I went to four editions a month thanks to several Chesterfield City Councilpersons who went to the regional editor of Patch.com (a national news website that covered local news). They did not like some of the columns I wrote concerning Chesterfield government and politics and wanted to review all of my columns before they were posted. This move caused me to add Chesterfield to my newsletter.

My Chesterfield Patch editor, Jean Whiteny, put a stop to this stupid idea. I was at Patch for 2-years, until 2012 when columnists and freelancers were cut. In 2013 the company then started to close down websites and kept others with no actual news features. This is why I list 545 newsletters with Chesterfield included in the newsletter. My journalism background has included writing feature magazine articles, covering Congress and the DOJ for two magazines, as a part time sports editor for the Kansas City Star and as a sportswriter for a number of papers and websites on the East Coast.

TOWN AND COUNTRY BOARD OF ALDERMEN MEETING



The meeting was over in 15 minutes. The hot issue of expanded outside seating for the bars at the Town Square didn't happen. This issue brought a large number of nearby residents to the last meeting who were all opposed to the resolution. Plus a number of emails were received also all in opposition.

Ward-2 Alderpersons Holly Even and Fritz Wiesenhan originally introduced the resolution to almost triple the seating, causing loud and unhappy Ward-2 residents to voice their opinions.

At the September 25 meeting Ald. Wiesenhan made a motion to continue the resolution to the October 9th meeting. The continuance was known in advance or the aldermanic chambers would have been full of residents opposing the resolution. It seemed to me the smart thing would have been to simply vote it down. It seems to me that trying to reach a compromise will leave pissed off residents and not do much for reelection bids.

Almost no meeting! They have to have at least 5 of the 8 alderpersons present to hold the meeting. Also they have to have all five persons voting for an agenda item to pass anything. They had a bare minimum present with Barbara Ann Hughes (ward 1) and all of Ward-3 reps Michelle Fransico and Joe Kinsella missing.

I, Maxwell Triulzi, DSN 0366, Chesterfield Police Department, knowing that false statements on this form are punishable by law, state that the facts contained herein are true and documented in report number 23-3323. I have probable cause to believe that on August 6, 2023, within St. Louis County, Dakota Amerman, White, Male, 5'08", 162lbs, committed one or more criminal offense(s).

Count: 01 ABUSE OR NEGLECT OF A CHILD UNDER SECTION
568.060.5(1) - NO SEXUAL CONTACT

The facts supporting this belief are as follows: On August 5, 2023, Officers respond to a retail parking lot in St. Louis County. Officer(s) respond to the report of a possible assault. Victim is the 17 year old step daughter of the defendant. Victim reported that she was with her family at the bowling alley. Victim reported they were all leaving the bowling alley and walking in the parking lot she put her hands on her younger sibling shoulders. Defendant told victim to take her hands off the sibling then struck victim multiple times. Officer(s) observed bruising where on the victim's left rib cage and center of her back.

Officer(s) reviewed video surveillance which captures the incident. The video surveillance shows the family in the parking lot. Officer(s) see in the video the victim place her hands on the top of her siblings shoulder. Officer(s) then see on video the defendant walk up and strike the victim. The video shows the victim dropping to the ground after being struck. Defendant is interviewed and admits to striking the victim. Defendant demonstrated to officers that he struck the victim with a closed fist.

I believe that the defendant poses a danger to a crime victim because of the nature of the offense.

FELONY THEFT

SEU officers responded to Dick's for suspects that had stolen \$2,000 in merchandise. An area canvass was negative; however, the FLOCK camera system was utilized to find the suspect vehicle. Further investigation developed and identified a suspect who is now wanted.

FELONY THEFT

Utilizing the FLOCK camera system, an SEU officer was alerted to a vehicle near Premium Outlet that had warrants attached for traffic violations. Further investigation revealed that the person associated with the vehicle was wanted for Assault 1st Degree out of St. Louis City. The officer located the vehicle and effected a successful arrest.

FELONY THEFT

A delayed report from Ulta wherein approximately \$4,300 in merchandise was stolen by two suspects. With no vehicle information to go by, SEU officers obtained screen shots of the suspects and utilized Crime Matrix' mugshot recognition technology to identify the suspects involved. Both subjects are currently wanted as the officer continues his investigation.

OF NOTE

The SROs provided approximately 210 additional hours of Parks coverage during August before returning to their respective schools. SEU officers recovered a stolen vehicle and obtained 12 warrants on cases to include Felony Theft, Drugs, and UUW. SEU officers assisted with Backstopalooza held at the Chesterfield City Park.
