

DRUNKS AND THIEVES 2023 PART 1

DRUNK DRIVER DOING 110 MPH ON I-64 CLAIMS HE IS GOING TO VISIT HIS VISIT MOTHER IN THE HOSPITAL AFTER MIDNIGHT? Town & Country Police Officer Dustin York was WB on I-64 Friday night April 15, 2022 at 11:58PM (Good Friday, Passover) when he saw a car approaching him at a high speed.

As the Toyota passed him he clocked using the moving radar installed in his Police car at 110 MPH. He immediately turned on the overhead lights and siren and got the car stopped on the exit to Hwy 141.

Officer York contacted the driver, Brett Thomas Heumann, 22, who live with the parents in a house on the Greenbriar Estates Drive in Kirkwood. Heumann stated that he was in a hurry to see his mother who was in the hospital. Of course it was now four hours after the end of visiting hours. When Officer York asked Huemann why his mother was in the hospital he could not say.

By now it was clear to Officer York that Heumann had been drinking was appeared to be intoxicated. When asked how much he had to drink Heumann said just one 24oz Margarita (he changes that saying he had “margaritas” (super size one).

Heumann said he was at an Affton Mexican restaurant with friend watching HBO Max. He could not provide the name of the restaurant. Drinking with friends apparently was higher on the list than seeing your mother in the hospital.

These were Officer York's observations once he got Heumann out of the car:

Heumann did poorly on some of the field sobriety tests. A field breath test showed his BAC level to be .144%.

He was arrested and taken to the Town and Country police station (which Heumann thought was the Creve Coeur station).

At the police station he agreed to take an "official" breath test. That test showed that his BAC level was dropping, just not enough to help him. Heumann's BAC level was .131%

In an interview, despite failing two breath tests, Heumann stated he did not think he was intoxicated.

OUTCOME: On 07/21/22 Heumann pled guilty to DWI and received a 2-year SIS (No Fine, No Permanent Record, No Points) probation sentence. He also pled guilty to Speeding 110 MPH and was fined by Judge Niehoff \$466.

SOUND ASLEEP BEHIND THE WHEEL OF A RUNNING CAR PARTIALLY ON THE SHOULDER AND PARTIALLY IN THE ROAD WITH VOMIT ON HER, 33-YEAR-OLD BALLWIN WOMAN ARRESTED FOR DWI. It was Friday night into Saturday morning at 1;24am, 11/20/21. Cpl. Steven Doll was on patrol when he noticed a black Honda CRV partially on the shoulder and partially in the road at S. Mason Road and Mason Ridge south of the elementary school.

Cp. Doll observed a woman with black hair behind the wheel of the running car with the headlights on. She had vomit on her and on the floorboard. Cpl. Doll requested an assist car to block the front of the Honda so when she woke up she could not drive off.

Waking her up proved to be no easy task. Cpl. Doll opened the driver's door and asked the driver, later identified as Audrey Lauren Hitchens, 33, of Ballwin. Cpl. Doll asked

her several times to turn the car off and she didn't. Finally the assist officer Josh Hamel opened the passenger door, reached in, turned off the car and removed the keys.

Doll asked Hitchens how she was, "All good," was the answer. She then apologized for going to fast, think she had been pulled over for speeding. Hitchens then attempted to put the car in gear and drive off. It wasn't happening since Officer Hamel had the keys. This is from the police report:

I asked Hitchens where she was coming from. She stated, "St. Louis." I asked what she was doing in Saint Louis. She stated, "Living." I asked Hitchens how much she has had to drink. Hitchens stated, "Three drinks." I asked Hitchens what kind of alcoholic drinks she has consumed. Hitchens stated, "St. Louis," then multiple incoherent mumbling words. I asked Hitchens again what she has consumed. Hitchens mumbled/slurred, "Seven thirty-five, seventy-five, here you go."


I asked Hitchens for her name by word of mouth. Hitchens stated, "Lauren (incoherent last name)." Hitchens then attempted to put her vehicle in drive, but her vehicle had been turned off.

