


DRUNKS AND THIEVES 2022 PART 13

DRUNK CHESTERFIELD DRIVER PUTS CAR IN A DITCH, CLAIMS SHE IS NOT INTOXICATED, THEN REFUSED TO TAKE A BREATH TEST.

On Saturday night May 16, 2020 at 11:37pm Town and Country Officer Josh Cook was dispatched to a single vehicle auto crash on the ramp from NB Hwy 141 to the South 40 Outer Road.



On arrival he and Sgt. Freddie Yaakub found a 2009 Nissan Altima in a ditch requiring a tow truck.

The driver of the car was Lindsay K. Rozycki, 35, of Chesterfield. She stated she hit a “patch.” We are not sure what kind of patch it was. It was not ice as the temp was in the upper 60s. Perhaps it was some roadway patch or a large bag of Sour Patch Candy.



Both officers immediately noticed that Rozycki was drunk. Officer Cook’s crash report listed only “alcohol” as the cause of the crash. This is from the DWI report:


She failed all field sobriety tests given. During the Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus test, where she just had to stand still and follow Officer Cooks finger with her eyes, she fell. She lost her balance while performing several other tests.

She refused to take a field breath test, but claimed she only had one glass of wine earlier. This amount increased to 1 ½ glasses later.

Prior to the car being towed out of the ditch Officer Cook found a cooler that contained four cans of very cold beer and a can of cold wine.

Rozycki was arrested for DWI. At the police station she refused to take an “official” breath test.

Rozycki did not have a traffic or criminal record.

OUTCOME: Rozycki's attorney moved the case to the St. Louis County Associate Circuit Court in Clayton. On 09/29/21 she pled guilty to DWI. Judge Amanda McNelley placed her on a 1-year SIS (No-fine, No-Points, No-Permanent Record) Probation term.

BROTHER OF CHESTERFIELD SHOPLIFTER FROM SULLIVAN TURNS AROUND OUTSIDE THE STORE AND THEN RUNS THROUGH WALMART AND OUT BACKDOOR TO AVOID ARREST. IT DIDN'T WORK:

On Sunday May 31, 2020 just before 1 o'clock Michael S. Weber, 33, of Sullivan had just stolen \$182 worth of merchandise all placed in a tote bag and walked out of the Walmart store. He started waving for someone to pick him up.

The ride did not appear, possible because Officer Trevor McBride was nearby in a marked Chesterfield Police Car watching Weber.

McBride had been called direct by Walmart security on the Special Enf Unit cellphone.



As Officer McBride drove toward him, Weber took off eventually running back into the Walmart and then to the back of the store. Officer McBride then drove to the rear of the store where employees by the loading dock told him Weber had climbed a pile of pallets falling off over a fence.

Officer McBride then went on foot as Weber fell from some small trees. Weber then ran toward a ravine that was full of water. He stopped as other officers and McBride closed in.

He was arrested. When it was established that Weber was from Sullivan, MO McBride asked if he was related to William Weber who McBride has arrested twice for shoplifting and currently has to Failure to Appear warrants out for his arrest. Turns out they are brothers.

OUTCOME: Due to manpower shortages thanks due to COVID Weber was not taken to the station, booked, fingerprinted and photographed.

New Judge Mark Gaertner was a lot different that Judge Rick “Let em Loose” Brunk. On August 24, 2021 Michael Weber pled guilty before Judge Gaertner and was sentenced to 10 days in jail. His brother had pled guilty while Judge Brunk allowed PA Tim Engelmeyer to reduced both stealing charges of Weber’s brother, William, to non-criminal Health Code Violations on 02/10/22 just before he was forced to retire.

DRUNK DRIVER REFUSED TO TELL OFFICER WHERE HE WAS COMING FROM, BUT PASSENGERS IN THE CAR DID TELL AND GAVE MORE: On June 13, 2019 a drunk driver made the very stupid mistake at 3:35AM. He passed a police car on EB I-64 doing 103 MPH.

Chesterfield Officer Amanda Carlson contacted the stupid driver, Tyler Baldwin, 23, and immediately noticed that he was very drunk. After getting his drivers’ license Officer

Carlson asked for his proof of Auto Insurance. He said it was on his phone, but after getting his phone Baldwin could not find the insurance information.

Next Officer Carlson asked where he was coming from. Baldwin said he “didn’t want to tell” her that. When she asked him if he had anything to drink, his response quickly changed. “I had a little bit...I mean a lot.” He later said, “I know I’m going to jail.”

Once an assist car arrived Officer Carlson had Baldwin do some field sobriety tests which she stopped fearing Baldwin would fall down.

Baldwin agreed to take a field breath test. The test results showed his BAC was 3-times over the legal limit at .248%.

Officer Carlson described Baldwin as “loopy and irritating at times.”

The male and female passengers gave up where they were. They had been at a bar in Ballpark Village watched the St. Louis Blues in a playoff game.

Baldwin was arrested for Speeding and DWI.

