

DRUNKS AND THIEVES 2021 PART 4

54-YEAR-OLD WOMAN WITH WELL KNOWN LOCAL NAME CAUGHT STEALING HUNDREDS OF DOLLARS OF ITEMS FROM TARGET STORES BECAUSE SHE DIDN'T WANT TO ASK HER HUSBAND FOR MONEY:

Target store security on Friday February 15, 2019 observed a middle aged female shoplifter attempt to remove the security spider webbing from an Owlet Baby Monitor. She was unsuccessful and left the store.

Security officers saw her return to the store on Monday February 18, 2019 at about 2 o'clock. She returned to the baby monitor and successfully removed the security spider web wrapping and then went on a shoplifting spree besides taking the \$300 baby monitor, she grabbed a door wreath several pillows and even \$3.00 worth of M&Ms.

She placed all the goods in plastic Target shopping bags she had brought with her. Upon leaving the store without paying she was stopped by store security and voluntarily went with them to the loss prevention office.

There she was identified as Karen DOORACK, a familiar name associated with a brick business on Old Chesterfield Road and Baxter Road, which is now an empty lot.

When Chesterfield Police officers arrived Mrs. Doorack stated that just prior to coming to the Chesterfield Target Store she was at the Wentzville Target store shoplifting. She gave the officer permission to recover the stolen items in her GMC Yukon. Officer went to the vehicle and recovered \$454.88 of stolen items from the Wentzville Target to go with the \$390.44 worth of items she attempted to steal from the Chesterfield store.

Doorack agreed to be interviewed by officers and waived her rights per the Miranda Ruling. When asked why she was stealing she gave an interesting answer. This is from the police report:

I asked why she was stealing, and she explained she didn't want to keep asking her husband for money to buy things.

Doorack lives on Wydown Blvd. with her husband in a part of Clayton where everyone has money except possibly some of the Washington University students in dorms on Big Bend at Wydown.

We could find no other records of Karen Doorack being arrested or receiving a traffic ticket.

OUTCOME: On 08/21/19 Doorack pled guilty to an amended charge of a Health Code Violation and was fined \$300. You wouldn't expect a rich person who had stolen \$844 worth of merchandise to actually pled guilty to "stealing" in the Chesterfield Municipal Court. Poor people and drug addicts who can't afford lawyers are about the only ones actually convicted of stealing in Chesterfield.

DRUNK 16-YEAR-OLD RUNS STOP SIGN AT 12:57 AM. REFUSES BREATH TEST. 16-year-old Jacob Lemley from Webster Groves was drunk and driving his 2003 Toyota Corolla with two passengers in the car. It was a Sunday night into Monday morning at 12:57 when Lemley ran a stop sign in front of Town and Country Police Sgt, Chris Moore at North Forty Outer Road and Mason Road.

Sgt. Moore quickly determined that the driver Jacob Lemley has been drinking. As police sergeants are wanting to do, Sgt. Moore called for Officer Dustin Braynard to respond and handle the arrest and report. Braynard, an 11-year veteran of the Missouri Highway Patrol had no problem.

Lemley also refused to answer repeated question if he would take field sobriety tests. This is not a big surprise as Lemley's father is an attorney.


shoulder. While standing on the shoulder speaking to Juvenile #1, I could smell a moderate associated with the consumption of an alcoholic beverage emanating from his person. I also observed Juvenile #1's eyes appeared watery and had a glassy appearance. I asked Juvenile #1 multiple times if he would submit to a series of field sobriety tests, Juvenile #1 would not give and answer. Juvenile #1 would only ask a counter question, to make a phone call, but would not give an answer to my question regarding field sobriety.

Lemley refused to give a field Breath test. He was arrested for DWI and Disobeying a Stop Sign. At the police station he had the Missouri Implied Consent Law explained to him and asked if he would take the “official” breath test. He asked to call a lawyer. We are guessing at 2AM it might have been his father. After the phone call he refused to take the breath test.

Lemley was treated as an adult on the traffic charges per Missouri Law and appeared in Town and Country Municipal Court. This made his arrest report an open public record.

OUTCOME: On 11/13/2020 Lemley appeared with a lawyer in Town and Country Municipal Court and pled guilty to DWI. He was placed on a 2-year SIS “No Permanent Record, No Points and No Fine” probation term by Judge Andrea Niehoff. He also pled guilty to the 1-point Disobeying a Stop Sign charge and was fined \$191.

