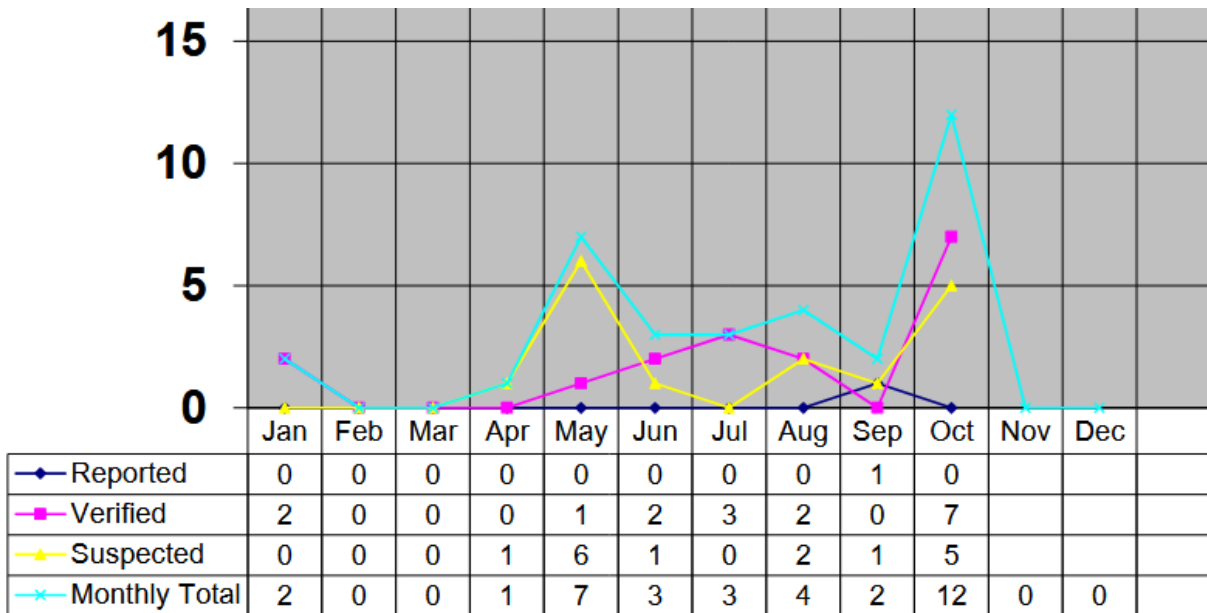

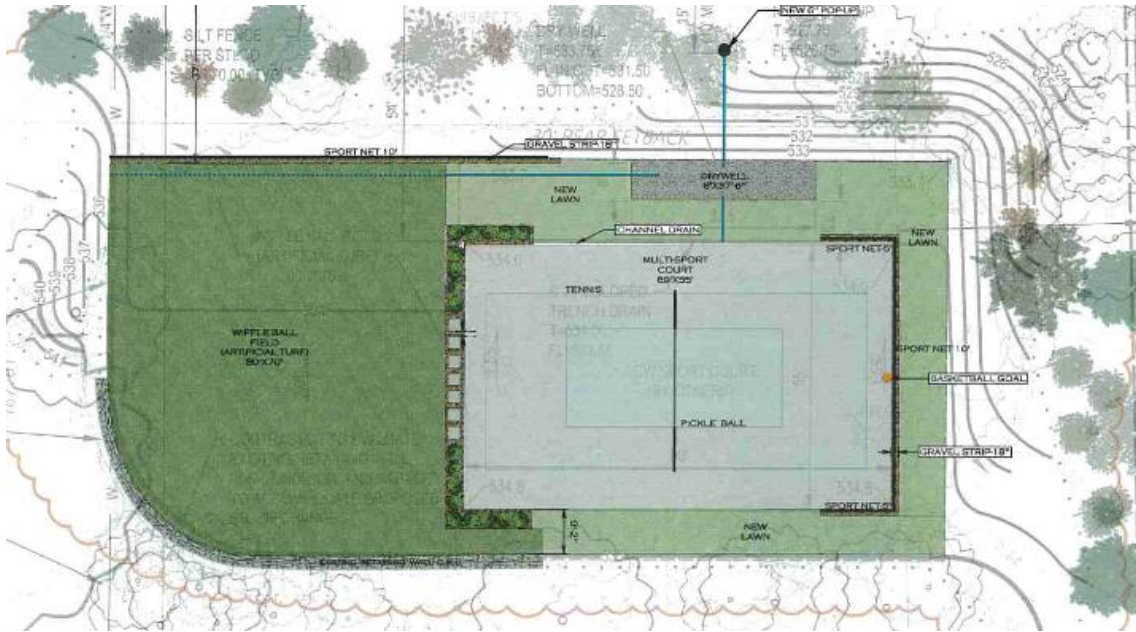
Todd is a graduate of SIUE and a licensed engineer in Missouri and Illinois.

