Narrative Description	During an argument about cocaine, one subject struck the other. Later, the second subject returned to the residence where he threatened to harm the first subject.						

25-4390 – Harassment 1st / Domestic Violence – Woodchase Lane

At 11:30 PM, officers were dispatched to an apartment on Woodchase Lane regarding a disturbance between a 61-year-old female and her 40-year-old son. The female reported that her son continues to smoke crack cocaine inside the apartment against her wishes. She stated that tonight she attempted to stop him and told him to leave the residence. Officers de-escalated the situation, and the male agreed to leave for the night. No cocaine was found.

At 1:45 AM, officers were called back to the residence after the female reported her son was pounding on the front door. She had bolted the door out of fear. Upon arrival,

officers located the male near the entrance to the apartment complex. He told officers he planned to kill his mother and was adamant about his intent. He also stated that he was not receiving the mental health assistance he needed. Officers transported him to Mercy Hospital for evaluation and completed an affidavit for a 96-hour detention. Officers will seek an at-large arrest warrant this morning for the threats, with the intent to arrest him upon his release from Mercy.

**** **Update** **** **25-4390 – Harassment 1st/ Domestic Violence:** A Detective responded to the state PA's office for warrant application. A warrant was issued for Harassment – 1st – Class E Felony with a \$100,000 cash only bond No 10%. CSU officers are currently attempting to locate the subject due to him being released from Mercy Hospital prior to the warrant being issued. This is from the charging document:

I, Kevin Restivo, DSN 0338, Chesterfield Police Department, knowing that false statements on this form are punishable by law, state that the facts contained herein are true and documented in report number 25-4390. I have probable cause to believe that on October 1, 2025, within St. Louis County, Martez Pearson, 40, Black, Male, 6'02", 175lbs, committed one or more criminal offense(s).

Count: 01	HARASSMENT - 1ST DEGREE - CLASS E FELONY
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The facts supporting this belief are as follows: On October 1, 2025, police received a call for a domestic dispute between the Victim and the Defendant. The Victim is the Defendant's mother. The Victim called 911. When police arrived, the two were separated. The Defendant was told to leave and complied. About an hour and a half later, police were called to the residence again. The Defendant was at the entrance of the complex and had been banging on the door. Officers put the Defendant in handcuffs because he was acting erratically. The Defendant told officers that he was going to "kill that bitch" and "I promise you I'm going to fuck that bitch up if she keeps playing with me, bro." He threatened the Victim at least four times. When the officers conveyed these threats to the Victim so that she could take precautions for her safety, the Victim was emotionally distressed

I believe that the defendant poses a danger to a crime victim due to the nature of the offense. The Defendant threatened the life and safety of the Victim and knows where she lives. The Defendant has prior convictions for Possession of a Controlled Substance, Burglary 2nd, Theft, Property Damage 2nd, Theft, False Imprisonment, Receiving Stolen Property, Tampering with a Motor

Vehicle, Stealing a Motor Vehicle, Assault 3rd, and Felony Fleeing. The Defendant has numerous prior arrests as well. I do not believe that he will appear on a summons and a warrant is requested.

25-4391 – Motor Vehicle Crash – 150 N Eatherton Road

At 4:00 AM, officers responded to a two-vehicle crash involving a tractor-trailer and an SUV. No injuries were reported. One vehicle required towing, and both northbound and southbound lanes were blocked for approximately 45 minutes.

At 12:37 AM, officers were dispatched to Dave's Hot Chicken for a robbery in progress. The suspect, armed with a semi-automatic handgun, was last seen running

toward Chesterfield Airport Road. Officers arrived within four minutes, established containment, and canvassed the area. The suspect emerged from a wooded area and was arrested. The 37-year-old male from East St. Louis, Illinois was found in possession of stolen money and a 9mm handgun previously reported stolen in Clayton, Missouri. Despite video evidence showing him in the same clothing, he denied committing the robbery. Ellisville K-9 assisted with an article search, leading to the recovery of the money bag in a sewer drain near McBride and Sons Center Drive. An in-custody warrant application will be made this morning.

UPDATE: 25-4433 – Robbery 1st / Armed Criminal Action / Possession of Stolen Firearm: A day watch officer responded to the St. Louis County Prosecuting Attorney's Office for warrant application. The suspect was formally charged with Robbery 1st, Armed Criminal Action, Receiving Stolen Property, and Assault 4th. The reviewing judge assigned a \$20,000.00 cash only bond.

Officers arrest the defendant, recovering a pistol reported stolen. The victim manager identified the defendant as the criminal during a show-up. Surveillance cameras captured the fight with the manager. Defendant was found wearing the same true religion underwear as he was seen wearing during the robbery.

CITY COUNCIL MEETING Monday October 6



NO RESIDENTS TO SPEAK AGAINST SPENDING \$17.3-MILLION TO BUY AND OFFICE BUILDING TO GET PARKING FOR THE CITY'S AMPHITHEATER.

Later in the meeting two bills were read for the first time. One concerned signing a contract to buy the Office Building at 16150 Main Circle Drive. There is not a vote on a first reading. However, Councilwomen Barb McGuinness and Patricia Toco voted against even placing bill on an agenda for a vote at the October 20th meeting. The vote was 6-2 to first read the bill by council members unconcerned with spending \$17.3-million.