LANE WEAVER CLAIMS JUST TWO DRINKS, BUT HER BLOOD ALOCHOL RATE KEPT GOING UP AFTER ARREST: Officer (Now Cpl) Steve Doll noticed while driving north on I-270 on Wednesday May 13, 2020 at 1:30 in the morning the Chevrolet Cruze in front of him slightly weaving across the lane dividers. He really took notice when the driver apparently almost drove past the exit to WB I-64 exit and suddenly at the last minute whipped the car to the right.

Doll decided to follow the car. He observed the driver weave the car both into adjoining left lane and the right-side lane. Officer Doll stopped the car at about I-64 and Mason Road and contacted the driver Melanie M. McGee, 41, of St. Peters, Mo.

He found that McGee appeared to be intoxicated despite her claim of just two drinks. She said she had a shot of "Fireball" and a Jack Daniels and Coke while at the bar Hotshots with a friend. She said she was weaving because she was on the phone (at 1:30am).

McGee failed several field sobriety tests. She agreed to take a field breath test. That showed her BAC level to be .154%, almost twice the legal limit.

Officer Doll noticed an almost empty bottle of Fireball Whiskey behind the driver's seat.

"Hotshots." It should be noted, while speaking with McGee, I observed an almost empty 375 ml. bottle of fireball whiskey directly behind the driver's seat.

McGee was arrested for Lane Weaving and DWI.

At the police station she agreed to take an official breath test. The results of that test showed her BAC level was going UP not down, indicating she was just recently drinking.

She agreed to be interviewed and stuck to the story of just “two drinks” but admitted she thought she was intoxicated.

OUTCOME: McGee has no record of traffic tickets let alone prior DWI arrests. On 12/17/20 she pled guilty to both charges. She was fined \$191 for the Lane Weaving. For DWI she was placed on a 2-year SIS "No Fine, No Points, No Permanent Record" probation.

DRUNK DRIVER'S EXCUSE FOR WEAVING, "I WAS READING A TEXT." WHAT'S WORSE DRUNK DRIVING OR READING TEXTS WHILE DRIVING? Town and Country Officer Dustin York was exiting WB I-64 to Hwy 141 at 10:36 on Saturday night January 4, 2020. In front of York was a Mazda Van. York noticed the van was weaving. The driver exited onto SB Hwy 141.

He continued to weave slightly onto the shoulder and into an empty adjoining lane. The driver exited onto Woods Mill when Officer York decided it was time to pull over the van. The van had turned right onto WB Clayton Road when York put the lights on it. The driver turned into the Lamp and Lantern Village Shopping Center.

Officer York told the driver, Richard Phung, 56, of Ballwin, several times why he was being stopped before he got it. This is from the police report:


The driver could not understand the violation and it me took several explanations. Finally, the driver stated he was reading a text message.

Phung failed several field sobriety tests and said he could not do a walk and turn due to a bad knee. Phung admitted having 3 beers. Officer York did not have a PBT Field Breath Test instrument, but felt he had enough evidence to arrest Phung for DWI. He was right.

At the police station Phung refused to be interviewed but agreed to take a breath test. The results showed he was drunk.

OUTCOME: Phung had no prior traffic convictions or DWI arrests. On 12/28/20 Town and Country Prosecutor Keith Cheung reduced the Improper Lane Use-Weaving charge to a non-moving parking violation. Phung pled guilty to something he did not do and was fined \$191. He pled guilty to the DWI and Judge Andrea Niehoff placed him on a 2-year SIS “No Fine, No-Points, No Permanent Record” probation term. Phung who was driving drunk at the end of the Christmas-New Year’s holiday week left the courtroom with no points on his record.

KATIE’S PIZZA EMPLOYEES GO FOR DRINKS AFTER WORK WHEN ONE ASSAULTS A CUSTOMER AT THE COUNTRY CLUB: After a busy Saturday night at Katies’ Pizza in Town and Country three of the employees went to the Country Club Bar, in the Lamp and Lantern Village about a block away.

One of the employees was Casey S. Weiss, 30, of Ballwin, who some might say has a temper. He would later tell Town and Country Officers that he suffers from PTSD issues dating back when he was in the service and he sees a Federal Court mandated therapist for anger issues.

At bar closing time 1:23AM on March 15, 2020 Town and Country Police were dispatched to the Country Club Bar parking for an assault that had just occurred. A customer at bar had been assault and thrown to the ground by Casey Weiss. The two other co-workers from Katie’s Pizza were trying to get Weiss off the victim.



