

DRUNKS AND THIEVES 2018 Part 2 May 27, 2018

VERY DRUNK DRIVER HITS CURB, DOESN'T KNOW WHAT TIME IT IS AND REFUSES A BREATH TEST: Town and Country Police Officer Doll was on patrol Thursday night into Friday morning September 16, 2016 at about 1:30 Am when he followed a 2015 Chevy Silverado up the exit ramp from WB I-64 to Mason Road.

The driver did not signal his left turn and when he made the left turn the Chevy's right side struck the overpass curb. Officer Doll continued to follow the car and then stopped the driver as he turned onto Mason Ridge Road.

Officer Doll contacted the driver Justin Mayo, 37, of South St. Louis County. It quickly became clear to Officer Doll that Mayo was drunk. Here are his first observations from the face sheet of his DWI report:

Mayo failed the field sobriety tests. He agreed to take a field breath test which showed he was intoxicated. He was arrested and taken to the police station.

He refused to take an official breath test. He did however agreed to be interviewed.

It was on after 2am on Wednesday morning. When asked what time it was Mayo said, "10:30."

He said it was Thursday when in fact it was Wednesday.

When asked when he had stopped drinking he stated, "At 11:30." This was an interesting answer since he had just said he thought it was 10:30. Apparently he was in a time warp as Mr. Peabody and his time machine was not at the Town and Country Police Station.

Mayo stated that he last ate the prior morning when he had some biscuits. He admitted that he might be intoxicated "to some extent." He admitted he had been drinking at a Hot Shots.

OUTCOME: Breaking News: A DWI Defendant gets a record for DWI! On 08/24/17 Mayo pled guilty to DWI after transferring the case to the St. Louis County Associate Circuit Court. He was sentenced by Judge Mary Ott to 90-days in jail, but then immediately placed on a 2-year probation term. However this was a SES (Suspended Execution of Sentence) so it goes on his record and he gets points. He was also fined \$600.

The Improper Lane Use charge where he drove out of the lane and hit the overpass curb was amended to Illegal Parking so he got no points on that one, The illegal parking fine was included in the \$600 fine according to court records. (Orig appear in Newsletter 328 on May 6.)

SAM'S CLUB EMPLOYEE KEEPS CUSTOMER'S GIFT CARD AFTER PURCHASE AND USES \$126 LEFT ON THE CARD TO PURCHASE AN APPLE SMARTWATCH. In other words she was dumb to use a stolen gift card to buy a Smartwatch. Alexis

Fulton, 19, of North St. Louis County was a cashier at the Sam's Club in Chesterfield Valley. On 11/27/16 Fulton was working and a customer made a purchase for \$75 and used a gift card. After the purchase there was \$126.90 left on the gift card. The customer didn't get the gift card back. Instead Fulton gave her back a gift card with a zero balance and kept the customer's card.

Later that day Fulton purchased an Apple Smartwatch for \$281 and used the \$126 on the stolen gift card to help purchase the Smartwatch, which she had shipped to her address in North St. Louis County.

Sam's Club security had determined this offense while the victim was still unaware as to what had happened.

The next day on 11/28/16 Fulton was brought into the security office. She denied stealing the card and said there was little left on it and the customer told her she could use it "for a cup." Security had the transaction on video and had contacted the club member he stated he was unaware of the card switch and desired prosecution.

The police were called and Officer Krumm and Officer Wiegman responded.

Fulton was arrested and taken to the Chesterfield Police Station. After being advised of her rights she agreed to speak and told the officers that the gift card she had used belonged to her mother. The officers showed her the card's ID number that was used for the club member's purchase with Fulton and was the same number that was on the card that Fulton used.

She then confessed and stated that it was the first time she had stolen anything on the job.

OUTCOME: Fulton didn't waste anytime. She hired an attorney and Chesterfield Prosecutor Tim Englemeyer, despite having a confession and a video of the crime, reduced the charge to "Littering." Stealing is a graduated felony, meaning you have to have priors before you can be charged with a Felony. This is typical Chesterfield justice. The City Council and Courts are not interested in justice but producing revenue, and taking care of defense lawyers. Fulton paid a \$300.50 fine plus \$26.50 in court costs for a non-criminal offense. (originally appeared in Ex Alderman Newsletter #305 on 11/27/17.)

