WHITE BUFFALO RETURNS TO KILL DEER IN TOWN & COUNTRY: Aldermen first read an ordinance for the return of While Buffalo Inc of Connecticut to cull deer in Town and Country in 2026. White Buffalo has been culling deer in Town & Country since 2009.

The city hopes for a harvest of 75 deer. Total cost would be \$48,791. This is from a memo by City Administrator Bob Shelton to the Alderpersons.

SUMMARY- Bill No. 25-56 on the agenda for first reading November 24, provides for an agreement with White Buffalo to cull an estimated 75 deer. To maintain a reasonable population level, the Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) recommends the removal of up to 75 deer in the winter of 2026. The 2026 proposed budget includes funding for 75 deer based on the number of sites expected and the 79 deer taken last year. Funding is broken down as follows:

There have been 34 recorded deer/vehicle collisions through October of this year.

White Buffalo is currently scheduled for early January with additional commitments in Des Peres and Wildwood. Staff will be coordinating with MDC once again to donate up to a dozen deer to the Zoo Red Wolf Program, which would reduce the food processing expense by \$1,680.





A resident from Ballwin asked the Board to delay voting on the Deer management program. He went on and on against shooting deer, claiming that the facts provided by Whie Buffalo were false and "flawed." The City has been using White Buffalo for 17 years. St. Louis County has been shooting deer for several years at Queeny Park that abuts Town and Country.

Alderpersons and Deer Lovers, Al Gerber and Barbara Ann Hughes are likely to vote against when it is second read and voted on in December.

Count: 01 DOMESTIC ASSAULT - 3RD DEGREE - CLASS E FELONY

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
The facts supporting this belief are as follows: On November 22, 2025, the defendant and his girlfriend victim E.M. returned home to Topping Acres Ln., where they both live, from dinner and drinks. During an argument, the defendant locked the victim outside the front door. The victim begins kicking the door. The defendant opens the door and shoves the victim on the chest, who falls and hits her head on the concrete. The front door camera captures the shove and fall. The defendant scolds the victim for kicking the door. The defendant claims the victim lunged at him and he shoved her in self defense. Paramedics check the victim and discover a golf ball sized lump on her head.

Count: 02 UNLAWFUL POSSESSION OF A FIREARM - CLASS C FELONY

The facts supporting this belief are as follows: On or about 11/17/25, we received a 911 call regarding a domestic violence disturbance at 15814 Country Ridge. Upon arrival we met with victim wife who was bleeding profusely from the face. She stated that she and her husband got into an argument about financial troubles which escalated into him grabbing her by the throat and

throwing her to the ground and slapping her repeatedly with an open hand causing her to bleed from the nose and mouth. Victim had visible marks to face and neck and was transported by ambulance to Mercy hospital. Defendant fled from home upon victim calling 911 and purportedly spent the night in the woods, we later found him through running a locator on his phone and found him at a friend's house. The friend let us in the home and told us he was asleep in their basement. We found him slepping with his bag next to him. The bag was searched incident to arrest and found a semi-automatic handgun with a round in the chamber and 2 full magazines.


