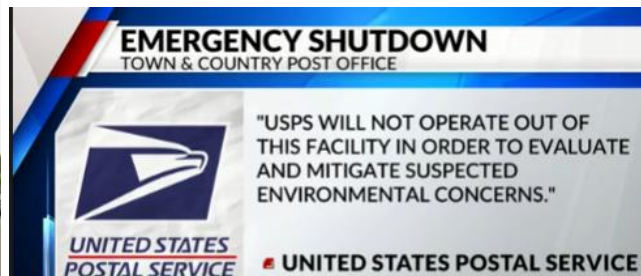

MERCURY SPILL CLOSES TOWN AND COUNTRY POST OFFICE: The West County EMS and Fire Protection District responded to the Town and Country Post Office at 1100 Town and Country Commons Drive off of Woods Mill Road to a mercury spill.



The spill was from a package.

The United States Department of Environmental Protection considers all mercury spills as potentially dangerous as vapors are dangerous to breath and absorbing mercury through the skin can be dangerous. (However, there are numerous websites that give simple instructions on how to clean up mercury spills at home.)

The West County EMS & Fire Protection District responded to the Post Office and staff reported that the spill was from a package and was very small. Post Office staff told fire officials they would handle the spill and the Fire District took no further action.

The Post Office was closed for all of Monday and refused to tell the press or customers why the office was closed. It was still closed on Tuesday with drive up mailboxes blocked off. We understand there was a recent mercury spill in a package at a North County Post Office and leaked onto a conveyor belt that was costly.



The Postal Service showed no concern to open record law or explaining anything to customers and boxholders as they refused to say why the office was closed. Home delivery in the 63017 area will continue.

Andy Banker with KTVI had to go to U.S, Rep Ann Wagner's office to get any info from the Federal Government. The West County EMS and Fire PD was more open and informative than the Federal government.

FOX 2 contacted Congresswoman Ann Wagner, as the post office is in her district.

Her staff finally did get answers, saying that a mercury spill from a package was the reason for the closure. The sender did not disclose that the package contained mercury. The post office is expected to be closed for at least seven to 10 days.

Wagner calls that time frame "completely unacceptable." She's calling for a contingency plan for quicker delivery of vital mail, which includes things like medications or paychecks.

BOARD OF ALDERMEN MEETING



68 TOWN STYLE HOUSES ON 11 ACRES IS CONTINUED A SECOND TIME: The zoning change to allow 68 town houses on 11 acres currently occupied by a mostly vacant retail strip center has been continued a second time. The proposal was originally voted down by the planning commission but made it to the agenda of the Board of Aldermen.

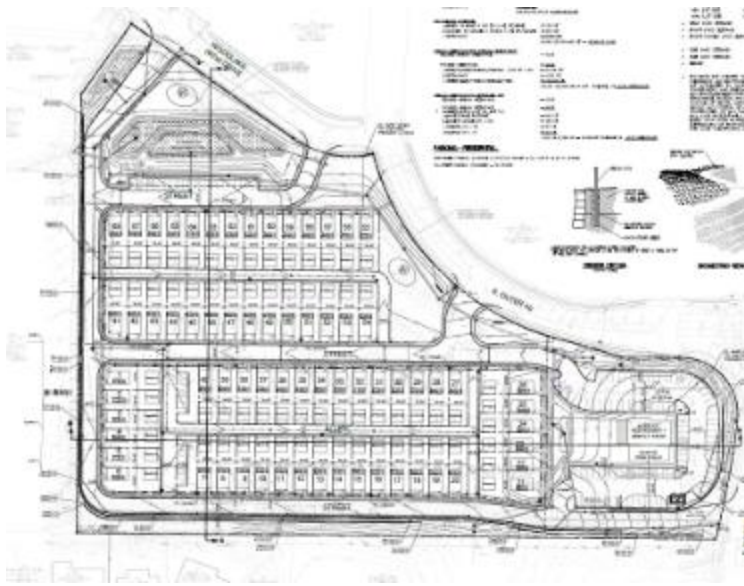


Current empty retail stores.

The continuance was so McBride could submit new plans. The proposal will be back on the June 24 agenda. Since it was voted down by the P&Z Commission it will need a “super majority” vote of 6-2 from the aldermen to pass.

Most public comments have favored the proposal, that would have unattached garages, tiny yards, no first floor bedrooms and limited parking.





So much for 1-acre lots. Is it time to remove Country from the city's name and just call it "Town"?

Town and Country Aldermen,

Since hearing the McBride representative describe their proposal for Woods Mill Center at the May 13 Aldermen meeting several things made me even more convinced this is the right development:

- It is in keeping with well-established urban planning principles to build transitional homes between commercial and larger home residential areas.
 - The proposed green space design along South Outer 40/South Woods Mill Road will be a major improvement to one of the entries to Town and Country. Not only will it be lovely, but it will also shield the view of the homes within the development from cars traveling alongside it. This design will be in keeping with the landscaping that Manderleigh Woods maintains along Woods Mill Road and will present a positive image for the entrance of Town and Country.
 - The new expected price points for these homes (\$600 to \$700 K) can only add to the value of our homes.

