On September 5th, 2025, Officer Hamel responded to a serious vehicle collision after recently going off-duty. On arrival, Officer Hamel exited his personal vehicle and immediately began providing aid to three injured occupants lying outside of burning vehicles. While pulling two of the injured occupants away from the burning vehicles, Officer Hamel observed a vehicle's front passenger side door open, and a female occupant falling halfway out of the vehicle. Officer Hamel used this window of opportunity to take immediate action. Without hesitation, he ran over to the fully engulfed vehicle and pulled the occupant out and away from the vehicle. Officer Hamel noticed the occupant's clothing and hair were actively on fire, so he ripped away the clothing and extinguished the fire. Officer Hamel then comforted and prayed with the occupant until medical personnel arrived.

For his dedication to dutifully providing an exemplary level of service, Officer Hamel is awarded the Town and Country Police Department Distinguished Service Citation with Valor.

The facts supporting this belief are as follows: On or about 10/13/25 I responded to vehicle crash and disturbance at Mike Duffy's Pub and Grill, 1024 Schnucks Woods Mill Plz. Upon arrival, I spoke with owner of BMW, Victim JG, who was a patron at the restaurant. Victim JG's car alarm goes off and Manager CS tells Victim JG that his car was struck in the parking lot. Victim goes outside and speaks with Defendant who struck his parked while attempting to park. Victim JG and Defendant exchange information and Victim JG goes back into restaurant. Approximately 10 minutes later Defendant gets out of his car and starts yelling to see the manager and wants to know who hit his car. Victim JG approaches to speak with Defendant again and Defendant punches Victim JG in the face. Off duty police officer Victim CB, is eating on the patio and intervenes but also gets punched in the face twice, breaking his Ray-ban sunglasses. Off -duty officer Victim CB pulls his concealed weapon and Defendant immediate leaves. Witnesses agree Defendant appeared very intoxicated. Defendant was found and arrested approximately 4 hours later was still very intoxicated at the time of the arrest. He is currently in custody in the Town and Country jail.

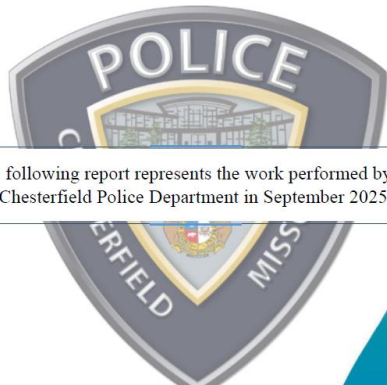

BURGLARY 1ST DEGREE/FELONY STEALING

Officers investigated the stealing of a color printer from a church located on **Eatherton Road**. While taking the initial report, officers discovered the perpetrator had returned to the scene to pick up the printer that had been staged outside of the church. The suspect placed the printer in a vehicle and attempted to resist arrest by fleeing. The suspect was prevented from entering the car and was taken into custody. The driver of the vehicle fled from the scene but did return sometime later with the printer still in the car. The driver of the car was also arrested. Both suspects were taken to the St. Louis County Jail for warrant application. The St. Louis County Prosecuting Attorney's Office issued warrants charging the suspect with Burglary in the 1st Degree and Felony Stealing. Bond was set at \$50,000.00. The suspect remains in custody at the St. Louis County Jail. For the driver, charges were taken under advisement by the St. Louis County Prosecuting Attorney's Office.

DRUG DISTRIBUTION/ DRIVING REVOKED

WB I64/Boones Crossing—An officer conducted a traffic stop for no seatbelt and failure to signal lane change. As the officer approached the vehicle, he observed a bag containing a substance he readily identified as psychedelic mushrooms through his past experience and training. 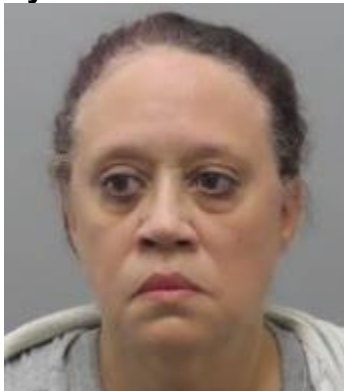

LADUE FARM ROAD BRIDGE REPLACEMENT: The State of Missouri in its regular inspection of bridges found that the bridge over Maryville Creek into the subdivision.