On April 8, 2017 Haley Nicole Hollins , 17 of Ferguson was clocked doing 91 MPH on EB I-64 near Highway 141 by Town and Country Police Officer Doll. It was 11:01 PM on a Saturday night. She was pushing a little 2017 Chevy Spark to the limit.

Six days later on April 14 Haley got a moving violation citation from the County Police.

On Wednesday June 28 at 2:02 PM Haley was stopped and cited by the Clayton Police for not wearing her seatbelt. (\$10 fine)

OUTCOME: On June 27, 2017 Haley's downtown lawyer got her moving violation issued by the County Police reduced to a \$100 parking violation.

On August 24, 2017 after moving the 91/60 citation to the St. Louis County Associate Circuit Court she pled guilty to yet another amended charge to Illegal Parking, before Judge Mary Ott. Apparently Town and Country Prosecutor Ed Sluys did not bother to check and see that Hollins had just two months earlier had a moving violation reduced to Illegal Parking or he simply did not care in indentifying a young but bad driver. He reduced the charge to Illegal Parking. Judge Ott, who also did not care, fined Haley Hollins \$150. (Originally appeared in the November 6, 2017 Ex Alderman Newsletter #302)

**DRIVING A MOTOR VEHICLE WHILE LICENSE IS
SUSPENDED
STOPPED FOR SPEEDING**

OUTCOME: On August 2, 2017 Town and Country prosecutor Ed Sluys amended the 12-point Driving While Revoked citation to a No-Point Illegal parking charge. Murillo's lawyer had moved the case to St. Louis County Associate Circuit Court. Judge Ott fined Murillo \$150 for the amended Illegal Parking charge. He pled guilty to the Speeding charge and was fined \$225 which should have carried 2 points.

A week before his appearance on the two Town and Country citations he was cited again in Town and Country on August 17, 2017 for speeding 89 MPH in a 60 Zone on I-64 at Hwy 141.

The day before his court appearance on these two citations he was cited by the Bridgeton PD for speeding. On April 13, 2018 Murillo was arrested by the Highway Patrol for Driving with a Revoked License and No Insurance. (Orig appeared in Ex-Alderman Newsletter #302 on November 7, 2017)

DRUNK DRIVER WHO WAS GOING WRONG WAY ON MANCHESTER, THEN WEAVING ON I-270, THEN ALMOST CRASHING AND SPEEDING ON I-64, REFUSED TO TAKE A BREATH TEST GETS NO POINTS IN SWEETHEART DEAL.

IN TOWN AND COUNTRY. What makes this case even worse is that two months after the Town and Country DWI case the same guy is arrested for DWI and Leaving the Scene of an Accident in Frontenac.

At about 12:06 AM on March 20, 2014 (Wed night into Thursday morning) Town and Country Police Officer Fowle was notified by a motorist that the driver of a white 2001 Infinity had been driving on the wrong side of Manchester Road before entering NB I-270. Officer Fowle found the car NB on I-270. It was weaving lane to lane. As he followed the car it began to exit onto WB I-64 and nearly struck another car and then sped up and was clocked doing 77 MPH in the 60 mph zone.

Officer Fowle stopped the driver, Alexander Birgenheier, of unincorporated St. Louis County near Maryland Heights, on WB I-64 west of I-270.

Officer Fowle immediately noticed that Birgenheier was drunk. His breath reeked of booze, his eyes were glassy and bloodshot, his speech was confused, slurred, loud and profane and his balance was unsure.

This is from the police report:


Birgenheier took a field breath test that showed his BAC level well above the legal limit. He was arrested for DWI and **then things took a turn to the very strange.**

Birgenheier was handcuffed and put in the back of the police car with a cage separating the front seat and the prisoner area. Despite being handcuffed behind his back, Birgenheier managed to unbuckle his seat belt and began loudly complaining to Officer Fowle how he was going to sue him for not having him seatbelted in. Officer Fowle stopped the police car and again fastened the seatbelt. Birgenheier then undid the seatbelt again and this time began hitting his head against the cage in the car.

All of this was captured on the in-car video recorder.