At the May 28 meeting only one person spoke, and his point was that if you approve this proposal, what will happen when the Spectrum site is redeveloped. This does not seem to be relevant to the current decision and any future proposals for other sites need to be evaluated on their own merit.

I am still flabbergasted that the Planning and Zoning Commission rejected this proposal when we made the same argument for rejecting the previous Maryville proposal which they approved. Their logic is inconsistent.

I am excited by this McBride proposal and believe it will create a vibrant community that we will be proud to say is part of Town and Country.

At the very least 95% of Town and Country residents live east of 141.

Those of us who live along Woods Mill - Cedar Springs and Manderleigh communities - are the residents who are almost exclusively impacted by Woods Mill Center. It is a blighted pocket in the far far west corner of the city.

We have to see this ugly island of asphalt and empty store fronts daily while those who live along Clayton Road, Mason Road, Topping Road, Conway Road (to name a few) get to enjoy green spaces, parks and lovely vistas. We do not!

PROPOSED DEER HOLLOW SUBDIVISION PLANS KILL MORE OF THE 1-ACRE LOTS FOR HOUSES ZONING. The Woods Mill Center plan by McBride isn’t the only proposed development that would say goodbye to Town and Country one-acre lots zoning. McBride wants to put 68 townhouse looking homes on 11 acres. Now Grand Communities/Fischer Homes wants to build a subdivision with houses between 2,100 square feet to 4,975 sq ft on 10 acres. The lots would be 8,200 sq ft.

George Stock, the consulting engineer for many residential and retail developments made the pitch for changing T&C zoning so 17 large homes can be squeezed in on 10 acres. Here is a part of the Stock presentation:

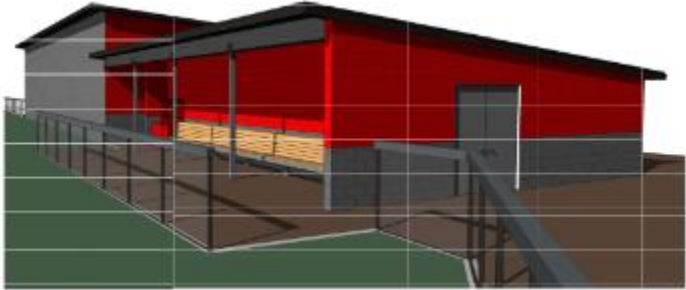
OPPOSITION FROM CREVE COEUR RESIDENTS: Two homeowners from the Creve Coeur subdivision of Balcon Estates off of Conway Road that would border the Deer Hollow subdivision spoke against the plans. They claimed they were told it would be 3-houes per acre (while George Stock said 2-houes per acre).

Their complaints are that the houses will be too close to their property, large trees would be destroyed, stormwater issues and flooding would threaten their large trees.

TOO MUCH GOVERNMENT 2: Last week we covered how Maryville University had to get approval from the Board of Aldermen to upgrade the dugouts on their baseball field and how it was a waste of time and money for Maryville to jump through the hoops and make the application and it was a waste of time for City staff. The matter passed on a 7-0 vote.



Here is this week's gross waste of time: The Board of Aldermen had to approve an ordinance for the owners of a new home under construction on Dry Ridge Road to get for a conditional use permit for a small 169 square foot greenhouse, next to the residence on a 13-acre property.

ATTENTION RESIDENTS OF TOWN & COUNTRY AND SURROUNDING AREAS

Our officers have been enforcing traffic on IS-64 and in just a few hours, they've stopped multiple drivers going over 80+ miles per hour in a 60 mph zone. Keep in mind, these are only a small handful of what was found today. Reckless speeding like this endangers everyone on the road.

In 2023, Missouri saw a significant number of car crashes caused by reckless driving:

- Over 1,000 crashes were attributed to speeding.
- These crashes resulted in more than 400 injuries and 50 fatalities.
- Speeding was a factor in 30% of all traffic-related deaths.
- Young drivers, aged 16-24, were involved in 40% of speeding-related crashes.



The primary focus on speed enforcement for many small towns in North County is to generate money. In Town and Country and Chesterfield Safety comes before fines. Unfortunately the municipal courts in both cities are well known for reducing charges of these excessive speeders to \$200 and \$300 parking violations if there is a defense lawyer involved and dangerous drivers walk out of court not being identified as dangerous and have no points or convictions on their records.

Also seeing three police cars might be a bit much since retail stores that produce a lot of revenue in sales taxes could use extra patrol. On the Police facebook page one resident stated Hwy 141 could use some of the speed enforcement.

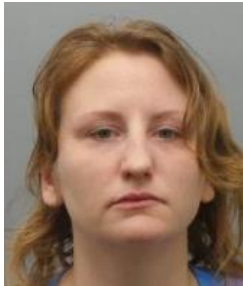

Our biggest day of 890 in a day was after sex scandals involving a local politician in Jefferson City.

