

TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE OBTAIN A GRAND JURY INDICTMENT ON AN EMPLOYEE AT MISSOURI BAPTIST HOSPITAL FOR STEALING \$3,100 BY CHECK FRAUD. Here is the indictment obtained by Cpl. Katie Exline.

I, <u>Katie Exline, DSN 0123, Town and Country Police Department</u>, knowing that false statements on this form are punishable by law, state that the facts contained herein are true and documented in report number 24-375. I have probable cause to believe thatbetween January 9, 2024 and April 1, 2024, within St. Louis County, Cheuk Ying Ivy Otterbacher, 59, Asian Or Pcfcis, Female, 5'01", 100lbs, committed one or more criminal offense(s).

The facts supporting this belief are as follows: Defendant worked for a healthcare company that provides environmental services to Missouri Baptist Medical Center. She worked for the company for a period of approximately 10 months between June 2023 and March 2024. An investigation by the company after defendant's employment was over discovered numerous unauthorized purchases made by defendant on the company's credit account with Grainger. She made at least \$1,718.25 in unauthorized purchases on the account between March 1, 2024 and April 1, 2024, and made at least \$1,464.61 in unauthorized purchases between January 9, 2024 and February 8, 2024. The orders were shipped to defendant's office at Missouri Baptist Medical Center. Defendant turned herself in to police, accompanied by her lawyer, and declined to make any statements. She admitted to her supervisors that she had made the unauthorized purchases.

TOWN & COUNTRY ALDERMANIC RETREAT MEETING From the minutes retreat meeting held on Thursday July 24 of interest:

DEER:

6. DISCUSSION – DEER MANAGEMENT Utilizing the attached presentation, Mr. Shelton provided the annual cost for Deer Management from 2011 to current. He noted that the Board approves a contract annually for program management, but that City staff performs baiting. He stated that the program and distance sampling reports have been managed successfully by White Buffalo. He further noted the programs effectiveness is notable evidenced by the decreasing number of deer/vehicle accidents. Discussion ensued relating to previous methods of deer

management and their outcomes. Mr. Shelton added that non-lethal methods are currently not authorized in Missouri.

SIDEWALKS:

TOPPING RD Half of the sidewalk is done from Clayton Rd to Topping Estates. The section section was then suppose to go to Pingry Parkway. City Administrator Bob Shelton said that has been revised and the sidewalk project will stop 2-blocks before Pingry at Thornhill Estates.

Topping Road Phase 2B Mr. Zeltmann noted that grant funding was rejected again. Mr. Shelton noted that the projected costs includes sidewalk construction to Pingry, but Staff is recommending stopping at Thornhill so costs are anticipated to come down. Mr. Shelton stated that, pending no objection, Staff plans to proceed with the project with the sidewalk stopping at Thornhill and utilizing City funds. Alderman Kinsella stated that public education should be a priority to ensure that there is no objection. Alderman Gerber suggested consideration of a "2C" project to complete the remaining strip of sidewalk sometime in the future

Bopp Road Mr. Zeltmann stated that grant funds were approved, and the project is slated for construction in 2029. He further noted that the multi-use trail was an integral piece of this project and is approximately 22% of the total project cost

Mason Road Mr. Zeltmann noted that St. Louis County will facilitate this project should it proceed, similar to the previous stretch of Mason Road, and the City will reimburse the County. He added that the County has slated this a high priority project

- **Ballas Road** Mr. Zeltmann reviewed the various potential funding mechanisms, and noted that 24 easements would be required, some being permanent, for MSD requirements. Discussion ensued relating to easement acquisition, which side of the road the sidewalk will be placed on, and overall cost to the City. Assistant City Administrator/City Clerk Ashley McNamara stated that because the roadway belongs to St. Louis County, they determine which side of the road the sidewalk would be placed.
- 2. **FACILITIES UPDATE** Utilizing the attached presentation, Mr. Shelton provided an overview of the status of the facilities upgrade projects. He stated that the current priority is **the new Public Works Facility, noting the estimated cost to be about \$3.7MM** for new construction on existing City owned property. He added that two employees along with various equipment would be relocated to the new facility. Finance Director Joan Jadali displayed charts depicting various transfers out of the General Fund and Parks and Stormwater fund into the Capital Fund over three years to fund the Public Works facility, City Hall and Fire Station

renovations. She noted that the projections also included all operational and future capital costs. Ms. Jadali stated that due to the General Fund balance policy, the end-of-year balance would never drop below 50%. Mr. Shelton added that all projections displayed include standard expenses.

Another quick meeting over in 19-minutes. Highlights were a public hearing (no one spoke) for the Mexican restaurant in the Schunks center at Clayton Road and Woods Mill to have outdoor dining.

Also there was a first reading to approve the bid of Gamma Tree Service for fall branch chipping at \$55,500. Apparently Gamma was the lone bidder.