At the police station during booking Sgt. Deckard asked Baldwin where he had been that night. Instead of saying how he would rather not say, he changed it to “I can’t remember.” He also stated that he had been stopped on I-70 which is not close to I-64 or Chesterfield. This is from the police report:

Baldwin also exhibited a variety of emotions. Most of the time he was loopy, but he would get irritated out of nowhere. He also used profanity a lot throughout his time in booking.

He agreed to take an “official Breath Test.” The results showed that Baldwin’s BAC level was going down a bit but he was still very drunk. The test showed a BAC an hour after he was stopped at .232%.

OUTCOME: On 11/16/21, it was 5-months after Judge Rick “Let em Loose if they hired a lawyer” Brunk was off the bench and replaced by Judge Mark Gaertner. Baldwin showed up with a lawyer from Town & Country. He pled guilty to the 103 in a 60 and was fined \$500, meaning the points went on his license.

Baldwin also pled guilty to DWI. He got almost no break on that plea. He was fined \$1,000 and sentenced to 90 days in jail. \$500 of the fine was stayed as was the jail time as Baldwin was placed on a 2-year SES probation term. With SES probations the person gets all the points and can be fined.

DAUGHTER CALLS POLICE WHEN HER INTOXICATED MOTHER GOES TO HER CAR PARKED IN FRONT OF THE HOUSE. On Thursday October 24, 2019 at 4:30pm Jessie Holman called the Chesterfield Police and reported that her mother was intoxicated and had just gone to her car parked in front Holman's house on Meadow Oak Drive and was attempting to drive off.

Officer Brendan Steber (now with the Ladue PD) arrived on the scene and observed Holman standing next to her mother's black Mitsubishi. Mrs. Belinda Andrews was behind the wheel, the car was running and the headlights were on.

As Officer Steber walked toward the vehicle, Andrews suddenly turned the car off and threw the keys into the backseat. She then got out of the car and continued to argue with her daughter.

When Steber, the top DWI officer at the time, contacted Andrews it was clear she was drunk. He asked her how much she had to drink. She said two beers. Stebers said he knew she was lying. She then changed it to three beers, Stebers again said she was lying.

Later she changed the statement about three-beers to three-whiskeys.

Officer Steber attempted to do field sobriety tests but stopped when Andrews was having trouble either doing the test or following the instructions.

Andrews agreed to take a field breath test. The results showed that she was more than double the legal limit at .17% BAC.

Officer Steber asked Andrews if the police had not shown up would she have driven away. She replied that she would.

Andrews was placed under arrest at which time she unleashed a tirade at her daughter. This is from the police report:

- "Do you know how much money this is going to cost me!?"
- "I am never ever going to fucking forgive you!"
- "I am never going to forgive you, never ever!"
- "I am never ever coming back to your house again!"

- "I am never going to be a grandmother to your kids!"

While enroute to the police station, Officer Steber heard a metal-on-metal sound coming from the backseat. Andrews had slipped out of her handcuffs.

Officer Steber pulled over to re-handcuff Andrews when she stated, "What do you want me to do? I had to blow my nose."

At the police station she agreed to take an "official breath test." The results of that test showed Andrews BAC level was now at .156%.

Andrews complained that she was going through a divorce and did not have any place to stay.

After the breath test and while waiting to make bond, Andrews complained of a medical condition. An ambulance from the Monarch Fire Protection responded. Andrews was release for medical reasons and she was transported to a hospital.

Andrews had no other criminal or DWI record.


OUTCOME: On 06/10/21 Andrews pled guilty to DWI. Chesterfield judge Mark Gaertner placed her on a 2-year SIS (No-fine, No-Points, No permanent record) but did require she install an Ignition Interlock device on her car for two years not allowing her to start the car if she had been drinking.

DRUNK DRIVER WIPES OUT SIGNS AND TREES ON WILSON ROAD. NOT HIS FIRST TIME DRIVING DRUNK. It was almost midnight on Wednesday August 22, 2018 when Brock Jonathan Bauza, 27, of Weldon Springs was driving a 2018 Ford Explorer with New York license plates. Bauza was very drunk driving north on Wilson Avenue approaching Wilson Forest Court when he lost control of his SUV and drove off the road.

First he hit a utility pole and guard rail, a road work sign and continued driving off the road hitting and up rooting two smaller trees before coming to a stop after hitting a large tree. This from the police report:

Chesterfield Officers Adams and Don Schlemmer responded to the scene.



The officers found Bausa sitting on a curb. He said he was okay, but he was bleeding from cuts on both ears and his face. It was clear to officers he had not been wearing a seatbelt.

Officer Adams said Bauza stated he was going home from Chesterfield Valley (this would not be the way). He stated he did not know what happened and he did not know if he had a passenger ("I don't think so" was his reply).

He was Bauza's general condition per Officer Adams' report:

There were four or five male standing nearby who stated they came out of a house after hearing the crash.

The officers determined there was no passenger. But Bauza later claimed there was a passenger, but could not point him out and was unable to give a name.

Paramedics from the Monarch FPD transported Bauza to Mercy Hospital for treatments of his cuts. At the hospital he refused to allow a blood draw to determine his BAC level. Officer Adams did not attempt to obtain a warrant for a blood draw.

Bauza also refused to answer any questions.

