Town and Country Police investigated the crime and arrested Robinson. He was sentenced to 8-years in a Missouri prison. Now he has filed a lawsuit to EXPUNGE his arrest, conviction and prison sentence.

Jerome C. Robinson, 19, of Florissant, was charged Monday with taking a car at gunpoint from a woman in Town and Country on June 20.

Police said Robinson used a car to block the woman's SUV at a stop sign at Bopp and Clayton roads about 10:50 p.m. Two men forced their way into her red Jeep Cherokee, taking it, her purse and a cell phone.

Robinson, of the 1400 block of Sunsetshire Drive, was charged with first-degree robbery.

TOWN AND COUNTRY DETECTIVE EXLINE RECEIVES COMMENDATION OF APPRECIATION FROM THE FBI

In 2021 and 2022 Det. Exline investigated a case where suspect Robert Merkle was calling and emailing a Town and Country woman threating to rape her and break into her house and sexually assault her.

She developed Merkle as a suspect and found that he may have been committing similar crimes in other States, at which time she notified the FBI and continued to investigate with an FBI agent.

They found other victims in Illinois and Mississippi. Merkle was arrested and the FBI found the computer and a cellphone responsible in sending the sex threats.

Here is what was on the FBI Commendation to Det. Exline.

The U.S. Department of Justice, Federal Bureau of Investigation recognized (Detective) Katie Exline for her exceptional performance during a cyberstalking investigation conducted throughout 2022-2023. The investigation was initiated in 2022 when several victims in Missouri and across the country reported they had been receiving explicit and threatening illegal messages from an unknown perpetrator. One such incident was reported in the City of Town and Country. When the investigation encountered technological barriers, (Detective) Exline contacted the FBI for assistance. As a result of this co-investigation and partnership, the suspect was identified, charged, and convicted at both the state and federal level.

The FBI expressed that it was extremely grateful to work with such a devoted Law Enforcement partner and congratulated (Detective) Exline on a job well done. The document was signed by Christopher Wray, Director of the FBI.

BOND HEARING REDUCES "NO BOND" TO \$150,000 FORMER TOWN & COUNTRY POLIC OFFICER FOR SEX CRIMES. Recently retired Town and Country Police Seargent Jordan Fowle on 01/29 had a Jefferson County judge set his bond on 9-counts of Child Sexual Assault of his daughters at \$150,000 with house arrest and no contact with the victims or juveniles under 18-years of age, wear a monitor and possess no guns.

INTRODUCTION

The City of Town and Country contains a matrix of suburban and commercial development, parks, and other open spaces. The absence of any deer management combined with fertile soils allowed the local deer population to increase to a level incompatible with some land use and human activities before our involvement. Although deer physical condition is not an issue, there is ongoing concern regarding deer-vehicle collisions and damage to garden and landscape plantings. This is the 14th year in which a deer population management program was implemented.

METHODS

Pre-baiting was conducted from 13 December 2023 - 2 January 2024. Sharpshooting efforts were conducted from 3 - 15 January 2024. Eleven days of fieldwork were required to achieve the harvest of 89 deer.

We followed the operations protocol outlined in the contract and changes agreed to verbally prior to the onset of site preparations. Sixteen sites were available throughout the area of operation.

Fourteen sites were used as part of the 2023/2024 Town and Country, MO deer management program. Two locations were not used due to lack of deer activity or weather conditions not being conducive to operations. Nine of the locations had been used in previous years. Five new sites were added to the property list: one in Ward 2, one in Ward 3, and two in Ward 4. The five new sites resulted in the harvest of 22 deer. Ward 2 continued to produce the highest removal numbers, accounting for 42% of the overall harvest. This pattern has been stable throughout the years.

When temperatures become extremely cold deer tend to reduce their movement to conserve energy. This resulted in a lower harvest on the last 3 days of the project than would be expected in better climatic conditions.

Harvest results from specific sites ranged from a high of 11 deer to a low of 3. The most productive site was in Ward 4 and contributed 12% to the total.

UNLAWFUL USE **OF A WEAPON**

18521 Outlet Blvd - During a dispute over a parking space at the outlet mall, the victim stated a male subject displayed a handgun, putting her and her passenger in fear for their safety. The victim was able to give a good description of the suspect, and he was located by Officers inside the mall. The subject was arrested, and a handgun was seized.

CRIMINAL ACTION

ASSAULT/ARMED Village Green Apartments - The victim reported he got into a verbal altercation with the suspect on Thursday night after a road rage incident. The suspect, a 21-year-old resident of Chesterfield, then drove his car at the victim at a high rate of speed and struck the victim. The victim stated he jumped and struck the windshield. The victim suffered non-life-threatening injuries. He identified the vehicle parked at the apartment complex. There was substantial damage to the windshield and the front driver's headlight. The suspect was contacted by phone and admitted to driving the car. FELONY/ MISDEMEANOR THEFTS

Target reported the same subject stealing on four different occasions for a total of \$1,850. An SEU investigation was able to identify the suspect vehicle as well as the suspect, who lived locally. Contact was made and she turned herself in at the station, at which time she refused to make a statement. Warrants were applied for and she was charged with one felony count and two state misdemeanor counts.

Many of the items still had sensor tags attached. Also seized were tools used to assist shoplifters to either remove or defeat anti-theft sensors. All subjects were arrested and warrants have been applied for.

FELONY THEFT

SEU was called to Polo at the Premium Outlet for a larceny in progress. Employees had observed subjects concealing items. Officers responded and based on the information provided by the reporting party, arrested 3 subjects for stealing. Items were found on the subjects that they could not account for with receipts. Two of the subjects were observed via video concealing merchandise in bags and on their person. A search of the suspect's vehicle located two firearms, which were seized for safekeeping. On June 1, 2017 the department entered into a contractual agreement with the neighboring City of Clarkson Valley to provide comprehensive police services; 24-hour uniform patrols, traffic enforcement, response to calls for service, court and meeting security and community engagement programs.


