and TSG reach a resolution of this

matter that will allow both parties to participate in the redevelopment of the area with respect to their respective parcels in the proposed Redevelopment Area. We respectfully submit that the City Council should table and defer any further actions on the Development Plan until any discussions between Dillard's and TSG are concluded. Alternatively, the Redevelopment Area should be reformed to exclude the Dillard's Parcel so as to ensure that Dillard's rights in connection therewith are not violated.

Thank you for sharing these comments with the City Council.

DEFENDANT CITY OF CHESTERFIELD'S SUPPLEMENTAL OBJECTIONS AND RESPONSES TO PLAINTIFF'S FIRST SET OF INTERROGATORIES (10-13)

Defendant City of Chesterfield objects to the plaintiff's voluminous instructions and definitions, which are overbroad, unduly burdensome, and seek to impose obligations beyond those set forth in the Missouri Supreme Court Rules. The plaintiff's purported definition of the City, for example, is unworkably broad, extending to "Defendant City of Chesterfield and its agents, employees, attorneys, investigators and all other 'persons' acting for or on behalf of the City of Chesterfield." The City could only and will only provide responses for itself.

Pursuant to Rule 57.01, parties are limited to propounding "no more than 25 written interrogatories, including all discrete subparts." Taken together with the plaintiff's voluminous instructions and definitions, the City objects that the plaintiff's interrogatories and discrete subparts far exceed 25.

The City responds as follows to the plaintiff's first set of interrogatories. The City reserves the right to supplement, amend, and/or withdraw these responses as appropriate.

- 10. Did Defendant ever consider formation of a Community Improvement District ("CID") for any portions of the real property located in the Redevelopment Area? If so, please provide:
- a. the date(s) between which such consideration was undertaken;
- the identit(ies) of the individuals principally involved on Defendant's behalf in such consideration; and
- if there was no CID formed, the reasons for Defendant's failure to do so.

OBJECTION: This interrogatory is unreasonably vague, broad, and unlimited as to time. This interrogatory is not reasonably calculated to lead to the discovery of admissible evidence. The City cannot determine what is meant by the request to list individuals involved in consideration or to list all reasons why something did not happen.

Subject to these objections, it is believed that a community improvement district is created after presentation of a petition signed by owners of real property within a proposed district's boundaries. The City has investigated whether any petition for formation of a community improvement district was placed before the City Council within the last ten years. To the best of the City's knowledge, the answer to this interrogatory may be derived or ascertained from the records dated August 21, 2020, and September 28, 2020, produced along with this response.

- 11. For the period from January 1, 2018 to the present, please provide the following:
- a. the number of police calls to the properties in the Redevelopment Area and the dates thereof;
- the number of calls to a fire district, including, but not limited to, the Monarch Fire District, regarding the properties in the Redevelopment Area and the dates thereof; and
- the number of emergency service calls with respect to the properties in the Redevelopment Area and the dates thereof.

OBJECTION: This interrogatory is unreasonably vague and broad. Further objecting, this interrogatory calls for information of entities other than the City.

Subject to these objections, the City responds as follows:

- a. the number of police calls to any properties adjoining the properties in the Redevelopment Area and the dates thereof;
- b. the number of calls to a fire district, including but not limited to, the Monarch Fire District, regarding any properties adjoining the properties in the Redevelopment Area and the dates thereof; and
- c. the number of emergency service calls with respect to any properties adjoining the properties in the Redevelopment Area and the dates thereof.

OBJECTION: This interrogatory is unreasonably vague and broad. Further objecting, this interrogatory calls for information of entities other than the City.