This is from Officer Fowle's police report.

While transporting Birgenheier to the Town & Country Police Station, he removed his seatbelt and stated he was going to sue me for not properly securing his seatbelt in the police car. I stopped the police car and again fastened his seatbelt. As soon as I had latched the seatbelt, Birgenheier again removed it and began to complain that he was not seatbelted. While traveling southbound Mason Road over I-64, Birgenheier deliberately struck his head on the cage of the patrol car to cause a self inflicted injury. Birgenheier began to complain that he was injured in the police car due to not being properly secured in a seatbelt. The video from the in-car camera is also equipped with a camera view of the back passenger seat. When the video is switched to the backseat camera, it is clearly visible that Birgenheier was properly latched in his seatbelt prior to transport. Birgenheier can also be seen unfastening the seatbelt 2 times. Birgenheier can be seen on the video as he purposely strikes his head on the cage of the patrol car.

At the station Birgenheier refused to take the official breath test. A refusal report was sent to the Department of Revenue Drivers' License Section.


Birgenheier was issued citations for DWI, Failure to Signal a Lane Change, Speeding 77/60.

Two months later on May 20, 2014 Birgenheier was arrested by the Frontenac Police for DWI and Leaving the Scene of an Accident that happened on the I-64 exit to Spodee Road . After fleeing the scene Birgenheier's vehicle became disabled on Clayton Road at Clayton Downs at about 12:18 AM. He also refused to take a breath test in connection with the Frontenac arrest. 20 hours later at 10:39 PM he was arrested in Ballwin on Clayworth Drive for a criminal ordinance violation.

Frontenac Case: It was a leaving the scene of an accident call. When the police found him with part of a highway exit sign was sticking out of the back of his car. When the police arrived on Clayton Road west of Spoede Road they found Birgenheier behind the wheel with a metal street sign pole sticking out of the left side rear window.

Birgenheier was so drunk he had to be helped out of the car and needed two officers to help him walk.

An oil trail was left from the point of impact on the exit sign and curb from I-64 to where the Ford Fusion became inoperable. Here is the diagram from the accident report.



The police report by Frontenac Police Officer Nicole Farris was even more graphic as to what had happened.

As we approached westbound Clayton Rd. just west of S. Spoede Rd. we observed a

facing westbound in the center lane of Clayton Rd. There was a male driver in the driver's seat, and what appeared to be a metal pole sticking out of the rear driver's side window. The vehicle appeared to be inoperable. I activated my emergency lights and approached the vehicle. As I approached the vehicle, I observed heavy front end damage. I made contact with the driver,

Alexander J. Birgenheier

I immediately noticed that Birgenheier was sweating profusely. Birgenheier's eyes were bloodshot, staring, reacted slowly to my flashlight, and were watery. I smelt a faint odor of an alcoholic beverage on his breath. I asked him if he had been involved in a vehicle accident, and he stated "no". Upon closer inspection of the vehicle, I saw that the metal pole in his backseat was attached to a street sign. I asked him about the street sign and pole and he turned around, looked at it, and stated that it was "just a landmark". I asked him to exit the vehicle and submit to a series of field sobriety tests.

P.O. Koch and I had to assist Birgenheier in exiting his vehicle. Birgenheier had a very difficult time standing and walking. He was unable to take a single step without our assistance, and was unable to maintain his balance long enough to perform either the Walk and Turn Test or the One Leg Stand. I explained and performed the Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus on Birgenheier, however, P.O. Koch had to assist him in maintaining his balance as he leaned against the patrol car. See page 1 of AIR 2389 for further results.

I also asked Birgenheier to submit to a Preliminary Breath test to which he refused.

Cpl. Scronce responded to the eastbound I-64 exit ramp at S. Outer Forty and observed that a street sign and its pole had been broken off at the base of the concrete median in which it was affixed. In this same location, Cpl. Scronce observed dark fluid on the street, that appeared to be motor oil and a large black piece of plastic, possibly from the undercarriage of a vehicle. The oil marks continued west on S. Outer Forty for about 50 feet, and then changed to an eastward direction all the way to S. Spoede Rd.