Hitchens failed most of the field sobriety tests. At one point she sat down on the curb. She took a field breath test. The results showed her BAC level to be .157%. She was arrested for DWI and Improperly Stopping.


At the police station Hitchens agreed to take an "official" breath test. However there was a delay. She needed to throw up again. This time instead of on herself, she was given a wastebasket. She puked at 2:05am which delayed the "Official" Breath Test until 2:35am. At the time her BAC level was dropping but she was still testing drunk at .136%



She agreed to be interviewed. This is from the police report. If you notice her alcohol consumption went from 3-drinks to 2-drinks and then in the interview to 5-drinks. In the interview she admitted that she considered herself intoxicated.

OUTCOME: On 04/21/22 Hitchens appeared in Town & Country Municipal Court with a defense lawyer. She pled guilty to DWI and Judge Andrea Niehoff placed her on a SIS (No fine, No Points and No Permanent public record) probation term for 2-years. The Improper Stopping Charge was reduced to a Parking Violation with a \$191 fine. She left court with No Points for driving drunk and passing out in the road.

A CASE OF A SHOPLIFTER STEALING BOOZE, SOCKS AND CHAPSTICK TURNED OVER TO A DETECTIVE WHO GOT THE ARREST of Dana Ivy, 54, an active shoplifter after completing a 30-year-prison sentence for Robbery was a somewhat known figure around St. Louis County police departments.

On October 4, 2021 Dana Ivy went to the Whole Foods store in the Town and Country Crossing, got a shopping cart and filled it mostly with liquor products and then pushed the cart out of the store without attempting to pay for any of the items.

The theft and facial views of Ivy were all on security video. Also in the cart apparently dropped by the suspect was a receipt from the Lee Pawn Shop in St. Louis dated 10/4/22 in the name of Dana Ivy and Ivy's date of birth, SSN and phone number.

Here is what was stolen:

- 2 cases (12 packs) of Bud light Beer
- 2 bottles of Tito's Vodka
- 2 750 ML bottles of Hennessey Whiskey
- 2 750 ML bottles of Tanqueray
- 1 750 ML bottle of Crown Royal
- 3 sticks of Chapstick
- 2 pair of crew socks

Total value: \$141.54

Town and Country Officer Gowen took the original delayed report. He returned to the police station and spoke with Ivy who repeatedly denied being at Whole Foods and added that he was on house arrest.

Ivy did later drive to the Town and Country Police Station, but Officer Gowen was then on night watch.

The case was transferred to Det. Katie Exline.

Det. Exline obtained photos of Ivy selling electronics at Lee's Pawn to the video imagine from Whole Foods and found it was the same person.

Det. Exline called Ivy who continued to deny being at Whole Foods. He was told to turn himself in at the Town and Country Police station. He said he was going to call his lawyer and Det. Exline told him to have his lawyer call her. She gave him until October 15 to turn himself in or he would be entered in the police computer system as a wanted person.

Det. Exline called a detective with Clayton PD who said they were very familiar with Ivy for thefts, burglaries and exposing his penis to children in the restroom of a Starbucks. Det. Exline sent him a photo of Ivy in Whole Foods and he confirmed it was the same person.

Ivy turned himself in on Friday October 15. He was wearing the same gold glasses and gold watch he had on when stealing in Whole Foods.

Det. Exline pointed out the video from Whole Foods and how it was clearly him. Ivy then stated he wanted to call his lawyer. Det. Exline said he could and she would not advise him of his Miranda Rights or ask him any questions. He was release on a citation for Stealing.

Ivy served his full sentence for a robbery in St. Louis. He was in prison from March 3, 1988 to September 6, 2018.

OUTCOME: On 12/16/21 Ivy appeared before Town and Country Judge Andrea Niehoff without a lawyer. He pled guilty and was sentenced to 30-days jail, but given a 2-year SES probation term in lieu of jail.

STAFF HELPS PUT \$2000 RIDING LAWN MOWER ON CUSTOMER'S TRAILER, GOES BACK-IN TO DO PAPERWORK AS CUSTOMER TURNS INTO CRIMINAL AND DRIVES AWAY TO A PAWN SHOP. Dru Hoy, 38, a drug addict, ex-con and active criminal made the trip to the Town and Country Home Deport on Manchester Road with a pickup truck and trailer on May 17, 2021.