They were reunited at the station, and it was determined no criminal negligence occurred by the mother. She advised that she and her son have lived in Chesterfield since 2013, and this was the first incident in which he was able to reach the locks and leave the house undetected. The matter was referred to Social Services for a home follow-up.

THE SPECIAL COUNCIL MEETING

The meeting at first was not going to be live streamed. Then it was, however there was sound but no video of the Council or speakers. All that was on the screen was a photo of City Hall and then outlines on topics Mike Geisel was speaking on for just under two hours.

City Administrator Mike Geisel was the primary speaker. He said he would not share his opinion of the purchase and then started on these items:


Goal 2: Provide Exceptional Parks, Facilities, and Recreational Programming

- Objective 2: Continue to build out the eight acres recently purchased in Central Park.
 - Creating additional parking for the Chesterfield Amphitheater is a key marker for this objective. Adding the 422 parking spaces on the property makes progress on this objective and goal of the strategic plan.

Mike Gesiel spoke for 1-hour 48-minutes. I'm sure some in the chamber suffered injuries when they fell asleep and their heads rapidly fell forward. After a bathroom break it was Q&A submitted by residents on cards.

Residents were not allowed to speak. They had to fill out cards with questions that were read by the assistant city administrator in an attempt to avoid 4-minutes of angry comments.

Geisel claimed this was the numbers of City property usage.

Much of the presentation dealt with issues not directly related to the proposed office building/parking garage purchase.

Mike Geisel at one point mentioned that the office building was never on the market as being for sale. This was simply between the property owner Gershman and the City.

In spite of the voluminous torrent of words....2 hours of it.....there is still no explanation as to why the council offered 17.3 M instead of the newer lower appraisal of 14.5 M.....it's insane.

THE FLIERS Last week cards were placed on parked cars on lots in Chesterfield against the City Council spending \$17,300,000 to purchase an office building and parking garage near the City's amphitheater. Locals seem to be against this while the Council so far is 6-2 vote for it. The cards gave an email address of

This is the email of facts concerning the purchase that is sent to people inquiring:

At the Monday, August 18, 2025, City Council meeting, the City of Chesterfield intends to approve the purchase of the Mass Mutual building at 16150 Main Circle Drive, which is in the southeast quadrant of Central Park, near the amphitheater.

The purchase would include a two-level parking structure with 280 parking spaces, needed by the City only a few times each year for concerts at the amphitheater. (Less expensive options for parking should be considered.)

While the City might benefit a few times a year from extra parking spaces, there is ZERO need for the City to use any office space in the building itself.

The City has suggested that some of the space in the building could be used for a police substation. However, since the building wasn't designed for that purpose, it would require substantial costs for renovations.

The City has also suggested that space in the building could be used for a community center. However, when most people think of a community center, they think of what is already being provided at the Jewish Community Center, or even the newly renovated YMCA, which isn't remotely possible to provide in the building they want to purchase. - (If the City has something else in mind, it would be much less expensive to lease space on the first floor than to buy the building.)

The anticipated \$17.3 million purchase price is nearly \$3 million more than a recent appraisal, which valued the property at \$14.5 million.

With 95,000 square feet of office space in the building, a \$17.3 million purchase equates to a \$182 per square-foot purchase price. In comparison, the most recent sale of a similar Class A office building in Chesterfield, the 226,000 square-foot office building at 14528 S. Outer 40 Road, was for \$6.78 million, or only \$30 per square-foot.

The City contends that the monthly revenues generated from tenant rents when combined with a 100% property tax exemption (they assume they'll be allowed) will generate significant monthly cash flows which will provide funding for other projects in the City.

If the 100% property tax exemption is allowed, it will reduce funding to our local schools by nearly a quarter of a million dollars (or more) each year. It will also reduce funding to the Monarch Fire District by nearly \$50,000 each year and to the Special School District by over \$40,000 a year.

If the property exemption is NOT allowed, it makes the City's positive financial assumptions less valid, maybe even very questionable.

If the City is on questionable legal ground about receiving a property tax exemption of 100% but buy the property and decide to take one anyway, the matter will probably be decided in a court of law. If they were to lose that court case (and therefore, the right to take the exemption) then the positive financial assumptions they've made become very suspect. But it would then be too late to correct the situation.


While there's no doubt that Chesterfield is expanding, it doesn't mean that every department of the City will also need to expand. And there is still unused space available in the City Hall building, if needed.



Prior to hearing public comment on this issue and before there was public discussion about it between council members, Chesterfield Mayor Dan Hurt claimed that the City wanted to listen to residents to learn if they wanted to 1) keep the status quo, 2) have the City move forward with plans to purchase the building, or 3) do something else. The August 12th meeting is a chance for you to learn the facts as well as have your opinions heard.

Also, regardless of how we feel about the validity of the City's positive financial assumptions, the question of whether the City should be getting into the landlord business, or not, is an issue which needs to be addressed.