OUTCOME: On September 21, 2017 Birgenheier appeared before Town and Country Judge Niehoff and pled guilty to DWI and guilty to Speeding, plus an amended charge of Improper Lane Use that was reduced to Illegal parking. He was fined \$225 for speeding. The Lane Usage and failure to signal reduced to Illegal Parking had a \$225 fine. The DWI charge resulted in a No-Points, No-Fine SIS probation term.

What is unusual about this is that Judge Niehoff is also the Frontenac judge. On September 5, 2017 or 16 days earlier Birgenheier pled guilty in front Niehoff to DWI and Leaving the Scene of an Accident. In that case she placed Birgenheier on a SES probation for DWI with a \$689 fine and full points. However the Leaving the Scene charge was a SIS probation term with No-Fine and No-Fine. Another moving violation associated with the case was reduced to Illegal parking with a \$225 fine.

The Ballwin case was reduced to a non-criminal "Littering" violation with a \$275 fine.

WHY DOES THIS GUY DESERVE ANY BREAKS? I found it amazing that 16 days before accepting the Town and Country plea Niehoff had already sentenced Birgenheier

to a SES Probation with full fine and points. Why didn't she ask for the facts in the case before sentencing him in Town and Country? Why didn't city prosecutor Ed Sluys insist on giving the judge the facts in the case after the guilty plea? How does a person who is clearly drunk, attack the officer with profanity, keeps unbuckling his seatbelt and intentionally hits his head on the police car's prisoner cage, threatens to sue the officer and then refuses to take a breath test, deserve any kind of a break?

THE BREATH TEST REFUSALS: Birgenheier contested both breath test refusals for over three years. Finally in June of 2017 a DOR hearing officer found against him and revoked his drivers' license for each refusal. (Originally appeared in Ex Alderman Newsletter #303 on November 13, 2017)

ANOTHER DRUNK DRIVER COURTESY OF HARPO'S: On May 13, 2017 at about 12:47 AM (Friday night into Saturday morning) Town and Country Officer Yaakub was on EB I-64 from Highway 141 and noticed the car in front of him speeding. He clocked the car at 81 MPH in the 60 MPH zone. He tried to stop the Nissan Altima, but the driver did not pull over until they were on a curve on the exit ramp to SB I-270.

He contacted the driver, Anthony Fairman, 25, who lived on West Pine in midtown St. Louis despite having an Illinois drivers' license.

Officer Yaakub found Fairman to be drunk. Fairman would later agree. He had a strong smell of booze on his breath, his eyes were glassy, he staggered when trying to walk and his speech was slurred and he mumbled.

After failing some field sobriety tests and a field breath test he was arrested for Speeding and DWI.

He said he was going home from his job at Monsanto in Chesterfield. When asked when he got off he said at 10 o'clock. It was pointed out that is was 2 hours and 45 minutes after 10 o'clock and Fairman then added he had been at Harpo's in Chesterfield, a bar with the more well known location in Columbia, Missouri. Fairchild admitted having three beers at Harpo's.

In our random check of police reports we have found that Harpo's is the only place in Chesterfield with a liquor license that regularly produces drunk drivers, drunken fights inside and outside of the bar, underage drinkers and drunk drivers crashing cars on the parking lot. The Chesterfield Police have never seemed to increase patrols and "bar checks" at Harpo's despite the evidence of over serving customers.



Fairman

Fairchild was arrested and taken to the police station where he agreed to take a breath test. The results of the breath test showed that Fairman was just over the limit at 0.088%. He was issued summons for Speeding and DWI.

OUTCOME: On September 21, 2017 Fairman pled guilty to DWI and was placed on a 2-year SIS NO-Fine, NO-Points probation sentence. He also pled guilty to speeding and was fined \$350. (Orig appeared in Newsletter #328 on May 6, 2018)

OFFICER WITH AN EXPIRED LICENSE TO OPERATE BREATH TEST

INSTRUMENT CAUSED DWI TO BE REDUCED TO CARELESS DRIVING: On Thursday December 29, 2016 at about 10:50pm Sgt. Weiss of the Chesterfield Police Department stopped a white 2011 Ford after he observed the driver speeding 80 MPH in a 60 MPH zone and weaving on EB I-64 before Timberlake Parkway. It appeared as if the driver, Joseph Dressel, 43 had been drinking.