He was cited for DWI, Failure to Maintain the Highest Degree of Care While O/M/V and No Seatbelt.

OUTCOME: Bauza made a serious mistake. He waited until Judge Rick (Let'm Loose if the hire a Lawyer) Brunk had retired and replaced by Judge Mark Gaertner. He pled guilty to his second DWI was placed on a 2-year SES (full record) probation. He was fined \$1000 (\$500 stayed) and got the points. The Failure to Maintain the Highest Degree of Care was amended to a Health Code Violation with a \$343 fine.

FIRST OFFICER SAW CAR STOPPED AT A FLASHING YELLOW LIGHT. THEN HE WATCHED DRUNK DRIVER TURN RIGHT INTO THE GRASS.

At 1:35am on a Friday night into a Saturday morning on October 27, 2018 Chesterfield Officer Randy McWilliams was on patrol when he observed a 2015 VW Jetta stopped on WB Olive at River Valley Road. As he watched the car stopped at a flashing Yellow Light, the driver suddenly turned right from the right lane into a grassy area off the road.

Officer McWilliams pulled behind the Jetta and contacted the owner/operator Michelle Marie Adams, 54, of St. Louis. He immediately noticed that she was very intoxicated.

Adams at first told him she only had two beers in south St. Louis County. She said she was in currently in St. Louis and not West County.

This is the overall condition Officer McWilliams found Adams in at the time he first contacted her:



Adams failed a number of field sobriety tests almost falling several times.

She was arrested for Improper Lane Use (using the grass off the road as a lane) and DWI.

At the police station she refused to take a breath test, but she agreed to be interviewed.

Instead of having just two beers she now claimed she had 5 beers at the Social House in Westport between 6 and 9 pm. The time of the interview was 2:50AM. Adams admitted that she was intoxicated and should not be driving.

OUTCOME: Adams played the Judge Rick Brunk and Prosecutor Tim Engelmeyer game of NO Justice in Chesterfield as long as you hire a lawyer. Adams hired the local lawyer.

On March 25, 2021 Adams pled guilty to DWI. She refused to take a breath test, drove off the road, did not know where she was, badly failed the field sobriety tests. Judge Rick Brunk placed her on a 2-year SIS "No-Points, No-Fine, No Permanent Public Record" probation.

Next Prosecutor Engelmeyer reduced the 2-point Improper Lane Use citation to a Parking Violation with a \$191 fine.

Adams walked out of the Chesterfield Municipal Court with NO POINTS on her driving record. Of course it is hard just to blame Brunk and Engelmeyer. Mayor Bob Nation keeps reappointing them and the City Council members keep voting to retain them. The only good news is that Brunk reached age 75 and was forced to retire in June of 2021.

CHESTERFIELD POLICE RESPONDED TO NUMEROUS CALLS FROM CITIZENS ABOUT A RECKLESS AND SPEEDING COVETTE. On Friday May 26, 2021 at about 9:25pm the County Police Dispatch Center that handles calls for the Chesterfield Police suddenly got numerous calls of a person driving a blue Corvette in a reckless manner and at a very high speed.

Officers were advised that the driver of the Corvette was speeding and doing donuts in the area of Schoettler Road and I-64.

Chesterfield Officer Matt Niemeier found the Corvette on the shoulder of the EB South Forty Outer Road at Schoettler Road.

As Officer Niemeier pulled behind the Corvette, the driver suddenly pulled out and accelerated at a very high rate of speed. Officer Niemeier turned on his in-car radar and clocked the Corvette at 96 MPH in the 45 mph zone.

Officer Niemeier managed to get the driver to pull over after Timberlake Parkway.

He contacted the driver, Edgar Amezcua, 43, a Chesterfield resident living on Candish Lane. Amezcua clearly had been drinking and also pissed in his pants. Amezcua lied to Officer Niemeier telling him that he does not drink. From the police report, this is the condition Officer Niemeier found Amezcua in:

PASSING A POLICE CAR AT 91 MPH IS A GOOD WAY TO MEET AN OFFICER:

Sgt. Dan Duddleston (then Cpl. Duddleston) of the Town and Country Police Department was working the afternoon shift on Saturday March 3, 2018. At about 8:15pm he was driving west on I-64 between I-270 and Mason Road when he noticed a SUV (Chevy Equinox with Arizona license plates) rapidly overtaking him. The driver also maintained a blank stare as I conversed with her. I asked the driver if she consumed any alcoholic beverages and she stated she did not. The driver's speech was slurred and soft. I asked the driver if she had consumed any prescription medications and she stated she has not. I asked the driver why her eyelids were droopy and she stated she was tired. I observed an infant in the rear center seat. The infant was in a car seat; however, the car seat was not properly secured to the vehicle.

Smith failed some field sobriety tests. She was arrested for Driving While Intoxicated/Drugs, Speeding, Fail to Properly Secure Child, and Poss of Marijuana.

The child was turned over to its' father.

Also found in the car were two almost empty bottle of hi-test cough medicine. Smith claimed those belonged to someone else. Her Arizona driver's license showed an address in Yuma.

Smith refused to give a blood sample to test for drugs.