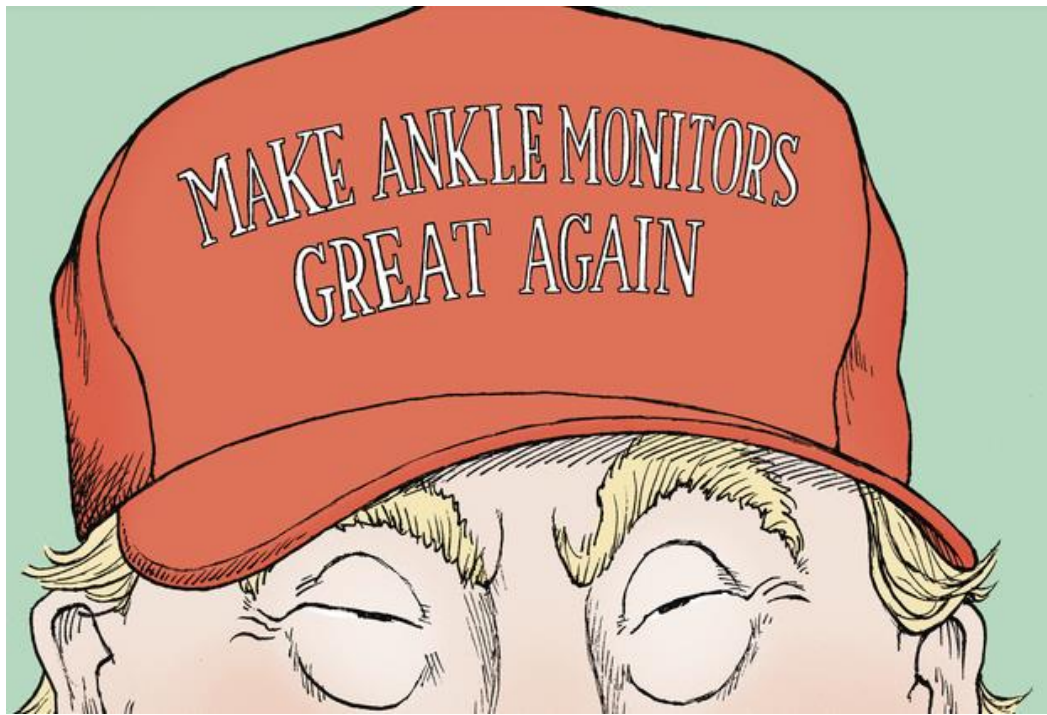
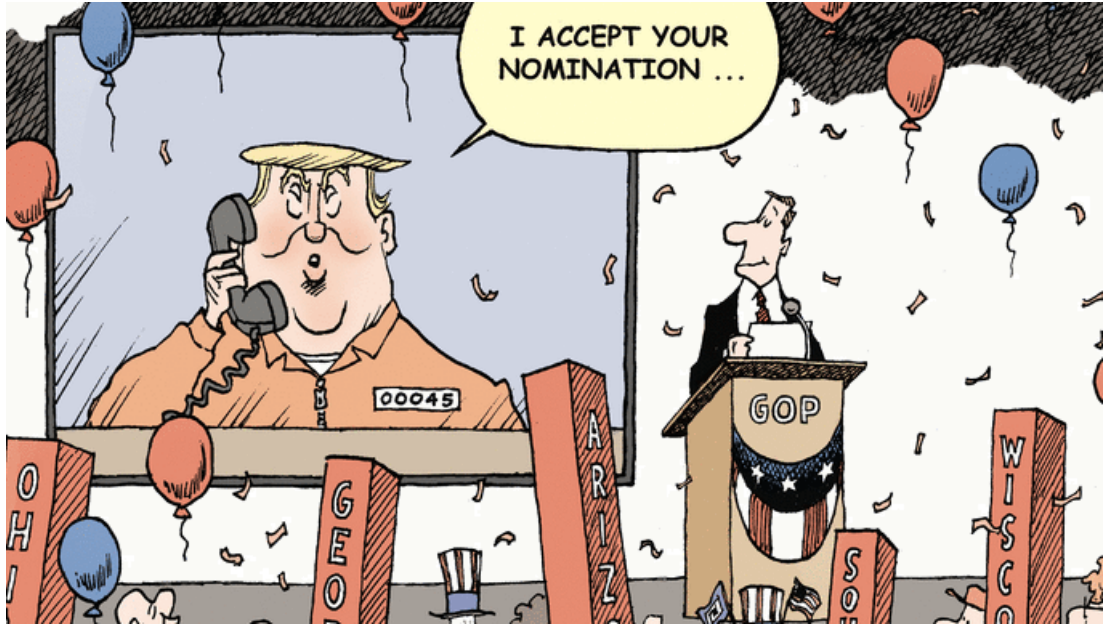
We had one reader threaten to stop reading due to all the police and crime news. However, many people want to see where the crime is and who is being arrested in their town.