He went inside and told the staff he wanted to buy a John Deere riding lawn mower (\$1,999). He got a salesperson to help him put the mower on his trailer. Then instead of joining the salesperson inside to pay for the lawn mower, he drove off and headed straight for a pawn shop.

Det. Katie Exline tells the story as well as I could in her Probable Cause Court Document. The crooked alignment and dark color is thanks to the County Courts.

I, Katie Exline, DSN 0123, Town and Country Police Department, knowing that false statements on this form are punishable by law, state that the facts contained herein are true and documented in report number 21-477. I have probable cause to believe that on May 17, 2021, at 13929 Manchester Road, Dru Hoy, White, Male, DOB 07/22/1983, 5'11", 185lbs, committed one or more criminal offense(s).


Count: 01 STEALING - \$750 OR MORE - CLASS D FELONY

The facts supporting this belief are as follows: At the Home Depot store in Town and Country, defendant stole a John Deere riding lawn mower, valued at \$1,999.00. Accompanied by a Home Depot employee, he pushed the mower onto a trailer hitched to a white pickup truck. When the employee went inside the store to check on some paperwork defendant had provided him, defendant drove away with the mower. At no time had defendant provided any payment for the mower. Defendant was identified from surveillance video of the theft. Later that same day he was arrested in Overland after attempting to sell the stolen mower at a pawn shop. He confessed to stealing the mower, saying he had executed an online purchase of the mower (with pickup in store) but when the payment for the

mower was declined for insufficient funds, he printed out a document purporting to show that he had paid for the item (complete with an order number) and presented it at the store. Defendant admitted tht he had not provided payment for the mower and also confessed to attempting to sell the mower at the pawn shop, blaming his fentanyl habit.



48-YEAR-OLD GETS DUMPED BY HER FIANCE STARTS DRINKING BEFORE NOON WHILE CRASHING HER CAR THREE TIMES. SHE HAS ONE OF THE HIGHEST BAC LEVELS WE HAVE REPORTED ON. On Friday July 19, 2019 at about 12:30 in the afternoon Chesterfield Police were dispatched to a crash reportedly involving a drunk driver at Clarkson Road and Kettington Road in Clarkson Valley, a community Chesterfield PD polices.

The driver of the striking vehicle, a 2014 Mazda, 48-year-old, Candice Coleman was still behind the wheel when officers Michelle Best and Todd Lantz responded as did Ellisville Police as Coleman had two crashes in Ellisville.



The officers found Coleman to be highly intoxicated.



The crash was crazy. Coleman made a right turn from Clarkson Road onto Kettington, left the road while making a wide U-Turn and the rear ended a car at the stop sign.

Coleman gave the reason why she was very drunk at noon. This is from Officer Lantz's report:

Coleman stated "Yeah, my fiancé broke up with me." I asked her if she knew why she was here and she just stated she was sorry for all the police here. I could smell a strong odor of intoxicating beverage coming from her person. Her eyes were bloodshot and watery. Her speech was slurred. I asked her if she thinks she had too much to drink. She stated "Probably, Yes, Sorry."

Coleman after getting out of the car could not stop falling down. This is also from the police report:

Officer Lantz and another Officer had to hold on to Coleman and help her out of traffic as she was literally falling down drunk. She would tell officers she had "a fifth" to drink.

This is also from the police report:

I requested she exit her vehicle. Coleman had trouble exiting her car. She almost fell back into the driver's seat and had to use the door for balance. Once she stepped out, she fell backwards into her car. Her back hit the back door and she grabbed the door to hold on for support. I asked her how much she had to drink and she admitted to drinking "a 5th". I requested she walk to the other side of her vehicle to talk to her away from traffic. Coleman was unable to walk. PO Clymer DSN 335 and I assisted her in walking by holder her up right.

When they sat her down on the grass, she fell backwards and passed out. That is when Officer Lantz decided to hand her off.

