**WHITE BUFFALO DEER COUNT.** 79 deer were harvested (killed) in Town and Country during a 1-week period in January 2025 by contractor White Buffalo. As in past years the deer were taken to a butcher and then sent to feed the poor.

**28-YEAR-OLD TOWN AND COUNTRY MAN ARRESTED FOR ASSAULTING HIS FATHER.** On January 12<sup>th</sup> Town and Country Police responded to 617 Aspen Ridge Court on a call of an adult son attacking his father. They arrested 28-year-old Robert Emmett Donnelly for felony assault on his father, who had multiple injuries from being punched in the face.

The facts supporting this belief are as follows: 1. On January 12, 2025, police arrive at 617 Aspen Ridge, St. Louis County for a domestic disturbance.

2. Victim Father RD, tells police his son was intoxicated and attacked him for no reason by punching him multiple times.

3. Police find defendant hiding in the bathroom. Police are told defendant has alcohol, mental health issues and suicidal issues.

4. Police later overhear defendant state to his mother that he will murder his father and he will slit his father's throat with a knife and watch him bleed out.

5. Defendant currently is hospitalized in a psychiatric unit at Mercy.

6. Defendant has previously been arrested in 2022 for felony domestic assault but his father did not wish to prosecute at that time.

7. Defendant is a flight risk and danger to the victim and community based on the above listed facts.

**W I64 / Long Road**—An Officer initiated a traffic stop on a vehicle suspected of impaired driving. During the stop, it was revealed that the driver, a 60-year-old male, and the front passenger, a 64-year-old male, both had outstanding arrest warrants for theft and traffic-related offenses. The driver displayed clear signs of impairment and failed field sobriety tests. A drug recognition expert was called to the scene and confirmed signs of drug influence. The driver was arrested for DWI-drugs, driving with a revoked license, and for the outstanding warrants, while the front passenger was arrested for his warrants. An inventory search of the vehicle uncovered suspected fentanyl, drug paraphernalia, and a stolen 9mm handgun located under the driver’s seat. Initially, the driver provided the name of his brother, who also had outstanding warrants. After fingerprinting, the driver’s true identity was confirmed, revealing multiple theft and traffic warrants. The arresting officer issued several municipal traffic citations and submitted a state warrant application packet for Felony charges of Possession of a Controlled Substance, Possession of a Stolen Firearm and Unlawful Possession of a Firearm.

**FELONY THEFT**

Suspect took victim's jewelry while cleaning her home over a 2-year period. Detectives were able to find three additional victims who had property taken under the same circumstances and involving the same suspect. Detectives were able to locate some of the stolen jewelry at a local pawn shop and recover it. All four victims had items returned to them totaling \$24,720 in recovered property.

**FORGERY**

Victims had checks stolen out of their mailboxes before they were forged and cashed with the suspect's information printed on them. Detectives identified the suspect, took him into custody, and obtained a full confession. While investigating this matter, Detectives were able to link this case to others in Chesterfield along with neighboring jurisdictions. Additional suspects in the mail theft and forgery have been identified. Detectives are working with USPS inspectors to apprehend the additional suspects and possibly refer the charges to a federal prosecutor.

While working an alcohol and nicotine compliance buy, an underage confidential informant (CI) was able to purchase a nicotine vape product from Luxe Vapor (13367 Olive Blvd. Chesterfield, MO 63017). This resulted in the clerk being issued a summons for selling nicotine to a minor. Of note, this is the second time this business has sold nicotine products to a minor.

## SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS

The School Resource Unit serves as resources and department liaisons at nineteen public and private schools located in Chesterfield and Clarkson Valley. The agency has ten full time officers assigned to the program. Six of the School Resource Officers (SROs) are individually assigned to the three public high schools and three public middle schools located in the two cities. The high school and middle school SRO programs are partially funded by the Parkway School District and the Rockwood School District representing one of the department's many successful community partnerships. In recent years, the department has added three additional officers to the unit that serve a similar role in the City's elementary schools, the Elementary SRO program (ESRO). These ESROs are assigned to seven public and six private elementary schools. Additionally, one ESRO is assigned to Logan College.

**STATE OF MISSOURI BUYS OFFICE BUILDING IN CHESTERFIELD TO MOVE JOBS OUT OF DOWNTOWN ST. LOUIS:** State government has purchased the 5-story office building at 1390 Timberlake Manor Parkway and will be moving offices out of the 10-story Wainwright Building in downtown.

The State paid \$16,250,000 for the 116,000 square foot building in Chesterfield that was built in 1998.

The Missouri Department of Transportation is already in two Chesterfield buildings.