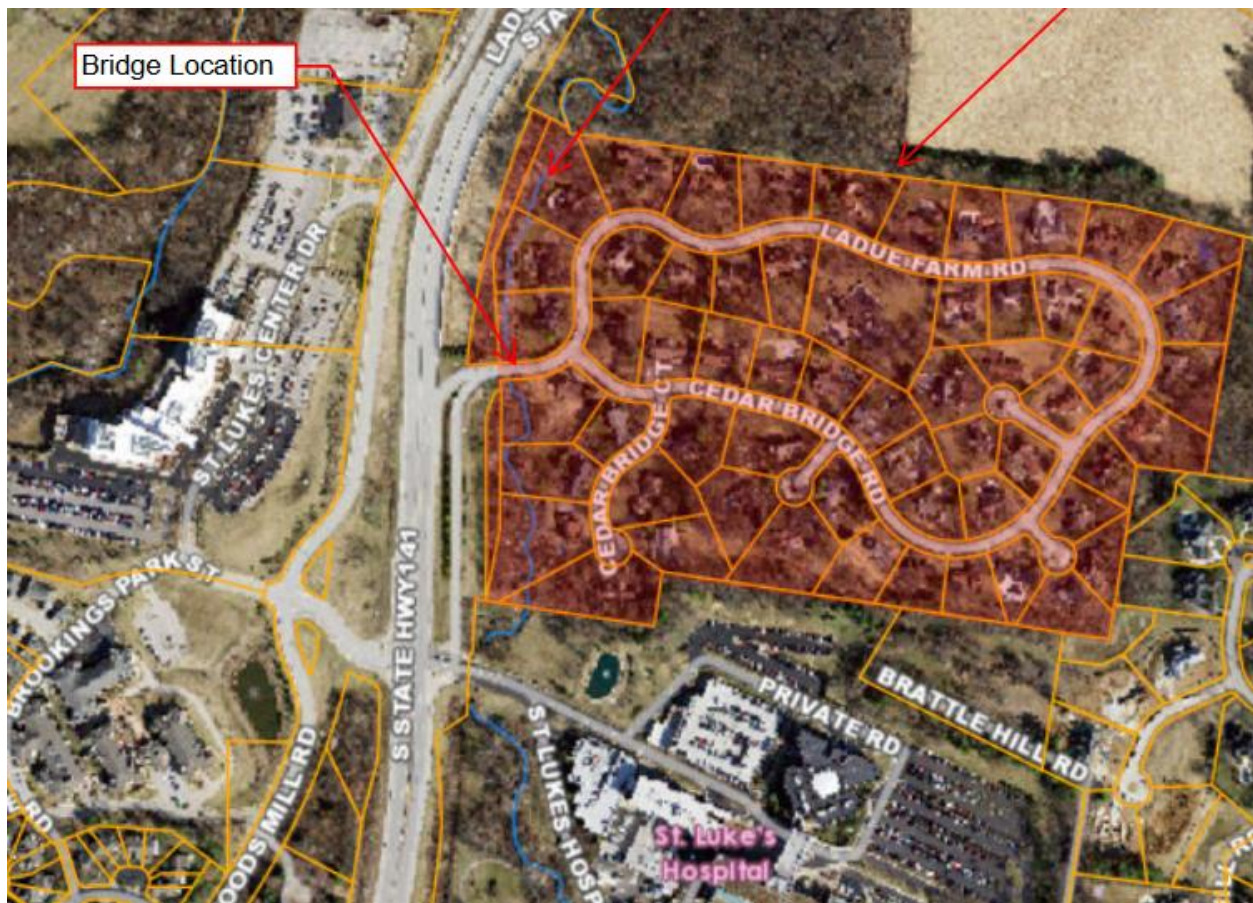
The estimated cost of the bridge replacement is \$2,227,900. The Surface Transportation Block Grant Fund will pay for \$1,575,920 of the cost leaving the City to pay for \$651,980. Land acquisition would start in 2026 and construction in 2028. This passed on a 8-0 vote.

From the City file:

The Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) will fund up to \$1,575,920 of the estimated total project cost of \$2,227,900. This results in local (City) funding of only \$651,980. Design of the project was previously approved by City Council and is currently underway. If the Program Agreement is approved, right of way acquisition will commence in 2026 and the bridge will be scheduled for reconstruction in 2028. As the bridge is the only means of access to the Ladue Farm subdivision, the new bridge will be designed to accommodate traffic during construction.

PURCHASE OF THE 5-STORY OFFICE BUILDING CONTRACTS ARE APPROVED.

The Council approved the contracts signed for the purchase of the 5-story office building and parking garage for \$17.3-million (\$3-million above appraise value) and approved to continue an existing contract with Gersham Commercial Real Estate to manage and operate the building. There was no dollar amount in the Bill approving the Gersham costs.



At the start of the meeting seven people had comments to make about the purchase. When this purchase first became public there were more persons speaking against it.

On Monday the issue did a 180. Of the seven speakers only one was against the purchase and six very much in favor of it.

When it came time to vote on the matter it continued to be Councilpersons Barb McGuinness and Patricia Tocco voted “NO” on buying the building and hiring Gersham.
