Columbus Day is only a National Holiday.

CHANGES TO SOLAR ENGERY DISH LOCATIONS ON HOUSES AND MORE: The is charge in the current ordinance in a bill set for a first reading on 10/13 and a final reading and aldermanic vote on October 27. The first ordinance on solar panels was in 2013. These amendments would now include 500 sq ft pool houses, green houses and detached garages.



1. Ground-Mounted Solar Energy System. No A conditional use permit shall be approved by the Board of Aldermen for any new ground-mounted solar energy system and roof mounted solar energy system that is mounted either on the front of the roof, or on the side of the roof facing a street, or on flat roofs on which the application can be seen from the ground shall be issued until such time as the Board of Alderman shall approve a conditional use permit based on an affirmative finding that the proposed solar energy system is prior to the issuance of any building permit and the system shall be in compliance with all standards and requirements of this code, including the standards set forth in Section 500.110.

2. Roof-Mounted Solar Energy System – Visible from Street. The Architectural Review Board shall review and approve new roof-mounted solar energy systems that are mounted either on the roof facing a street, or on flat roofs on which the application can be seen from the ground on a street or lot adjacent to the roof, prior to the issuance of any building permit and the system shall be in compliance with all standards and requirements of this code, including the standards set forth in Section 500.110.

3. Roof-Mounted Solar Energy System – Not Visible from Street. The construction of roof-mounted solar energy systems that are flush-mounted on a roof at the rear of the roof of a building, on the side of the roof not facing onto a street, or on top of a flat roof and not visible from the ground, shall require the issuance of a building permit. The system shall be in compliance with all standards and requirements of this code, including the standards set forth in Section 500.110.

a. Ground-mounted solar energy systems shall be permitted in all zoning districts with approval of a conditional use permit, except that a minimum lot size of five (5) acres shall be required in order to be located on a residential property

b. Ground-mounted solar energy systems shall not exceed ten (10) feet in height, as measured from the average grade at the base of the structure to the highest point of the structure.

c. Ground-mounted solar energy systems shall be placed in such a manner that glare will not be directed onto nearby properties or adjacent streets.

d. Ground-mounted solar energy systems shall be substantially screened from public view (including adjacent properties and public rights-of-way) by fencing, walls, plantings, or other architectural feature or any combination thereof; provided, however, that screening shall not be required to be so dense, so tall, or so located as to render equipment essentially non-functional.

FOOTBALL AT NIGHT AT PRINCIPIA: The Principia High School Panthers' football field on the edge of the campus at Clayton Road does not have lights for night time games and the city has not issued a permit for lights as the field is close to residential homes. However, in the past the school has received permission from the city to use portable lights for a single game. This last occurred in 2023.

At the October 13th Board of Aldermen meeting s resolution was passed for the use of Portable Lights being used on Friday October 24th for a 7pm game against Lutheran South High School.



This is part of a letter to the City and alderpersons from the school's Director of Facilities:

Re: Temporary Use Permit Request for Portable Light Towers – October 24, 2025

Town and Country Board of Alderman,

Principia School will be hosting a home football game on Friday, October 24, 2025, with kickoff scheduled for 7:00 p.m. We are respectfully requesting a **temporary use permit to operate 10 portable light towers** for this event. The towers would be placed on both sides of the track surrounding our football field. The lights will be in use from approximately **7:00 p.m. to no later than 10:30 p.m.**, providing safe and sufficient lighting for the duration of the game, from sunset through its conclusion.

In recent years, we have played evening games on the natural grass surface of our west field. However, we've been experiencing some issues with this grass field over the past several months, affecting both its safety and overall suitability for play. For this reason, we are kindly requesting a **one-time exception** to host the game on our main field under temporary lighting.

The Board passed the resolution on a unanimous vote.

PLANNING AND ZONE ACTION SENT TO ALDERPERSONS

A memo was sent to the Alderpersons from Ryan Spencer concerning some action by the Planning Commission for the Alderpersons' consideration. The memo was long but these items caught my attention:

3. **GREENHOUSES** – Greenhouses are not enumerated (listed) as a specific accessory building/structure and therefore automatically require a conditional use permit. Staff recommend enumerating this type of structure and permitting up to 200sf in area and 12ft in height. Staff based this recommendation on review of residential greenhouse models which range from 30sf to 400sf with a recommended height of 10-14 feet for the purpose of air circulation.
5. **CHILDREN'S PLAYHOUSES**– Town & Country has had the accessory structure, Children's Playhouse as a permitted structure since 1984. This terminology is outdated and does not recognize the numerous types of play structures that are prevalent throughout the community. Only two conditional use permits for Children's Playhouses have been approved in the recent past. Both involved playhouses that were elevated and of a size above the permitted 50sf. Staff recommends changing the terminology to *Children's Play Structure(s)* and permitted size (250sf) and height (12ft) to better encompass the structures that have been and will continue to be installed in the community.
6. **CHICKEN COOPS** – Following discussion by the Planning and Zoning Commission on January 15, 2025 related to a chicken coop CUP application, staff recommends that the existing regulations regarding chicken coop design be amended in order to allow for a chicken coop to be situated on the ground if it is placed on a solid foundation. This recommendation is due to the extended discussion regarding the minimum height a chicken coop should be off the ground to prevent vermin infiltration. Staff review of twenty-four (24) St. Louis municipalities that permit the keeping of chickens found that only Town & Country requires the floor of chicken coop to be elevated.