Sgt. Weiss called Officer Lucchesi to the scene to unload the arrest and reporting off on him. (Honestly in the years I was a police sergeant and captain if I stopped a drunk driver, I never forced another officer to write the report. But apparently that is very common now, at least in Town and Country and Chesterfield.)

Dressel failed a number of field sobriety tests and failed a Field Breath Test. He was arrested and taken to the police station.

Officer Howes came to the police station to operate the Intoximeter Instrument. Dressel's BAC level was 0.090. 0.8 is legally intoxicated in Missouri. A DWI citation was issued along with a speeding citation plus a citation for a marijuana smoking pipe found in the van.

However, before Dressel was released Officer Howes noticed that his license to operate the Intoximeter instrument had expired 04/16/16 or 8 ½-months earlier.

Another Officer was called into the station to give another test. An hour after the first test, Dressel's BAC level was dropping. The second test showed his BAC level to 0.064, which is under the legal limit.

Dressel still left the station with a DWI citation. You can make a DWI case on visual observations. This is done all the time when drunk drivers refuse to take a breath test. However, since the first test at the station didn't count, I don't really know how Dressel got stuck with a DWI charge when the second test showed he was under the limit.



OUTCOME: The DWI charge was amended to Careless and Impudent Driving by Chesterfield Prosecutor Tim Engelmeyer. To make a C&I charge you need two elements. They had them in this case. Dressel was speeding and lane weaving. He was fined \$198.50 plus \$26.50 in court costs.

However, the speeding charge should be dismissed since it was used to make the C&I charge. It wasn't. Engelmeyer was now raising revenue for the City of Chesterfield. He amended the Speeding citation to Illegal Parking. Dressler pled guilty and was fined \$198.50 plus \$26.50 in court costs. Dressel was charged twice for the same offense. Chesterfield picked his pocket for a total \$225.


The marijuana pipe charge was amended to littering and it was another \$225 fine and costs.

SCRUBS STOLEN BY SOMEONE WEARING SCRUBS: The Uniform Store AKA the Uniform Outlet at the Taubman Outlet Mall was visited by Sheila Massie, 36 of Wentzville, MO on Tuesday December 27, 2016 around 6pm. Massie who works in the health care field arrived carrying a large empty handbag. She was wearing some dark blue medial scrubs.

She went about the store thinking she was not being watched and was shoving scrubs in the empty purse and up the sleeve of a coat she was wearing.

She thought wrong about not being watched and the store manager called the Chesterfield Police. As luck would have it, two officers from the retail patrol unit were in the area of the Taubman Outlet Mall. After getting the call and the description of Massie, they saw her leaving the mall in the area of the Uniform Store. They stopped her and had an interesting conversation. This is from the police report:

On 12/27/16 while patrolling the Taubman Outlet Mall, I received a radic call indicating that a female was actively stealing at the Uniform Store The call notes stated that the female was described as a white female wearing scrubs and had stuffed items into her purse.

Myself and Officer Tyndell observed this female exiting the mall near the Uniform Store and made contact with her on the sidewalk. I informed the female that I was investigating a theft involving her. The female began to get very nervous and said ok. I asked what was inside her purse, and she said stolen stuff. I removed the purse and Officer Tyndell placed her under arrest.

A search of her purse revealed 7 scrub style clothing items and I also found another scrub rolled up into a the sleeve of her jacket. The female was identified as Sheila Massie and she was placed in the rear seat of vehicle 26.

It should be noted that the purse had been completely emptied, indicating that it was brought into the store for the only purpose to conceal items.

A total of 8 items were recovered with a total value of \$200.92. These items were photographed and returned to the store.

Massie was charged with Stealing and Possession of a Theft Device.

OUTCOME: On July 20, 2017 Massie pled guilty to stealing and was rewarded with a SIS No-Record, No-Fine probation term, but must attend a Theft Offenders Program. The Possession of a Theft Device charge was amended to "Littering" and she was fined \$150.50 plus \$26.50 in court costs. (Orig appeared in Ex Alderman Newsletter 307 on 12/11/17.)

