TOWN AND COUNTRY WANTS TO SPEND \$10,000-TO-\$35,000 FOR JOB HAVING ALWAYS BEEN HANDLED BY STAFF. The City accepting bids for marketing events and renting facilities. This is something that has been handled by Parks Director Anne Nixon and her staff from day-one. Now the city that poured \$10,000,000 into the Town Square project (twice the estimated cost) wants to spend up to \$35,000 annually for a job that staff has always handled. Here is part of the post requirements:

Seeking: A marketing or events firm specializing in event revenue and facility rental marketing

Deadline: February 15, 2024, 10 AM.

II. Project Scope – Components of the project may include, but are not limited to:

- ☐ Propose and execute an event sponsorship plan for annual City events including a Concert Series, Fall Fire & Ice, Pawty in the Park and T&C Winter Fest.
- ☐ Propose and execute a marketing plan for the Longview Farm House.

VI. Budget

- ☐ Estimated budget for this project is agreement \$10,000-35,000.
- ☐ The project is to be funded by the City of Town & Country

Marketing the Longview House could also be tough. If there other activities at the park or just a nice day with families coming to the park, parking can be limited. There is one large room while the others are divided by walls.



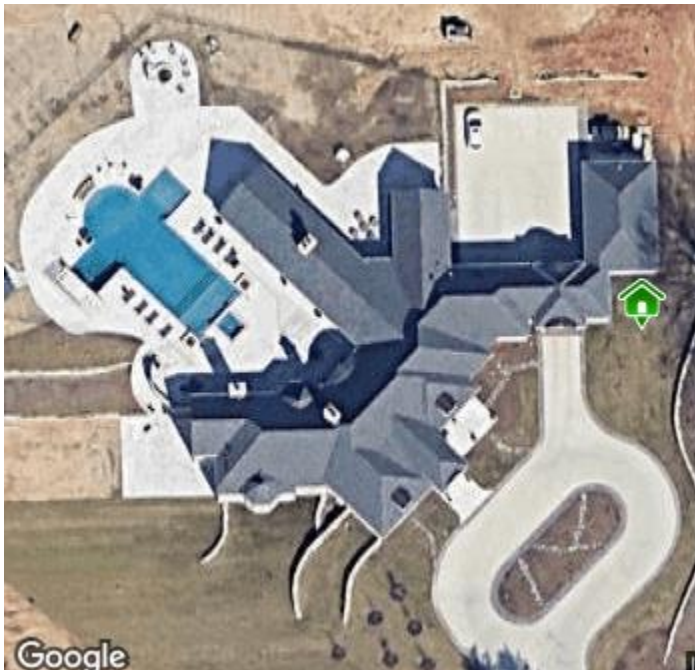

Subsequent investigation by SEU officers found 1 subject to be wanted out of St. Louis County for traffic charges. During a search, he was found to be in possession of Methamphetamine. Subject was released on the drug charge pending warrant application and posted bond on the traffic charge.

20-273- Warrant arrest- Station- A subject with an active Chesterfield warrant surrendered, was processed, and released on a new court date after posting bond.

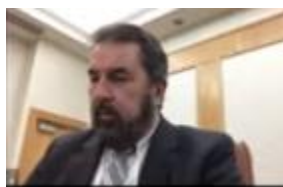

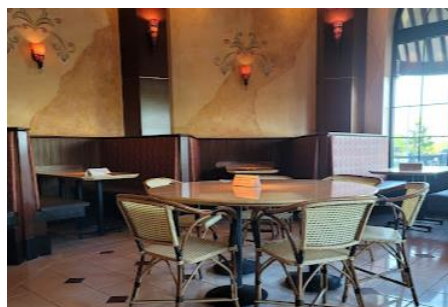

COUNCIL VOTES TO CONDEMN CHEESECAKE FACTORY AT CHESTERFIELD

MALL. Last year the City Council voted to blight a large area including most of Chesterfield Mall for the “Downtown Chesterfield” redevelopment project. Most tenant’s

leases expire this year. The popular Cheesecake Factory restaurant with an outside entrance had a lease that extended beyond this year.

The City Council voted to condemn the restaurant to make way for demolition of the Mall (except the Dillards' store).



CHESTERFIELD JOINS TOWN AND COUNTRY IN URGING STATE LEGISLATORS TO REFUSE TO LIFT SALES TAX ON FOOD AT SUPERMARKETS. Although not currently on the agenda in Jefferson City, Chesterfield joins Town and Country to keep it that way and block the state from removing sale taxes on food at supermarkets, WalMart and Target, which would save shoppers money at the dinner table and cost the city a lot of revenue.

Here is a section of the resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHESTERFIELD, ST. LOUIS COUNTY, MISSOURI AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City of Chesterfield, Missouri City Council recognizes the necessity of maintaining municipal sales tax on food items to sustain critical local government services.

Section 2. The City of Chesterfield, Missouri City Council calls on the senator and representatives of the Missouri General Assembly to oppose any legislation or proposal seeking the elimination of municipal sales tax on food products. In doing so, securing the safety and welfare of Missouri residents and safeguarding the financial viability of local government across the state.

