CHANGES TO DEER HOLLOW PLANS:

Developers of the proposed subdivision of North Outer Forty at the Creve Coeur Limits have submitted modified plans for the Deer Hollow project of putting 17 large homes on 10 acres of land after taking some heat from homeowners in the adjoining Creve Coeur subdivision.



Here are the changes listed in Consultin Engineer George Stock's memo, much of it is in response to Creve Coeur residents in the abutting Balcon Estates subdivision:

- 1) On Page 1 of MEMO dated 6/10/24 under Requirements; Permanent Open Space should be 47.79% not 48.86%.
 - 2) Regarding Concessions for the Residents of Balcon Estates
 - a) Consolidation of proposed Stormwater basins into the southern/central portion of the site further away from Balcon Estates. Storm water management system reduces the rate of runoff on this site approximately 82%.
 - b) Removal of 1 cul-de-sac street, shifting lots to the east and south, further from Balcon Estates.
 - c) Increased the Permanent Open Space from 45.98% to 47.79%.
 - d) Increased the Preserved Woodlands area from 1.1 acres to 1.20 acres.
 - e) Slid the proposed retaining wall from 10 ft to 25 ft south of the Balcon Estates Property Line. Provided a 25 ft wide Landscape Buffer Reservation along Lots 3 thru 10 to maintain the Landscaping in perpetuity by the Deer Hollow HOA.
 - f) Substantially increased the quantity and size of the Buffer Yard Landscaping adjacent to Balcon Estates well above the City of T and C requirements.
 - g) Agreed to monetary compensation into the Balcon Estates HOA in the event tree replacement is required on their private Lots.

AT THE BOARD OF ALDERMEM MEETING: There were three speakers from Balcon Estates the Creve Subdivision that abuts this project. Two speakers thanked Town and Country for the changes in the plan. The third speaker, Fred Strasheim, spoke to the lot sizes of Deer Hollow saying, "This is not in the spirit of Town and Country,"

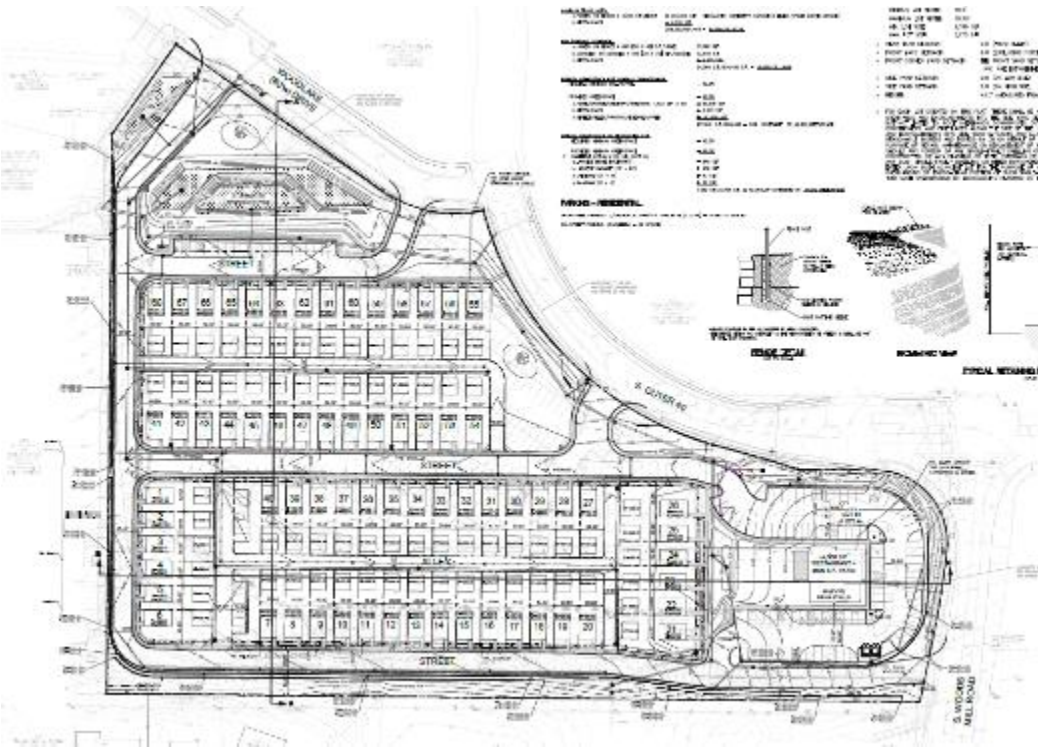
Later in the meeting when agenda items were announce dAlderman John Harder stated that the subdivision would be next to a "GATEWAY." To Town and Country, which it certainly is not. It is on an access road, the North Forty Outer Road. Ald. John Steinhubl called him out saying it was NOT on a Gateway to Town & Country. Harder replied, "Well, there is a city limits sign."