DRUG ADDICT WITH TWO SMALL CHILDREN IS STOPPED AFTER DRIVING ON SHOULDER OF INTERSTATE HIGHWAY. Dawn Kruse was a troubled sole. She was a long time drug addict with addictions to heroin and other drugs. On August 1,

2014 at 8:20 in the evening she was driving a 1999 gold Buick west on I-64 east of Ballas Road.

In the car with her were her son age 3 and her daughter age 1.

Cpl. Berry of the Town and Country Police observed that she had driven off the highway and was driving on the shoulder. She then exited onto NB I-270. Cpl Berry tried to stop Massie using the police car's red and blue lights and a siren. She did not pull over, but continued north on I-270, then exited at Ladue Road and finally stopped at Ladue Road and Emerson Road in Creve Coeur.

The following is from the police report:

Kruse exited the vehicle with her hands up. I explained to Kruse the reasons for the traffic stop. I immediately noticed Kruse's speech was slurred and her eyes glassy. Kruse's pupils were very constricted. Kruse was mumbling and seemed confused at times.

I asked Kruse if she took any medication. Kruse stated she took Methadone for a prior Heroin addiction and several other drugs for her mental condition. Kruse also stated she had smoked some marijuana earlier that day and took one xanax pill.

Kruse stated she was returning from St. Louis City and thought she was traveling on Interstate 170 going to House Springs. It should be noted Interstate 170 does not go to House Springs.

After she completed the Field Sobriety Tests, I observed needle track marks on both of Kruse's forearms. Kruse stated she had a Heroin relapse two weeks ago.

Based on my observations of Kruse's driving, her physical condition, and the results of the field sobriety tests, I placed her under arrest for Driving While Intoxicated-Drugs. The result of the PBT field sobriety test revealed a that Kruse did not have any alcohol in her system (.000 BAC)

Kruse's husband Joseph House was called and he responded from House Springs to pick up the children.

Kruse agreed to give blood for a drug test. First she was taken to Mercy Hospital, but the wait was too long for a blood draw, so she was taken to Missouri Baptist Medical Center.

After the blood draw she was taken to the Town and Country Police Station for booking. During booking she complained of severe chest pains. An ambulance was called and she was taken back to Mercy Hospital.



OUTCOME: On August 29, 2017 Kruse pled guilty to Felony DWI-D (she had prior DWI-D convictions) and a misdemeanor Driving While Revoked.

She was sentenced to 4-years in prison for the DWI-D but was immediately placed on 5-years probation. However on October 20, 2017 a probation violation notice was filed against Kruse. The hearing is set for June 15, 2018.

On the Driving While Revoked charge she was sentenced to 30 days in the County jail and was given credit for time served.

The other traffic charges and the municipal court charges of endangering the welfare of her two children were filed in Town and Country Municipal Court. Kruse has failed to appear and there are bench warrants for the charges.

BALLWIN MAN TESTS DRUNK ON THE STREET. REFUSS BREATH TEST AT STATION AND HAS CHARGES DROPPED TO CARELESS DRIVING. On Saturday night into Sunday morning February 21, 2016 a concerned motorist called 9-1-1 to

report a white Chevy Tahoe weaving from lane to lane while being driven westbound on I-64.

Town and Country Police Officer McPherson spotted the White Tahoe after it exited from I-64 onto SB Highway 141. He followed it and observed it weave completely from one lane to another and then decided to stop it.

Officer McPherson stopped the Tahoe and contacted the driver, Travis Buckner, 32, of Ballwin. Buckner appeared to be drunk. His breath had the strong smell of booze, screwed up looking eyes and he staggered when he tried to walk. Buckner failed several field sobriety tests and test intoxicated on a field breath testing instrument.

He was arrested and taken to the police station. There he denied having anything to drink and refused to take a breath test.

Officer McPherson's police report did not provide many details about Buckner's condition or any other more detailed observations. If you look at Buckner's mug shot he sure looks drunk.

OUTCOME: Since many DWI arrests end with No-Point, No-Record and No-Fine probation terms I guess this one is better than some. The DWI charge was amended to Careless and Impudent Driving so Bucker does not have a first DWI as part of a graduated 2-prior DWI convictions make a third DWI arrest a felony. The Improper Lane Use citation was dismissed entirely by Town and Country Prosecutor Ed Sluys.