Officer Lantz was concerned with the high level of her intoxicated condition and had a Monarch FPD District Ambulance respond and transported Coleman to St. Luke's Hospital.

At the hospital she had the Missouri Implied Consent Law for police to check blood or breath alcohol levels of drivers explained. She agreed to have a blood test. She also was advised of the Miranda Ruling and agreed to be interviewed.

The blood draw would later be found that **Coleman's BAC was .408%**.

It should be noted that prior to towing Coleman's Mazda officers found "AIRPLANE" bottles of Cherry Vodka and a plastic water bottle containing Cherry Vodka.

In the interview she was 9-days off on the date and 8-hours off on the time. She thought she was in Wildwood. There are no hospitals in Wildwood.

Unfortunately Coleman was left at the hospital due to her high BAC level and there is no mugshot.

She did not seem to have prior arrest issues. This is her court record:

OUTCOME: On 01/19/22 Coleman pled guilty to DWI before Chesterfield Judge Mark Gaertner hearing cases from Clarkson Valley. Unlike all the years of Judge Rick “Let Loose if they hired a lawyer” Brunk, Judge Gaertner gave her a conviction and a \$1,000 fine. 90-days in jail were stayed with a SES Probation.

On a guilty plea of an Open Container instead of the usual \$50 or \$100 fine she was fine \$492. A guilty plea for Improper Lane Use resulted in a \$170 fine. Two other moving violations were reduced to Health Code Violations with a \$320 fine and \$100.

TRIVIA NIGHT IN MAPLEWOOD TURNS INTO “DO YOU KNOW WHAT HAPPENS WHEN YOU REFUSE TO TAKE A BREATH TEST IN CHESTERFIELD: Officer Art Mueller was working the midnight shift on Saturday night into Sunday morning February 9, 2000. He was parked on the parking lot of the small retail/office center and service station on Ladue Road at about 1:38am, when he saw a BMW pull onto the lot.

After a very short time the driver of the vehicle turned onto Greentrails Road and then onto Ladue Road at a high rate of speed. Officer Mueller followed.

The car then turned onto Saylesville Dr and then onto the deadend residential street of Saylesville Court, drove to the end of the cul-de-sac and stopped.

Officer Mueller lit up the car. The driver got out and Officer Mueller had to order him several times to get back into the car.

The driver, John P. Dabrowski III, 43, of St. Peters, MO in St. Charles County. Dabrowski said he had been playing trivia in Maplewood and was dropping of a teammate. He added he was lost and trying to find his way out of the subdivision.

Officer Mueller could smell a strong odor of booze on Dabrowski's breath. He stated he had four beers while playing trivia at a Maplewood church.

He was asked to take a field breath and refused. Next he was arrested for DWI and transported to the Chesterfield Police Station.

At the police station Dabrowski refused to take an official breath test. He did agree to be interviewed. He stated that he did not consider himself drunk. He changed the number of beers he had at the church during trivia from four to five.

OUTCOME On 03/31/22 Dabrowski pled guilty to DWI. Judge Mark Gaertner placed him on a 2-years SIS (No-Record, No-Points, No-Fine) probation plus attendance at a Substance Abuse Traffic Violator Program.

SUICIDE ON I-64? NOT TODAY: On Thursday 01/28/21 at 11pm Chesterfield Officer Ashley Saffa was on WB I-64 before Timberlake Parkway when she noticed a blue Honda CRV in front of her going well under the speed limit and then speeding. The vehicle was also weaving and at one point weaved to the right almost hitting a Jeep.

Officer Saffa then stopped the CRV at Chesterfield Parkway East. Instead of pulling to the far right, the driver partially blocked the exit lane.

(The driver talked about trying to kill herself the night before...because her having possible mental health issues we will not use her real name. We picked Wanda as a substitute name.)

Upon contacting the driver Officer Saffa immediately detected the smell of booze on her breath and asked “Wanda” how much she had to drink. “Wanda” denied having anything to drink.

After asking for her drivers’ license and insurance card “Wanda” said nothing, held her right arm straight ahead and stared. Officer Saffa asked again how much she had to drink and “Wanda” replied “No.” Next she was asked what she was on and she replied “No.”