Despite passing a bill to approve taking a 1/2 acre from the Creve Coeur City limits, the proposal to approval the Development plans was continued to the next meeting as word come down that the Creve Coeur City Council (meeting at the same time of T&C) had not approved the land and city limits change and continued it.

Immediately before this vote the Aldermen approved the rezoning for Deer Hollow on a 5-2 vote with Ald. Schwoerer and Ald. Harder voted against it.

FOR THE THIRD TIME THERE WAS A CONTINUANCE REQUEST BY MCBRIDE HOMES FOR THE 68 HOUSE ON A 11 ACRES AT WOODS MILL AND SOUTH FORTY PROPOSAL

Six days before the June 24 Board of Aldermen meeting McBride Builder engineer, George Stock filed the third request for a continuance of the proposal to put 68 homes on 11 acres (plus 1-acre for restaurant and 1 acre for green space) at the current location of a mostly vacant strip center.



This of course would shatter the 1-house per acre city guideline. The Board could have agreed to the continuance or of course they could have voted NO on the continuance and then voted down the proposal.

Mason road sidewalk and repaving:

Public Works Director Michael Zeltmann told the Aldermen that the paving and sidewalk project on Mason Road from Clayton Road to I-64 has been delayed due to stormwater sewer issues. He expects St. Louis County (Mason is a County road) to start the paving project on July 15 and have the road and sidewalks complete before Mason Ridge Elementary starts classes the third week in August.

ALDERMEN APPROVE PHASE TWO OF TOPPING ROAD SIDEWALK PROJECT:

Missouri Transportation grant money will be use for the project. Phase One was resurfacing Topping Road and installing a sidewalk from Clayton Road to Topping Estates.

Phase Two is estimated to come in at \$630,466 with the City paying for \$454,493 and the rest from grant money. It will be from Topping Estates to Old Colony Lane

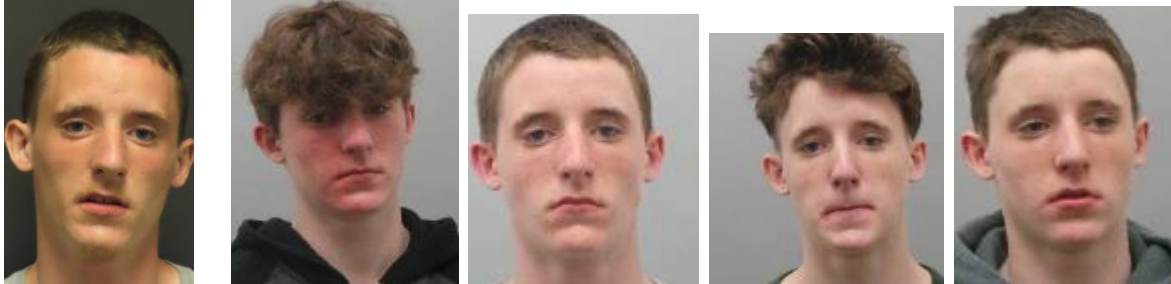

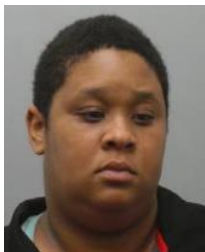

We have the phone number of one of the local agents that we can call this weekend if we need any other help from them, but for now we are following their lead on this since they are the professionals when it comes to these situations.

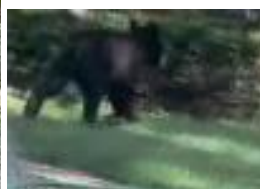
MDC also believes that the bear isn’t a cub, but rather a 1-2 year old bear based on photos that were shared with them.