PUBLIC HEARING RECREATION FACILITIES AT 13770 STONEMONT CT

SUMMARY- A request has been submitted by Dan Klemme of Bergfeld Recreation, applicant, on behalf of Chris Seyer, owner, for approval of a Conditional Use Permit for an accessory structure (permanent outdoor game court), located at 13770 Stonemont Ct., in the Suburban Estate (SE) Zoning District.

CURRENT PROPOSAL – The owner of the 4.35 acre property intends to construct a permanent outdoor game court in the rear yard. It will consist of a 5,600sf artificial turf field and a 4,895sf sport court consisting of a concrete pad with picklegrip tiles and a net for pickleball and tennis as well as a basketball hoop on the south end of the court. A ten foot tall containment net will be installed along the turf field to the east and along the sport court to the south. A five foot containment net will be installed along a portion of the southeast and southwest sport court.





This house is on 4.35 acres.

The property used to have a Mason Road address and was a horse farm.



The Evil Developer, Rob Rheingruber, who often felt zoning laws did not apply to him, bought the property including adjoining property and built a subdivision.



A resident and spokesman for the condos abutting the property in unincorporated St. Louis County spoke saying the condo residents were concerned about noise, late night activity and water runoff. The developer with Bergfeld Recreation and the homeowner, Chris Seyer spoke saying plans call for all water runoff to remain on the property drained away from the property line.

Later in the meeting the bill was first read with a second reading and vote at the next meeting.

A notification was received from a Lieutenant with the Ballwin Police Department as well as the owner of Slick City, indicating that several juveniles were reportedly using social media to plan a gathering at Slick City in the Valley. CHESTERFIELD — A light plane crashed Tuesday night in a wooded area of Chesterfield and the two men inside walked away with no injuries, authorities said.

The incident took place shortly after 6 p.m. near Wilson Avenue and Walnut Hill Farm Drive, said Jim McKay, a spokesman for the Monarch Fire Protection District.

McKay said the plane was making its final approach toward Spirit of St. Louis Airport when the aircraft's built-in parachute deployed. The plane landed in some trees, with its nose touching the ground, he said. Inside were the pilot and a passenger, he said.

Airport Director John Bales said the plane, a single-engine propeller aircraft, lost engine power and it essentially floated toward the ground.

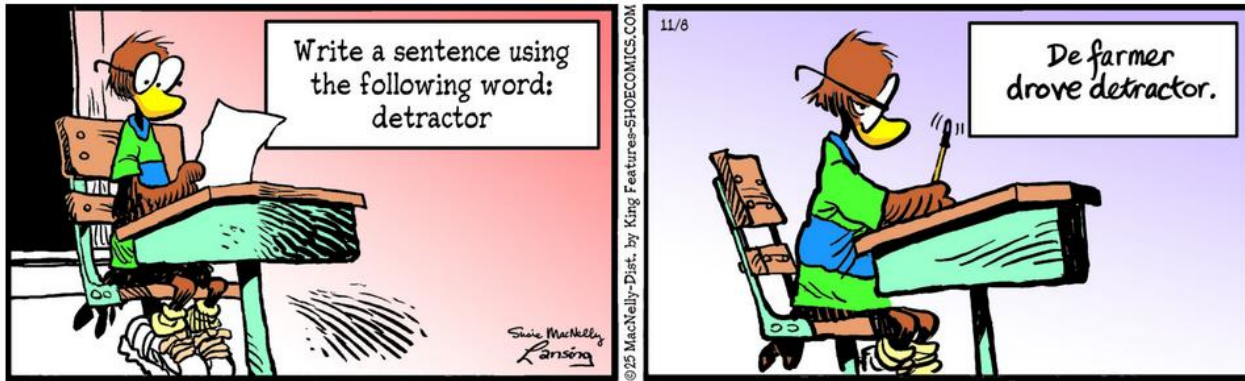