Section 3. The City of Chesterfield, Missouri City Council urges neighboring municipalities to educate its state elected officials and residents on the negative effects of eliminating the taxation of retail sales on food.

Section 4. The City of Chesterfield, Missouri City Council directs the City Administrator to forward a copy of this Resolution to senators and representatives of the Missouri General Assembly representing the St. Louis County region.



Mayor Bob Nation began an attack on the State attempting to take away this sales tax.



He called any proposal by the State as “Irresponsible” and a “political stunt as much as anything.” He pointed out that Chesterfield does not have a real estate property tax to provide revenue for services.

The loss of food sales taxes could be between \$10,000,000 and \$15,000,000.

Councilwoman Barb McGuinness brought up last year and questioned if any state reps and senators live in towns that depend on sales taxes to provide services.

“This is an attack on police, parks and streets,” said Councilmen Adam Wahl.

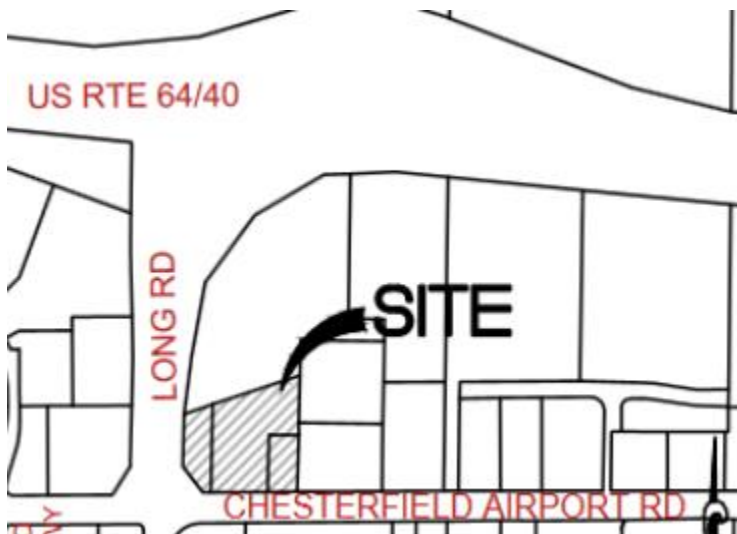
The resolution to send a protest to state elected legislators passed 8-to-0.

The Miracle Field is for players with disabilities. When originally built Chesterfield received large donations from Cardinal players Mike Matheny and Albert Pujols.



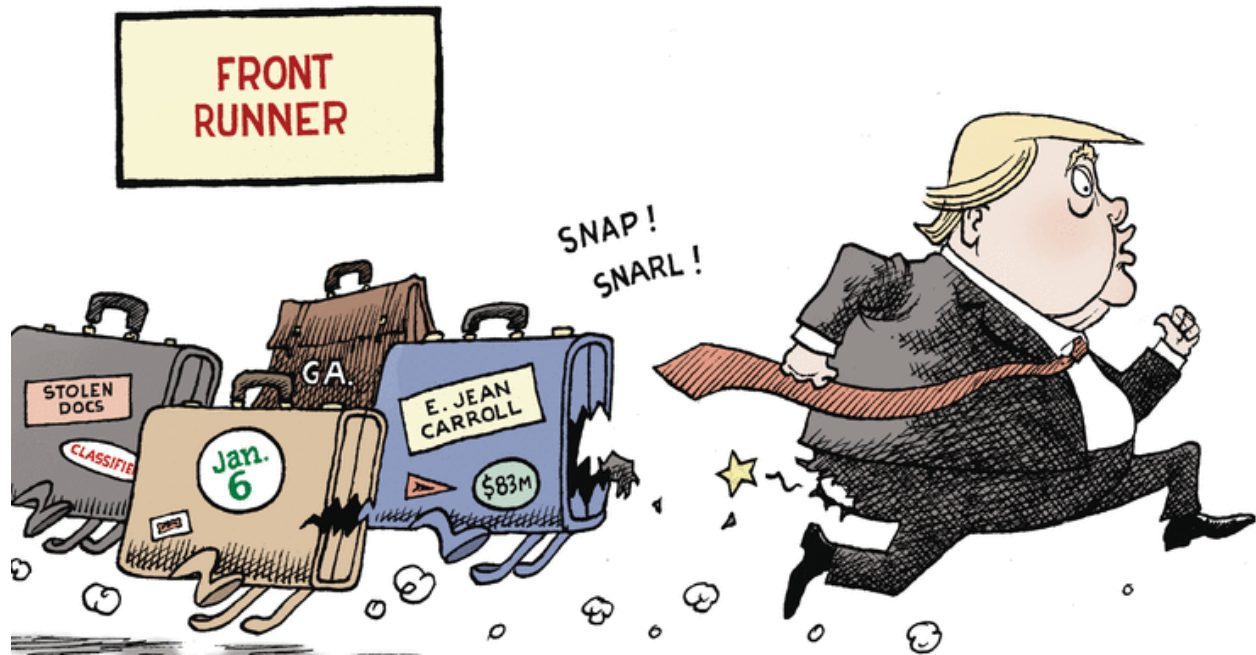
COUNCIL APPROVES REZONING FOR A SERVICE AND CAR REPAIR BUSINESS WITH SOME NO VOTES