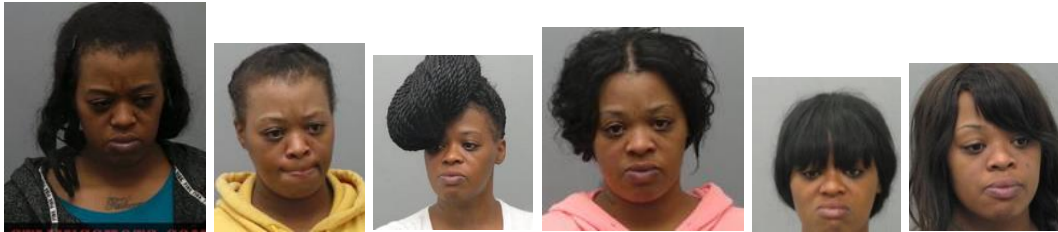

After seeing the Nutcracker once, they would always say they wanted to see White Christmas.

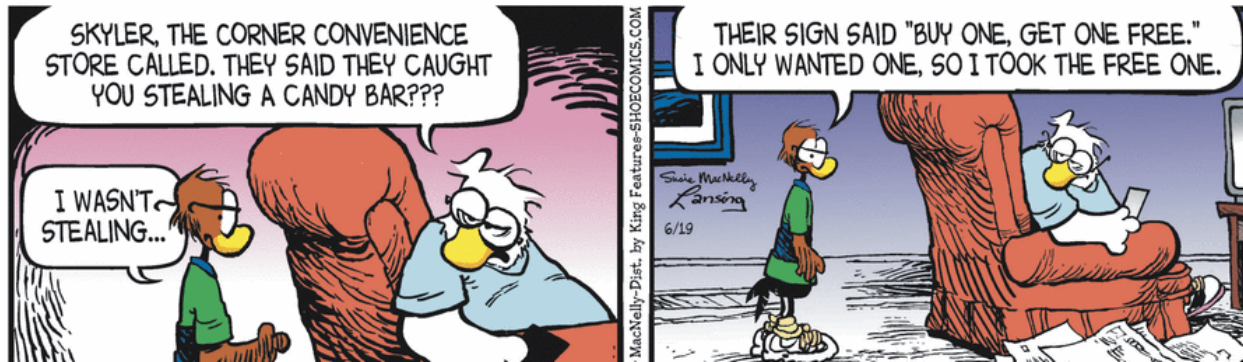


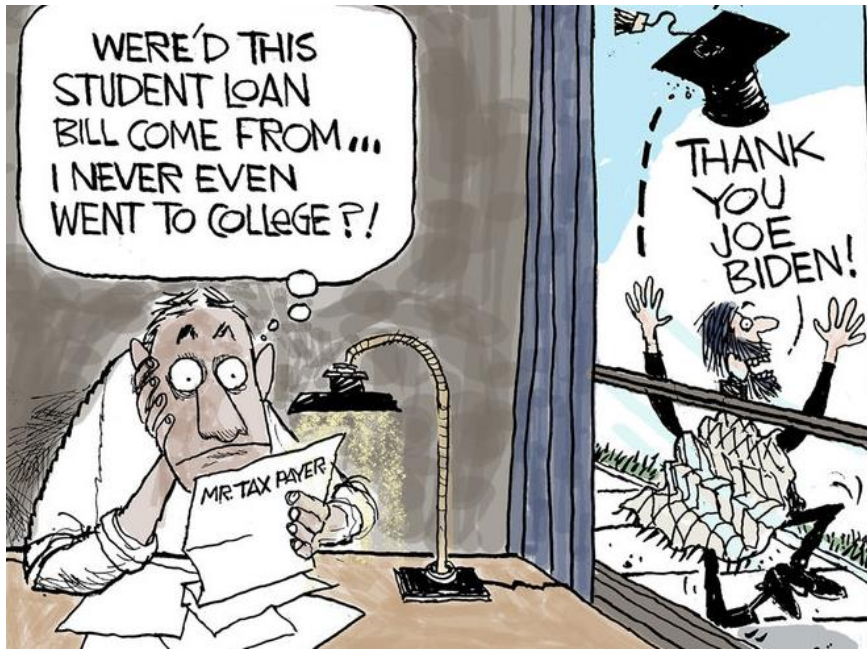
