### DOMESTIC ASSAULT

I64: An Officer conducted a traffic stop and his investigation revealed the driver, an 18-year-old resident of St. Louis, possessed a large amount of a controlled substance and a firearm. He also possessed individual bags, a scale for weighing the drugs, and a large amount of US currency all consistent with drug distribution. Officers arrested the suspect, towed the vehicle, and seized assets for forfeiture. The Officer obtained and executed a search warrant on the car as part of the investigation.

Upon their arrival, the two unknown males brandished firearms, prompting the driver to speed away. One of the male suspects fired shots at the vehicle, but no injuries were reported. ## Priority Street Enforcement Activity

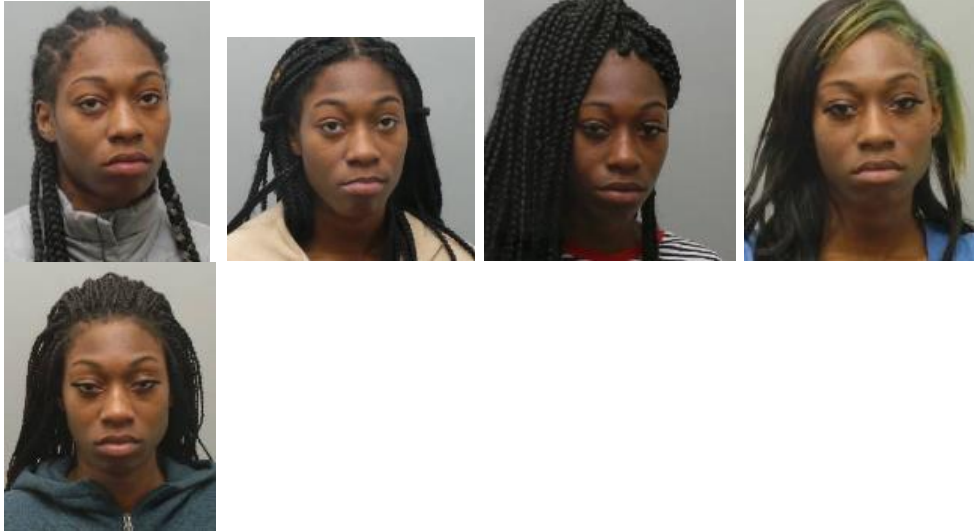

**HOG HOLLOW HOUSE MANAGEMENT WANTS TO USE PORCHES:** The meeting opened with citizen comments. The only two speakers were the new manager of the tearoom and antique store in the Old House at Hog Hollow. The house is allowed to be open until 6pm for retail sales, but the food and wine service has to stop at 4pm.

The manager mentioned that the two rear porches have room for five tables each that seat four. The business is restricted to inside only operation with the business being located so near houses in abutting subdivisions. The house on 2-acres was built in 1859 and has been a business for over 30 years.

Management wanted to service customers outside with a promise of no music. They pointed out the porches added 70 years ago have roofs attached to the building and doors from the building.

They also wanted food and wine hours to be extended to 6pm. This is a little less than a request two months earlier.

The owners appeared at the March 18<sup>th</sup> meeting wanting the zoning to change to allow outside dining and have food and drink hours extended to 9pm on weekends.

The manager said she told the owners she hoped to be making a profit in six months.



Councilwoman Barb McGuinness said, "We are concerned about the neighbors having a quiet neighborhood. She and later Mayor Bob Nation mentioned that the zoning

restrictions have been in place for sometime and they should have been studied before the most recent purchase of the house.

In Town and Country at the Town Square with a bar and a restaurant having outside seating with no music is still creating noise problems for homeowners in nearby subdivisions.

**NEW CITY LOGO APPROVED:** The council approved a new city logo that they were told would be more compatible with new digital requirements on computers. Councilman Dan Hurt asked with the current logo could stay on the flag that flies in front of City Hall. He was told “no way.”

**BIKEABLE/WALKING TRAIL** The Council approved \$95,000 for Toole Design of Kansas City to produce and plan for a new bike/walking path in the city.

**CITY HALL FOUNTAIN CREATES CONTROVERSY.** The only controversy in the meeting was an item that looked like it would pass 8-0. It was to spend \$80,338 for updates, improvements and maintenance to the fountain in front of City Hall.

Councilman Budoor wanted to continue the matter to a June meeting. He was questioned why and some councilpersons asked what difference it would make. There was then a discussion if it was a postponement or a continuance.



There was a vote to continue the item to the June 3 meeting. That failed 3-5.

The original agenda item was then voted on and passed 6-2.

**dictatorship.** It would be nice if he could find a way to rid of municipal city prosecutors who reduce charges to non-serious ones for defense lawyers.



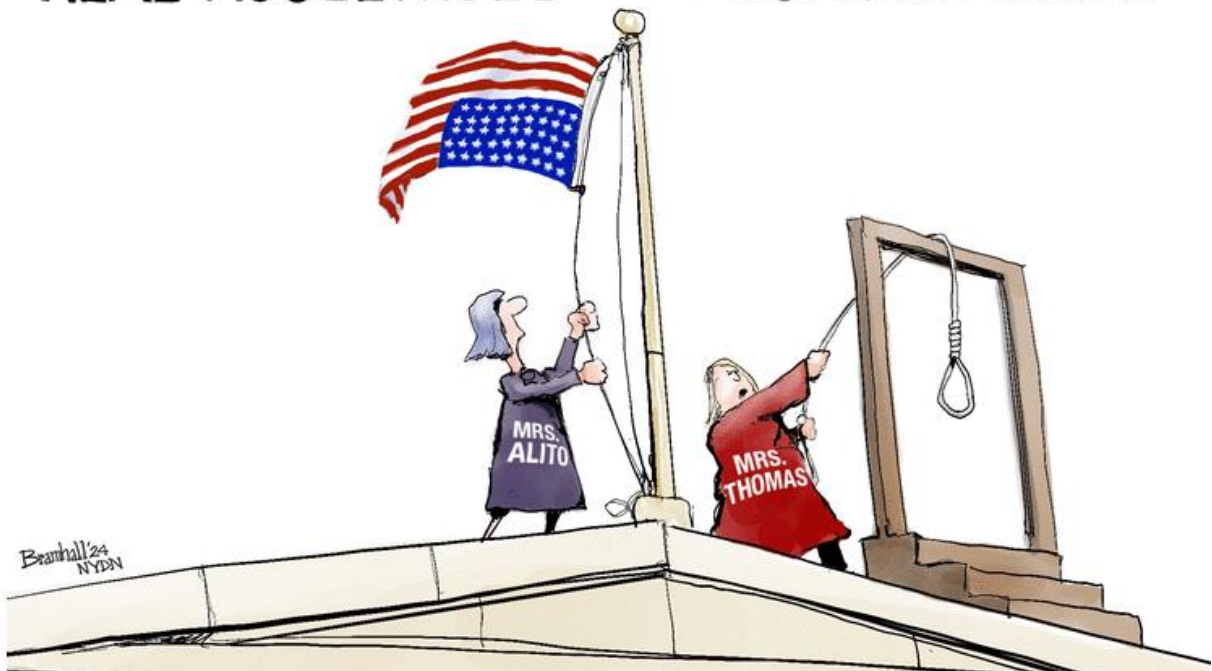