The facts supporting this belief are as follows:

On October 7, 2025, an officer responded to 790 S New Ballas Road for an assault that had just occurred. Upon arrival, the defendant said he was wearing the victim's shoe that he had taken from the victim. The defendant was bleeding from his face and rambling incoherently. The officer then spoke with the victim, who said he just wanted his shoe back and believed the defendant was crazy and needed to be locked up. While speaking with the victim, the defendant was walking all over the area rambling and acting erratic. The victim said he was waiting at the bus stop when the defendant walked up on him. The victim told the defendant to back up and not get so close to him. The defendant then walked back up to him and was getting in the victim's face. The victim again told the defendant to back up, at which time, the defendant pushed the victim and kicked the victim. The defendant then walked back towards the victim. They began tussling and eventually fell to the ground. The defendant began choking the victim with his forearm. The victim felt as though he was going to lose consciousness. The defendant released his arm from the victim's neck, and once back on his feet, the defendant pushed the victim and punched the victim in the face. The victim punched back at the defendant. The defendant was involved in a disturbance with hospital security before officers took the defendant into custody for assault.

There is reason to believe the defendant poses a danger to the community and crime victim based on the above-outlined facts.

ST. LOUIS COUNTY, Mo. – A self-admitted thief already serving parole and probation will appear in court on Monday for running a ticket-switching scam at a Chesterfield hardware store.

According to the Chesterfield Police Department's probable cause statement, a loss prevention employee at Lowe's contacted authorities on Sept. 25 and reported David L. Willyard had been stealing from multiple stores since Aug. 19.

Police said Willyard was caught attempting to ticket-switch merchandise at the Wentzville Lowe's store but was unsuccessful and left the store. Employees shared a description of both Willyard and his vehicle with investigators.

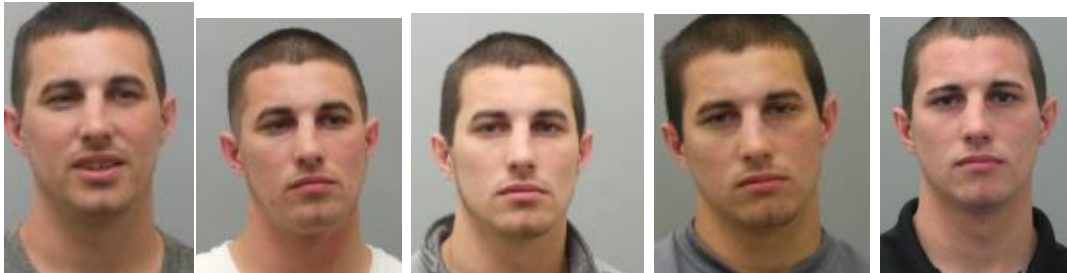
Lowe's ultimately confirmed Willyard had successfully completed a ticket-switch theft on several prior occasions. Willyard would take tickets of lower-priced merchandise and put them on higher-priced items and then go to the self-checkout line. He would scan the lower price and pay the cheaper amount.

Chesterfield police said Willyard went to the Lowe's on Sept. 1 and purchased a Porta Cool Apex 500, worth \$1,099, for approximately one-tenth of that amount. On Sept. 3, Willyard returned to the store and bought a 12-foot Immortal Nightwalker, priced at \$449, and paid just \$39 for it. He went back to the store on Sept. 9 and picked out a Larson 36-inch storm door and a Masonite 36-inch front door, worth \$399 and \$498, respectively, and paid only \$163.65.

The St. Louis County Prosecuting Attorney's Office charged Willyard with two counts of stealing – \$750 or more. He remains jailed on a \$50,000 cash-only bond.

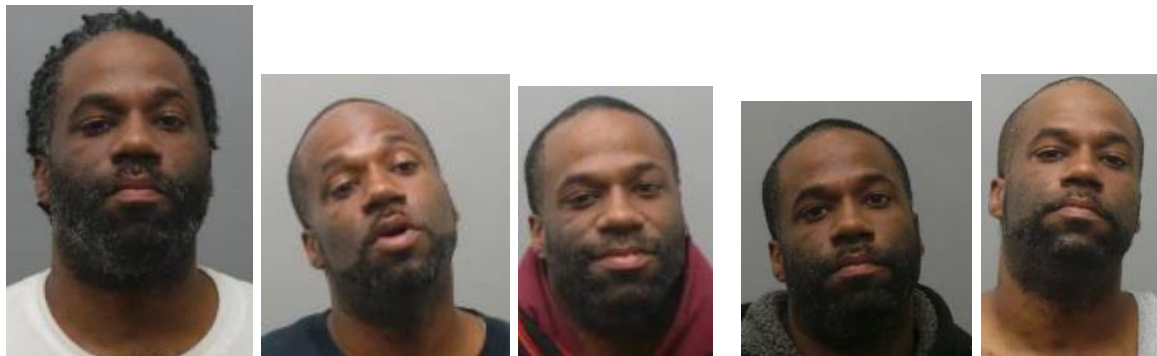
