## RESOLUTIONS PASSED TO APPLY FOR GRANT MONEY FOR SIDEWALK AND ROAD PROJECTS:

Bopp Road: The Board voted 8-0 to apply for a Block Grant to repave Topping Road. The total amount for the project would be \$2,324,685 with the city paying \$813,640.



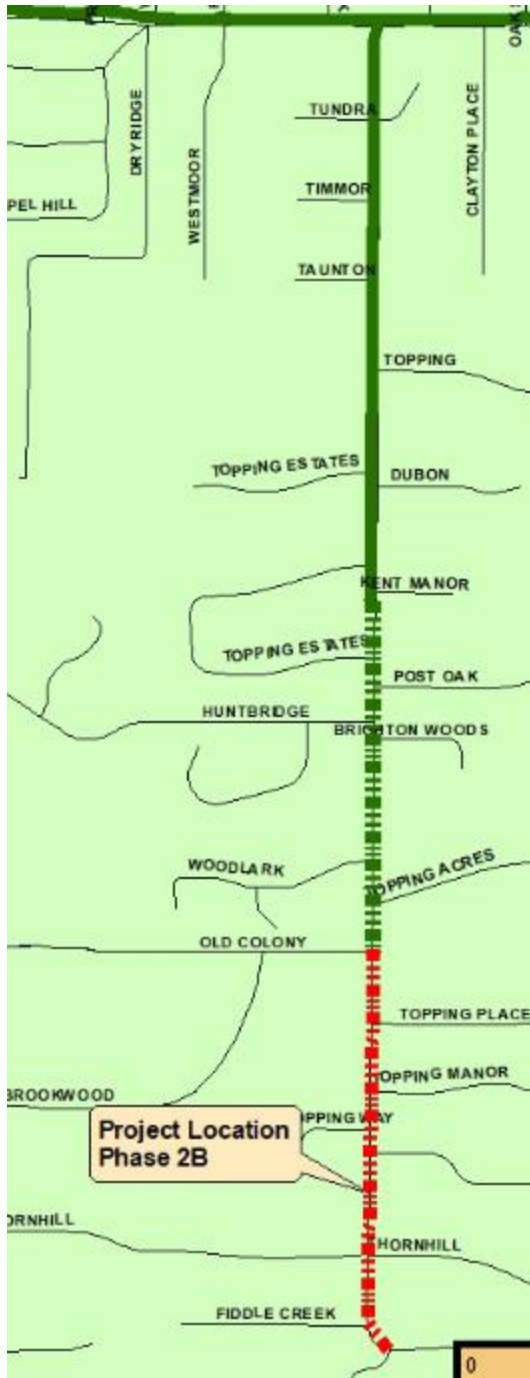
A similar application for a grant was made in 2024, but turned down by the Surface Transportation Block Grant program administered by the East-West Gateway Council of Governments.

**TOPPING ROAD SIDEWALK COMPLETION;** Another resolution was approved to apply for a grant with the Transportation Alternatives Program also administered by the East-West Gateway Councils of Government. The construction cost would be \$1,046,144 and the City would have to pay \$563,072 if the grant was awarded. Two phases of the sidewalk have been completed, one with Grant money and the other financed by the City when the grant application was turned down. Phase 1 was done in 2022 and Phase 2 in 2023





## CHESTERFIELD CITY COUNCIL MEETING



**BIGGEST SPENDING** Council approved 16-Baseball bullpens to be located next to the dugouts of 8 City owned baseball fields in Chesterfield Valley for a cost of \$519,000. Another \$40,284 was approved for new pitching mounds on the fields.



**PROPERTY TAX APPROVED FOR NEW DOWNTOWN CHESTERFIELD DISTRICT:** Chesterfield has no property tax, but that is about to change for a small section of town. The Council approved a property tax up to 85-cent per \$100 access valuation for property in the new Downtown Chesterfield development on the area where the former Chesterfield Mall was located.

The tax is to cover police, street, public service, parks and other city services without current residents having to cover the costs of the land and not buildings. The tax will have to have residents approve the tax, which won't affect them, at the April Municipal Election. The developer, The Staenberg Group, has no problem with the tax.

The Measure passed on a 6-1 vote. Councilman Aaron Wahl was absent and Dan Hurt, who is running for mayor, voted NO without saying the reason for the vote.

**\$9,430 FOR 2025 LIFEGUARD TRAINING:** The Council approved speeding \$9,430 to train new lifeguards for the city's pools and aquatic areas. The training for 50 lifeguards will be done by Aquatic Risk Management Services of Maitland, Florida.

**RETURN TO SECRECY:** Secret meeting that the public is not allow to attend are becoming more and more common in Chesterfield. The Council was holding a secret meeting prior to the regular meeting and then returned to secrecy after the 25-minute regular meeting was over. Closed meetings are held for personnel issues, contacts bids and lawsuits. This is fine and good government but having the closed meetings on a very regular schedule seems a bit much.

**MOST GO TO THE HOSPITAL TO GET BETTER NOT MURDERED:** We normally just have news out of Town & Country and Chesterfield, but Mercy Hospital at the edge of T&C and Chesterfield while in Creve Coeur draws lots of patients from both cities so this is of note.

