TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE ADD TWO NEW CIVILIAN EMPLOYEES The police department has added two new civilian employees. One woman was hired from the St. Louis PD record room. She will handle vehicle service plus assist in the record room. The other Izzy Simmonds had worked at KSHE radio.

Vehicle service currently requires an on-duty officer to drop off a vehicle out of town at the Christian Brothers on Dougherty Ferry Road or Dobbs in Manchester and require another officer to pick them up meaning two fewer officers in the city.



We hear the other woman will be handling administrative work currently done by supervisors and command staff officers, again meaning more officers to deal with calls.

Police Chief Wilkey added this information:

Civilian personnel assisting with administrative tasks will allow our new supervisors to focus on both learning their new core functions and providing them an opportunity to mentor junior supervisors and officers. Also, the assistance of civilian personnel will allow Commanders to focus more on higher-level administrative tasks and strategic planning for our future

OFFICE MANAGER OF TOWN AND COUNTRY LAW FIRM CHARGED WITH

STEALING OVER \$59,000 FROM FIRM. Over 5-months the new office manager of the McCarthy, Leonard & Kaemmerer at 825 Maryville Center sold over \$59,000.

The embezzlement was discovered after the Office Manager Kelley Zoph, 57, was injured and had to miss sometime at work. The firm brought back the office manager Zoph replaced on a parttime basis. While doing payroll she discovered that Zoph had been paying herself \$54,754 more than her actual salary. Furthermore it was discovered that Zoph had made \$4,939 in personal purchases on the firm's credit card.

Zoph confessed to the thefts to a firm's partner.

Town and Country Officer Rose Prewitt prepared a Probable Cause Statement and a felony charge was issued on February 28.

I have could be probable cause to believe that between May 27, 2022 and December 15, 2022, within St. Louis County, Kelley Zoph, White, Female, 5'08", 230lbs, committed one or more criminal offense(s). STEALING - \$25,000 OR MORE - CLASS C FELONY Count: 01 The facts supporting this belief are as follows: Defendant worked as an office manager for a law firm located in Town and Country. As part of her duties she was in charge of payroll. When defendant was hospitalized due to serious injuries sustained in a fall, her predecessor as office manager was re-hired on a part-time basis by the firm. It was subsequently discovered, as the part-time manager prepared the payroll, that defendant's listed pay rate was several thousand dollars more than it had been when that manager last prepared the payroll, approximately seven months earlier. An audit revealed that defendant had paid herself \$54,754.46 in unauthorized salary and, in addition, had made \$4,939.25 in unauthorized purchases with the business credit card. Defendant confessed the theft to a partner at the firm.

UNIVERSITY CITY POLICE ARREST 20-YEAR-OLD FROM CHESTERFIELD SPAY PAINTING JEWISH, BLACK AND ASIAN BUSINESSED WITH HATE MESSAGES:

Frankie Rizzello, Jr., 20, originally from Warrenton and living is an apartment at 14512 Cazado Drive in Chesterfield before moving to the County Jail.

Rizzello and at least two other self-proclaimed racists spray painted hate messages on a University City church and an Asian restaurant. Normally we would write "allegedly before the charges, but Rizzello was so smart that he posted himself standing in front of one of the messages, a Jewish hate message. The police investigation also reported that Rizzello posted threats against residents of his Chesterfield apartment complex bases on race and religion. He admitted being an American NAZI.

The facts supporting this belief are as follows: The defendant acting with others, spray-painted 'NS Hooligans' on an exterior wall of 6346 Delmar the One Family Church. The defendant, acting with others, also spray-painted 'NSH' on an exterior wall of 6316 Delmar, Poke Doke Asian Cuisine Restaurant. Damage to both businesses exceeded \$750.00 each.

The defendant admitted to police to assisting in the vandalism and advised the graffiti were tags for the NS Hooligans (Nazi Hooligans) movement. The defendant told police that NS Hooligans is a white nationalist movement and stated that he does not like 'blacks' or 'Jews.'

I believe that a warrant is necessary to ensure the safety of the community based on the nature of the offenses. Further, the investigation revealed that when police initially attempted to approach the defendant, he armed himself with a rifle and searched the internet for the penalty for killing a police officer. The defendant has also posted electronic messages threatening individuals living in his apartment complex based on race, religion and sexual preference.

A press release from the County Prosecutor's Office gave credit to ADL (Anti Defamation League) for assisting in the investigation.

ADL, a global organization that fights all forms of antisemitism and bias, was essential to bringing these two felony charges.

CHESTERFIELD CITY COUNCIL MEETING The Council Meeting after public comments was 14 minutes long. The comments section at the start of the meeting was 31 minutes long.



PUBLIC COMMENTS

The first speaker was Scott Ririe the owner of the OLD HOUSE AT HOG HOLLOW restaurant, gift & antique shop and party location. The 124-year old house has been a business for sometime before Ririe and his wife Rachel bought it and rehabbed the structure and grounds, including a patio that was not allow per city restrictions.

The problem is the OLD HOUSE abuts residences on Spyglass Ridge and Gatwick Ct. Further city restrictions allow food and drinks to be served only to 4pm and the retail shop must close at 6pm.



Ririe complained that the police come reference either noise, which he claims doesn't exist or the business being open after hours. It should be pointed out that on February 9, 2024 Ririe was cited for a Liquor Law Violation by the police on the property. His other citations ref alcohol are two DWI arrests with Breath Test refusals.

He further explained that they do rent out a section for birthday parties and other low key events. There are also some jazz music groups and singers booked at the house on the weekends for shows from noon to 3pm.

"It is very difficult to operate a business," said Ririe reference the restricted operating hours.

This brought Councilwoman Barb McGuinness to the mic asking if he had read the restrictions prior to buying the business/house. Ririe was not giving her s direct answer causing her to ask several times and finally ask, "did you read the restrictions before buying it? Yes or no!"

"You have turned it into a Party House and it is right next to residential houses," McGuinness said.

McGuinness asked City Administrator Mike Geisel if Ririe had been given the preexisting restrictions when he bought THE OLD HOUSE. Geisel said that happened and added he would prepare new copies of the restrictions for Ririe.

Ririe apparently went and obtained some support. A couple living nearby spoke separately on they never hear loud music from the house and were very positive about the house. Another neighbor who lives in the Spyglass Ridge said he started going to the OLD HOUSE for lunch or a glass of wine adding he had never heard music outside when he went to an event.

Next was a resident who walks the trail around the Central Park Lake regularly. She was **complaining of graffiti covering the spillway flood walls and trash in the lake**.



City Administrator Mike Geisel stated that the graffiti has been a problem since the flood walls were built in 2007. He said he believes the trash is due to construction in the area and it will be addressed.

One resident spoke of concern that the expansion of the YMCA will include a medical office and would create excessive traffic. Mayor Nation, an active member at the Y said the medical office would be for Y members and primarily do rehab work.

There were also three men from the developer doing the expansion at the YMCA in the event of any questions.

THE REGULAR AGENDA: Councilpersons Dan Hurt and Aaron Wahl were missing. The biggest item seemed to be the vote to accept the bid of \$50,744 to paint the Aquatic Center. It was mentioned that the Aquatic Center is likely to be replaced in the next 3-to-5 years.