On September 19, 2017 Associated Circuit Court Judge Mary Ott fined Buckner \$225 for C&I Driving. Since Sluys did not obtain a even a DWI probation conviction the

Missouri Department of Revenue License Unit dropped the suspension of Buckner's driver's license for his failure to take a breath test. (Orig appeared in May 27, 2018 Newsletter #331)

DRUNK WEBSTER GROVES WOMAN REFUSES TO TAKE BREATH TEST AND GETS PROBATION: Town and Country Officer McNutt was westbound on I-64 on Friday night into Saturday morning September 5, 2015 when he observed the driver of a 2011 Buick Regal pass a vehicle on the right while speeding. He got behind the Buick and clocked it doing 80 MPH in the 60 MPH zone at Mason Road. The driver of the Buick did not use turn signals when making the illegal pass.

Officer McNutt turned on the red/blue lights of the police car and stopped it after the driver exited onto the North Forty Outer Road.

He contacted the driver, Kinsey Decker, 33, of 430 W. Lockwood in Webster Groves.

He could quickly tell that Decker was drunk. Her breath had a heavy smell of booze, her eyes were bloodshot, her speech slurred and staggered when trying to walk.

Officer McNutt asked her to recite the alphabet starting with the letter “J” and ending with the letter “W”. She stated, J,P,K...H...S, L...o.” he then asked her to recite the alphabet from A-to-Z. She said, “A...D.” and quit.

Officer McNutt asked her to count backwards from 57 to 42. She replied, “57...41, 50, 51.”

She failed several other sobriety tests and then refused to take a field breath test. She was arrested and transported to the police station.

There she refused to take the official breath test to determine BAC level but agreed to be interviewed. She stated that she had been at Hot Shots with friends, had four beers and admitted that she considered herself under the influence.

She was cited for DWI, Speeding and Illegal Passing.

OUTCOME: Decker’s attorney transferred the case to the Associate Circuit Court in Clayton before Judge Mary Ott. It was still prosecuted by Town and Country Prosecutor Ed Sluys. On August 2, 2017 the Illegal Passing was dismissed. Decker pled guilty to DWI and was placed on a No-Record, No-Points, No-Fine probation term. She also pled guilty to the speeding charge and was fined \$473.

DRUNK AND DRUGED DRIVER WITH PRIOR DWI CONVICTIONS LEAVES SCENE OF ACCIDENT. A drunk driver is sentenced to 4-years in prison, but is placed on probation after serving 120 days in jail.

On Saturday February 25, 2017 at 10:19pm Charles John Ross was involved in an accident and fled the scene. There was a witness who was not going to let him get away with it.

Charles John Ross, 23, of O'Fallon, Missouri was driving a 2003 GMC Sierra, when Ross drove off of Clayton Road at Mason Ridge Road into a ditch, knocked over a street sign and then kept going at a high rate of speed.

A motorist was behind Ross and witnessed the accident and called 9-1-1 reporting the accident and saying they were following the GMC.

Town and Country Officer Pflueger was in Patrol Car 4 at Clayton Road and Claymark waiting for the GMC. When it passed Officer Pflueger observed there was right side damage to the SUV and that the right front headlight was broken out. Officer Pflueger followed the GMC and observed the driver drift completely out of the east bound lane. He stopped the vehicle and driver on Clayton Road at Country Life Acres. There he contacted Ross, whose eyes were glassy, constricted and bloodshot, his speech was slurred and confused. He also reported that Ross stumbled as he walked, but did not have a smell of booze on his breath.


The GMC had expired license plates and Ross could not show proof of insurance.

The right front passenger window was shattered with glass all over the passenger compartment of the truck. When asked what had happened Ross said, "I must have hit something."