The only speaker at the start of the meeting was Mike Kane, who spoke how the **Chesterfield Historical Calendar for 2026** is now available. The calendars are free at the front desk of the City Hall. I'm still a paper and pen guy and have 10 years of these calendars.

CITY COUNCIL PLANS TO EXEMPT CHESTERFIELD FROM STATE LIQUOR LAW CHANGES FOR THE SOCCER WORLD CUP. The State of Missouri has lifted bars and restaurants from obeying State Law on closing during the FIFA (Soccer) World Cup Tournament from June 11 to July 19. A Bill was first read to not follow the State changes for sale of drinks from 23-hours a day, but to current for Chesterfield's Bars to close at 1:30am. The bill will be voted on at the next Council meeting on October 20.



COUNCIL APPROVED SIDE AND STREET CONTRACT. The Councilperson voted 8-0 to accept a bid up to \$100,000 to do crack sealing on City streets. The Council also voted 8-0 to accept a bid of \$79,885 from Spencer Contracting to install 24 ADA Curb Compliant ramps in the Schoettler Village and Schoettler Valley Estates subdivisions not to exceed \$110,000 in event of cost overruns.

COUNCIL TO CHANGE ORDINANCE ON TRASH CANS AT CURBS. Currently residents can put the trash out by the curb for pickup at 5pm the day before pickup and must retrieve the containers by 11:59pm the day of the pickup.

There is a bill that will change that which was first read at Monday's meeting to be voted on at the meeting on October 20. The bill will allow the containers to remain curbside until 9am the day after pickup.

The thinking behind this is that some homeowners work the "afternoon" shift from 4pm-to-midnight and return home after midnight and feel uncomfortable getting the trash cans late at night in the dark. This is the change in the ordinance:

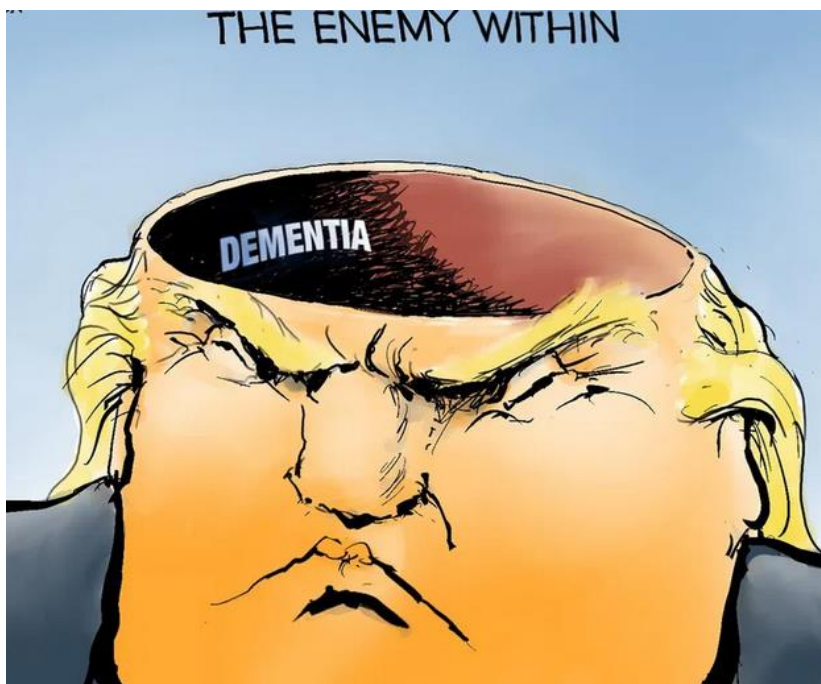

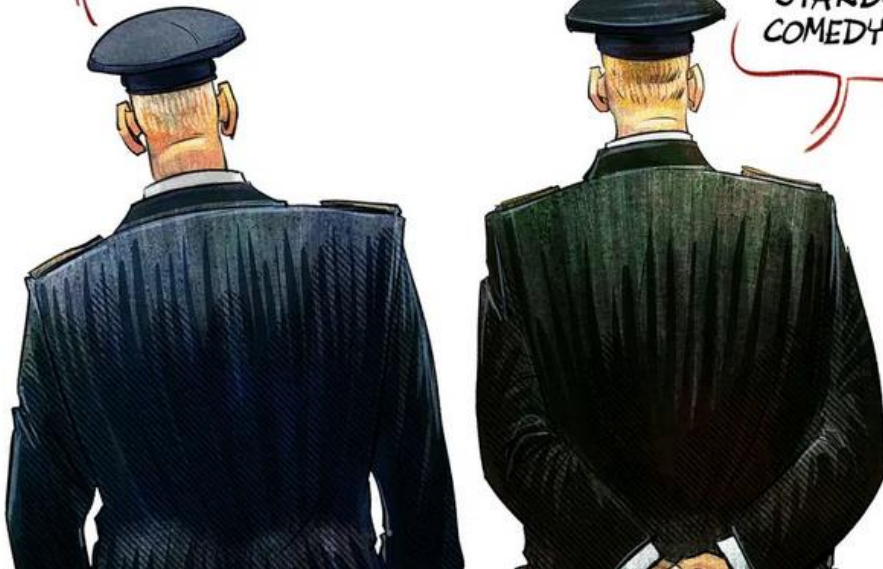