Once they got Weiss off the victim, Weiss went to his pickup truck, did some donuts in the parking lot and then drove off screaming “FAGGOT” at the victim.

The victim was treated at the scene by paramedics for cuts and scraps and was not transported to a hospital.

The victim, Michael Smith, said the attack was due to him being Gay.

This is from the police report:

Upon Investigation, Smith explained the bar closed and he was waiting outside when the suspect attacked him out of nowhere. When I asked how he was attacked, Smith said the suspect just started running at him and pushed him down on the sidewalk, outside the front of the bar. I asked what happened after he was pushed down, and Smith said he fell on his hands and knees as the suspect continued to grab at him while two of the suspect's friends began pulling the suspect off.

Smith said once the suspect's friends got the suspect off of him, the suspect got into a silver Chevy truck and began quickly going around in circles in the parking lot. Smith said at this time he went towards the suspect's truck and took a picture of his license plate.

Town and Country Officer Rowland reported that the victim was clearly intoxicated. Witnesses in the bar, including a waitress and bartender confirmed the victim's account and added that Weiss was yelling at the victim at the bar which caused the employees to announce closing a few minutes early.

The case was then handled by detectives, who were able to identify Weiss from the license plate the victim photographed. They obtained a photo of Weiss and put together a mug shot line up. However, the witnesses at the Country Club Bar said they were unable to identify Weiss, because he was wearing a hat in the bar when they were serving him.

Weiss' co-workers from Katie's Pizza were contacted. One said the victim was wearing a suit and talking to Weiss at the bar, but outside was screaming at him, when Weiss attacked him.

Weiss was contacted by detectives and eventually came to the police station and gave a verbal statement. This is from the police report:

Weiss said he served in the U.S. Army and has P.T.S.D./anger issues. Weiss said he sees a court mandated therapist and has been in a downward spiral by self medicating with alcohol and Marijuana. Weiss said he went to the bar with his co-workers from Katie's Pizza. Weiss refused to identify who he was with at the bar (already determined to be Walker and Rains). Weiss said he first saw Smith outside when he was smoking and they said hello to each other. Inside, Smith was talking with their group and Weiss said "He was in my bubble." Weiss said that he did 5 years in

federal prison and keeps personal space between others. Weiss said Smith told him that he was cute enough to work for him and Weiss said "What the Fuck?" Weiss said what "triggered" him was the look Smith gave him after he yelled at him. He denied being "black out" drunk and said he only had a couple beers. Weiss said he went to leave and was in his truck and Smith was "taunting me" and "talking shit". Weiss said he "saw red" and was so angry he ran towards him shoving him to the ground. Smith said he is a bad fighter so he may have tried to punch him but may not have actually hit him. Smith said he doesn't even remember calling him a "Faggot" and was mortified that he said that. Weiss said he felt really bad and wanted to apologize to the victim. Weiss said the Assault was not motivated by Smith being gay but was because Smith was in his personal space.

Weiss was issued a citation charging him with an ordinance violation of Assault and released.

TOWN AND COUNTRY OUTCOME: On October 20, 2020 Weiss pled guilty to Assault before judge Andrea Niehoff. He was given a SIS “No Fine, No Permanent Record” 2-year probation term.

I’m fine with the probation, but I’m not fine with an SIS. The guy is a Federal Ex-Con for a Child Sex violation. It seems like a Suspended Execution of Sentence (SES) where the record is permanent would be more appropriate.

MID-LIFE CRISIS! 47-YEAR-OLD DRUNK DRIVER WITH A HEART CONDITION DRIVING A MUSTANG PASSES A POLICE CAR AT 82 MPH ON I-64. On Saturday August 22, 2020 at 8:45pm Town and Country Police Officer Dustin York was EB on I-64 approaching I-270 when a gray Mustang convertible approached in Lane 2 and passed Officer York’s patrol car at a high rate of speed. Officer York used RADAR and clocked the Mustang doing 82 MPH in a 60 MPH zone.

Officer York caught up to the Mustang as the driver was exiting at Ballas Road. Officer York then used red lights and siren to pull over the car. The driver continued south on Ballas and turned into the entrance of Missouri Baptist/BJC Hospital and stopped.