The people who called in Ross' inability to drive to 9-1-1 stopped where the police had Ross pulled over. This is from the police report:

It should be noted that witnesses ██████ Fassino and ██████ Tosic pulled over near the traffic stop and stated they were the ones that called 9-1-1 about the truck. They stated they observed the truck traveling east on Clayton Road approaching Woods Mill Road. They noticed that the truck was weaving over both sides of its lane and almost striking other vehicles. Fassino stated she honked her horn to alert other motorists in the area of the truck. The two continued to follow the vehicle until they observed it leave the roadway to the south side of Clayton Road at Mason Ridge Road. They both saw the vehicle strike the road sign that marked the street names at that intersection. Tosic used her cell phone to call police as the vehicle left the scene of the crash and continued east on Clayton Road. They continued to observe the vehicle and its driver until it was stopped by police on east Clayton Road at Country Life Acres.

Police found needle track marks on Ross' arm. A field breath test showed no evidence of alcohol in Ross' system.

He was arrested and taken to the police station. Officer Pflueger apparently was unaware of Ross' prior DWI arrests and convictions. He did not obtain a search warrant by phone for a blood draw at Mercy hospital and released Ross on citations for DWID, Leaving the Scene of an Accident, Improper Lane Use, No Proof of Insurance and Expired License plates.

After Ross' release on citations he updated his report apparently finding the rest of Ross' record stating the he would apply for warrant for Felony DWID. Ross had two prior DWI convictions in St. Charles County.



On 05/15/2018 a probation violation was filed against Ross in this case.





PAIR STEALING AT VICTORIA'S SECRET ARRESTED WITH ONE SUSPECT USING HER SISTER'S NAME. NOTHING LIKE STRONG FAMILY TIES! At 7:32PM on June 20, 2016, a Monday evening, Chesterfield Police Officer Pollman was dispatched to the Chesterfield Mall concerning three possible suspects who had been stealing at the Victoria's Secret store.

The suspects were located and detained. It was determined that one of three females had not been in the store, but the other two had. The first one was identified as

The second person gave a false name, the name of her sister. But she had prior arrests and after being booked at the police station a fingerprint check revealed her to be:

Markita SIMMONS, 25

The pair had handbags lined with tin foil to keep sensor alarms from sounding. They had between them \$332 in underwear from Victoria's Secret.

Let's break this down per each individual. Clemont does not have much of a police record. She was cited for ordinance violations of Stealing and Possession of a Theft Device.

She hired a lawyer and he moved the case from Chesterfield MUNI Court to the Associate Circuit Court, but fear not, Chesterfield's useless prosecutor Tim Engelmeyer would still prosecute the case.

On 10/26/17 Engelmeyer reduced the Stealing charge to trespassing and the Theft Device to Littering. Clemont was fined \$227 on each charge by Judge Mary Ott.

ENGELMEYER ALLOWS CRIME TO CONTINUE: Tim Engelmeyer and the Chesterfield Police Department could team together and set of standard that would keep some shoplifters out of Chesterfield. NO BREAKS IF THEY HAVE A THEFT DEVICE. Those cases should not be amended to help out a local defense attorney. If thieves who prepare in advance to come out to steal in Chesterfield with foil lined bags and small metal cutters should get maximum fines and even one-week jail sentences. Use it as a deterrent to keep repeat retail thieves out of town. I mean come on, you have the foil lined handbag and the metal cutters as evidence. In most cases you have the theft on video. But this is not enough for the prosecutor who hates to actually do trials.

But with Engelmeyer that is not likely to ever happen. So far only Ben Keathley, Tom DeCampi and Michelle Ohley have had the good sense to try and remove Engelmeyer.

Bob Nation has appointed the guy twice and listened to his lies and illogical excuses for not doing his job. Barry Flachsbart and Randy Logan have repeatedly voted to keep him employed. It appears as if these people need to be removed to get Engelmeyer gone. (Logan was removed by voters in April of 2018.

CLEMONT STRIKES AGAIN: Between her arrest in Chesterfield in 2016 and her plea to amended charges by city prosecutor Tim Engelmeyer, Clemont was arrested in Des Peres for stealing at the West County Mall.

On July 5, 2017 she was arrested in the West County Mall have stolen items valued at more than \$1,000. In her possession was another handbag lined with tin foil. With her was Markita Simmons.

This arrest was a public record when Tim Engelmeyer amended the Stealing charges and Theft Device charge against her in October of 2017. She has a felony charge of Stealing-Receiving Stolen Property pending against her.