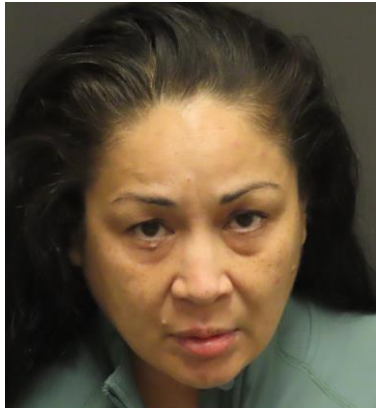

**CHESTERFIELD RESIDENT SERVING 15 YEARS IN FEDERAL PRISON ON SEX CHARGES INVOLVING A MINOR:**



John Kenneth Low, 41, formerly of Millrun Court in Chesterfield is now living in a Federal Prison. We wrote 2-years-ago about Low was arrested after taking the 15-year girl from her home in Riley County, Kansas (Manhattan). They had been connecting on a social media site. Missouri and Federal charges were filled.

This is from the U.S. Attorney's Office on Low's arrest:

The St. Louis Division of the Federal Bureau of Investigation was notified that the victim could be at John Low's residence in Chesterfield, Missouri. Accompanied by Chesterfield Police, FBI agents knocked on door of the residence. Agents determined John Low resided at this address and discovered the victim in the house.

The girl was found wearing a dog collar at the time of the police raid.

Low pled guilty in Federal Court to:

Coercion and Enticement of a Minor, Transportation with Intent to Engage with Sexual Activity with a Minor and Travel with Intent to Engage in Illicit Sexual Activity.

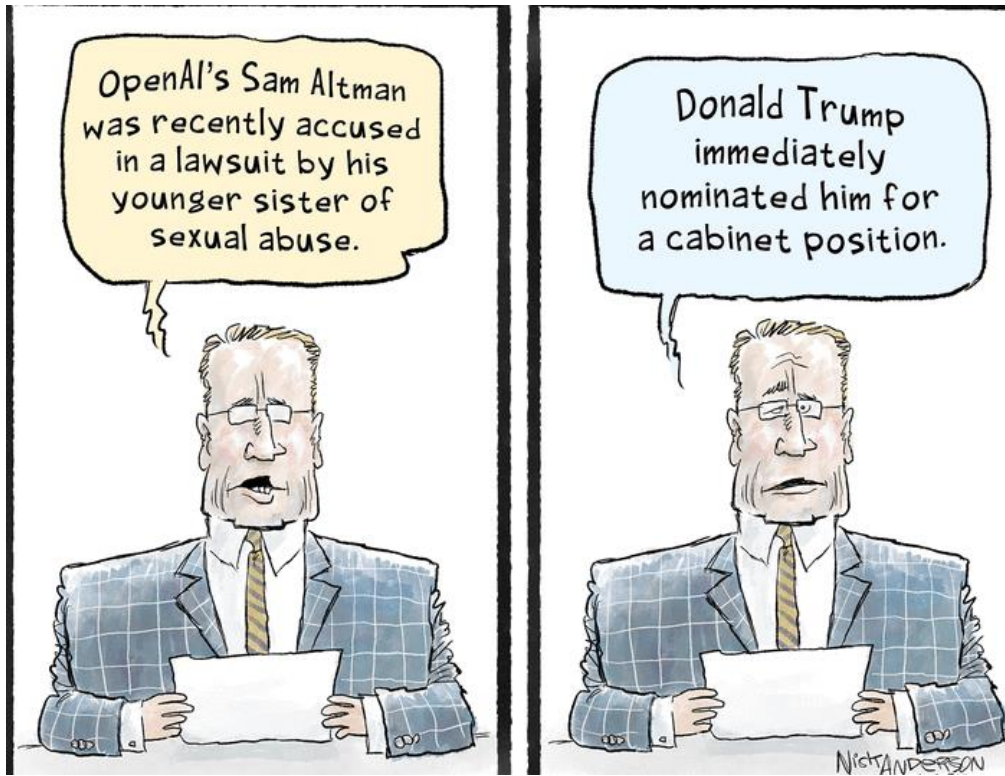

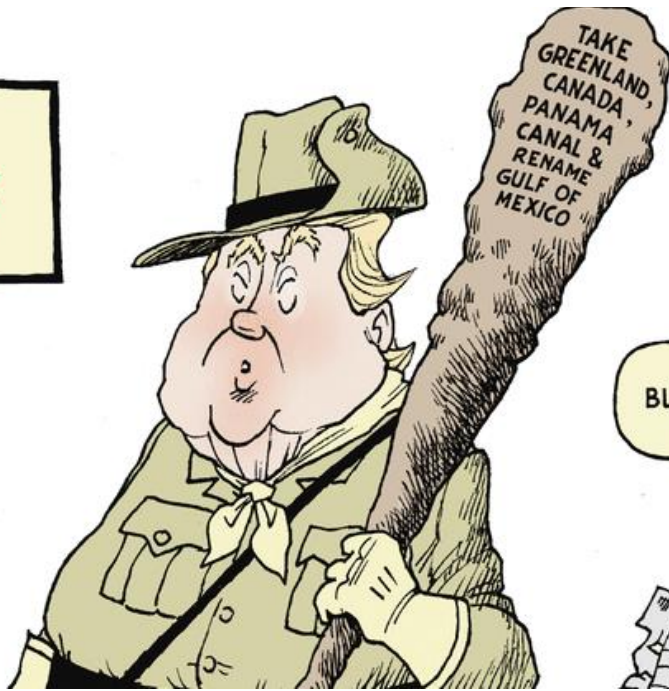