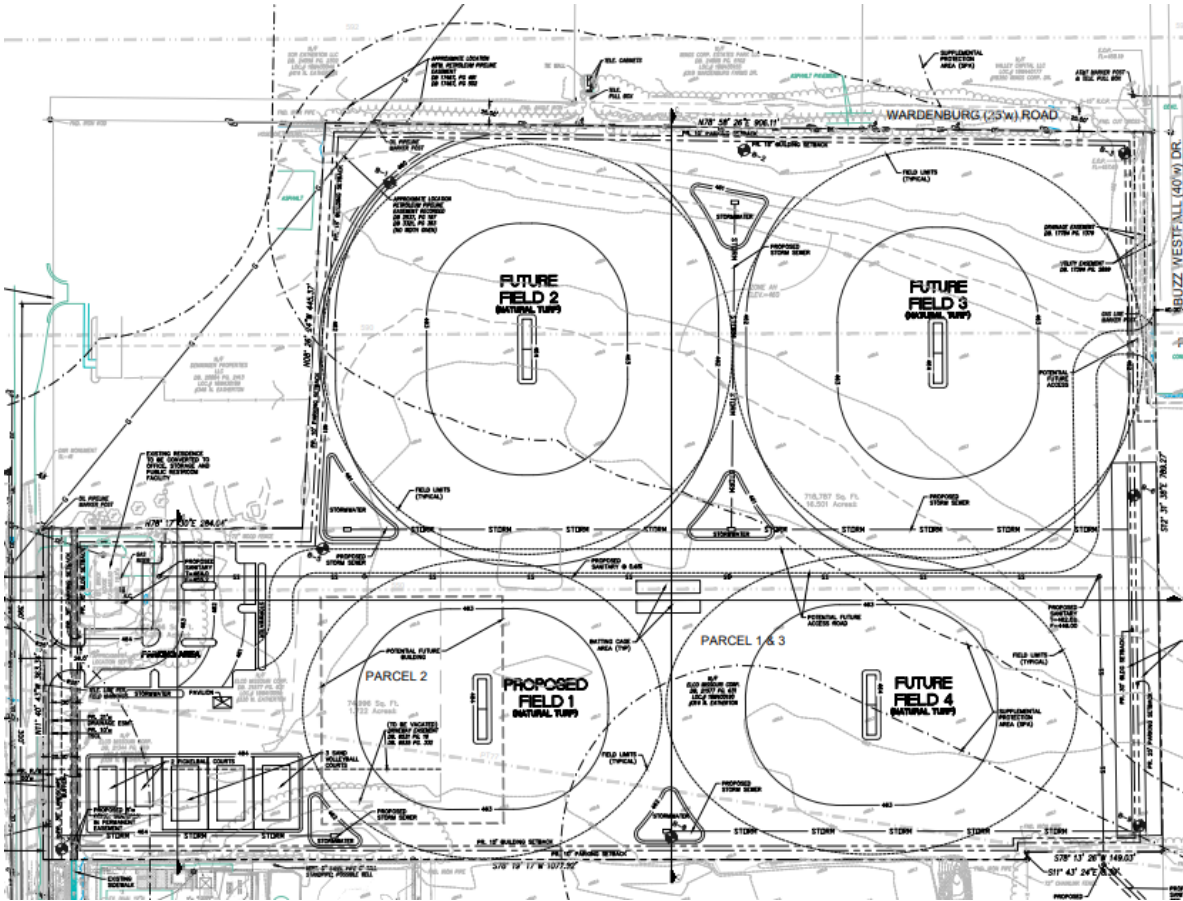

**Chesterfield soon to be Cricket Capital of Missouri:** The India Sports Association wants to rezone a 19.5 acre site off of Eatherton Road from a Non-Urban classification to a Planned Industrial District. They hope to build an athletic center that will feature 4 cricket fields.

St. Charles Country closed down the only cricket field in the area several years ago. A number of cricket players from India live in Chesterfield, including Councilman Gary Budar. The Chesterfield Parks Department has provided a single cricket field near the Missouri River, partially funded by cricket players.

Summary

Stock & Associates Consulting Engineers, Inc., on behalf of India Sports Association, LLC, has submitted a request to rezone a 19.489-acre tract of land zoned “NU” Non-Urban District to “PI” Planned Industrial District. The change is in preparation for a multi-sport complex east of Eatherton Road. The proposed site featured on the Preliminary Development Plan (PDP) includes an existing house to be renovated and repurposed as a clubhouse, an area for parking, and athletic sports fields and courts.



This passed on a 8-0 vote.

**PROPOSED BUILDING FOR A NEW KIA DEALERSHIP IN CHESTERFIELD**

**VALLEY:** The building would handle minor repairs for the new dealership off of Long Road.

There was discussion that the Council did not want motorists on eastbound I-64 which this property abuts having to see parked cars after entering Chesterfield. The owner of the property had agreed to plant shrubs to block the property view from I-64. This passed on a 8-0 vote.