Upon contacting the driver, Christopher J. Woodworth, 46 of University City, presented a Massachusetts drivers license. York could clearly tell that Woodworth had been drinking. However, Woodworth denied having anything to drink, despite the odor on his breath, bloodshot eyes and slurred speech. This is from Officer York's police report:

Woodworth said he takes heart meds but had not taken any recently. He declined to do walking and one leg stand sobriety tests. He did take a field breath test that showed he was drunk. (2x over the limit)

He was arrested for speeding and DWI. At the police station he agreed to take an official breath test. However, that was delayed as Woodworth threw-up. He declined to have paramedics check him out. There was a wait of 15 more minutes after his mouth was cleaned out.

At 10:05 pm Woodworth took the official Breath Test. It showed his BAC level was dropping since his .17 test an hour and ten minutes earlier. The test results were .117%.

OUTCOME: On 12/15/20 Woodworth pled guilty to Speeding 22 MPH over the limit and was fined \$466. He also pled guilty to DWI and was given a 2-year SIS “No Fine, No Points, No Permanent Record” Probation term.

3 PM AND PASSED OUT BEHIND THE WHEEL AT ONE OF THE BUSIEST PLACES IN CHESTERFIELD...THE PARKING LOT NEXT TO MCDONALDS: On Saturday May 9, 2020 the Chesterfield Police and a Monarch Fire District ambulance crew were dispatched to a passed out man behind the wheel of a running car at 1701 Clarkson Rd, the parking lot next to McDonald's.



Passed out behind the wheel of his 2007 Volkswagen Passat with a plastic cup of Vodka nearby was David Dunavant of nearby Springrun Drive in Chesterfield.

The Volkswagen was parked across three parking spaces. Officers who first contacted 66-year-old Dunavant found him to be drinking from a cup of Vodka, which he poured the vodka onto the parking lot when contacted by officers. Behind the driver's seat on the floor was a large bottle of Smirnoff Vodka (1.75 L).

Dunavant told officers he came "here often to hang out." Dunavant denied that he had drunk all the vodka in the bottle "today." He added that he likes to put his head back if he feels tired and sleep.

Officer Adams conducted field sobriety tests that ended when Dunavant agreed to take a field breath test. The results of the test showed Dunavant to be intoxicated with a BAC level of .128%.

He was arrested and transported to the police station. From the police report, here is what he said on the way to the police station:


During transport Dunavant stated "I had a drink from my cup a few minutes before you gave me test. I would take a sip and fall asleep for maybe for five minutes. Wake back up and drink some more and take a nap." Upon

There he agreed to take an official breath test. That test showed his BAC level to be at .119%.

In an interview at the police station Dunavant stated he started drinking vodka at 10am and stopped at 3pm at McDonalds. He stated he did not consider himself intoxicated.

OUTCOME: This is beyond creepy! A 66-year-old man's favorite place to "hang out" is the parking lot next to McDonalds. It is where, while wearing his undershirt, he drinks vodka from a cup until he passes out (or as he says "falls asleep"). His past record that we could find over 15 years was two speeding tickets and a following too closely violation.

Dunavant was issued three citations, but the Police Records Unit would only provide us with the DWI. A second citation (we are guessing 'Open Container') was amended to a health code violation with a \$355 fine. On July 6, 2020 just two months after being arrested, Dunavant with an attorney pled guilty to the DWI. He was given a SIS (No Permanent Record, No-Fine, No-Point) probation term but does have to attend a substance abuse program and a Victim's Impact Panel. (A guy who likes to go to the

McDonald's sit on the parking lot watching everyone come and go including kids while he gets drunk is clearly no danger to the public in the eyes of Judge Rick "Let'm Loose if they paid a lawyer" Brunk.

A HABITUAL SPEEDER MAKES A COMPOUND MISTAKE...IT IS 14 MPH OVER THE LIMIT WHEN HE IS DRUNK: It was Sunday night November 24, 2019 at 10:09 pm when Chesterfield Officer Devin Kitrel was running radar on Olive Bld. At Hog Hollow Road when he clocked a grey Jeep Grand Cherokee doing 59 MPH in the 45 MPH limit zone on EB Olive Blvd. At least we think it was Sunday November 24.

NARRATIVE

On 11/25/2019 I was running stationary radar on Olive Blvd at Hog Hollow Road. I observed a Gray Jeep traveling East on Olive Blvd, before Hog Hollow Road doing 59MPH in a 45MPH zone. The gray Jeep was later identified as:

Of course mistakes happen and it normally is easy to make a correction. In Chesterfield at least two people review the reports.