Officer Saffa then explained that she had stopped her because she was concerned about and the way she was driving.

“Wanda” then said she had tried to kill herself the day before and nothing has been right since.

This is from the police report:

During my interaction with **** she denied consuming any alcoholic beverages or drugs, legal or illegal. However, I observed that her eyes were bloodshot, her movements were uncoordinated and sluggish, and her speech was confused and slurred. I could also smell a moderate odor of an intoxicating beverage.

She said when she attempted suicide she tried to overdose on Benadryl. Benadryl is an antihistamine used to treat allergies. The FDA has issued the following warning about Benadryl: can lead to serious heart problems, seizures, coma, or even death.

Officer Safa noted her first impressions of the driver in her police report:

After poor performances on field sobriety tests "Wanda" was arrested for DWI.

At the police station she agreed to take a breath test. The test showed she had been drinking contrary to her earlier denials but the BAC level was under .08% the Missouri legal level for intoxication. But due to her condition and admitted use of drugs the night before she was cited for DWI.

In an interview she now admitted drinking, stating she had 3-mixed drinks at a friend's house in Creve Coeur and she was now going home to Florissant. (She was driving too far west to go to Florissant.)

We could only find one violation prior to her Chesterfield arrest. It was for Disobeying a Stop Sign in Florissant on 02/19/20. A FTA Warrant was issued on 11/10/21.



CHESTERFIELD OUTCOME: On 10/14/21 the DWI-D charge was reduced to Careless & Imprudent Driving. She pled guilty and was fined \$191. She also got 2-points. The Improper Lane Use was reduced to a Parking Violation with a \$191 fine. The fact her car was unregistered resulted in a \$45 fine.

PASSING A POLICE CAR AT 90MPH NEVER ENDS WELL: It was a Sunday night November 3, 2019 at 9:32. Chesterfield Police Officer Devin Kitrel was west on I-64 before Timberlake Manor when he noticed in his rearview mirror a vehicle approaching him at a high rate of speed.

The rear facing radar clocked 1996 Honda Civic at 90 MPH as it approached the police car. Did the driver slow down after passing a police car? Nope! Officer Kitrel clocked the Honda still at 90 mph after it passed him.

Officer Kitrel managed to get the Honda stopped past Chesterfield Parkway East where he contacted the driver, Gaspar Cruz, 18 years old and a Mexican National. When asked for his drivers' license Cruz said he did not have one and handed Officer Kitrel his passport.

Cruz denied having anything to drink. Officer Kitrel knew better, this is from his report concerning his original observations:


Cruz agreed to do field sobriety tests which led to him agreeing to take a field breath test. The results showed that Cruz had a BAC level of .109%. Officer Kitrel then arrested him for DWI and Speeding.

A check of Cruz's car revealed five unopened cans of Modelo Mexican Lager beer and one empty can.



At the police station an interpreter service was contacted and Cruz was explained the Missouri Implied Consent Law. He agreed to take an “official” breath test. The test results showed he was still drunk at .104%



In an interview done with the assistance on an interpreter Cruz now stated he had “one or two beers.” He stated he stopped drinking when the police stopped him, indicating he was drinking while driving, but then he also stated that he had two beers “at home.”



Collins agreed to take Field Sobriety Tests which he did not excel at. He then agree to take a field breath test. That showed him to be intoxicated with a BAC level of .111%.



He was arrested and at the police station he agreed to take an “official” breath test. That showed he was still intoxicated but that his BAC level was dropping after the booking procedure. He now tested at .099%.



OUTCOME: On 10/06/21 Collins pled guilty to DWI and was placed on a 2-year SIS probation (no fine, no-points and no-permanent record). Prosecutor Tim Englemeyer who doesn't want to see anyone leave with courtroom with points on their record as long as the hired a defense lawyer, reduced the Fail to Drive with Care to a Misc. Health Violation with a \$355 fine. For Englemeyer and some elected officials producing revenue for the city and defense attorneys is far more important than public safety.