Back to the story: So the driver makes a couple turns off of Olive and is stopped on Heatherview Drive. Officer Kitrel immediately noticed that the driver, Aaron Crouse, 32, of St. Louis, had been drinking.


This was from the police report:

I asked him again for his vehicle insurance, at which time he handed me valid insurance. I asked where he was coming from. Aaron said he was coming from a friend's house, where they were watching football. While speaking with Aaron I could detect an odor of an alcoholic beverage(s) coming from the vehicle. I also noticed Aaron to have watery, blood shot eyes. I asked if he had been drinking, at which time he told me he had a couple of "tall boys" about an hour ago.

Sunday night on November 24, 2019 was an upset with the Green Bay Packers losing in San Francisco to the 49ers 37-8.

Crouse refused to take a field breath test. He did some field sobriety tests which he failed and was arrested for DWI and Speeding.

At the station Crouse agreed to take a breath test. The results showed Crouse to be well over the legal limit.



Despite saying he had been watching football at a friend's house and he was confused at the police station. This is from the police report.

Hanging out at my friend, Alex's house watching the Raiders game.

The then Oakland Raiders were in New York playing the Jets at 12 noon CST. The game would have been over by 3:30pm. The Sunday night game was the San Francisco 49ers and the Green Bay Packers.

OUTCOME: On July 1, 2020 Crouse Pled Guilty to speeding and was fined \$191 plus the 2-points on his driving record. The court file did not show a defense attorney, so it was a surprise when Crouse Pled Guilty to DWI he got a SIS (No-Fine, No-Points, No-Permanent Record) 2-year probation term.

BEFORE 10PM ON A SATURDAY NIGHT CHESTERFIELD RESIDENT IS ALREADY MORE THAN TWICE THE LEGAL LIMIT. On Saturday night November 16, 2019 at about 9:56pm Chesterfield Police Officer Brendan Steber (now a Public Safety Police/Firefighter/EMT at Des Peres) was on patrol on EB Olive Blvd. near River Bend when he observed an Audi SUV going westbound at a high rate of speed passing all traffic. Officer Steber turned on the moving RADAR unit in his patrol car and saw that the Audi was doing 58 MPH in the 45 MPH zone.

Officer Steber put on his car's flashing lights, turned around and stopped the Audi.

Steber walked up on the passenger side of the Audi to stay out of the way of passing traffic and contacted the driver, Timothy J. Wilmering, 65, of Ridge Crest Drive in Chesterfield. Wilmering said he was speeding because he was cut off and was trying to pass the car that cut him off.

By this point Officer Steber could tell Wilmering was drunk. This is from his police report.

It should be noted, upon contacting Wilmering at the front passenger window of his vehicle, I detected a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage(s) emitting from the vehicle. I further noticed Wilmering's speech was slurred and his eyes were watery and bloodshot.

At one point, while speaking with me, Wilmering attempted to lower the volume of the music that was playing on his vehicle's audio system, but struggled to do so.

I re-contacted Wilmering and asked if he had recently consumed any alcoholic beverages. Wilmering initially stated he had not consumed any alcoholic beverages, before admitting to having "a beer" upon further discussion.

I asked Wilmering if he was willing to submit to a series of Standardized Field Sobriety Tests (SFSTs). In response, Wilmering said "Oh, really? Come on... I'm a block from home. Yeah, I do have an issue with taking tests."

(The "One-Beer" would change in an interview at the police station.)



Wilmering had some other things to say to Officer Steber. They were captured in the report.

It should be noted, throughout the entirety of the booking process, Wilmering was uncooperative, and verbally aggressive.

Several different times during the booking process, Wilmering stared at me intently and said "I hope you're really proud of what you're doing", "You're ruining my life", and "You're such an uptight asshole".

In addition, on different occasions, Wilmering told me I was "a real cute guy" and a "cool guy", but these remarks did not seem sincere.

OUTCOME: On 03/13/20 Wilmering pled guilty to Speeding and was fined \$184.50. He also Pled Guilty to Drunk Driving. Despite being over 2X the legal limit, Wilmering was placed on a 2-year "No Fine, No-Point, NO Permanent Public Record" SIS Probation. Apparently to Judge Brunk and Prosecutor Tim Engelmeyer motorists that are arrested for DWI and more then twice the legal limit are no real danger to the public as long as they hire a lawyer when they come to court.
